THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES under sections 11 and 12 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors within the Irrigable Area of the Kalameti Modera Irrigation Work, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

RULES.

(I.) In addition to the rules relating to the Walawe Right Bank Scheme published in the *Gazettes* of January 9, 1925, January 25, 1929, and July 3, 1931, the following rules shall apply to all lands under the Kalameti Modera Work:—

(1) There shall be two seasons for cultivation, namely, yala and maha.

(2) (a) The cultivation for yala shall commence on March 7 and the sowing of 90 days' paddy shall be completed by May 1 and the sowing of 60 days' paddy by May 26.

(b) It shall be an offence to sow 90 days' paddy after May 1 or 60 days' paddy on or before May 1, without a special permit granted by the Assistant Government Agent.

(3) (a) The cultivation for maha shall commence on September 20, and the sowing of 90 days' paddy shall be completed by November 8, and the sowing of 60 days' paddy shall be completed by December 3.

(b) It shall be an offence to sow 90 days' paddy after November 8 or 60 days' paddy on or before November 8, without a special permit granted by the Assistant Government Agent.

(4) Before the commencement of the cultivation for each season a meeting of the proprietors shall be convened by the Assistant Government Agent, or an officer duly authorized by him to determine—

(a) the variety of paddy to be sown;

(b) the fields to be cultivated and the conditions on which they are to be cultivated; and

(c) the fields to be left fallow.

(5) It shall be an offence for any proprietor to cultivate a variety of paddy other than that decided by a majority of the proprietors under rule 4.

(6) (a) The proprietors shall construct the necessary fences and watch huts and keep them in repair, and shall keep regular watch, in accordance with the directions given by the Vel-Vidane.

(b) The fences shall be constructed within one week from the dates fixed for the completion of sowing. If any proprietor fails to construct the necessary fences or watch huts within the prescribed time, the Vel-Vidane shall cause them to be constructed within ten days of such default and recover the cost from the defaulting proprietor or the cultivator or the gambaraya actually responsible.

(7) (a) The Kalameti Modera, that is to say, the mouth of the Kalameti Kalapuwa, shall be cut when there is too much water in the Kalapuwa for successful cultivation of the fields under the Modera.

(b) The proprietors of all the fields shall contribute labour in proportion to their holdings—

(i.) for the cutting of the Modera at the commencement of each season within ten days after the last sowing date for the variety of paddy decided upon at the meeting held under rule 4; and

(ii.) whenever abnormal rains or floods make it necessary to cut the Modera.

(c) The time at which the Modera is to be cut shall be determined by the Cultivation Officer and reasonable notice whereof shall be given by the Vel-Vidanes.

(d) The decision of the Assistant Government Agent on any dispute, relating to the cutting of the Modera, shall be final.

(e) Any proprietor failing or delaying to contribute his proper share of labour shall be liable to the penalties provided in section 29 of the Ordinance for a breach of rules.

(8) (a) In the event of any proprietor sowing paddy of a variety other than that decided at the meeting held under rule 4, the other proprietors shall not be liable to contribute labour for cutting the Modera for his benefit.

(b) If the Modera has for any reason to be cut after the date specified in paragraph (b) (i.) of the foregoing rule 7 only the proprietors of those fields which require the cutting of the Modera shall be liable to contribute labour therefor.

(9) The Vel-Vidanes elected or appointed for the area under the Walawe Right Bank Scheme shall enforce these rules under the supervision of the Cultivation Officer, Walawe Right Bank Scheme.

(II.) The rules under section 11 of the Ordinance dated April 21, 1923, and published in the *Gazette* of April 27, 1923, are hereby rescinded.

THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

RULES under section 12 of the Irrigation Ordinance, No. 45 of 1917, made by the prescribed majority of the proprietors of the tract bounded as follows:—

On the north by the Bolana Koggalla District Road Committee road

On the east by the Left Bank Irrigation Channel

On the south by the Hambantota Tangalla Public Works Department road

On the west by the Ambalantota Ridiyagama Irrigation road,

and comprised in the irrigable area of the Walawe Left Bank Scheme in the Hambantota District of the Southern Province, and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 19 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

CULTIVATION RULES.

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Cultivation Officer” means the officer appointed by the Assistant Government Agent, under section 20A of the Ordinance, to supervise the work of the Irrigation Headmen and to exercise control in accordance with these rules under the instructions of the Assistant Government Agent.

