GREETING.

WHEREAS by Letters dated the 11th day of September, 1930, under the Public Seal of the Island, a Commission was appointed for the purpose of considering the present state of the Kandyan Law and to make recommendations thereon, with FREDERICK AUSTIN HAYLEY, Esquire, King's Counsel, as Chairman :

And whereas the said FREDERICK AUSTIN HAYLEY, Esquire, King's Counsel, has resigned his appointment as Chairman :

And whereas it is considered expedient to appoint you the Honourable Mr. TIKIRI BANDA PANABOKKE to be Chairman of the said Commission in place of the said FREDERICK AUSTIN HAYLEY, Esquire, King's Counsel :

Now therefore, know Ye that We, the said Officer Administering the Government, reposing great trust and confidence in your prudence, ability, and fidelity, have, in pursuance of the powers in Us vested by the Ordinance No. 9 of 1872 and Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, nominated, constituted, and appointed, and by these presents do nominate, constitute, and appoint you the Honourable Mr. TIKIRI BANDA PANABOKKE to be Chairman of the said Commission for the purpose aforesaid, with authority to exercise all the powers which Commissioners appointed under the said Ordinance may lawfully use and exercise.

THE text of an Agreement between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, the Government of India, and the French Government regarding Deportations from certain British and French Territories, signed at Paris on July 29, 1933, is hereby published for general information.

AGREEMENT.

Agreement between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom, the Government of India, and the Government of the French Republic regarding Deportations from certain British and French Territories.

Paris, July 29, 1933.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of India

on the one part, and the Government of the French Republic, on the other part, have agreed upon the following provisions for the repatriation of Asiatic subjects of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and Asiatic persons under the protection of His Majesty, natives of British India (including Burma), the Indian States under the suzerainty of His Majesty, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, the Federated and non-Federated Malay States, and Hong Kong, expelled from French Indo-China, on the one hand, and subjects and protected persons of the French Republic natives of French Indo-China who are expelled from British India (including Burma), the Indian States under the suzerainty of His Majesty, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, the Federated and non-Federated Malay States and Hong Kong, on the other.

ARTICLE 1.

Any Asiatic subject of His Majesty the King or Asiatic person under the protection of His Majesty, native of British India (including Burma), the Indian States under the suzerainty of His Majesty, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, the Federated and non-Federated Malay States, or Hong Kong, who is expelled from French Indo-China, shall be deported at the expense of the Government-General of French Indo-China to the following ports :—

1. Asiatic subjects of His Majesty, natives of Hong Kong, to the port of Hong Kong.
2. Asiatic subjects of His Majesty or Asiatic persons under the protection of His Majesty, natives of the Straits Settlements and the Federated and non-Federated Malay States, to the port of Singapore.
3. Asiatic subjects of His Majesty or Asiatic persons under the protection of His Majesty, natives of British India (including Burma) and the Indian States under the suzerainty of His Majesty, to the port of Madras.
4. Asiatic subjects of His Majesty or Asiatic subjects under the protection of His Majesty, natives of Ceylon or its dependencies, to the port of Colombo.

ARTICLE 2.

Any French subject or French-protected person, native of French Indo-China, who is expelled from British India (including Burma), the Indian States under the suzerainty of His Majesty, Ceylon, the Straits Settlements, the Federated and non-Federated Malay States, or Hong Kong, shall be deported at the expense of the Government of the country from which he has been expelled to the ports of Saigon or Haiphong, whichever is the nearer.

ARTICLE 3.

Provided that the provisions of the preceding articles are complied with, the Contracting Parties undertake to refrain from claiming from each other the repayment of any expenditure of whatever nature which may be incurred by these deportations.

ARTICLE 4.

The present agreement shall come into force immediately. It shall remain in force until the 31st December of the year following that in which either of the two Contracting Parties may denounce it.

