THE SMALL TOWNS SANITARY ORDINANCE, 1892.

REGULATION.

1. From and after April 1, 1935, in the Sanitary Board town of Dondra there shall be levied, in lieu of the conservancy rate specified in the Notification dated May 14, 1928, and published in the *Gazette* of May 18, 1928, a conservancy rate of 2 per centum per annum on the annual value of all houses, buildings, lands, and tenements as determined for the purposes of the assessment rate levied under the Ordinance: Provided that where the amount so payable in respect of any house, building, land or tenement is less than 25 cents per quarter, the amount recoverable under this regulation in respect of such house, building, land, or tenement shall be 25 cents per quarter.

Clause 26A.—Alter caption to “ Maintained schools ”.

Clause 31B.—Add a new clause as follows after Clause 31A:—

31B. (i.) In schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, the number of teachers eligible for grant during any school year shall be based upon the average attendance of eligible pupils for the previous school year and in accordance with Clause 31A.

In the case of new schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, the number of teachers eligible for grant during the first school year shall be decided by the Department.

(ii.) In Maintained English Schools, the rates of fees charged shall be in accordance with Clause 105 of the Code of Regulations for Government Schools, and the whole of the fees shall be remitted each month to the Department.

In other English schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, an amount not less than the Manager's contribution towards the salaries of the teachers shall be remitted to the Department each month.

## AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 16.—In the amendments to this clause, in sub-clause (g) delete “ within 1½ hours of the opening . . . . . in a one-session school ” and substitute “ before the end of the session ”.

Clause 32A.—Alter caption to “ Maintained schools ”.

Clause 36.—In line 6 alter “ Re. 1.50 ” to “ Re. 1.00 ”.

Add at the end: “ Grant for maintenance and equipment shall not be paid to schools maintained by Education District Committees ”.

Clause 37 (c).—After the sentence “ A fraction of over one-half the quota shall count for an additional trained teacher ” add a new sentence as follows: “ This rule is to take effect as from August 3, 1934 ”.

Clause 37 (d).—Delete lines 6 to the end, viz., “ English teacher . . . . . not less than 20 ” and substitute: “ English teacher for every 80 units of average attendance of pupils taking this course. Grant for part-time English teachers will be allowed proportionately to this quota provided the units of average attendance of such pupils are not less than 20 ”.

Clause 39B.—Add a new clause as follows after Clause 39A:—

39B. (i.) In schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, the number of teachers eligible for grant during any school year shall be based upon the average attendance of eligible pupils for the previous school year, and in accordance with Clause 39A.

In the case of new schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, the number of teachers eligible for grant during the first school year shall be decided by the Department.

(ii.) In Maintained Bilingual Schools, the rates of fees charged shall be in accordance with Clause 106 of the Code of Regulations for Government Schools, and the whole of the fees shall be remitted to the Department each month.

In other Bilingual Schools where salaries are paid direct to the teachers by the Department, an amount not less than the Manager's contribution towards the salaries of the English teachers shall be remitted to the Department each month.

## REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDING SEPTEMBER 30, 1934.

The Annual Report of the Ceylon State Mortgage Bank is submitted together with the statement of accounts and balance sheet for the year ending September 30, 1934.

*Debentures.*—Total number of debentures sold during the year ended September 30, 1934, was 8,224 (3,633 at 5 per cent. and 4,591 at 4½ per cent.) amounting to Rs. 411,200, out of this amount 31 debentures of the 4½ per cent. issue amounting to Rs. 1,550 were sold in place of compulsorily redeemed ones.

*Interest to Debenture Holders.*—Amount paid as interest to debenture holders for the year ended September 30, 1934, was Rs. 61,547·40 being Rs. 27,512·70 for ½ year ended March 31, 1934, and Rs. 34,034·70 for ½ year ended September 30, 1934.

*Redemption of Debentures.*—During the year under review 169 debentures of the first 5 per cent. issue amounting to Rs. 8,450 were redeemed—111 voluntarily and 58 compulsorily.

*Loans.*—Number of loans granted for the year September 30, 1934, was 24 amounting to Rs. 459,000. The actual amount paid out during the year was Rs. 458,829—the difference Rs. 171—represents cost of stamps paid out before the commencement of the year.

*Securities.*—The security for these loans consist of 1,975 acres agricultural lands and 18 properties in town.

*Interest received on Loans.*—Interest on loans for the year amounts to Rs. 97,471·42—Rs. 67,874·87 represent interest actually earned during the year and Rs. 29,596·55 accrued interest to September 30, 1934.

*Capital Repayment on Loans.*—Repayment of principal on loans for year ended September 30, 1934, was Rs. 35,612·23.

*Cost of maintaining the Bank.*—The working expenses of the Bank during the year amounted to Rs. 40,523·79, as against Rs. 63,882·09 the previous year.

