“THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927.”

REGULATIONS under sections 53 and 70 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, made by the Governor, by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, for the urban area of Ambalangoda.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. The regulations made for the Sanitary Board town of Ambalangoda and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,746 of November 22, 1929, are hereby repealed.

2. In these regulations:—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Ambalangoda.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.

“Public Stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

3. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

4. No vehicle other than a hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

5. No hiring car, omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place except a public stand.

6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

7. No hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

8. No hiring car, omnibus or lorry, shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

9. The driver of every hiring car, omnibus or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the hiring car, omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand.

10. The driver of any hiring car, omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car, omnibus or lorry.

11. Every driver or other person in charge of any hiring car, omnibus or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

SCHEDULE.

Scale of Charges for the Use of Public Stands.

For every hiring car or omnibus or lorry Rs. 5 per annum.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws relating to dairies published by Notification in the *Gazette* of November 7, 1930, are hereby amended:—

- (1) by the deletion, from the heading of the part or chapter thereof numbered II., of the words "and for sale of milk"; and
- (2) by the insertion, immediately after the aforesaid part or Chapter II., of the following new part or chapter:—

III.—Regulations for Sale of Milk Generally.

1. No person who is not a licensee of a dairy as aforesaid, shall himself, or by any agent or servant, sell or deliver, or expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, any milk within the administrative limits of the Council, save in accordance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed.

2. (i.) Every such person, whether resident within or without the limits of the Council, who desires to sell or supply for money milk in any quantity to any person or persons within the limits of the Council, shall cause himself to be registered in the books of the Council as a purveyor or supplier of milk.

(ii.) Such registration shall be free of all fees or charges.

3. Every such person shall, by proper application made for that purpose, further cause registration-cards to be issued annually by the Chairman to each servant, vendor, or agent, whether paid or unpaid, employed by him in the work of selling or delivering milk.

4. Any contravention of, or non-compliance with, the foregoing provisions shall be an offence.

5. (1) The Chairman may in his discretion refuse to register as a purveyor or supplier of milk under the foregoing by-law 2, any person who has not been recommended for registration, after such inspection, as may be necessary, of his premises, his animals, and his utensils and equipment generally—

- (a) if he is a resident within the administrative limits of the Council, by the Medical Officer of Health of the Council; or
- (b) if he is a resident in any area outside the limits of the Council, by the Chairman of any duly constituted local authority there may be in such area, or if there is none, by the Medical Officer of Health for the district in which such area lies.

(2) The Chairman may likewise refuse to issue any registration-cards, under the foregoing by-law 3, until a Medical Officer deputed by him has examined and found each such servant, vendor, or agent to be free from any infectious or contagious disease and from diseases of the skin.

6. The registration-cards so issued by the Chairman shall include the following particulars:—

- (a) employer's name and number on register;
- (b) name of vendor or servant or agent, and his thumb impression.

7. It shall be an offence for any person to deliver milk or to carry or hawk milk for sale within the limits of the Council, unless he has in his possession a registration-card for the current year duly issued as aforesaid.

8. (i.) It shall be an offence for any person delivering milk or carrying or hawking milk for sale within the limits of the Council, to refuse, or to fail for any reason, to produce for inspection a duly issued registration-card for the current year, when called upon to do so by a Sanitary Inspector or by any person specially or generally authorized by the Chairman in that behalf.

(ii.) In the event of any person so refusing or failing to produce such card, it shall be lawful for such Sanitary Inspector or other authorized person to exercise the powers given to peace officers by section 33 (1) of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

9. It shall be an offence for any person to sell or deliver or to expose, keep, carry, hawk, or offer for sale, within the limits of the Council—

(i.) any milk from which the cream has been removed, unless such milk is contained in a vessel which is distinctly and conspicuously labelled "Skimmed milk" in English, and the equivalent term in Sinhalese and Tamil, and is sold as such.

