AIR NAVIGATION.

THE CARRIAGE BY AIR (PARTIES TO CONVENTION)
ORDER, 1934.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 9th day of
November, 1934.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS a Convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air was on the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, signed at Warsaw on behalf of His Majesty :

And whereas provision is made by the Carriage by Air Act, 1932, (a) for giving effect to the said Convention :

And whereas by subsection (2) of section one of the said Act His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time certify who are the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention, in respect of what territories they are respectively parties and to what extent they have availed themselves of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention :

And whereas since the date of the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1933, (b) certain additional States have ratified, or acceded to, the said Convention,

and it is, therefore expedient that the said Order of 1933 should be superseded by a more comprehensive Order :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. It is hereby certified that the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention and the territories in respect of which they are respectively parties are as specified in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, and that the only High Contracting Party who has availed himself of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention is the High Contracting Party specified in Part II of the said Schedule, who has availed himself of those provisions to the extent specified in the said Part.

2. The Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1933, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1934.

SCHEDULE.

PART I.

1. The High Contracting Parties to the Convention and the dates on which the Convention came or will come into force in regard to their respective territories are as follows:—

The President of the United States of America on the 29th October, 1934.

The President of the Latvian Republic on the 13th February, 1933.

His Serene Highness, the Prince of Liechtenstein on the 7th August, 1934.

The President of the United States of Mexico on the 15th May, 1933.

Her Majesty, the Queen of the Netherlands on the 29th September, 1933.

The President of the Polish Republic on the 13th February, 1933.

His Majesty, the King of Roumania on the 13th February, 1933.

The Central Executive Committee of the Union of Soviet Socialist Republics on the 18th November, 1934.

The President of the Spanish Republic on the 13th February, 1933.

The President of the Swiss Confederation on the 7th August, 1934.

His Majesty, the King of Yugoslavia on the 13th February, 1933.

2. The territories in respect of which His Majesty, the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the seas, Emperor of India, is a party to the Convention are the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands and the Isle of Man.

Each of the other High Contracting Parties above mentioned is a party to the Convention in respect of all territories (including colonies, protectorates and territories under mandate) subject to his sovereignty or authority and any territory under his suzerainty.

PART II.

The President of the United States of America has availed himself of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention by declaring at the time of accession that the first part of Article 2 of the Convention will not be applied to international transport controlled by the United States of America or to international transport in the territories which are under the jurisdiction of the Government of the United States of America.

THE VILLAGE COMMUNITIES ORDINANCE,
No. 9 OF 1924.

RULES under section 29 (33) of the Village Communities Ordinance, No. 9 of 1924, made by the Village Committee of Naimana-Makawita subdivision in Matara District, Southern Province, in pursuance of the powers delegated to the Committee under section 14 (1), and approved by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 30 of the Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

SUB-SECTION (33).

Procedure at Meetings.

1. (1) Ordinary meetings of the Committee shall be held at least once a month and shall be convened by the Chairman.
- (2) Special meetings of the Committee shall be convened by the Chairman if requested thereto in writing by any five members of the Committee, for the transaction of such business as may be stated by them in such written requisition.
- (3) Any meetings duly convened may be adjourned, if the majority of the members present and voting so decides, to any other specified day or hour.
2. All meetings of the Committee shall ordinarily be open to the public: provided that the Committee may at any meeting decide that in the public interest any part of its proceedings shall be conducted in private, and the public may thereupon be excluded from such meeting during such part of the proceedings.
3. At a special meeting only the business stated in the notice convening the meeting shall be transacted.
4. Meetings shall be held at such convenient place within the subdivision as may be approved by the Assistant Government Agent.
5. (1) The notice convening any ordinary meeting shall contain the Agenda for the day and shall be served on the members seven clear days before such meeting.
- (2) Any notice of a special meeting shall be served on the members not less than four days before such meeting.
6. The quorum for the due transaction of business at any meeting of the Committee shall be not less than one-third the number of the elected members of the Committee.
7. The Chairman shall preserve order and decide on all disputed points of order.
8. As soon after the hour appointed for any meeting as a quorum assembles, the Chairman shall take the chair and the Committee shall proceed to business.
9. Should a quorum not be present at the expiration of half an hour from the time appointed for the meeting the meeting shall not be held.
10. At least 10 days' notice shall be given to the Chairman of any resolution or question which a member desires to place before or to raise at any ordinary meeting of the Committee.
11. No motion negatived at a meeting shall again be brought forward until after the expiration of at least three months; and no motion, in any way contrary to one already passed by the Committee at any meeting duly held, shall be entertained until the expiration of the same period.
12. (1) All questions and resolutions shall be determined by a majority of the votes of those present.
- (2) The Chairman shall have the right to vote and in the event of an equality of votes in any matter he shall have a casting vote in addition.
13. The Committee may permit the mover to withdraw or amend a resolution brought before it at any meeting.
14. The business of the meeting shall be conducted in the following order:—
 - (a) The minutes of the previous meeting shall be read and confirmed after such correction as may be necessary.
 - (b) Memorials, petitions, or other communications addressed to the Committee shall be laid before the meeting and orders made thereon.
 - (c) The other business shall be considered in the order set down in the order book mentioned hereafter in rule 15.
15. The Chairman shall keep an order book in which shall be entered and numbered consecutively the subjects to be brought up for discussion at each meeting.