*Profits.*—The nett profit for year ended September 30, 1934, was Rs. 2,002·85.

1. The regulations contained in the Table "C" in the schedule annexed to the "The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance of 1861" shall apply to this Company which shall be governed by the regulations contained in the Articles but subject to repeal, addition, or alteration by special resolution and in the construction of These Presents words including the masculine gender shall include the feminine and words importing the singular number only shall exclude the plural and *vice versa* and words importing persons shall include corporations.

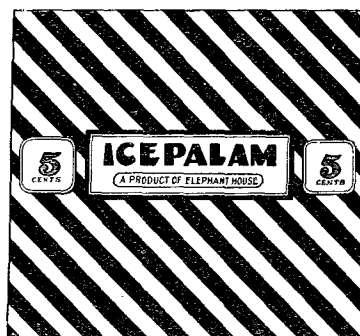

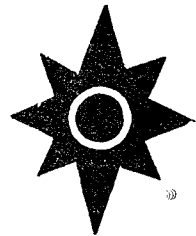

#### General Clerical Examination, 1935.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination for candidates wishing to enter the Clerical Branch of the Public Service will be held commencing on May 8, 1935. This examination is confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

2. Applications for admission to the examination by persons not now in the Public Service must be addressed to the Director of Education, must bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10, and must be in the prescribed form (Schedule A). Forms can be obtained at the Education Office, Colombo, and application for the same must be sent so as to reach that office by February 13, 1935. A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to have been born after May 1, 1912, but not later than May 1, 1918, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person,\* to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application. Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted. In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration from the register of past births, the certificates will be accepted only after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which the candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, as amended by Ordinance No. 23 of 1900; and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him. Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

3. Candidates other than those eligible under paragraph 5 must also furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed either—

- (a) The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or higher examinations of the University of London; or
- (b) The Senior School Certificate Examination (English); or
- (c) The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate Examination (English), and either (i.) the examination for the Commercial Certificates of the Government Technical Schools or of the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the examination for the London Chamber of Commerce Certificates in English, Arithmetic, and either Bookkeeping or Shorthand and Typewriting.

4. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of  $\frac{2}{3}$  the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in paragraph 4 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Education Office by April 8, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Education Office, Colombo, before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the perfected entry form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

5. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments; but including those clerks of the Railway Clerical Service who are at present temporarily employed in General Clerical Service posts) from whatever funds they may be paid, who shall have completed three years' service, before the date of the examination and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination, irrespective of age and without fee, and although they may not have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination must be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

\* If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, the certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can readily be made.

6. Clerks in Government Service (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's or Railway Departments; but including those clerks of the Railway Clerical Service who are at present temporarily employed in General Clerical Service posts) if within the age prescribed in paragraph 2 above will be admitted without fee, even though they have not completed three years' service under Government, but they must have passed the examination or examinations referred to in paragraph 3.

7. Candidates in Government Service who are not eligible under paragraphs 5 and 6 may enter for the examination under the conditions laid down in paragraphs 2 and 3.

8. Applications must reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on February 20, 1935. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

9. The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved, to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidate's ticket of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

10. The examination will be held in Colombo only at places which will be notified to the candidates in due course. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education leave to present themselves for the examination.

11. The examination will be competitive. The number of places in Class II. assigned for general competition will be 25. Appointments in Class III. will be offered, as vacancies occur, to the first 50 of those who are not selected for appointment to Class II.

12. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

13. Appointments to Class II. will be on two years' probation in the first instance and will be on the salary scale of Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108 to Rs. 2,448 per annum. Appointments are pensionable.

14. Appointments to Class III. will be on two years' probation in the first instance and will be on the salary scale of Rs. 480 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,200 per annum. Appointments are pensionable.

15. Persons appointed, who are new entrants to the Public Service, will be eligible for Leave and Holiday Warrants in terms of Chapter III. of Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934.

16. Clerical Servants are required to pass a test in typewriting before they are eligible for their first increment.

17. The subjects for examination are those set out in Schedule B of this notice. The examination will be in two parts. The first part is a qualifying examination in Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper. The papers of any candidate failing to obtain half the marks allowed for each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper will not be considered for the second part of the examination. The second part of the examination will be in the remaining subjects in Schedule B. Credit will not be given for any paper in which a candidate scores less than 25 per cent. of the maximum marks. In all the written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is untidy or illegible or contains defects in the formation of letters will be disqualified.

18. Clerks admitted under paragraph 5, who fail to secure places in the general competition under conditions in paragraph 17, will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for six appointments, if in the first part of this examination they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in each of the subjects, Arithmetic, English Language and Essay, and General Paper.

19. The Government does not undertake to provide the successful candidates with posts immediately, but they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.