In witness whereof the undersigned, duly authorized to that effect, have signed the present agreement and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done at Paris in the English and French languages, both being equally authentic, the twenty-ninth day of July, 1933.

The notification dated 26th October, 1933, appearing in the *Gazette* of 27th October, is hereby cancelled.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the prescribed form (Schedule A). Forms can be obtained at the Education Office, Colombo, and application for the same must be sent so as to reach that office by December 13, 1933. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born on or after January 1, 1911, but not later than January 31, 1917, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, as amended by Ordinance No. 23 of 1900; and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

3. Candidates other than those eligible under paragraph 5 must also furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed either—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or higher examinations of the University of London; or
- (b) The Senior School Certificate Examination (English); or
- (c) The Cambridge Junior or the English School Leaving Certificate Examination, and either (i.) the examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Government Technical Schools or of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the examination for the London Chamber of Commerce Junior Certificates in English, Arithmetic, and either Bookkeeping or Shorthand and Type-writing.

4. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of $\frac{2}{3}$ the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in paragraph 4 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Education Office by January 3, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Education Office before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the perfected entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

5. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments; but including those clerks of the Railway Clerical Service who are at present temporarily employed in General Clerical Service posts) from whatever funds they may be paid, who shall have completed three years' service, before the date of the examination and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee, and although they may not have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination must be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

6. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments; but including those clerks of the Railway Clerical Service who are at present temporarily employed in General Clerical Service posts) if within the age prescribed in paragraph 2 above will be admitted without fee, even though they have not completed three years' service under Government, but they must have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3.

7. Candidates in Government Service who are not eligible under paragraphs 5 and 6 may enter for the examination under the conditions laid down in paragraphs 2 and 3.

8. Applications must reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on December 20, 1933. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

9. The Director of Education will return to the candidate his application, approved or disapproved as the case may be, after taking, if necessary, the orders of Government thereon. The approved applications shall constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

10. The examination will be held in Colombo only at places which will be notified to the candidates in due course. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education leave to present themselves for the examination.

11. The examination will be competitive. The number of places in Class II. assigned for general competition will be 17. Appointments in Class III. will be offered, as vacancies occur, to the first 20 of those who are not selected for appointment to Class II.

12. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

13. Appointments to Class II. will be on two years' probation in the first instance and (for new entrants to the Public Service) will be on the salary scale recommended by the Salaries and Cadres Commission, 1932, viz., Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108 to Rs. 2,448 per annum (less temporary levy). Rent allowance is payable. Appointments are pensionable.

14. Appointments to Class III. will be on two years' probation in the first instance and will be on the salary scale recommended by the Salaries and Cadres Commission, 1932, viz., Rs. 420 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,020 per annum (less temporary levy). Rent allowance is payable. Appointments are pensionable.

* If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can readily be made.

15. Persons appointed, who are new entrants to the Public Service, will be eligible for Leave and Holiday Warrants in terms of section 19 of Sessional Paper XVI. of 1932 and section 19 of Sessional Paper XII. of 1932, respectively.

16. Clerical Servants are required to pass a test in typewriting before they are eligible for their first increment.

17. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allowed for each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper will not be considered for the second part of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. **Candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be disqualified.**

18. Clerks admitted under paragraph 5, who fail to secure places in the general competition under conditions in paragraph 17, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for four appointments, if in the first part of this examination they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper.

19. The Government does not undertake to provide the successful candidates with posts immediately, but they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

VITAL STATISTICS.**Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 11, 1933.**

