THE CEYLON RAILWAY BENEFIT ASSOCIATION ORDINANCE, 1908.

RULE made by The Ceylon Railway Benefit Association under section 14 of the Ceylon Railway Benefit Association Ordinance, 1908, and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by the said section and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULE.

The rules dated October 26, 1908, and published in *Government Gazette* No. 6,320 of July 23, 1909, as amended by Notification, No. 7,906 of February 12, 1932, shall be further amended as follows :—

(1) by the deletion of rule 7 and the substitution of the following therefor :—

7. Every member shall contribute monthly ^{Monthly} contribution to the funds of the corporation such percentage of his monthly salary, not being less than 1 per cent. or more than 10 per cent., as may be determined by him at the date of his admission to membership and at the beginning of each financial year :

Provided that the sum so contributed by any member shall not in any case be less than one rupee a month.

(2) by the deletion of paragraph (6) of rule 17 and the substitution of the following therefor :—

(6) Every such loan shall be repaid by regular monthly instalments, not being less than one-fortieth of the amount of the loan; but nothing herein contained shall be deemed to prohibit the earlier repayment of any such loan.

(3) by the deletion of paragraph (4) of rule 18 and the substitution of the following therefor :—

(4) Such advance may be granted irrespective of any loans granted under rule 17, but shall not exceed one month's salary of the member to whom it is granted.

(4) by the deletion of paragraphs (2) and (8) of rule 21 and the substitution of the following therefor :—

(2) The applicant shall forward with his application the title deeds of the property offered as security, the fee for legal opinion as to the validity of his title, the appraisers' fee calculated in the first instance at the rate of $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the amount applied for, and the travelling expenses for one of the appraisers.

(8) The appraisers' fee shall be $\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. of the actual amount of the loan, the minimum being Rs. 10, and shall be divided between the member of the Committee and the resident member in the proportion of three to one. In addition to the above fee, the member of the Committee shall also be paid his travelling expenses calculated at Rs. 2.50 for every 25 miles or part thereof travelled, the minimum being Rs. 5. Any excess paid as appraisers' fee by the borrower in the first instance shall be refunded to him.

THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908.

RULE made by the Officer Administering the Government by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by section 7 of "The Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, 1908," and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, and declared to be in force from December 18, 1933.

RULE.

The rules published by Notification dated August 19, 1909, in the *Supplement to the Ceylon Government Gazette* No. 6,325 of August 27, 1909, are hereby amended by the insertion of the following new rule between rules 116 and 117:—

116A. (1) Greetings and messages of congratulation or of condolence may be sent by telegram at reduced rates on such occasions as the following:—

- (a) Christmas and New Year
- (b) Wesak
- (c) Hindu New Year
- (d) Id
- (e) Birthdays
- (f) Birth of a child
- (g) Weddings
- (h) Funerals and deaths.

(2) Such telegrams—

(a) may be written out on the usual form for Inland telegrams, but shall bear the words "Cheap Rate Telegram" written at the top of the form;

(b) may be sent from any Postal Telegraph Office, but in no case shall they be sent from or to any Railway Telegraph Office;

(c) may be accepted by telephone for onward transmission.

(3) No such telegram shall be entitled to the following special services, namely:—

Urgent, Reply Paid, Multiple, Collation, Acknowledgment of Receipt or Delivery to Addressee Personally.

(4) No such telegram shall in any case be accepted or transmitted as a State Telegram.

(5) In ascertaining the number of words in any such telegram,—

(a) four words will be allowed for the addressee's name and address;

(b) one word will be allowed for the sender's name; and

(c) the message itself will be counted as one word, if it consists either of a stock phrase selected from the list published from time to time in Section IX. of the Ceylon Post Office Guide or of the number, written in words, corresponding to that phrase in the aforesaid list.

(6) The charges payable shall be 30 cents for each such telegram consisting of not more than six words, and 5 cents for each additional word in the name and address of the addressee or of the sender. In the message itself no additional words shall in any case be allowed.

(7) No telegraph money order shall be transmitted as part of any such telegram.

VITAL STATISTICS.

Registrar-General's Report on Vital Statistics of the City of Colombo for the Week ended December 9, 1933.

Births.—The total births registered in the city of Colombo in the week were 208 (1 European, 12 Burghers, 137 Sinhalese, 29 Tamils, 21 Moors, 4 Malays, and 4 Others). The birth rate per 1,000 per annum (calculated on the estimated population on July 1, 1933, viz., 294,400) was 36.8, as against 29.6 in the preceding week, 34.4 in the corresponding week of last year, and 30.3 the weekly average for last year.