(ii.) any milk adulterated with water or any other foreign substance or liquid; provided that milk, to which tea, coffee, or cacao has been added for consumption on the premises of any tea or coffee boutique or eating-house, shall not be deemed to be adulterated for the purpose of this by-law.

(iii.) any milk contained in bottles of which the mouth is not covered with paper or other impermeable material.

10. If any person found guilty of an offence under the foregoing by-law 9 is proved to be the agent or servant, whether paid or unpaid, of any other person, such other person shall also be liable to be punished for the same offence, unless he proves to the satisfaction of the court that he had given all necessary instructions and used due diligence to ensure compliance, and that the offence was due to an act or default of his agent, or servant without his own knowledge, consent, or connivance.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- (1) the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- (2) the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- (3) a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at Re. 1, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

4. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person

or persons whose names and addresses may have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

RULES under section 11 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the Village Tanks Irrigation Districts of Wilachchiya korale, Kende korale, Kadawat korale, Nuwaragam korale, Eppawala korale, Kanadara korale, Mahapotana korale, Uddiyankulama korale, Kalpe korale, Kunchuttu korale, Ulagalla korale, Matcambuwa korale, Meda pattu, Sinhala pattu, Egoda pattu, Maminiya korale, Kalagam korale south, Kiralowa korale, Kalagam korale north, Negampaha korale, and Unduruwa korale in the North-Central Province, at meetings duly held on January 7, 10, 12, 15, 18, 25, 9, 10, 12, 13, 17, 19, 16, 18, 27, 17, 21, 23, 25, 27, and February 25, 1933, respectively, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES.

Irrigation Meetings.

1. (1) Before the commencement of each season a meeting of the proprietors shall be held, as far as possible in the following months:

for the maha cultivation in September,
for the meda cultivation in December,
for the yala cultivation in April.

(2) Any proprietor may attend any such meeting either in person or by representative.

2. Any such meeting may among other matters relating to the cultivation for the approaching season determine the following:

- (1) The nature and extent of the lands to be cultivated.
- (2) The date for the completion of each of the works of—
 - (a) clearing channels,
 - (b) fencing fields,
 - (c) sowing,
 - (d) erecting watch-huts, and
 - (e) reaping.
- (3) The description of paddy to be sown.
- (4) The place and manner in which black cattle and buffaloes are to be confined during cultivation.
- (5) The last date for issue of water.

3. In the event of any matter mentioned in the foregoing rule 2 remaining undetermined by reason of the failure of the majority of the proprietors either to attend a meeting of which due notice is given or to arrive at a decision thereon, such matter may be decided by the Government Agent or an officer authorized by him in that behalf, and every decision of the Government Agent or such officer under this rule shall be binding on all the proprietors.

Field Fences.

4. (1) Before the date fixed for the completion of the work of fencing fields, every proprietor shall construct or repair the portion of the fences marked out by the Irrigation Headman as the share proportionate to the extent of such proprietor's fields, whether such portion adjoins such field or not; and he shall thereafter, whether he cultivates such field or not, maintain such portion of the fences in good repair, so as to be capable of keeping out cattle, until the crop on all the fields in the tract is reaped.

(2) No extension of time shall be allowed for completing any work of fencing, if any proprietor has sown his field by the date determined under the foregoing rule 2.

5. If the whole field or a distinct tract called "bage" be cultivated, the fences at the two ends of the field called respectively the "ihala, and pahala elapat, fences" shall be put up by the respective proprietors at those ends, and the rest of the proprietors shall put up the portions of the fences adjoining their shares called respectively the "ihat and pahat fences".

6. Where there is a common fence between two fields, the proprietors of both shall jointly erect it even though only one field is cultivated.

Cultivation.

7. (1) If for any reason it is not possible to commence cultivation on the date determined under the foregoing rule 2, or if the supply of water is likely to be insufficient to irrigate the whole area decided on originally, a further date, or the proportion of the tracts to be abandoned, shall be determined at a meeting of the proprietors duly convened for the purpose; provided that, if the meeting so convened is not able to arrive at a unanimous decision as regards the area to be abandoned, the Government Agent or such officer as may be deputed by him shall have power to determine the area that is to be abandoned.