16. The Chairman shall also keep a journal of proceedings into which he shall transcribe, or cause to be transcribed, in a fair handwriting, the minutes of the proceedings at every meeting. The entries made in respect of each meeting in such journal shall constitute the minutes of such meeting.

17. Any member causing any disturbance or otherwise conducting himself in a disorderly manner at any meeting, and continuing to do so after being called to order by the Chairman, may be ordered by the Chairman to leave the meeting, and may be suspended from attending any number of subsequent meetings not exceeding four, by a resolution of the Committee carried by a two-thirds majority of those present and voting at such meeting.

THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ORDINANCE,
No. 11 OF 1920.

IT is hereby notified in terms of section 9 (2) of the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, that it is intended to constitute as from January 1, 1936, an Urban District Council for the area within the administrative limits specified in the schedule hereto, to replace the existing Kolonnawa Urban District Council which was constituted for the area within the administrative limits specified in the schedule to the Notification dated February 29, 1932, published in the *Gazette* of March 4, 1932.

SCHEDULE.

Limits of the Urban District Council, Kolonnawa.

North.—From a point on the eastern limit of the Colombo Municipality at the confluence of the Kittanpahuwa-ela with the Kelani-ganga south-eastwards and eastwards along the left bank of the Kelani-ganga as far as the centre of the railway bridge over the Kelani-ganga.

East.—From the last mentioned point south-westwards along the centre of the railway line as far as the centre of the railway bridge over the Kittanpahuwa-ela, thence south-eastwards and southwards along the centre of the said ela till it meets the Kolonnawa bund on the Angoda road, thence eastwards along the northern boundary of the Angoda road as far as the eastern limit of Gotatuwa village, thence southwards along the said limit to the north-eastern corner of lot M 2 in preliminary plan No. 4,785.

THE COLOMBO MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

General Meeting.

Wednesday, January 16, 1935, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated January 8, 1935.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of December 5 and of the Special Meeting of December 12, 1934, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

1a. The Chairman read the following statement regarding anti-malaria measures taken in Colombo, and on the present situation in the City :—

(1) Members will have seen from the report of the Medical Officer of Health circulated to the Council last month that the necessary preventive measures were taken by the Public Health Department within Municipal limits as soon as it became apparent that there was a possibility of the prevailing epidemic invading Colombo. The measures taken which consisted in the systematic treatment and where possible the complete elimination of all likely breeding places of mosquitoes, were carried out simultaneously by special oiling gangs on a front extending along the whole land-ward boundary of the Municipality, the gangs working inwards towards the centre and re-commencing the operation on completion of the initial programme. The third round of oiling is now in progress. The labour force engaged consists of 15 gangs under overseers. Twelve of these gangs are engaged in the general campaign mentioned above, the remaining 3 are detailed to attend to neglected private premises purely as an emergency measure and with no intention of continuing this work indefinitely or of relieving private owners of their obligations in this respect.

(2) The likely breeding places that have been treated include all quarries, swamps, stagnant ponds, canals, drains, pits, and unused wells. In the absence of a preliminary survey or the means and time to undertake one to ascertain the actual breeding places of the known malaria-carrier *anopheles culicifacies*, it was necessary to treat alike all possible breeding places. In the course of these general operations, however, specimens were taken and the known carrier was found to be breeding in four localities, viz., (1) between Castle street and Cotta road, (2) behind the Victoria Golf Links, (3) the swamp adjoining Liveramentu cemetery, (4) near the junction of Greenlands road and Park road. All these localities have been exhaustively treated. Attention having been drawn to the possibility of mosquitoes breeding in the street gullies the Municipal Engineer has detailed a special gang for the continuous oiling of all gullies.

