A PROCLAMATION.

GRAEME THOMSON.

WHEREAS it seems advisable to the Governor to establish in Pallehapuwide village in Matale Udasiya pattuwa, Matale South, of the District of Matale, Central Province, a general cemetery for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits hereinafter specified and defined:

And whereas the Governor may under section 6 (3) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, either wholly or in part exempt any cemetery from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24:

And know Ye that We, the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in Us by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, do hereby under section 6 (1) of "The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899," as amended by the Cemeteries and Burials Amendment Ordinance, 1931, establish, as from the date hereof, a general cemetery on the land described in Schedule A hereto for the burial or cremation of the dead within the limits specified and defined in Schedule B hereto.

And We do hereby exempt the said cemetery wholly from the operation of sections 11, 16, 17, and 24 of the said Ordinance.

"THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927."

REGULATIONS under sections 53 and 70 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, for the Urban area comprised within the administrative limits of the Urban District Council of Bandarawela made by the Governor

by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. The regulations dated September 24, 1929, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,736 of September 27, 1929, are hereby repealed.

2. In these regulations—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Bandarawela.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.

“Public stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

3. No vehicle other than a motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in or enter a public stand.

4. When a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall be parked in it or enter it.

5. (a) A hiring car shall not enter a public stand except by the passage provided for such entrance and shall not leave except by the passage provided for such exit.

(b) All hiring cars shall when parked in a public stand be halted facing the same direction and immediately behind each other.

(c) All hiring cars parked in a public stand shall move up in due order as vacancies occur in front.

6. The driver of the motor cab or omnibus or a person capable of driving it shall be in charge while the motor cab or omnibus occupies a public stand.

7. No motor cab or omnibus shall be parked in any public place except a public stand; and no motor cab or omnibus shall enter or remain in a public stand—

(a) Unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under rule 8, and

(b) Unless he produces it when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman.

8. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing motor cabs or omnibuses to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

9. The driver of a lorry shall not allow it to stand on any highway declared by regulation to be suitable for lorry traffic except—

(a) In the event of a breakdown and then only so long as may be necessary to enable essential repairs to be effected;

(b) For the purpose of loading or unloading goods and then only so long as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose.

10. All drivers and other persons in charge of hiring cars in the stand shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner.

SCHEDULE.

Scale of Charges for the Use of Public Stands.

For every hiring car, Rs. 2.50 per mensem or cents 25 per diem.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by Notification in the *Gazette* of October 25, 1929, are hereby amended:—

(1) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words “and for sale of milk”; and

(2) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—*Regulations for Sale of Milk generally.*

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

(a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or

(b) if he is resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

(a) employer's name and number on register;

(b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

(i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled “Skimmed milk” in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.

(ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cacao has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.

(iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on July 15, 1933, at 8.30 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated July 10, 1933.**

Present : Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, Chairman ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. J. W. S. Attygalle ; Dr. L. C. Wijesingha ; Mr. O. T. Nettelton ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva.

1. The Minutes of proceedings of the meetings held on June 17, 1933, and July 1, 1933, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and copies thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1932 to June 30, 1933, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.
- (c) Health Officer's report for June, 1933.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of June, 1933.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended July 15, 1933.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910," be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during June, 1933.

3A. (1) Mr. de Silva having inquired what compensation was paid by the Council to those who sustained loss of property during the recent floods, the Chairman referred Mr. de Silva to the decision made at the previous meeting on the subject and pointed out what funds were available and how they had been distributed.

(2) Mr. de Silva also raised the question of failure of lights in some parts of the town for several nights and inquired what the Electrical Engineer's explanation was.

The Chairman read out the report of the Municipal Electrical Engineer and stated that the failures on July 5 and 6, were attributable to natural causes, and failures on July 7, 9, 10, and 11, were not accounted for.

It was agreed that an Engineer of the Government Electrical Department should be asked to pay the periodical visit of inspection early and report particularly on the causes of failure.

4. Petitions :—

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(1) Petition from M. Cader Saibo of Market Spaces 44 and 45, urging his claims for a transfer of the licence in his favour in respect of the 2 spaces and suggesting an inquiry. (2) Petition from Romanis Appu, late plumber of the Works Department, praying for balance pay from January 1 to 9, 1933, and an enhanced monthly pension.

Dr. Attygalle presented—(3) Petition from N. M. P. Pandara Nadar, asking the Council to move Government to increase the quota of Indian goats allowed to be imported to meet the requirements of the Central Province.