Deaths.—The total deaths registered were 160 (1 European, 5 Burghers, 102 Sinhalese, 25 Tamils, 19 Moors, 3 Malays, and 5 Others). The death rate per 1,000 per annum was 28.3, as against 29.0 in the previous week, 28.7 in the corresponding week of last year, and 24.5 the weekly average for last year.

Infantile Deaths.—Of the 160 total deaths, 40 were of infants under one year of age, as against 40 in the preceding week, 35 in the corresponding week of the previous year, and 29 the average for last year.

Stillbirths.—The number of stillbirths registered during the week was 9.

Principal Causes of Death.—1. (a) Thirty-four deaths from *Pneumonia* were registered, 19 in Maradana hospitals (including 8 deaths of non-residents), 5 in Kotahena South, 3 each in Maradana North and Wellawatta North, 2 in Kotahena North, and 1 each in New Bazaar and Maradana South, as against 27 in the previous week and 15 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Thirteen deaths from *Influenza* were registered, 2 each in St. Paul's, New Bazaar, Maradana North, and Slave Island, and 1 each in San Sebastian, Kotahena South, Maradana East, Kollupitiya, and Wellawatta North, as against 7 in the previous week and 8 the weekly average for last year.

(c) No deaths from *Bronchitis* were registered during the week, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

2. (a) Five deaths from *Phthisis* were registered, 2 each in New Bazaar and Maradana hospitals (of non-residents), and 1 in Wellawatta North, as against 10 in the previous week and 11 the weekly average for last year.

(b) Two deaths from *Phthisis* of residents of Colombo town occurred at the Anti-Tuberculosis Hospital, Ragama, during the week.

3. Five deaths from *Enteric Fever* were registered, 3 in Maradana hospitals (including 2 deaths of non-residents) and 1 each in Maradana North and Maradana South, as against 3 in the previous week and 3 the weekly average for last year.

4. Twelve deaths from *Enteritis* were registered, 10 from *Debility*, 7 from *Diarrhoea*, 5 from *Worms*, 1 each from *Infantile Convulsions*, *Tetanus*, *Puerperal Septicaemia* and *Accident*, and 65 from *Other Causes*.

5. *Reported Cases.*—Seven cases of *Chickenpox*, 6 of *Measles*, 2 of *Mumps*, and 1 of *Whooping Cough* were reported during the week, as against 5, 15, nil, and nil, respectively, in the preceding week.

State of the Weather.—The mean temperature of air was 78.9°, against 78.4° in the preceding week and 79.2° in the corresponding week of the previous year. The mean atmospheric pressure was 29.869 in., against 29.863 in. in the preceding week and 29.899 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year. The total rainfall in the week was 0.39 in., against 0.66 in. in the preceding week and 1.90 in. in the corresponding week of the previous year.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, November 18, 1933, at 9.30 a.m., pursuant to notice dated November 10, 1933.

Present :—Mr. J. D. Brown, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on Saturday, October 14, 1933, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka and one by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. The Chairman moved :—That the by-laws relating to bakeries published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,968 of February 17, 1933, be amended by the addition of the following by-laws numbered 20 (4) and 21A, respectively :—

"20 (4) No person shall, within the limits of the Council, sell, offer, hawk, or expose for sale bread from any bakery situated outside the limits of the Council unless he has in his possession a card of registration issued by the Chairman as aforesaid, and such card shall not be issued unless the Chairman is satisfied from a report of the Medical Officer of Health of the District in which the bakery is situated, that the said bakery conforms to the requirement of these by-laws."

"21A. No licensee of a bakery shall in any place within the limits of this Council, allow his bread vendors to sell or expose for sale bread from a receptacle which is not suitably closed."

Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman moved—That a sum of Rs. 3,200 be expended on improvements to the Kaluwella drainage after calling for tenders. Mr. A. J. R. Scharenguivel seconded.—Carried.

5. The Chairman moved :—That in terms of by-law 9 of Chapter VI, a special licence be issued to hawk meat for sale within Municipal limits on payment of a fee of 50 cents per mensem. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

6. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. J. E. Perera :—That the Galle Municipal Council requests Government to re-consider its proposal to reduce by 10 per cent. the allowance paid in lieu of Poll Tax, and to continue to pay the full amount of Rs. 14,293 which was fixed by Government when the Poll Tax was abolished, in view of the fact that a portion of the Baddegama-Galle Trunk road is maintained by this Council."

With the leave of the Council the mover deleted the words "in view of the fact that a portion of the Baddegama-Galle Trunk road is maintained by this Council." Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded.—Carried.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved :—(1) That the authorities concerned be requested to take over to the Government the following Municipal roads :—(a) Dangedera road from the bus stand to the limit of the Baddegama P. W. D. road at Hirimbura ; (b) Morris road from Sarenthukade Junction to the junction of the Labuduwa Experimental Station ; (c) Hirimbura road from the junction at the Labuduwa Experimental Station to the limit of the Baddegama P. W. D. road at Hirimbura. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.—Carried

(2) That the Kamba Bana (Rope Walk) in China Garden be acquired for a Municipal road. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.