(3) The large swamps such as the Bloemendahl swamp and the quarries presented the chief difficulties, portions of the former are almost inaccessible, owing to the nature of the swamp, and it was found in the case of the quarries that the oil film tended to be blown to one side by the strong prevailing wind. The only satisfactory solution in the case of the quarries is to fill them up and the chief difficulties appear to be want of filling and the expense involved. In the case of the larger swamps a satisfactory solution has still to be found.

(4) The Member for Wellawatta made a very sound suggestion that the co-operation of the local authorities on our boundaries should be sought and that a zone should be established round the City which should be freed and kept free of mosquitoes by intensive measures. The Medical Officer of Health has from an early stage been in touch not only with the Medical Officers of adjoining Urban District Councils but with the anti-malaria branch of the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services and steps have already been taken to deal with likely breeding places within a zone of half a mile from the City limits, particular attention being paid to the numerous quarries in Dehiwala not far from those limits. The operation is, however, one that it would severely tax the resources of the local bodies concerned to carry out, and the Department of Medical and Sanitary Services has accordingly undertaken this work. The work which is now being carried on under the immediate direction of the Government Malarialogist consists in the careful examination of breeding places and the treatment of all those where *anopheles culicifacies* is found, commencing simultaneously from Hendala and Dehiwala and working south and north along the boundary.

(5) Whether owing to the preventive measures taken or to the comparative immunity from Malaria that the City of Colombo normally enjoys, the fact remains that the incidence of the disease among the resident population although abnormal for Colombo has been remarkably low as compared with adjoining areas. In the period December 12, 1934, to January 12, 1935, the total number of cases reported chiefly from Municipal dispensaries was 506 which works out at about 1.5 per 1,000 of the total population. These figures are, however, by no means exhaustive and a fairly liberal allowance must be made for cases treated by private medical practitioners and for cases treated by Ayurvedic methods. It is impossible to obtain complete figures as malaria is not a notifiable disease. With few exceptions the cases reported have occurred in Kotahena, Maradana, and Wellawatta Wards and even in those wards are for the most part confined to special localities. At the same time it must be stated that a good many cases treated at the dispensaries, although giving Colombo addresses, are not Colombo residents and in many other cases the infection is known to have been acquired outside Colombo.

(6) The treatment given in the Municipal dispensaries consists in atebri followed by quinine. Quinine is also supplied for prophylactic use, if desired, by members of any household in which a case has occurred. I am glad to be able to inform the Council that the number of fresh cases being reported shows a distinct diminution and the Medical Officer of Health is satisfied that there is no longer any likelihood of a more serious outbreak so far as Colombo is concerned. At the same time the number of relapses that are reported indicates the absolute necessity of continuing the preventive measures already taken for some time to come until any possibility of a recrudescence is finally removed. The total cost of the campaign including both preventive and curative measures is estimated at Rs. 10,000 per mensem and a supplementary vote of Rs. 30,000 will be laid before the appropriate Committees next week.

(7) With a view to assisting convalescent malarial patients discharged from the General Hospital to complete recovery and to relieve congestion in the hospital by enabling the discharge of such cases earlier than might otherwise have been possible, the Trustees of the Ceylon Social Service League applied to me for the use of the City Refuge at Mart road as a temporary convalescent hospital under its direction and that of the League's medical advisers. The Council will recollect that the League rendered valuable services during the floods of last year in the feeding of the refugees who were temporarily housed in the Refuge and I gladly agreed to their request on your behalf and also sanctioned in anticipation of the Council's approval the provision by the Municipality free of charge of certain services the cost of which will ultimately be charged to the supplementary vote on account of the epidemic which will be presented to the Council at its next meeting. The total number of cases admitted to the convalescent hospital up to date is 186 of which a good many have already been finally discharged to their homes completely recovered. Of the total admissions roughly half have been Colombo residents. The Council will, I have no doubt, very greatly appreciate the excellent work that is being carried out by the Social Service League in this connection, work in which the League has received valuable assistance from the Salvation Army, the Girl Guides, Toc H, and the Boy Scouts, as well as from numerous other social workers. Apart from the free services supplied by the Municipality, the hospital is entirely supported by voluntary contributions including a grant of Rs. 1,000 from the Central Malaria Relief Fund.