“Vel-Vidane” means the Irrigation Headman elected under section 20, or appointed under section 21, of the Ordinance, to be in charge of a division, or of a tract or a series of tracts of fields.

“Joint Labour” means labour contributed by all the proprietors concerned in each case, in proportion to the extent of their respective holdings.

2. (1) Every Vel-Vidane shall reside within the division or tract or within one mile of the division or tract, in his charge, and shall not absent himself from duty without the permission of the Assistant Government Agent.

(2) On assuming office every Vel-Vidane shall, by the hypothecation either of a cash deposit of Rs. 250 or of lands of that value, give security to the Assistant Government Agent for the proper disposal of Government monies advanced to him or in his charge and for the payment of any compensation that may be awarded by the Assistant Government Agent in respect of any damage caused to any proprietor through any malicious act of the Vel-Vidane.

(3) The term of office of a Vel-Vidane shall be restricted to 3 years but he shall be eligible for re-election.

3. It shall be the duty of every Vel-Vidane (a) to supervise all paddy cultivation within the division or tract in his charge subject to instructions from, and to the control of, the Cultivation Officer, and (b) to enforce these rules and, subject to the instructions of the Cultivation Officer, to enter prosecution for breaches thereof.

4. (1) Every Vel-Vidane shall be entitled to receive, from the proprietors or cultivators of fields within the division or tract in his charge, a huwandiram of 3 kurunies of paddy for each extent on which an amunam is ordinarily sown, that extent being deemed for the purpose of these rules to be equivalent to 2½ acres.

(2) The whole or any portion of the huwandiram may be withheld if, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, the Vel-Vidane has not satisfactorily carried out his duties during the preceding period of cultivation; and the huwandiram or portion so withheld shall be disposed of as the Assistant Government Agent may in each case order.

(3) Any person acting for the Vel-Vidane shall be entitled to a share of the huwandiram proportionate to the time he so acted; and in the event of dispute, this share shall be determined by the Assistant Government Agent.

(4) The huwandiram due in respect of each season, shall, unless the Assistant Government Agent has made any order to the contrary, be handed over to the Vel-Vidane within one month after the reaping of the crop, and before any paddy is removed from the threshing-floor; and a receipt shall be given by him therefor.

5. (1) Cultivation for yala shall begin on March 7 and the sowing shall be completed by May 1 every year.

(2) Cultivation for maha shall begin on September 20 and the sowing shall be completed by November 9 every year.

6. (1) In respect of all tanks, dams, channels, water-courses and the like works which are required by these rules and which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation—

(a) ordinary repairs shall be carried out by the joint labour of the proprietors benefited, and completed 10 days before the dates fixed for the commencement of cultivation in each season;

(b) repairs which appear to be necessary in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer, shall be carried out by the joint labour of such of the proprietors as are benefited by the work and are served with a written notice in that behalf, and shall be completed within the time specified in the notice; and

(c) extraordinary works, such as widening, strengthening, or improving, decided upon by the Assistant Government Agent after such inquiry as may be necessary into any suggestions or objections that may be offered or raised by the proprietors in response to a preliminary notice of his intention to have such works carried out, shall be carried out by the joint labour of such of the proprietors as are served with a written final notice in that behalf, and shall be completed within the time specified in that notice.

(2) All channels shall be kept clear and in a state of good repair throughout the period of irrigation by the joint labour of the proprietors benefited thereby.

(3) If any of the above mentioned repairs, improvements, or works are not satisfactorily completed within the time specified, such repairs or improvements shall be carried out by the Cultivation Officer after notice to such of the proprietors concerned as are registered under section 14 or section 64A and in the case of works likely to cost over Rs. 50 with the prior approval of the Assistant Government Agent obtained on submission of estimates of the cost.

(4) The Cultivation Officer may for that purpose receive an advance from the Fine Fund, and the expenses incurred shall be recovered from the proprietors concerned, in proportion to the labour due from each of them.

7. (1) Paths between cultivated lands shall be kept clear by the joint labour of the proprietors of those lands, and shall be maintained at a width of at least 2 feet.

(2) All ridges shall be satisfactorily maintained so as to prevent waste of water.