(2) Each of the proprietors of the area which it was originally decided to irrigate, shall have a right to cultivate a proportionate share of the reduced area.

8. (1) No tank bed shall be cultivated without a permit from the Government Agent.

(2) If the prescribed majority of the proprietors duly decide to cultivate the bed of any tank, and a permit in that behalf has been obtained from the Government Agent, each proprietor shall be entitled to cultivate a portion of such tank bed proportionate to his holding of land under the tank.

9. All high lands and lands situated at a distance from the irrigation work and all lands not fully asweddumized and lands known as "akkaraidam" shall be cultivated for maha; if they are not so cultivated they may not be cultivated for any other season during the year without the permission of the Government Agent which will be granted only on adequate grounds.

10. (1) In the event of the supply of water, after the sowing has been completed, proving for any reason insufficient for the whole extent sown, the proprietors of the fields sown shall, by the prescribed majority, at a meeting duly convened, decide what part of the tract shall be abandoned, and the remainder of the tract shall be divided among such proprietors in proportion to the extent sown by each.

(2) If any meeting so convened fails for any reason to arrive at a decision, the Government Agent or the officer duly appointed by him for the purpose shall have power to decide what proportion of the tract shall be abandoned and every decision of the Government Agent or such officer shall be binding on all the proprietors.

(3) If it is decided to abandon any cultivation under the foregoing paragraphs of this rule after an extension of time has been allowed, any proprietor who has sown his share before the date originally fixed shall be entitled to his full share of the water and shall not be bound to allow the late cultivators any share in his crop.

Watching of Fields.

11. Before the date fixed for finishing the erection of watch-huts under the foregoing rule 2, each proprietor of fields where watch-huts are necessary shall erect a proper watch-hut in such place as may be indicated to him by the Irrigation Headman, and shall continue to keep watch until the date for the completion of reaping fixed under the said rule.

Channels.

12. (1) All field channels, dams, amunams, or water-courses whether outside or inside any field, which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, shall be repaired, cleared, and kept in good order throughout the season by the proprietors whose lands are irrigated thereby.

(2) Each proprietor shall be responsible for such proportionate share of the channels, dams, amunams, or water-courses as may be demarcated with pegs or blocks by the Government Agent or any officer deputed by him for the purpose.

13. (1) Applications for permission to construct any new channels, dam, or other work decided on by the majority of the proprietors in any tract shall be made in writing to the Cultivation Officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 20A of the Ordinance.

(2) Any work, the construction of which is permitted, shall be carried out in such manner and within such time and along such alignment as may be specified by the Government Agent or any officer deputed by him for the purpose.

(3) For the construction of such work, every proprietor of fields within such tract shall be liable to contribute labour in proportion to his holding.

14. (1) Every proprietor of new lands, which have been surveyed and demarcated by landmarks with reservations for field channels for irrigating such lands, shall construct his proportion of such field channels in accordance with alignments approved by the Government Agent or any officer deputed by him for the purpose.

(2) If any proprietor of such lands is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to any default on the part of any other proprietor in constructing his share of the field channels, after notice from the Cultivation Officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 20A of the Ordinance calling upon him to do the necessary work, the Irrigation Headman may with the approval of the Cultivation Officer cause the work to be done and recover the cost thereof from the defaulter in accordance with section 23 of the Ordinance.

15. (1) Every proprietor shall grant wayleave for such channels, dams, or other works even though his own lands may not be benefited thereby.

(2) All proprietors whose lands are benefited by any such work, shall be liable under this rule to pay to the owners of lands, which suffer damage by the construction of such work, compensation for any land taken or damage done, in proportion to the area of the holdings benefited, and according to such rates of compensation as may be determined by the Government Agent: Provided that, unless the Government Agent otherwise directs no compensation shall ordinarily be payable in respect of lands lying within the fields or tract of fields benefited.

Irrigation and Distribution of Water.

