BY-LAW.

Preaching or holding Meetings on Thoroughfares prohibited.

No person shall preach or address any assembly or crowd or hold any meeting on any thoroughfare within the limits of the Hatton-Dikoya Urban District Council area,

except in pursuance of a permit from the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within the times and limits specified in such permit. Any person who shall commit a breach of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding twenty rupees.

P. P. 12) spreads; thence northwards along the western boundary of the above-mentioned agara up to the southern boundary of lot 536 in T. S. P. P. 12; thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of the said lot 536 up to the south-eastern corner of lot 540

in T. S. P. P. 12 (railway reservation); thence south-westwards crossing the railway line to Chilaw along the southern boundary of the said lot 540 in T. S. P. P. 12 (railway reservation) up to the western boundary of the above-mentioned lot; thence south-westwards along the southern boundary of lot 517 in T. S. P. P. 12 as far as the south-western corner of the above-mentioned lot; thence south-westwards and southwards along the northern and western boundaries of the Ihalatinnepitiyawewa up to the northern boundary of the Mellawa-agara road; thence south-westwards along the western boundary of the said Mellawa-agara road as far as the landmark on the south-eastern corner of lot 408 in T. S. P. P. 12; thence south-westwards across the said Mellawa-agara road up to the western bank of the Pahalatinnepitiyawewa; thence south-westwards along the western bank of the said Pahalatinnepitiyawewa as far as the south-eastern corner of lot 1 in T. S. P. P. 12.

South.—From the above-mentioned point westwards along the southern boundary of lot 1 in T. S. P. P. 12 up to the eastern boundary of the Colombo road; thence north-westwards along the eastern boundary of the said Colombo road up to the south-eastern corner of lot 49 (Colombo road) in T. S. P. P. 12; thence south-westwards across the said Colombo road along the southern boundary of the said lot 49 in T. S. P. P. 12 to the western boundary of it; thence westwards and north-westwards along the southern and western boundaries of lot 2 in T. S. P. P. 12 and northwards along the western boundaries of lots 3 and 4 in T. S. P. P. 12 as far as the south-eastern corner of lot 7 in T. S. P. P. 12; thence north-westwards and south-westwards along the southern boundary of lot 7, eastern and southern boundaries of lot 8, and eastern boundary of lot 10 in T. S. P. BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

By-laws regarding the Tax on Vehicles and Animals.

1. In these by-laws—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Weligama Urban District Council.

“Ordinance” means the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920.

2. The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the urban area or outside and supposed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles, shall be made in a schedule which shall be supplied by the Council and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such schedule is addressed.

3. If any person after having filled up and returned such schedule, shall acquire, keep, or use any vehicle or animal not mentioned in such schedule, he shall, within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify the Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition and further furnish true and correct information in respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or used. Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish such information as aforesaid, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

4. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance, any person who has furnished the schedule referred to in by-law 2 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of vehicles or animals entered in such schedule, to pay the tax for the year for which such schedule is furnished and any person who has sent the written notice required by by-law 3, shall be liable to pay the tax on vehicles or animals referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicles or animals were acquired by him or otherwise came into his possession.

5. Any person who having furnished the schedule required by by-law 2 or the written notice required by by-law 3, claims to be exempt from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such schedule or notice shall forthwith give notice in writing to the Chairman of his claim for such exemption, specifying the grounds on which such claim is made.

6. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the Twenty-eighth day of February in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used for the purpose of drawing vehicles within the limits of the Weligama Urban District Council.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid, a metal plate as specified in the schedule hereto with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the registers of vehicles. Such plate shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in respect of which the plate was issued.

Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the limits of the Weligama Urban District Council, the owner or person in charge of any such vehicle in respect of which the prescribed plate should have been so affixed shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding fifteen rupees.

If at any time the cost of either the ordinary diet of Scale B or the full diet of Scale A exceeds Rs. 2 and 40 cents per diet respectively, the Inspector-General of Prisons shall report the matter to Government.