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 170 (2 Europeans, 13 Burghers, 87 Sinhalese, 23 Tamils, 30 Moors, 4 Malays, and 11 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 30.1, as against 29.8 in the preceding week, 30.8 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 129 (4 Burghers, 66 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 22 Moors, 5 Malays, and 3 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 22.8, as against 28.5 in the previous week, 26.0 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 129 total deaths, 25 were of infants under one year of age, as against 39 in the preceding week, 28 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Still Births.—The number of still births registered during the week was 14.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Twenty-three deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 13 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 4 in Kotahena North and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, Kotahena North, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Kollupitiya, as against 15 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 3 each in San Sebastian and Slave Island, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, and Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Kotahena North, as against 9 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Six deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Maradana North, Maradana East, and Slave Island, as against 8 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 7 in Maradana hospitals (including 6 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in St. Paul's, San Sebastian, and Kotahena North, as against 14 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo Town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. One death from *Enteric Fever* was registered in Kotahena North, as against 2 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Six deaths from *Debility* were registered, 4 from *Enteritis*, 3 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Puerperal Septicaemia*, 2 each from *Dysentery*, *Worms* and *Accidents*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Tetanus* and 52 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Seven cases each of *Chicken-pox* and *Measles*, 4 of *Enteric Fever*, 2 each of *Diphtheria* and *Mumps* and 1 of *Small-pox* were reported during the week, as against 4, 4, 5, nil, 1 and nil respectively in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 77.2°, against 79.2° in the preceding week and 78.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.893 in., against 29.874 in. in the preceding week and 29.881 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 3.16 in. against 3.39 in. in the preceding week and 3.77 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated October 5, 1933.

A. Owles.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 4, 1933, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read.

Resolved that the Minutes of the General Meeting of October 4, 1933, be confirmed.

2. To submit, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1932.

The Chairman moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1932, be submitted to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government. Mr. W. J. Price seconded.

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved, as an amendment, that the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the Chairman's Administration Report. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

Dr. E. A. Coorey moved that the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1932, be submitted to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government with the following resolutions :—

Resolution No. 1.—(1) That this Council calls on Government to fulfil its pledges with reference to the payment of arrears of assessment rates and a reassessing of the rates on Government property. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman read recent correspondence with the Commissioner of Local Government on the subject.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando and Mr. T. W. Hockly supported the motion.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

(2) That this Council urges on the Government the urgent necessity for the immediate continuance of the widening of the Galle road and urges that the full section up to Dickman's road be taken in hand as the first step. Mr. T. W. Hockly seconded.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik suggested that the widening be extended up to the first bridge.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha suggested that the widening be extended up to the Municipal limits.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando spoke to the motion.

Dr. E. A. Coorey agreed to amend the motion in accordance with the suggestion of Mr. A. R. A. Razik.

The motion, as amended, was put to the meeting and carried.

Amended Motion, i.e., Resolution No. 3.—That this Council urges on the Government the urgent necessity for the immediate continuance of the widening of Galle road and urges that it be taken in hand at least up to the first bridge, i.e., the bridge over the Kirillapone canal, as the first step.

Referring to paragraph 2 on page 168 of the Chairman's Administration Report for 1932, Appendix F, Report of the Municipal Engineer, under the heading "Housing Ordinance and By-laws", Dr. E. A. Coorey moved :—This Council is of opinion that in the exercise of the powers vested in the Chairman of this Council, he should consult the Council or the appropriate Committee.

The Chairman ruled the motion out of order.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando drew the attention of the Council to the last paragraph of Appendix F, Report of the Municipal Engineer (page 170), and stated that it should not find a place in the Report.

The Chairman explained that the Municipal Engineer was referring to test cases.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved that the last paragraph of the report of the Municipal Engineer be deleted. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and declared lost.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council resumed.

The Chairman formally moved in Council that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the Financial Year 1932, be submitted to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government, with the two resolutions adopted by the Council in Committee. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

3. With the permission of Council, Dr. S. Muttiah presented a petition from the pedal cyclists of Colombo, praying that the present tax of Rs. 3 be reduced to the uniform rate of Re. 1 per annum and thereby relief be granted to them and requested that it be considered in connection with the 1934 Budget.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council should resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the Report of the Special Committee regarding the supply of Gas and the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The Report of the Special Committee regarding the Supply of Gas, dated July 23, 1932, and the dissents attached thereto together with the extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of October 12 and November 18, 1932, and of August 16, 1933, were laid before the Council in Committee.