Mr. Usoof Ismail presented—(4) Petition from A. Z. A. Jaldin, Overseer, Rat Campaign, asking the Council to pay the expenses of his medical treatment due to a motor car accident he met with, when out on Municipal duty.

The Chairman agreed to consider the matters referred to in the various petitions.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved—“ That a sum of Rs. 40,000 be voted out of the surplus Revenue of this Council to construct a Maternity Ward and an Outdoor Dental Surgery for the benefit of the inhabitants of the town. The said premises be constructed in the Kandy Hospital Grounds and the said buildings be handed to the Central Government for management after their construction.” Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and was declared lost by 4 votes.

Ayes.—Mr. de Silva, Mr. Usoof Ismail. *Noes.*—Dr. Attygalle, Dr. Wijesinha, Mr. Wijayatilake, Mr. Soysa, Mr. Nettelton, The Chairman.

5A. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved motion standing over from meeting of January 21, 1933.

“ That this Council is of opinion that the area covered by the Kandy Municipality be divided into twelve electoral districts in view of the forthcoming reform of the constitution.” Mr. Soysa seconded.

It was agreed to refer the question to the Committee that would be appointed to consider the whole question of reforms.

6. Pursuant to notice Dr. Attygalle moved—“ That in view of the publication of the Draft Ordinance providing for a new Constitution for the Colombo Municipal Council which can be made applicable to Kandy with such modifications as may be deemed necessary by proclamation of the Governor, a Special Committee of this Council be appointed, (1) to consider and report to this Council what modifications should be made in the proposed Constitution in the light of the reform proposals submitted by this Council to Government in 1921, (2) to advise the Council as to the number of electoral wards or divisions that are considered necessary, and to suggest their boundaries.” Mr. Wijayatilake seconded.—Carried.

The elected Members of Council were appointed to form the Special Committee, 4 members to form a quorum.

It was agreed that the papers relating to the proposed extension of Municipal limits should also be referred to this Committee for consideration.

7. In connection with the retirement of Mr. A. B. C. Kulasekera, Clerk in Grade I. of the Clerical Service, on reaching age limit on October 30, 1933, to sanction (i.) payment to Mr. Kulasekera of a commuted pension of Rs. 3,610 and an annual reduced pension of Rs. 1,083, with effect from October 30, 1933. (ii.) Leave of three months preparatory to retirement for the period July 30, 1933, to October 29, 1933, and (iii.) employment of a substitute at Rs. 50 per mensem during Mr. Kulasekera's absence on leave.

Resolved that the pension and the leave be sanctioned and arrangements be made to carry out Mr. Kulasekera's duties for the period of his leave with the present staff.

8. Application from Mr. A. R. L. S. V. N. Chettyiar for permission to erect a Lecture and Theatre Hall at the Pullayar Kovil premises in Katukelle.

Resolved that the application be allowed subject to the reservation that the Municipal Council will not be liable in damages in the event of the theatre proving a nuisance and the licence for public performances being withdrawn for this or any other reasons.

The Council's lawyer to draft this condition.

9. Papers *re* the proposal to create a post as Building Inspector and Surveyor on a salary scale of Rs. 1,800—Rs. 120—Rs. 3,000, with a travelling allowance of Rs. 300 per annum and the usual rent allowance.

The Chairman explained the position and obtained Council's permission to place fresh proposals before the Works Committee for consideration in due course.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on June 17, 1933.

(3) Petition dated May 8, 1933, from the occupier of the rice boutique and the sundry goods boutique at Mahaiyawa, praying for a reduction of the rents charged for these boutiques in view of the prevailing depression.—Recommended to reduce the rent by Rs. 5 on each building.

(4) Petition dated May 17, 1933, from the temporary boutique keepers in the Market grounds praying that the Council reconsider its previous decision and allow them an extension of time by a further year for quitting the boutiques.—Recommended that the previous decision be adhered to.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on June 17, 1933.

(5) Papers *re* the proposal to compensate Mr. H. de Moor, late cemetery-keeper, Mahaiyawa General Cemetery, for loss of leave preparatory to retirement.—Recommended that Rs. 40 per mensem be paid for the 2 months of August and September, 1932, as a personal allowance.

(6) Petition dated May 17, 1933, from the temporary boutique keepers in the Market grounds praying that the Council reconsider its previous decision, and allow them an extension of time by a further year for quitting the boutiques.—Recommended that the previous decision be adhered to.

(7) Papers *re* the proposal to pay Messrs. Bamber & Bruce a consolidated annual fee of Rs. 750 for testing milk, food, and water samples submitted to them for analysis, in lieu of the piece rates paid now.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on July 1, 1933.

