- (1) divide, with effect from July 1, 1935, the subdivision set out in column 1 of Schedule A hereto into the five new subdivisions set out and defined in column 2 of the said schedule; and
- (2) provide in the manner set out in Schedule B hereto for the matters necessary to give effect to the divisions so effected.

SCHEDULE A.

Column 1.

Subdivision of the Chief Headman's Division of Katugampola Hatpattu in the Kurunegala District made by Proclamation dated August 9, 1890.

Dandagamuwa subdivision consisting of Meddeketiya, Yatikaha South, Yatikaha North, Karandapattu, Kinyama, Yagampattu, Katugampola North, and Katugampola South korales.

Column 2.

Subdivisions now defined.

1. Horambawa subdivision consisting of Meddeketiya korale.

2. Piduma subdivision consisting of Yatikaha North and South korales.

3. Bingiriya subdivision consisting of Karandapattu and Kinyama korales.

4. Dummalasuriya subdivision consisting of Yagampattu korale.

5. Udubaddawa subdivision consisting of Katugampola North and South korales.

SCHEDULE B.

1. The inhabitants of each of the new subdivisions set out in column 2 of the foregoing Schedule A shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the original subdivision set out in column 1 of the said schedule for all such purposes of the Ordinance as may relate to that new subdivision.

2. (i.) Any balance of the moneys deposited with the Government Agent and lying to the credit of the original subdivision on June 30, 1935, shall be divided into five equal portions and these portions credited to the respective accounts of the new subdivisions on July 1, 1935.

(ii.) All other movable property of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall be deemed to be vested in five equal shares in the respective inhabitants of the five new subdivisions.

(iii.) Such of the immovable property of the inhabitants of the original subdivision as lies within the boundaries of any particular new subdivision shall be deemed to be vested exclusively in the inhabitants of that particular subdivision.

3. All the rights, powers and duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of the inhabitants of the original subdivision shall so far as they relate to any of the new subdivisions be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of such new subdivision.

4. All rules now in force under the provisions of the Ordinance in the original subdivision shall be in force in each of the new subdivisions as if they had been made by, or by virtue of the powers delegated by, the inhabitants of the new subdivisions.

5. The Committee now in office in the original subdivision shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the division of the said subdivision into new subdivisions but shall remain in office until June 30, 1935, or until the respective fresh Committees elected for the new subdivisions come into office.

RESEARCH PROBATIONERS, AGRICULTURAL DEPARTMENT.

APPLICATIONS are invited from candidates possessing Honours degrees in the appropriate scientific subjects for appointment to three posts of Research Probationer in the Department of Agriculture. These posts will be assigned to the Chemical, Entomological, and Botanical Divisions respectively. Applicants must be natural-born British subjects of Ceylonese descent.

2. In the first instance the selected candidate will be attached to the appropriate Research Division for training. During the period of training he will be paid a salary of Rs. 2,700 per annum. If he proves suitable, he will be provided at Government expense with a further course of training abroad. During his period of training abroad he will continue to receive the salary of Rs. 2,700 per annum, together with such allowances and other assistance as may be determined. On satisfactory completion of the period of training the officer will be placed on a salary of Rs. 3,200 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 200 to a maximum of Rs. 6,000 per annum. Officers in this grade will be eligible for appointment to vacancies in the higher Research staff of the department on the salaries recommended in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934.

3. If in any case the qualifications and experience of the selected candidate are such that further training out of Ceylon is unnecessary, he may be appointed on Rs. 3,200 or such higher salary in the scale as may be considered appropriate to his attainments.

4. Applications from persons already in the Government Service will be considered only if forwarded through the Heads of their departments. Applications, which should give full particulars of age, qualifications, and experience must reach the Chief Secretary before March 15, 1935.

ARTICLES OF ASSOCIATION OF THE ASSOCIATED CINEMAS, LIMITED.

BORROWING POWERS.

8. GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, December 7, 1934, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated December 3, 1934.**

Present :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo ; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 24, 1934, were amended as regards item 4 (4) by the addition of the name of Mr. R. L. Ephraums to the names of members who had voted against the motion, and as regards the further resolution of Council in connection with item 18 (7), by the insertion of "Wards 4 and 5" instead of "Ward 5".

The minutes as amended, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented, one by Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka and two by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo. The Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. The following questions stood in the name of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka :—(1) What is the generating cost of a unit of electricity ? (2) What is the standing cost of a unit of electricity ? (3) What is the amount paid by the General Revenue for a unit of electricity for street lighting ?

The Chairman stated that the replies to these questions were not ready and that they would be answered at the next meeting. He further stated that the expression "Standing Cost" in question No. 2 was not understood and requested the member to be good enough to explain the meaning of it before the next meeting.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved :—(1) That this Council is of opinion that in future no letters of recommendation be given by members of the Council to candidates applying for employment in the Municipality.