(c) All other classes of civil prisoners who do not provide their own food will receive the full diet as laid down in Dietary Scale A. Provided that the Superintendent may, in the interests of health, on the recommendation of the Medical Officer, allow any such prisoner to receive the ordinary diet as laid down in Dietary Scale B.

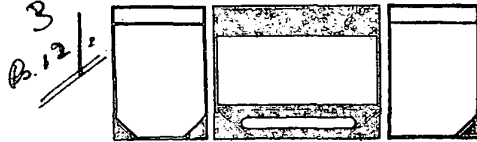

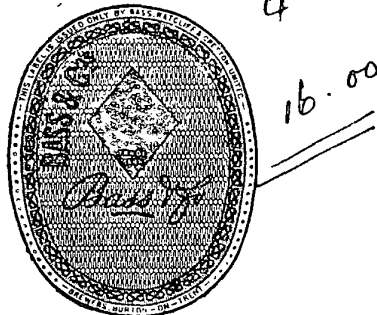

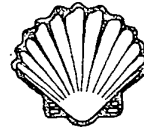

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended November 25, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 171 (2 Europeans, 8 Burghers, 102 Sinhalese, 28 Tamils, 22 Moors, 4 Malays, and 5 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 30·3, as against 24·6 in the preceding week, 34·1 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30·3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 164 (1 European, 10 Burghers, 92 Sinhalese, 31 Tamils, 21 Moors, 3 Malays, and 6 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 29·0, as against 28·2 in the previous week, 31·6 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24·5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 164 total deaths, 33 were of infants under one year of age, as against 23 in the preceding week, 36 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Sixteen deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 9 in Maradana hospitals (including 4 deaths of non-residents), 2 in Kotahena South and 1 each in San Sebastian, New Bazaar, Maradana South, Slave Island, and Wellawatta South, as against 17 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Ten deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Maradana South and 1 each in San Sebastian and Kotahena South, as against 12 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) Four deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 1 death of a non-resident) and 1 in Kollupitiya, as against 6 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Ten deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in Kotahena South, Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and Slave Island, and 1 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana East, and Kollupitiya, as against 12 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) One death from *Phthisis* of a resident of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Six deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 5 in Maradana hospitals (including 3 deaths of non-residents) and 1 in Kotahena South, as against nil in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Eleven deaths from *Debility* were registered, 10 from *Worms*, 7 from *Enteritis*, 5 each from *Infantile Convulsions* and *Dysentery*, 4 each from *Puerperal Septicæmia* and *Accidents*, 2 each from *Diarrhoea* and *Homicide*, 1 from *Tetanus*, and 67 from *Other Causes*.

5. **Reported Cases.**—Twenty-three cases of *Measles*, 4 of *Chickenpox*, and 1 of *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 7, 9, and nil, respectively, in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 79·6°, against 77·6° in the preceding week and 78·3° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29·899 in., against 29·878 in. in the preceding week and 29·855 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0·21 in., against 1·62 in. in the preceding week and 6·35 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, October 14, 1933, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated October 10, 1933.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the Special Meeting held on Saturday, October 7, 1933, were amended by the addition of the words "Mr. Mohammedo supported the motion" after the words "Mr. D. I. Durham seconded."

The minutes of this meeting, as amended, and of the General Meeting of September 16, 1933, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented by Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna, E. A. Paulas, and Thomas Amarasuriya respectively, and one letter by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice Mr. E. A. Paulas moved :—(a) That a Committee be appointed to enquire and report to this Council whether the staff of this Council could be reduced. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka seconded.

Mr. J. E. Perera said he did not think the Council was overstaffed or that they were spending too much money, but on the ground that the appointment of such a Committee would be a source of education to members, he supported the motion.

Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, in opposing the motion, stated that the time was not opportune to appoint such a Committee. If they effected retrenchment at this stage it would only increase the number of unemployed.

The Chairman said he was absolutely neutral in the matter and had no special views to put forward.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 8 votes to 4, the Chairman not voting.