The Chairman said he was in sympathy with the motion, but suggested that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees for consideration. This was agreed to.

(3) That the existing road from the Jail road to the Kaluwella temple be widened and extended up to the Keppu-ela. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded.

On the suggestion of the Chairman this matter was referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved :—That a bathing place for ladies be constructed at the south-eastern portion of the seashore by the ramparts facing Hospital street, Fort. Mr. R. L. Ephraums seconded.

The Chairman suggested that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration. This was agreed to.

9. To submit the recommendations of the Special Committee appointed on July 15, 1933, to study the Reform proposals for the Colombo Municipal Council with a view to making recommendations to the Council :—Mr. A. C. Mohammedo moved that the recommendations of the Special Committee be adopted. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka raised the objection that the Special Committee was not a properly constituted one in that the quorum had not been fixed at the General Meeting at which the Special Committee was appointed, as provided for in the by-laws. For this reason he stated the matter should not have come up for discussion at all. He opposed the motion and asked that the recommendations of the Special Committee be rejected.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail supported the motion.

The mover replied.

The objection raised by Mr. Dahanayaka was over-ruled by the Chairman.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried, the voting being as follows :—For : The Chairman, Messrs. J. E. Perera, D. I. Durham, A. J. R. Scharenguivel, A. M. Saheed, Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka, Messrs. F. Magdon Ismail, A. C. Mohammedo, Thomas Amarasuriya, E. M. Karunaratna, and R. L. Ephraums. Against : Messrs. S. H. Dahanayaka, and E. A. Paulas.

10. To submit the Budget for 1934 as approved by the Four Standing Committees on Law, Sanitation, Finance, and Works on October 28, 1933.—Submitted.

11. To nominate two members to the Education District Committee for the Municipal area for three years commencing January 1, 1934 :—Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved that Messrs. A. M. Saheed and P. R. Gunasekara be re-nominated to serve on the Galle Municipal Education District Committee for a further term of three years commencing January 1, 1934. Mr. D. I. Durham seconded.—Carried.

12. To consider the question of retaining the services of the Council's Lawyer :—Resolved that the services of the Council's Lawyer be retained.

13. To consider an application from Mr. E. H. Jansen, Superintendent of the Electricity Department, for a loan of three months salary for the purchase of a motor car :—Resolved that a loan of three months' salary be given, repayable in not more than 18 monthly instalments and that interest at 2½ per cent. per annum be charged on the amount outstanding.

14. To consider tenders for the supply of bulls and drivers for scavenging carts for three years from January 1, 1934 :—Resolved that the tender of L. O. E. de Silva at Rs. 50 per mensem for a pair of bulls and a driver and Rs. 37.50 per mensem for a single bull and driver be accepted for three years from January 1, 1934.

15. Lease of fruit trees at (a) Victoria park and (b) Bataduwa Night Soil Depôt for 1934 :—With regard to (a) it was resolved that the present lessee be given the lease of the trees for 1934 at Rs. 45 ; with regard to (b) it was resolved to accept the offer of Rs. 70 made by the present lessee.

16. To sanction the expenditure of a further sum of Rs. 600 in connection with the Circular road outlet drain for the purpose of constructing masonry walls on both sides of the channel and paving the space between the walls and the channel.—Sanctioned.

17. To consider the question of inaugurating a free service for minor repairs to water taps :—The Chairman moved that with effect from January 1, 1934, a free service be inaugurated for minor repairs to water taps, *i.e.*, the replacement of defective washers, the cost of leather to be met from the vote of Maintenance of Mains. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

18. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 750 for fuel, oil waste, &c., under the Head of Expenditure E1.—Sanctioned.

19. To sanction the following supplemental votes :—Rs. 100 under Head 15, Holiday Warrants ; Rs. 50 under Head 19, Sanitation-Contingencies ; and Rs. 200 under Head 77, Destruction of Stray Dogs.—Sanctioned.

20. To fix a date for the next General Meeting and for the Special Meeting to consider finally the Budget for 1934 :—Resolved that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, December 2, 1933, at 9.30 A.M., and the Special Meeting to consider finally the Budget for 1934 on the same date immediately after the General Meeting.