(8) To sanction the transfer of a sum of Rs. 650 from the unexpended balance in the “ Sanitary Improvements in Rural Areas Vote ” (Est. 38/30) to meet the cost of building the unbuilt portion of the side drain in Matale road.—Recommended.

(9) Memo dated June 5, 1933, from the Municipal Engineer submitting details of a scheme whereby it is proposed to provide a Municipal Garage for housing Municipal lorries, a motor workshop, carpentry, and blacksmith shops, stores and muster shed, in a centralized position in the town.—Recommended and that as proposed in it, provision for garages, workshop, washing place, roads, and fencing, amounting to Rs. 12,360 be provided.

- (10) To sanction a vote for Rs. 2,000 to meet the cost of improving a section of the drains in Mahaiyawa Model Tenement premises, in terms of the Chairman's memo of June 23, 1933.—Recommended.
- (11) Papers *re* the proposal to provide 400 concrete blocks at a cost of Rs. 1,400 for use in connection with the fixing of number plates to paddy fields.—Recommended that the original design and estimate be adopted.
- (12) To sanction a vote for Rs. 151.90 to meet the cost of destruction and burial of condemned unserviceable articles.—Recommended.
- (13) To approve of the transfer of a sum of Rs. 23 from "Infectious Diseases Prevention Vote (3)" to "23 Capital Expenditure"—Est. 50—to meet cost of providing a ceiling for the Veterinary Surgeon's Office.—Recommended.
- (14) Memo from the Municipal Engineer dated June 30, 1933, reporting that another dangerous slip has occurred in Heerasagala road with estimate for Rs. 1,570 for a retaining wall.—Recommended.
- (15) Application for a water service to premises No. 399, Peradeniya road.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on July 1, 1933.

- (16) Estimate for Rs. 90 from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for erecting a karri timber pole in Lady Torrington road to replace the bracket fitted to a tree to support the overhead main, and fixing one public lamp bracket on this pole.—Recommended.
- (17) To sanction a vote for Rs. 110.50 to meet the cost connected with the provision of concrete flooring for the workshop at the Power House.—Recommended.

Resolution of Council.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted with the exception of item (9) which was deferred for next meeting to enable papers to be re-circulated.

11. To restore Ratwatte Adigar, who has been absent from three consecutive meetings to the office of Councillor, in terms of sections 29 and 30 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance.

Resolved that he be restored to office.

12. *Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on July 15, 1933.*

Further letter dated March 16, 1933, from Mr. G. F. Buultjens asking the Council to reconsider its previous decision and refund to him the sum a Rs. 202.87 appropriated by the Council from the fee of Rs. 405.73 paid to him by the Municipal Education District Committee for supervising the building of the Lady Gordon's road Tamil School in 1927.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 202.87 be refunded to Mr. Buultjens.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended August 19, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 183 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 118 Sinhalese, 27 Tamils, 18 Moors, 6 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 32·4, as against 31·5 in the preceding week, 24·0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 161 (2 Burghers, 109 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 13 Moors, 3 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28·5, as against 27·5 in the previous week, 23·8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 161 total deaths, 36 were of infants under one year of age, as against 27 in the preceding week, 29 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 11.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Eighteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 11 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 3 in Wellawatta South, and 1 each in Maradana North, Slave Island, Kollupitiya and Wellawatta North, as against 20 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Twelve deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 5 in St. Paul's, 4 in Kotahena South, and 1 each in New Bazaar, Maradana hospitals, and Maradana East, as against 7 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 1 each in St. Paul's, Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals, Maradana North, and Maradana East. The number registered during the preceding week was also 5 and the weekly average for last year was 3.

2. (a) Twenty deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 3 each in Kotahena North and Kotahena South, 2 each in St. Paul's and New Bazaar, and 1 in San Sebastian, as against 17 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town, occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 4 in Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 in Maradana North, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Fourteen deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 8 from *Worms*; 7 from *Debility*, 4 from *Dysentery*, 3 from *Diarrhoea*, 2 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Tetanus*, *Homicide*, and *Puerperal Septicaemia* and 58 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases*.—Nine cases of *Enteric Fever*, and 5 each of *Chickenpox* and *Measles* were reported during the week, as against 5, 5, and 1, respectively, of the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80·0°, against 80·3° in the preceding week and 80·7° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·861 in., against 29·850 in. in the preceding week and 29·838 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·47 in., against 1·34 in. in the preceding week and 2·17 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.