(8) As regards the relief of distress in homes afflicted by malaria, the situation is being carefully watched and relief is being afforded in kind to necessitous cases, the cost being met so far from a grant of Rs. 500 from the Central Relief Fund. The Charity Commissioner is in charge of the work and relief has already been administered in about 244 cases, of which the majority were described as " fever ", chiefly in the Wanathamulla, Maligawatta, Dematagoda, and Kotahena areas with a few cases in other parts of the City. Every deserving case reported to the Charity Commissioner, whether direct or by letter or by telephone, is attended to the same day.

(9) In conclusion I wish to say that the preventive measures that have been and are being carried out are for the most part temporary in their effect. Permanent measures are required if Colombo is to be safeguarded against the possibility of malarial infection in the future, and I propose to have a report on this important subject submitted to the Council for its consideration at an early date.

2. Pursuant to notice, Dr. E. A. Cooray asked the following questions which the Chairman answered :—

With reference to the statement by the Medical Officer of Health, dated December 20, 1934, and my minute thereon dated December 22, 1934, on the Malaria Epidemic, will the Chairman be pleased to state—

(1) Q.—In view of the statement by the Malariologist that *Anophele Varuna* found in the abandoned metal quarry pits near Pamankada road may be possible malaria-carriers, whether the Chairman will consult the appropriate Committee or Committees to consider what steps might be taken, besides the temporary measures of oiling, to permanently eradicate these abandoned pits of which there are over a dozen in Wellawatta Ward near Pamankada road, although the question of filling up all these pits was given up when pressed by me a few years ago, on the ground of expense and because it was stated at that time that there were no malarial carriers found in those pits? A.—Yes.

(2) Q.—Whether the Medical Officer of Health has been instructed to get into communication with the neighbouring U. D. C's as suggested in my minute under reference with a view to have their co-operation in dealing with abandoned pits and swamps in the areas immediately adjoining the City, by adopting permanent measures? If not, whether the Chairman will be pleased to take steps without delay to ask for the co-operation of the neighbouring U. D. C's as the presence of breeding grounds for malaria carriers in these areas is a source of great danger to the City? A.—The point is dealt with in the statement that has just been made.

(3) Q.—As it has been reported that the well known malaria-carrier *Anophele Culicifacies* has been found behind Havelock road, Liveramentu burial ground, Victoria Golf Links and between Cotta road, and Castle lane—all within Wellawatta Ward—whether the Chairman has taken or intends to take steps to permanently have these breeding grounds removed by filling up these swamps or by other suitable means beyond oiling, the effects of which are by no means permanent? A.—The question is a large one and will have to be considered by the Standing Committees and the Council.

3. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha :—“ That this Council, whilst denouncing the policy pursued by the Treasurer, of seizing trade implements, &c., of the Council's tenants, for a month's arrears of rates, whilst a deposit of three months' rent is available, as harsh and cruel, demands that this practice should be stopped forthwith.”

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved for permission to introduce the above motion at the next meeting of Council. This was agreed to.

4. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded. Carried.

KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on January 19, 1935, at 8 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated January 15, 1935.

Present :—Mr. E. T. Dyson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. W. Beven ; Mr. O. T. Nettelton ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser ; Mr. D. M. de S. Abhayanayake.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on December 15, 1934, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements for the 12 months ended December 31, 1934, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to November 30, 1934.

(c) Health Officer's report for December, 1934.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of December, 1934.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ended December 31, 1934.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during December, 1934. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. At the request of Mr. Wijayatilake, the Chairman read extracts from the Medical Officer of Health's report relating to the Malaria Epidemic and steps taken to afford treatment and relief.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Abhayanayake presented (1) petition dated December 31, 1934, signed by Mr. Habibu Mohammado and several others asking that they be released from payment of taxes on their properties in the villages of Siyambalagastenne, Nittawela, Mawilmada, &c.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented (2) petition dated January 17, 1935, from Mr. S. M. Mohideen submitting his claims for a transfer of beef stall No. 86.

Resolved to refer (1) to the Finance, and (2) to the Markets Committee.