8. Any terrace in a field which by reason of its sloping position or uneven nature causes any wastage of irrigation water, shall be levelled or rectified by the construction of additional ridges by the proprietors of the field so as to prevent the wastage.

9. Wherever it is necessary to avoid irrigation water being taken from terrace to terrace, field channels shall be extended by such of the proprietors, as are directed so to do by the Cultivation Officer.

10. (1) Every proprietor shall deliver to the Cultivation Officer a list of the managers or lessees of his fields within 7 days after the date fixed in rule 5 for the commencement of cultivation in each season: Provided that no list shall be required of any proprietor who informs the Cultivation Officer before that date that there has been no change among his managers or lessees after the last list furnished by him.

(2) (a) The managers of fields shall prepare a full list of the goiyas to be employed in their fields, and no water shall be issued to the fields until such list is delivered to the Vel-Vidane.

(b) The list of goiyas shall be made out on the printed form supplied by the Assistant Government Agent and shall bear the signature of the manager and of all the goiyas.

(c) All the information required by this form shall be accurately filled in.

(d) All changes and additions in the list of goiyas shall be notified to the Vel-Vidane in writing.

(e) All lists of goiyas shall be handed over by the Vel-Vidane to the Cultivation Officer.

11. Every proprietor shall be liable to contribute the labour or carry out the works required by these rules for each season's cultivation, unless specially exempted by the Assistant Government Agent, on written application made in that behalf.

12. Only such varieties of paddy shall be sown either for maha or yala as will not require more than 90 days of water from the date prescribed in rule 5 for the completion of sowing.

13. (1) The sowing of any fields after the dates prescribed in rule 5 without a special permit from the Assistant Government Agent shall be an offence for which the person in charge of the cultivation shall be liable to prosecution.

(2) (a) Such permits may be issued by the Assistant Government Agent upon such terms as he may deem fit in each case.

(b) In ordinary circumstances no extension shall be allowed, which will involve an extension of the irrigation period.

(c) The permit shall specify the extension allowed, the name of the field, and the kind of seed to be sown.

(d) The contravention of any of the conditions of the permit shall be an offence.

14. Subject to the control of the Cultivation Officer, the apportioning of water, after it has left the irrigation works and entered the tracts, shall be performed by the Vel-Vidane.

15. (1) No person shall wilfully or without the permission of the Vel-Vidane prevent water from flowing to the field below his own, or obstruct the flow of surplus water from any field on a higher level, or allow water to flow into a field through any hole or gap in the ridge.

(2) No person shall issue, apportion, cut off or divert, or use the water in any manner except in accordance with the instructions of the Vel-Vidane.

16. (1) The cultivators shall construct the necessary watch huts as directed by the Vel-Vidane and maintain them in good repair and shall keep regular watch in accordance with the orders of the Vel-Vidane.

(2) Huts shall be so constructed as to be 6 feet from the level of the ground.

17. (1) Should any portion of any tract sown by the date prescribed for the completion of sowing, ripen before the rest of that tract, the cultivators of that portion may reap and store their crop but shall continue to keep watch over the fields until the crop of the remainder of that tract is reaped and stored.

(2) Should any portion of a tract not ripen until after the reaping of the crop on the remainder of that tract either on account of sowing after the prescribed date or because of the sowing of a different kind of paddy, the cultivators of the remainder of the tract shall not be bound to continue to keep watch over the field until that portion of the tract ripens.

18. The proprietor shall pay the share due to the cultivator at the threshing-floor immediately after the harvest after deducting any advances that may have already been paid.

19. (1) All field channels and water-courses which are not in charge of the Director of Irrigation, shall be in charge of the Vel-Vidane acting under the directions of the Cultivation Officer.

(2) No person shall fill up or encroach upon such channels or water-courses or any of their reservations.

20. (1) Any channel, dam, or other work required, whether outside or inside any field, shall be constructed by the joint labour of the proprietors interested.

(2) (a) Every proprietor shall grant way leave for such channels, dams, or other works even though his own land may not be benefited thereby.

(b) Such works shall be constructed and maintained so as to cause the least damage to the land through which such way leave is granted.

(3) On receipt of a written application for permission to construct any such works the Cultivation Officer may give the proprietors the necessary permission, provided that no work which is likely to affect the general irrigation under the scheme or the lands of proprietors other than the applicants, shall be permitted until the matter has been referred for approval to the Assistant Government Agent acting in consultation with the Divisional Irrigation Engineer.