At the suggestion of the Chairman, the following extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) were considered first :—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding the Report of the Special Committee on Supply of Gas and the Dissents attached thereto of October 12, 1932, were considered.

The Committees considered the Report paragraph by paragraph.

Paragraph 8.—Recommended that the recommendation contained in this paragraph that the maximum price of gas to the consumer should be fixed in relation to the cost of coal by contract with the Council, and that verification of the price of coal be made each quarter by comparing the quarterly statements supplied to the Municipality with the Gas Company's books, be adopted, and that the quarterly statements be circulated to the Council.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik moved that the price for gas should be fixed at the flat rate of Rs. 2 per 1,000 cubic feet for all purposes. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Mr. M. L. M. Reyal moved, as an amendment, that the above recommendation of the Committees be adopted. Mr. N. R. Blande seconded.

Mr. T. W. Hockly supported the amendment.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando opposed the amendment.

The Chairman gave the rates charged by the Gas Company for gas.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke to the motion.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared carried.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik called for a division and the Council divided as follows:—*Ayes*: (1) The Chairman, (2) Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, (3) Dr. E. V. Ratnam, (4) Mr. N. R. Blande, (5) Mr. M. L. M. Reyal, (6) Dr. S. Muttiyah, (7) Mr. T. C. Dyball, (8) Mr. F. Dadabhoy, (9) Mr. F. J. Soertsz, (10) Dr. S. T. Gunasekera, (11) Mr. G. K. Thornhill, (12) Mr. T. W. Hockly, (13) Mr. W. J. Price, (14) Mr. T. A. Owles. *Noes*: (1) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, (2) Dr. E. A. Coorey, (3) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, (4) Mr. A. R. A. Razik.

The amendment was put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

Paragraph 12.—Recommended that frequent tests of quality of the gas manufactured be carried out as at present, and that at least one of these tests in each month should be carried out by an Engineer.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik moved that the recommendation be adopted subject to (1) the deletion of the words "as at present" and (2) the substitution of the words "by a qualified Gas Engineer" for the words "by an engineer". Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Chairman stated that tests of the quality of gas manufactured were being carried out regularly for some months past, and the Municipal Engineer's Report thereon in respect of September, 1933, which was among the documents laid on the table, was shown.

Mr. N. R. Blande moved, as an amendment, that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. M. L. M. Reyal seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

Paragraph 13.—Recommended that the next contract should specify the minimum pressures to be maintained (a) at the works, as recorded by the Company's automatic recorder, and (b) in the districts, and that tests be made in the districts from time to time to ensure that the prescribed pressure is maintained.

Paragraphs 16 and 17.—Recommended that the Municipal Engineer should be asked to submit proposals for carrying out the provisions of the Gas Meter Ordinance of 1871, relating to the stamping of meters.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding the Report of the Special Committee on Supply of Gas and the Dissents attached thereto of November 18, 1932, were considered.

(1) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Engineer, dated November 14, 1932, forwarding a report of the Mechanical Engineer regarding the proposals to carry out the provisions of the Gas Meter Ordinance of 1871.—Recommended:—(1) That Council should provide its own laboratory and staff, as recommended by the Municipal Engineer, and test and stamp all meters as laid down in the Ordinance. (2) That the original testing and stamping fee for each meter be paid by the Gas Company. (3) That meters be tested at the request of the ratepayers and fees recovered as follows:—(a) If a meter is found to register correctly, the fee to be paid by the applicant. (b) If a meter is found to register incorrectly the fee to be recovered from the Gas Company. (4) That every meter be re-tested and stamped once in every 5 years, the fee to be paid by the Gas Company. (5) That the Ordinance be amended to give effect to these recommendations, and also in regard to the definition of a cubic foot, and that the fees for testing be fixed so as to cover the actual cost.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Meeting of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) regarding the Report of the Special Committee on Supply of Gas and the Dissents attached thereto of August 16, 1933, were considered.