16. No proprietor or cultivator or any other person under any pretence whatsoever shall interfere with any canal, water-passage, sluice, or dam without the permission of the Cultivation Officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 20A of the Ordinance, or of the Irrigation Headman.

17. In the order beginning with the field furthest from the tank and ending with the nearest, each proprietor shall take his supply of water strictly in turn and only in proportion to the extent of his holding, at such intervals and for such number of hours as the Irrigation Headman may fix.

18. No proprietor who neglects to utilize his share of water in his proper turn, shall be allowed any supply until his next turn comes round.

19. Any proprietor who takes water out of his turn or for a longer period than he is entitled to, or who after having had his full share allows the water to run to waste through negligence, or who misappropriates his neighbour's water through the boundary ridges, shall forfeit the right to his share in the turn next following, and shall be guilty of an offence punishable under Chapter V. of the Ordinance.

20. When water is in transit through a water-course to irrigate any particular tract, no person shall divert the water from such water course to the fields through which it passes or obstruct or otherwise interfere with it.

21. When there is a deficiency of water in the tank, no proprietor who has neglected to commence cultivation at the proper time or who has sown paddy of a kind other than that determined under the foregoing rule 2 by the majority, shall take or be allowed any water for his cultivation.

Cattle.

22. During the cultivation season—

(1) buffaloes shall be kept at such distance from the fields as may be fixed at the cultivation meeting held under rule 2,

(2) black cattle shall be tended by day and folded at night outside the fields cultivated.

23. (1) No owner of a paddy field forming part of a tract under cultivation shall drive in, graze, or tether cattle in his own field till all the fields in the tract have been reaped and crops removed.

(2) No cattle shall be tethered in or near any irrigation channel.

Threshing-floors.

24. All the proprietors who stack paddy on a common threshing-floor shall—

(1) be jointly responsible for the erection of a strong fence round such floor, and

(2) keep watch in turn over the paddy so stacked until all the paddy is threshed and removed.

25. (1) No paddy shall be removed from the fields during any harvest, until the shares due to the Headmen have been paid, and in the case of fields cultivated for a share of the produce, until all dues have been paid to the landlord.

(2) In any case where there is any serious risk of damage to any paddy left on the threshing-floor, such paddy may be removed with the consent of the other party concerned, or if consent is not given, the cultivator shall leave sufficient paddy on the threshing-floor to settle the claim and remove only the remainder.

Enforcement of Ancient Customs.

26. Any existing custom relating to any matters not provided for in these rules, and not inconsistent with them, shall have the force of these rules and be considered part of them.

Irrigation Headmen.

27. It shall be the duty of every Irrigation Headman elected or appointed under Chapter IV. of the Ordinance—

- (a) to reside within three miles of the area for which he is elected or appointed ;
- (b) to operate and maintain in good order all sluices, regulators, and other structures placed in his charge ;
- (c) to issue the necessary notice, call out labour, and supervise all earthworks and repairs and all works of irrigation and paddy cultivation within his area subject to instructions from, and under the control of, the Government Agent or the officer deputed by him ;
- (d) to report the occurrence of any damage to any bund, spill, sluice, or any other work connected with the irrigation work, or of any leak at the sluice, to the Cultivation Officer appointed by the Government Agent under section 20A of the Ordinance, or the Irrigation Officer in charge ;
- (e) to prepare before 31st December in each year a list for the ensuing year of pangu under each tank in his charge with the names and shares of the owners, and to forward it to the Irrigation Officer in charge ; and
- (f) to enforce these and all other irrigation rules and to bring all breaches thereof to the notice of the Cultivation Officer.

28. (1) Every such Irrigation Headman shall be entitled to receive from each proprietor one and a half per cent. of the produce of all lands cultivated by such proprietor.

(2) Subject to the provisions of the foregoing rule 25 (2), the aforesaid percentage shall be handed over on the threshing-floor before any of the produce is removed therefrom.

Contribution of Labour to be made by the Proprietors.