(4) Before permission is given to construct a field channel through land which is not to be benefited thereby, the proprietor of such land shall be notified of the proposal by the Cultivation Officer.

21. (1) If the proprietor of any land is unable to obtain water for irrigation owing to the neglect of any other proprietor to cut his share of the field channels, such other proprietor shall be called upon by the Cultivation Officer to do the necessary work and in the event of his failing or refusing to perform the work required within a reasonable time the Cultivation Officer shall forward an estimate of the cost of the work to the Assistant Government Agent.

(2) The Assistant Government Agent may advance the amount required from the Fine Fund and direct the Cultivation Officer to carry out the work, and recover the expenses incurred from the defaulting proprietor.

22. (1) Cattle may be kept within the lands of the proprietors until the date prescribed in rule 5 for the completion of sowing.

(2) Within 24 hours after that date, all cattle shall be removed outside the cultivated areas to a distance of at least 2 miles or be securely tethered or penned.

23. No paddy shall be sown in any irrigation or other channel.

24. Every proprietor shall, whenever required by the Assistant Government Agent or the Cultivation Officer, point out the correct boundaries of his land, and shall erect bunds or other suitable marks to define such boundaries.

25. Any Cultivation Officer or Irrigation Officer or Vel-Vidane may take such action as may be necessary to prevent any waste of water occurring in any field.

Procedure at Meetings.

1. (1) Ordinary meetings of the Committee shall be held at least once a month and shall be convened by the Chairman.

(2) Special meetings of the Committee shall be convened by the Chairman if requested thereto in writing by any five members of the Committee for the transaction of such business as may be stated by them in such written requisition.

(3) Any meeting duly convened may be adjourned, if a two-thirds majority of the members present and voting so decides, to any other specified day or hour.

2. All meetings of the Committee shall ordinarily be open to the public: provided that the Committee may at any meeting decide that in the public interest any part of its proceedings shall be conducted in private, and the public may thereupon be excluded from such meeting during such part of the proceedings.

3. At a special meeting only the business stated in the notice convening the meeting shall be transacted.

4. Meetings shall be held at the Village Committee Office or any other convenient place approved by the Committee.

5. (1) The notice convening any ordinary meeting shall contain the agenda for the day and shall be served on the members seven clear days before such meeting.

(2) Any notice of a special meeting shall be served on the members not less than four days before such meeting.

6. The quorum for the due transaction of business at any meeting of the Committee shall be not less than nine of the elected members of the Committee.

7. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide on all disputed points of order.

8. As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum assembles, the Chairman shall take the chair and the Committee shall proceed to business.

9. Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting, the meeting shall not be held.

10. At least ten days' notice shall be given to the Chairman of any resolution or question which a member desires to place before or to raise at any ordinary meeting of the Committee.

11. No motion negatived at a meeting shall again be brought forward until after the expiration of at least three months; and no motion in any way contrary to one already passed by the Committee at any meeting duly held shall be entertained until the expiration of the same period.

12. (1) All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present.

(2) The Chairman shall have the right to vote and in the event of an equality of votes in any matter he shall have a casting vote in addition.

13. The Committee may permit the mover to withdraw or amend a resolution brought before it at any meeting.

14. The business of the meeting shall be conducted in the following order:—

(a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and confirmed after such correction as may be necessary.

(b) Memorials, petitions, or other communications addressed to the Committee shall be laid before the meeting and orders made thereon.

(c) Questions.

(d) Motions.

(e) Any other business.

15. The Chairman shall keep a journal of proceedings into which he shall transcribe, or cause to be transcribed, in a fair handwriting, the minutes of the proceedings at

every meeting. The entries made in respect of each meeting in such journal shall constitute the minutes of such meeting.

16. Any member causing any disturbance or otherwise conducting himself in a disorderly manner at any meeting and continuing to do so after being called to order by the Chairman, may be ordered by the Chairman to leave the meeting, and may be suspended from attending any number of subsequent meetings not exceeding four, by a resolution of the Committee carried by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at such meeting.

17. If a question should arise at any meeting regarding the procedure to be adopted in any matter not provided for in these rules, such question shall be determined in accordance with the Standing Orders of the State Council of Ceylon so far as the same may be applicable to this Committee and not inconsistent with these rules nor with the practice of this Committee.