21. *The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of October 21, 1933, were laid before the Council :—*

(2) To consider the question of having fixed rates for the sale of meat and mutton :—Recommended that, with effect from January 1, 1934, the following scale of rates be adopted for the sale of beef and mutton in the Municipal Market and that such rates be posted up at each of the stalls in which the meat is exposed for sale :—Beef without bones, undercut, 25 cents per lb. ; beef with bones, excepted, 20 cents per lb. ; mutton without bones (imported goats), 65 cents per lb. ; mutton with bones (imported goats), 55 cents per lb. ; mutton without bones (local goats), 75 cents per lb. ; mutton with bones (local goats), 60 cents per lb.

(3) To consider the results of the sale of market stalls, betel sheds, and fruit trees for 1934 for which no offers had been received from the present lessees to renew the leases at the same rentals paid for 1933 :—Recommended, with regard to meat market, that stalls Nos. 1 to 8 be offered to M. L. M. Abdulla, the present lessee of stalls 1, 2, and 5 for Rs. 775, and that stalls 11 and 12 be offered to A. H. P. Mohideen, the present lessee of stalls 13 and 14 for Rs. 75.

With regard to the offal market, that stalls 1, 2, and 3 be offered to A. H. P. Mohideen, the present lessee of stall No. 3 for Rs. 50, and stalls 4, 5, and 6 to M. L. M. Abubacker, the present lessee of stall No. 6 also for Rs. 50.

With regard to the Kaluwella vegetable market that the market be resold as a whole or in two blocks.

With regard to the Kaluwella meat market that the present lessee be asked to make an offer for the two stalls.

With regard to the fish market that the sale of stalls 5, 7, and 12 be confirmed and that either or both of the vacant stalls 12 and 17 be offered to K. H. A. Hendrickappu for Rs. 13 each.

With regard to the green market that the sales be confirmed.

With regard to the betel shed in the Bazaar that the sale to K. B. Nuhu for Rs. 50 be confirmed.

With regard to the betel shed in the Fort, that the offer of the present lessee for Rs. 250 be accepted.

With regard to the fruit trees in the Fort, Wakwella road, Katugoda, and Elliott road, that the sales be confirmed.

Resolution.

With regard to item (3) it was resolved, with regard to the meat market, to accept the following offers for 1934 :—Rs. 842.50 by A. H. P. Mohideen for the lease of stalls 5, 6, 13, and 14 ; and Rs. 925 by M. L. M. Abubacker for the lease of stalls 1, 2, 3, 4, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12.

With regard to the offal market, as the offers made to the present lessees had not been accepted, that no further action be taken.

With regard to the Kaluwella vegetable market, as there were no bidders at the sale, that no further action be taken.

With regard to the Kaluwella meat market that the offer of Rs. 50 made by the present lessee be accepted ; and

With regard to the fish market, green market, lease of betel sheds and fruit trees, that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to item (2) was also adopted.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. The resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of it as an office or place of business during his occupation of the resthouse shall pay a special charge of 50 cents for each hour or part thereof for each such use of any part of the resthouse. Every person so using the resthouse shall desist from doing so upon being requested by the resthouse-keeper, whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the resthouse. Resthouse fees at the rates specified in the tariff appended hereto are payable by all persons using the resthouse and garage.

2. Every person other than infants, using the resthouse or garage is separately chargeable for occupation, provided that—

(a) The servant of a traveller who occupies the resthouse may be allowed to sleep within the resthouse without the payment of any occupation fees.

(b) A chauffeur, whose car or whose master's car is garaged in the resthouse premises, may be permitted to sleep in the car or in the garage without the payment of the said fees.

3. Each visitor must sign his or her name in the resthouse book on entering the resthouse, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments.

4. No person shall occupy any portion of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

5. Travellers shall note in the resthouse book only those resthouse charges which are payable to the Urban District Council.

6. The resthouse fees and charges shall be in accordance with the tariff appended hereto, and shall be paid in cash on demand. In default further supplies will be refused. The attention of visitors is invited to Ordinance No. 33 of 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules, in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

7. No room shall be reserved unless engaged at least one day in advance, but when so engaged shall be paid for whether occupied or not, provided that until the arrival of the person or persons engaging accommodation, the accommodation shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

8. The resthouse-keeper is authorized to take no notice of telegrams asking him to prepare meals, when the name and address of the sender are not given.

9. Beds, sofas, or couches in the resthouse shall not be used for the purpose of sleeping without sheets. A breach of this rule will involve a charge of Rs. 5.

10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by visitors is to be paid in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

11. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper is a paid servant of the Council and is expected to wear a white coat and to be neatly dressed when attending on visitors.

12. Any complaint which a traveller may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper, should be noted in the complaint book, which the resthouse-keeper is bound to produce when asked for, or should be communicated to the Chairman, Urban District Council, Gampola.

13. A breach of any of the above rules will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 50, unless a lesser penalty is provided by the particular rule, and such penalty shall be recoverable as a fine as provided by section 11 (1) (b) of Ordinance No. 21 of 1901.