29. Every village tank, not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, and the channels, water-courses, and the like belonging thereto, shall be kept in a proper state of repair to the satisfaction of the Government Agent or the officer in charge, by the proprietors of lands irrigated thereby.

30. (1) For the ordinary works of repair, maintenance, and improvement each such proprietor shall be liable to contribute annually labour proportionate to his holding, calculated at the rate of twelve days' labour for each pangu of two acres.

(2) The works approved by the Government Agent in each year shall be commenced on such date as may be notified by the Irrigation Headman by beat or tom-tom or otherwise before the 31st day of May, and shall be completed on or before the 30th day of September.

(3) Any proprietor may commute the labour due from him by payment on or before the 30th day of June of money calculated at the rate of seventy-five cents for each day's labour due.

(4) Every proprietor who elects to perform labour shall attend daily at the time and place notified by the Irrigation Headman and contribute labour until the completion of the work or the portion of work assigned to him by such headman as the share proportionate to the amount of labour due from him.

31. (1) In any case of emergency or whenever the Government Agent or other duly authorized officer deems it imperative that any urgent work of repair or of prevention of impending damage should be performed, and gives reasonable notice of the need of labour for such purpose, it shall be the duty of every proprietor to attend in person or by substitute and to contribute uncommutable labour daily until the completion of the work : Provided, however, that the labour that any proprietor may be called upon to contribute under this rule shall not exceed twice the annual labour that he is liable to contribute under the foregoing rule 30.

(2) No labour contributed under this rule shall in any case be deemed to exempt any proprietor from the liability to contribute annual labour under the foregoing rule 30.

Maintenance, Conservation, Protection, and Management.

32. (1) No person shall cut or injure the bund of a tank, block, damage, or interfere with the spill or spill-gates, the sluices or regulators without the previous permission of the Government Agent.

(2) In any case where it is necessary to cut the bund of a tank to prevent otherwise inevitable damage and it is impossible to communicate in time with the Government Agent or the Irrigation Officer in charge, such permission from the Government Agent may be dispensed with, but the Irrigation Headman shall report such action at once to the Government Agent and the burden of proving such special circumstances shall lie upon the person or persons who took such action.

33. In any tank not provided with sluices, a place (to be approved by an officer deputed by the Government

Agent) shall be fixed for cutting the bund for the purpose of taking water and the bund shall be cut only at the appointed place.

34. After the sowing, in each cultivation season, every proprietor who does not himself cultivate his fields shall furnish a list of his cultivators to the Irrigation Headman, setting out their names and addresses and stating whether such cultivators are andakarayo, lessees, or hired labourers.

35. The cultivator of any land shall be liable to perform all duties imposed by these rules or by custom on the proprietor of such land.

General.

36. Any act or omission in contravention of these rules shall be an offence punishable under Chapter V. of the Ordinance.

37. Any Irrigation Headman wilfully neglecting any duty imposed on him by these rules shall be guilty of an offence punishable under Chapter V. of the Ordinance.

38. The rules dated December 29, 1868, published in *Gazette* No. 3,689 of January 2, 1869, and deemed to be in force hitherto by virtue of the provisions of section 2 of the Ordinance, are hereby repealed.

2. The Registrar shall keep accounts of all receipts and expenditure in connection with the work of the Council, and shall have power to make payments and sign cheques for all such purposes as may be authorized by the Council or necessary under the Ordinance.

3. (1) The accounts shall be audited annually by such person or persons as the Council may approve for that purpose.

(2) Every such person may be remunerated at such rates as the Council may approve.

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended September 16, 1933.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 167 (2 Europeans, 9 Burghers, 104 Sinhalese, 19 Tamils, 21 Moors, 9 Malays, and 3 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 29.6, as against 34.7 in the preceding week, 31.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 155 (3 Europeans, 5 Burghers, 88 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 27.5, as against 29.0 in the previous week, 20.6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 155 total deaths, 30 were of infants under one year of age, as against 34 in the preceding week, 20 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 10.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Fourteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 8 in Maradana hospitals (including 5 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Pettah San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana East, as against 13 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Four deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 in Slave Island and 1 each in Maradana hospitals and Wellawatta North, as against 4 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Five deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 2 each in Maradana hospitals and Slave Island, and 1 in Maradana East, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

(a) Thirteen deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 6 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents), 2 in New Bazaar and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana North, Slave Island, and Wellawatta North, as against 27 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident in Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Three deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents). The number registered in the preceding week as also the weekly average for last year was 3.

4. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 11 from *Debility*, 8 from *Diarrhoea*, 5 each from *Worms* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Infantile Convulsions*, and *Accidents*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 68 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Nine cases of *Enteric Fever*, 8 of *Chickenpox*, 2 of *Measles*, and 1 of *Diphtheria* were reported during the week, as against 10, 5, 3, and nil, respectively, in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 80.2°, against 79.5° in the preceding week and 81.3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.918 in., against 29.843 in. in the preceding week and 29.845 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.94 in., against 0.71 in. in the preceding week and 0.99 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, August 2, 1933, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated July 26, 1933.

Present:—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Mr. N. R. Blande; Mr. M. L. M. Reyal; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of July 5, 1933, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of July 5, 1933, be confirmed.

The Chairman stated that he wished to correct his reply to question No. 3 (7) of the questions regarding the Refreshment Club asked by Mr. A. R. A. Razik in Council on April 5, 1933, by deleting the word "Police" therefrom.

The question and the reply were as follows:—

Q.—If concessions are granted by the Council, what control does the Municipality exercise over the Club? A.—None. Similar concessions are granted to the Staffs in several Government Departments, like the Police, Railway, the General Post Office, and the Electrical Department, but no control is exercised over them by the Departments concerned.

2. (1) Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition signed by certain residents of Wijeratne Town, Mart road, praying that, until such time the Municipality takes up the maintenance of these roads the flushing of its drains be taken up and also street lamps be provided for lighting these roads which give access not only to the occupants of the bungalows but to ratepayers living within the Kolonnawa area who avail themselves of the facilities provided by the opening of the new roads, and asked that it be referred to the appropriate Committee for consideration.

(2) Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from Mr. S. S. H. Fernando of "Siri Wimana," Borella Cross road, with regard to the question of remission of rates of No. 27, Kynsey road, Colombo, and asked that it be referred to the appropriate Committee for consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. R. A. Razik asked the following questions which the Chairman answered:—

(1) Q.—Will the Chairman please state whether all officers in the Council's Service have given proof of age in accordance with the ages given in the budget? If not, will the Chairman be pleased to call for birth certificates from all officers of Council? A.—All officers appointed since 1924, have been required to produce birth certificates in proof of age. I cannot say what proof was required prior to 1924, but presumably some proof was required. Proof of age is also required when an officer retires on account of age. In the circumstances, it is not proposed to call for birth certificates from all officers of the Council.

(2) Q.—Will the Chairman be now pleased to furnish me with replies to my questions raised at the General Meeting on September 7, 1932, with regard to the conversion of gas street lighting to electricity? A.—This matter is before the Works and Finance Committees who are collecting all necessary information on the subject to enable them to make a recommendation to Council.

4. With the permission of Council, the Chairman moved that Council place on record its sincere regret at the death of Dr. A. K. Pani, who was formerly an Assistant Medical Officer of Health in the Municipal Service and was held in high esteem by the Council. He left the Council's service at the end of 1907, and returned to India in the interests of his family. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried in silence all the members standing.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, moved:—"That the Council do take action to widen the Maradana road and that a start be made with the widening of First Division Maradana, from the Government Technical Schools as far as Maradana bridge, forthwith." Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader spoke to the motion.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported the motion, and suggested that the matter should be considered in connection with the Budget.

The Chairman suggested that the matter should be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for consideration of the preliminary estimates.

The mover of the motion agreed to the suggestion of the Chairman, provided he would be permitted to attend the meeting of the Four Standing Committees.