On the suggestion of the mover the following members were appointed to serve on the Committee :—The Chairman and Messrs. E. A. Paulas, J. E. Perera, S. H. Dahanayaka, A. M. Saheed, E. M. Karunaratna, and Thomas Amarasuriya with Mr. E. A. Paulas as convener. It was also agreed that three members should form a quorum.

(b) That the monthly meetings of this Council be held on week days other than on Saturdays.

Mr. A. C. Mohammedo rose to a point of order, he said the Council has no right to fix the day for its monthly meetings as section 82 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance provided that "the general meetings shall be held at the Municipal Office during the first week of every month, or as soon after as seems expedient to the Chairman." The motion was therefore *ultra vires* as this was a matter left entirely to the Chairman to decide. He asked for a ruling on the matter.

The Chairman said that even if the motion was passed it would not interfere with the powers given him by section 82 of the Ordinance. Personally he did not see that there was anything against the members of the Council expressing a wish in the matter in order to enable him to decide what action should be taken under that section. He ruled the objection out of order.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail then rose to a point of order. He said the motion was not properly worded and as directly contrary to section 82 under which the mover was not empowered to bring forward a resolution excluding Saturdays.

For the same reasons the Chairman ruled this point also out of order, but suggested that the motion be amended to read as follows :—"That the Chairman be requested to fix the monthly meetings of this Council for week days other than Saturdays." The mover agreed to the amendment.

Speaking to the motion the mover said he had brought it up at the request of the ratepayers. If meetings of the Council were held on week days other than Saturdays ratepayers who came to the Fort on business could attend the meetings without any additional expense. But as it was if any ratepayer wished to attend a meeting he had to come all the way specially for this purpose. Prior to 1914 meetings of the Council were held on Wednesdays. Then as a result of a resolution passed in Council the day was changed to Saturdays. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka seconded, and Mr. E. M. Karunaratna supported the motion.

Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail and A. C. Mohammedo opposed the motion.

The Chairman said he did not wish to express an opinion on the matter.

The motion was then put to the meeting, and the voting being equal the Chairman gave his vote in favour of the motion on the understanding that he would then be more at liberty to fix a particular day for any meeting after consulting the members.

4. At this stage the Chairman read out a letter received from the Secretary to the Officer Administrating the Government acknowledging receipt of the Chairman's letter of October 9, forwarding the resolution passed by Council regarding the death of the late Governor, Sir Graeme Thomson.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 7, 1933.

(2) To consider 7 applications for water service :—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(3) To consider an application for water service to house No. 24A at Milidduwa outside the water area :—Recommended that consideration be deferred till the next meeting of the works Committee and that in the meantime information be obtained as regards the possibility of extending the water area.

(4) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 1,175 for constructing a new road through Kachchiwatta in Galupiadde, Ward No. 3.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that tenders be invited for the work except for cutting and uprooting trees and clearing trace which should be done departmentally. (b) Rs. 275 for replacing the decayed boarding in the Fish Market sunshade by corrugated asbestos sheeting.—Recommended.

(5) To consider tenders for the following services for the year 1934 :—

(a) *Supplying of Metal.*—Recommended that the tenders of M. H. James at Rs. 8 and Rs. 14 per cube of 2" and 3" metal respectively be accepted.

(b) *Supplying of sea sand.*—Recommended that the tender of R. Perera at Rs. 2.40 per cube be accepted.

(c) *Coir dust.*—Recommended that the tender of T. H. Handy of Rs. 11 for 100 bags, each containing 2½ bushels be accepted provided he confirms this rate and also signs the tender form.

(d) *White washing Municipal buildings four times in the year.*—Recommended that the tender of B. M. A. Azeez of Rs. 73 per quarter be accepted.

(e) *Supplying bulls and drivers for scavenging carts.*—Recommended that tenders be invited again for this service for a period of three years commencing January 1, 1934.