Mr. A. C. Mohammedo objected to the motion in the form in which it had been submitted by the mover and suggested that it be amended to read as follows :—"That in future no candidate applying for employment in the Municipality should produce before the Chairman a letter of recommendation from a member of the Council." The mover agreed. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo then moved as an amendment that in future no candidate applying for employment in the Municipality should produce before the Chairman a letter of recommendation from a member of the Council. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.

Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved as a further amendment that in future candidates applying for posts in the Municipality carrying a salary of over Rs. 100 per mensem shall not be allowed to produce certificates from members of the Council in support of their applications. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.

The Chairman said he entirely agreed with the purport of the motion. Mr. J. E. Perera also spoke.

The amendment of Mr. E. M. Karunaratna was first put to the meeting and declared lost, 2 voting for and 9 against.

Mr. Mohammedo's amendment was then put to the meeting and carried by 9 votes to 2.

(2) That a separate collector for each Ward be appointed to collect rates and taxes.

Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. The motion was put to the meeting and declared lost, 2 voting for and 10 against.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya moved :—(1) That the owners of houses damaged by the recent floods be allowed to rebuild without submitting plans.

The Chairman said the motion was *ultra vires* and could not be accepted. He, therefore, ruled it out of order.

(2) That the steps taken to enforce the conversion of pit-latrines into dry earth latrines be suspended until conditions improve.

Mr. J. E. Perera seconded, but suggested that the following words be added to the motion :—"Except in the case of very insanitary pit latrines". The mover agreed to the suggestions. Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna and S. H. Dahanayaka opposed the motion. Mr. A. M. Saheed also spoke.

The Chairman suggested that the better procedure would be for the mover himself to bring to his notice any case where such conversion would cause hardship to the owner so that he (the Chairman) could personally inspect the premises and decide what action should be taken. He inquired whether the mover would agree to that suggestion and withdraw the motion. As the mover was not prepared to do so the motion was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 9 against.

6. To consider a draft amendment of by-law 2 of Chapter VII. prohibiting the slaughter of cows and other animals which in the opinion of the Medical Officer of Health, are unfit to be slaughtered for human consumption :—Resolved that the draft amendment be approved.

7. To consider Audit Query No. 105 I.M. of November 27, 1934, relating to the security of the Storekeeper of the Electricity Department :—The Chairman informed the meeting that the Special Committee appointed to inquire into the working of the Electricity Department had recommended that the security required from the Storekeeper should be increased from Rs. 250 to Rs. 500. This recommendation was adopted by the Council with the amendment that the increase should be by hypothecation of property.

It was, however, furnished in cash and deposited on October 11, 1934. He considered the present cash security of Rs. 500 to be sufficient :—Resolved that a reply be sent on the lines indicated by the Chairman.

8. To consider applications for the post of Shroff :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee.

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, (1) that a sub-committee of the Council consisting of the Chairman and Messrs. D. I. Durham, S. H. Dahanayaka, A. C. Mohammedo and Amarasuriya be appointed to select the names of 15 candidates to be submitted to Council for consideration at the next meeting ; (2) that the present acting arrangements do continue until the permanent appointment takes effect.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

9. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of Council :—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, January 12, 1935, at 9.30 A.M.

3. All the items under "Estimated Revenue" were accepted and passed.

Expenditure.

4. The Chairman moved an increase of Rs. 500 under Head 2—Gratuities.—Carried.

B.—*Administrative Charges.*

5. In connection with Head 7—Personal Emoluments the following questions were considered :—

(a) Withdrawal of the temporary levy on salaries :—Resolved that the temporary levy imposed on the salaries of the Municipal Staff be withdrawn as from January 1, 1935.

(b) Appointment of Chief Clerk and Accountant :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this question.

Council in Committee.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved that a Chief Clerk and Accountant be appointed with effect from February 1, 1935, and that applications for the post be called for. Mr. R. L. Ephraums seconded.

Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved as an amendment that Mr. M. A. Marikar, 3rd Clerk, be allowed to act in the post of Chief Clerk and Accountant for a further period of 6 months from January 1, 1935. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo seconded.

7. The following amendments were sanctioned :—(1) A decrease of 10,000 under Head 39—Maintenance of Roads. (2) A decrease of Rs. 250 under Head 43—Maintenance of Victoria Park, Esplanade and Public Seats.

(b) *Extraordinary.*

8. Head 58—Iron and Concrete Platform for Ossenagoda Bridge—was deleted, and the following amendments were sanctioned. (1) A decrease of Rs. 8,500 under Head 49—New Drainage. (2) A decrease of Rs. 7,000 under Head 51—Acquisition of Land. (3) A decrease of Rs. 300 under Head 60—Improvements to Esplanade.

(3) Application from the Chairman, Galle Municipal Education District Committee for an increase of Rs. 50 in the grant for the free issue of school books for needy children.

16. The decision of the Four Standing Committees that the Superintendent of Works be designated "Municipal Engineer" with effect from January 1, 1935, was formally approved.

The remaining items were passed.

20. The Chairman moved that the Budget, as amended, be adopted and that the taxes enumerated on page 11 be imposed and enforced.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

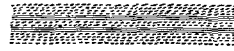