It was resolved that the motion be referred to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for consideration of the preliminary estimates and that Mr. A. E. Goonesinha be invited to attend the meeting of the Committees.

6. The following motion stood in the name of Dr. E. A. Coorey:—"That the building application of Mr. V. R. Paul in premises No. 78/2, lane off High street be referred to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee.

With the permission of Council, at the mover's request, the motion was allowed to stand over.

7. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—"That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. H. N. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

The gratuity is based on his service of 253 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 47·99. Registered No. 1,124.—Recommended.

Registered No. 840.—Recommended that a voluntary contribution of Rs. 200,000 be made by this Council to the Central Government, in five annual instalments of Rs. 40,000, on the following conditions :—(1) Government to undertake that at least fifty beds shall be available for City cases, recommended by the Public Health Department of this Council. (2) The first instalment to be payable on the commencement of the second part of the Scheme of proposed extensions to the De Soysa Lying-in-Home.

(5) To consider the reports of the Medical Officer of Health and the Acting Municipal Treasurer regarding the contract for the supply of photographs in duplicate of Milk Vendors. Registered No. 1,150.—Recommended that no new contract be entered into on the termination of the existing contract on August 2, 1933.

(7) To consider :—(a) Petition presented by Dr. S. Muttiah, M.M.C., in Council on May 17, 1933, on behalf of the Workmens' Resort at Slave Island requesting a Municipal grant to carry on their work and increase their usefulness. ANNEXURE A.

NEW RULES.

(1) The maximum number of inmates allowed in the three types of houses shall be as follows :—

"A" type house : Six adults. "B" type of house : Three adults. "C" type of house : Three adults. Two children under 12 years of age shall count as one adult.

(2) No extra rent shall be recovered from the principal tenant for outsiders or guests so long as the number of inmates as required in Rule (1) is not exceeded.

(3) Chairman's sanction shall be obtained for those special cases where one's family, *i.e.*, wife and children, exceeds the maximum number of inmates allowed.

(4) It is not permissible for any tenant to sub-let the whole or part of his house.

(5) Where single rates are being paid the actual number of inmates is restricted to the number of those paying rent only.

(6) A tenant, *i.e.*, principal occupant, on ceasing to work under the Council or when on leave in India, automatically ceases to be a tenant and must vacate the house.

(7) A fine equivalent to one month's rent may be imposed on chief occupant by the Head of his Department for infringement of Rule (1) above.

(8) Family rate shall be paid by a tenant working for the Council who occupies a line with his wife and their children (who are not adults) and where the total number of inmates does not exceed the maximum number allowed.

(9) Single rate shall apply to each of Council's labourers living in each house where he (or she) is the only occupant in which case he (or she) may be compelled to share the house with one or more of the same sex and each of them shall then be liable to pay the single rate.

ANNEXURE B.

(27) The Municipal Council has obtained the licence to permit to be performed in the Municipal Hall any and every musical works for the time being in the Repertoire of the Performing Right Society, and of the foreign societies for the time being affiliated thereto, which exercise and enforce the rights under the Copy Right Ordinance in respect of Public Performance of their musical works.

(28) The Agent of the Society has the free right of entry into the Municipal Hall during all times of public performance.

(29) The hirer of the Municipal Hall shall supply to the Society, through the Municipal Treasurer, on forms furnished by the Society, a list signed on behalf of the licensee of all the music performed and of all songs sung at the Municipal Hall with the names of the author, composer, arranger, and publisher of each such composition.

The furnishing of this return is an essential condition of the letting of the Hall.

(30) If the hirer shall commit any breach of the conditions and provisions hereof, the Council may, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore expressed to the contrary, withhold the refund of any moneys due to him until the terms of the Council are complied with.

The existing rule No. 27 will be numbered 31.