18. The rule under section 29 (33), relating to the quorum at meetings published in the *Gazette* of May 19, 1933, is hereby repealed.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws published by Notification in the *Gazette* of December 10, 1926, as amended by Notifications in the *Gazettes* of June 2, 1927, July 22, 1927, September 9, 1927, October 28, 1932, June 16, 1933, July 27, 1934, and December 7, 1934, are hereby further amended as follows:—

- (a) by the insertion of the words "hair dressing saloon, barber's shop," after the word "place" and before the word "or" in line 3 of by-law 2; and
- (b) by the addition of the following by-laws after those regarding "Public Bathing Places":—

HAIR-DRESSING SALOONS OR BARBERS' SHOPS.

I.—Conditions of Issue of Licence.

No person shall be entitled to keep a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

1. That the building is of permanent materials, well lighted and well ventilated, with a floor space of not less than 120 square feet. The walls shall be lime-plastered and lime-washed; the roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white; and the floor shall be cemented, with rounded corners at its junction with the walls.

2. That it is provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation.

3. That the living quarters, if any, attached to a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop conform to the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.

4. That a sufficient supply of water is available at all times on the premises.

5. That the saloon or shop is provided with means for securing a supply of boiling water adequate for the purpose of sterilizing implements and washing the appliances in daily use.

6. That a sufficient supply of towels and overalls is available for the use of the customers.

7. That facilities are provided for the barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work.

8. That the saloon or shop is provided with a sufficient number of spittoons which shall be kept by the seats readily available to customers and employees.

9. That for the reception of hair and sweepings a movable sanitary bin made of galvanized iron or other equally suitable and impervious material is provided and kept covered with a close-fitting lid.

10. That each washstand is provided with a vessel for a disinfectant for sterilizing razors, scissors, clippers, or other instruments.

11. A tray with disinfectants shall be kept in the saloon for keeping the instruments and combs after use.

II.—Regulations for Licensed Hair-dressing Saloons.

1. Every licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with the words "Licensed Hair-dressing Saloon" or "Licensed Barber's Shop."

2. Every Licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil to be framed and hung up in a prominent place on the premises.

3. The walls of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be lime-washed and the ceiling painted twice a year in the months of June and December.

4. No Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be used as a place for sleeping or eating during the night or day.

5. No person suffering from or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop or be employed therein in any capacity. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall submit himself for examination by the Medical Officer of Health and obtain a certificate from him to the effect that such person is free from any infectious or contagious disease. The certificate will be issued free of charge.

6. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall observe the utmost cleanliness in his work. He shall keep his person and his wearing apparel clean and in a sanitary condition. He shall keep his finger nails short and clean and shall wash his hands with soap and water immediately before attending each customer.

7. The floor, walls, ceiling, furniture, and fixtures of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall be kept clean at all times.

8. The razors, scissors, and other implements shall be disinfected immediately after each occasion on which they are used and before they are employed for another customer by dipping them in boiling water or by any other method approved of by the Medical Officer of Health.

Such razors, scissors, and other implements, when not in use, shall be kept in the tray with disinfectants provided for the purpose.

9. All spittoons shall always be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Each spittoon shall be emptied and cleansed once daily, or more frequently if necessary, with a disinfectant approved by the Medical Officer of Health, and a small quantity of disinfectant left in the spittoon.

10. Hair-brushes and combs shall be thoroughly washed, cleaned, and sterilized every day before use and kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

11. Shaving mugs, cups, and shaving brushes shall be thoroughly rinsed in hot water after each occasion on which they are used.

12. The use of styptic pencils, powder puffs, and sponges is forbidden. Alum or other material used to stop bleeding shall be applied in powder or liquid form.

13. Every licensee shall supply each customer with fresh clean towels and overalls. All towels or overalls shall be boiled and laundered after each occasion on which they are used.

14. No person shall expectorate within the premises except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

15. No person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber's Shop shall attend on any customer who is suffering from an infectious skin disease or any other infectious ailment.

16. If it so happens that a customer with any visible skin disease has been attended to, the hands of the barber shall be immediately cleansed and the instruments used sterilized.

17. After attention to each customer all hair cuttings shall be gathered and deposited in the sanitary dust bin provided. Such cuttings shall on no account be allowed to lie about in the premises.