(2) The draft of the new Gas Contract submitted by the Municipal Engineer, in pursuance of the resolution of these Committees having been circulated was considered clause by clause.

Period of Contract.—Recommended that the new contract be entered into for a period of 5 years. Dr. E. V. Ratnam stated that he reserved the right to move that the period of contract be reduced to 3 years, if it was found possible to do so.

Carburetted water gas.—The Committees further considered the resolution of November 18, 1932, "that in the next Contract to be entered into with the Gas Company, the clause relating to carburetted water gas be deleted".

As it was pointed out that the admixture in proper proportions, i.e., 33½ per cent. of carburetted water gas was not appreciably more injurious to health than ordinary coal gas, it was recommended, with a view to reducing the price of gas to the consumer, that this clause be allowed to stand.

Clause 7: Painting of columns, &c.—Recommended that the Company should continue to do this as in the existing Contract.

Clause 14.—Recommended that the following be substituted for clause 14 in the draft contract:—

That the gas supplied by the Company shall yield a heat equivalent of not less than Four Hundred British Thermal Units (gross) per cubic foot of gas as tested in Dr. Boy's Calorimeter, and such gas shall, with respect to its purity, be so far free from sulphuretted hydrogen that it shall not discolour bibulous paper moistened with lead acetate solution exposed to a current of gas issued for one minute under pressure of 5/10ths of an inch of water.

The ammonia content should not exceed 4 grains per one hundred cubic feet of gas.—Recommended that the Draft Contract, as amended, together with the recommendations relating thereto be submitted to Council.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik moved that the new contract be entered into for 3 years and that the maximum number of street lamps be reduced from 2,000 to 1,500. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. N. R. Blande moved, as an amendment, that the recommendations of the Four Standing Committees be adopted. Mr. F. Dadabhoy seconded.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

(3) The consideration of the Report of the Special Committee and the dissents attached thereto was continued. Recommended that the Report of the Special Committee and the dissents attached thereto be re-submitted to Council together with the recommendations of these Committees previously recorded.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman formally moved that the Report of the Special Committee regarding the supply of gas, dated July 23, 1932, subject to the foregoing resolutions be adopted. Mr. N. R. Blande seconded.

Mr. A. R. A. Razik spoke to the motion.

The Chairman, on behalf of the Council, expressed appreciation of the trouble which Mr. A. R. A. Razik had taken in connection with the question of the gas supply of the City.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of September 18, 1933, were considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(5) With reference to the resolution of the Council of September 6, 1933, regarding the creation of the new post of Supervisor, Anti-pest and Cleansing, to consider a memorandum of the Acting Secretary, Municipal Council, dated September 9, 1933. Registered No. 601.—Recommended that the new post be designated "Cleansing Supervisor" and that the following qualifications, &c., for the post be adopted.

Qualifications.—Either (a) Junior Local (Oxford or Cambridge), E. S. L. C. or a higher examination, or (b) proof of practical experience in cleansing and anti-pest work in the Public Health Department. The present Public Health Overseers in the Public Health Department are eligible for promotion to the new post, such appointment, if made, to be treated as a transfer on promotion.

The new post be grouped as 7 (a) of the Salaries Scheme.

(7) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health regarding the recent outbreak of smallpox at Siripina lane, recommending (i.) payment of Rs. 15 to W. Wahid for giving information regarding a man with smallpox walking about and (ii.) refund of Rs. 10 to Sanitary Inspector W. Wickramasinghe, who paid this amount of his own pocket to trace a contact. (b) A memorandum thereon of the Acting Municipal Treasurer, dated September 8, 1933. Registered No. 06,611.—Recommended that the payment of Rs. 15 to W. Wahid be approved.