- The Chairman stated that if the approval of the Governor was necessary under sub-section (1) of section 69, he felt that similar provision would have to be made under sub-section (2). The same condition should apply to both sub-sections, otherwise the Council acting under sub-section (2) might in effect defeat the object of the safeguard under sub-section (1).
Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that as regards sub-section (2), the resolution of the Committee be adopted and that as regards sub-section (1) the same condition should apply, *i.e.*, that the words "and in either case subsequently approved by the Governor" occurring at the end of this sub-section should be deleted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.
- Section 71. Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that this section be deleted.
4 Members voted for the motion and 6 Members against.—Lost.
(Mr. F. Dadabhoy declined to vote).
- Section 72. It was resolved that the marginal note should be altered as follows:—"Appointment of *other* officers and servants."
- Section 74 (b). It was resolved, on the motion of Mr. N. R. Blande, that the first three words of this sub-section, *i.e.*, "has acted or" be deleted.
- Section 76 (a). It was resolved that the words "One hundred ruppess a month." be substituted for the words "two hundred and fifty rupees a month."
- Resolution of Council in Committee.*
- Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that the resolution of the Committee be adopted regarding section 76 (a) but that in section 76 (b) the word "Mayor" be substituted for the word "Commissioner." Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.
- Sections 79 & 81. It was resolved that these sections be amended by the addition of the words "or by supplementary provision" after the words "sanctioned budget" occurring at the end.
- Section 83. Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that section 216 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, be substituted for section 83-3 of the Draft Bill.
3 Members voted for the motion and 7 Members against.—Lost.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Dr. E. A. Coorey wished to know what was the necessity for such a drastic step as was proposed in the Draft Bill. The Chairman stated that he believed that the provision was intended to make it easier for the Council to raise loans by giving greater security to the lenders.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that section 216 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, be substituted for section 83 of the Draft Bill. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

Sections 87, 88, & 90 (1) It was resolved that sections 87 and 88 of the Draft Bill be deleted, and that section 90 (1) be amended by the substitution of the words "provision of the law" for the words "lawful order made by the Governor" in the 5th line.

Sections 92, 93, and 94. It was resolved, on the motion of Dr. E. V. Ratnam, that sections 103 to 107 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, be substituted for sections 92 to 94 of the Draft Bill.

Section 99 (1) It was resolved that this sub-section be amended by the deletion of the paragraphs (b), (c), and (d) and the proviso thereto.

Transitory provisions Section 100 et seq. It was resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that under the heading "*Transitory provisions*" provisions should be made for the Chairman of the present Council to exercise the powers and duties that are now exercised by him under the provisions of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 and other Ordinances, pending delegation by the new Council.

Section 105 (1) It was resolved that the same resolution adopted by Council in September, 1930, be adopted, viz. :—
"The members were of opinion that it would be sufficient if provision was made for optional retirement without an allowance for abolition of office or compensation for loss of career on giving six months notice at any time within 3 years of the new Council coming into being."

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman stated that he informed the Municipal Staff of the terms of the resolution of the Committee, and he had received a memorial which was read by him.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved that the resolution of the Committee be adopted. Mr. T. W. Hockly seconded.

Mr. T. W. Hockly and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke again.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

Section 105 (3) It was resolved that this sub-section be deleted and provisions made as resolved in the foregoing resolution.

Muslim women. It was resolved, on the motion of Mr. A. R. A. Razik, that special provision be made to record the votes of Muslim women by the appointment of lady presiding officers.

The Chairman moved in Committee :—

That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council resumed.

The Chairman moved in Council :—That the resolutions of the Council in Committee, at its previous meetings held on August 11, 14, and 19, 1933, subject to any amendments of such resolutions by the Council in Committee together with the further resolutions of the Council in Committee to-day, be confirmed. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

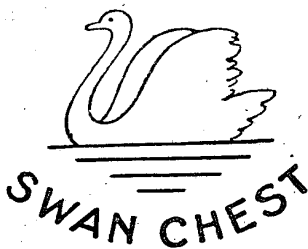

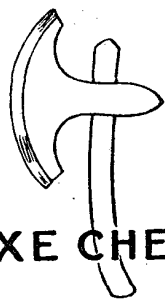