(f) *Supply of ekels, baskets, coir yarn, coconut oil, and coconuts.*—Recommended that the tender of W. V. Ginasena be accepted at the following rates :—Ekels, Rs. 250 per 100 bundles of 50 each ; baskets, Rs. 3.84 per dozen ; coir yarn, 24 cents per dozen skeins ; coconut oil, 32 cents per bottle ; and coconuts, Rs. 6.50 per 100.

(6) *Repairs to cart shed roof.*—Recommended that the Superintendent of Works be authorized to obtain the extra quantity of coconut rafters and other materials required to complete one half of the roof and that this portion be finished this year, the expenditure to be met from the vote of Rs. 2,000 sanctioned by Council on May 13, 1933. With regard to the other half it was recommended that asbestos sheeting be used and the the Superintendent of Works be requested to furnish an estimate accordingly.

(7) *Fencing of the Esplanade.* :—Recommended that a vote of Rs. 500 be sanctioned for the erection of a semi-permanent fence round the esplanade.

With regard to item (6) Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that, in view of the urgency of the work, (a) a further sum of Rs. 4,000 be voted in order that the whole work may be completed this year ; (b) the second roof be covered with asbestos sheeting on jak rafters ; and (c) that the Superintendent of Works be authorized to employ a Carpenter Baas to be in charge of the work at Rs. 1.50 per diem. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of October 7, 1933.

(2) To consider the Chairman's motion at the General Meeting of Council held on September 16, 1933, viz. :—

(a) To make and assess for the calendar year 1934, a rate of 17½ per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Police limits ; and a rate of 7 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police limits but within the Municipal limits of Galle as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, payable by four instalments on or before the following dates :—

First instalment on or before March 31, 1934 ; Second instalment on or before June 30, 1934 ; Third instalment on or before September 30, 1934 ; Fourth instalment on or before December 31, 1934.

(b) To adopt the valuation of properties for the current year subject to such alterations as the Chairman may from time to time find necessary to make for the purpose of rating for the calendar year 1934 :—Recommended that the present rates of 17½ per cent. within Police limits and 7 per cent. outside Police limits but within Municipal limits be not reduced, and that the Chairman's motion of September 16, 1933, be adopted.

(3) List of demolished buildings in Wards 1, 2, 6, and 7 :—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(4) Applications from the stall-holders of the Fruit Market requesting a reduction of the rents now charged :—Recommended that the rents of all the stalls in the Fruit Market be reduced by 20 per cent. with effect from January 1, 1934.

(5) Lease of fruit trees at (a) the Victoria Park and (b) the Bataduwa Night Soil Depôt premises for 1934 :—With regard to (a) recommended that the present lessee (who is the Park-keeper) be given the lease for 1934 at Rs. 60. With regard to (b) recommended that, as there has been an offer of Rs. 70 for the lease of these trees for 1934, the present lessee (who is the overseer of the Depôt) be given the option of renewing his lease for 1934 at this figure.

(6) Application from Inspector Wijesekara for a loan of Rs. 100 to purchase a new bicycle :—Recommended that the loan be given repayable by monthly instalments of Rs. 10 and that 2½ per cent. interest be charged on the amount outstanding.

(7) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 322.45 being arrears of electric dues outstanding for 1932 :—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 322.45 be written off as irrecoverable.

(8) To consider the question of granting 3 weeks leave to B. G. Appuwa, Conservancy labourer, of the Health Department, who has applied for permission to retire on the ground of ill health, in order that he may undergo operative treatment at the Hospital, as recommended by the Medical Board appointed to examine and report on his state of health :—Recommended that 3 weeks full pay leave be granted.

(9) To consider a letter from the Local Agent of the Performing Right Society, Ltd., calling upon the Council to obtain a licence for the right to have music from the Society's repertoire performed in public places :—Recommended that the licence be obtained.

(10) To recommend a further supplemental vote of Rs. 500 for printing and stationery :—Recommended.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

7. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council :—Resolved that the next General Meeting be held on Saturday, November 18, 1933, at 9.30 A.M.