4A. Correspondence :—Letter No. J 40/34 of January 15, 1935, from the Chief Secretary, inquiring whether the Council agrees to the appointment of Mr. H. P. Kaufmann as Chairman of the Kandy Municipal Council for a short period from about January 28 to March 2, 1935, on the same terms contained in letter No. I 163/31 of October 14, 1931, viz., pay and allowance amounting to Rs. 15,000 per annum.

Resolved to agree to the appointment on the terms stated.

5. Application from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for 7 months' furlough leave out of the Island from March 8 next.

Resolved that the leave be granted and the acting arrangements and inspections proposed in Municipal Electrical Engineer's letter of December 13, 1934, be approved and Rs. 200 be voted to meet cost of inspections by Messrs. Brown & Co.'s Engineer.

6. Recommendations of the Standing Committees :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on November 17, 1934.

(1) Papers *re* the unauthorized water connection made by the Maligawa authorities to the fountain. (C 81).—Recommended that meter be required for the fountain or the supply be cut off. (Item deferred from last General Meeting.)

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 15, 1934.

(2) Letter of November 17, 1934, from the Agent of the Mercantile Bank, applying for a reduction of the assessment of the Bank buildings in view of the fact that the upper floor of the building used as dwelling quarters by the Agent has been vacated and is unoccupied. (A/NT 59).—Recommended that a rebate be allowed from May 12, 1934, on the assessment of the dwelling flat at an annual value of Rs. 2,700. (Item deferred from the last General Meeting.)

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on November 17, 1934.

(3) Further letter dated November 7, 1934, from Mr. A. V. Perera in regard to his earlier application for lights to his bungalow in Lady Manning's drive. (F 76).—Recommended that the Municipal Council inform Mr. Perera that the extension of main to his house is not considered at present to be a commercial proposition. (Item deferred from the last General Meeting.)

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation held on December 15, 1934.

(4) Petition from Messrs. O. Naina Mohammed and O. Peer Mohammed applying for a reduction in the rent of the stalls in the Public Market which are used by them as sundry goods boutiques. (D/St 23 and 24).—Not recommended.

(5) Letter dated September 27, 1934, from Mr. S. Meera Mohideen, the licensee of stall No. 82, Public Market, stating that he is giving over the stock-in-trade of the stall to Mr. A. Mohammed Muthalib and asking that the licence of the stall be transferred in favour of the latter. (D/St 82).—Recommended.

(6) Letter dated November 29, 1934, from Mr. S. T. Fernando, the licensee of the fish stall at Mahaiyawa, stating that he has taken Mr. G. M. S. Aponsu into partnership and asking that the name of the latter be entered in the licence as joint licensee. (D 26).—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on December 15, 1934.

(7) Letter dated November 27, 1934, from Mr. Nigel I. Lee, Director, Kandy Hotels Co., Ltd., inquiring whether a reduction in the amount at present paid as taxes by the Queen's Hotel will be allowed if an entire wing of the hotel were closed.—Recommended that the Chairman should consider the possibility of assigning different assessment numbers to definite sections of the hotel.

(8) Claim from Mr. Fred G. Buultjens for Rs. 20 as his fee for reading files and conferring with counsel in connection with the case instituted against the Council by Mrs. A. V. Perera. (O 435).—Recommended.

(9) Application from Mr. W. A. de Alwis Seneviratne, Revenue Inspector, for a loan of Rs. 600 for the purpose of purchasing a secondhand motor car for his work.— Not recommended.

(10) Proposed terms for the hire of the Marquee recently purchased by the Council.—Recommended.

(11) Letter dated December 6, 1934, from the Honorary Secretary, Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary, asking for a supplementary vote of Rs. 100 on account of " Medicinal Herbs Purchases " in view of the likelihood of the vote provided for the purpose being exceeded owing to the prevailing malaria and dysentery epidemic.—Recommended supplementary vote for Rs. 115, the additional Rs. 15 representing the wages of a labourer for cleaning the herbs.

(12) Papers *re* the complaint made by the Municipal Electrical Engineer that the grievances of his staff in regard to salary and prospects have not been considered by the Special Committee on Municipal Salaries.—Recommended that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be informed that if he is able to show clearly that there are anomalies reacting unfairly on his department, such cases could be considered on their merits but that in general the decisions of the Salaries Committee which have been adopted by Council cannot be varied.

(13) Letter dated November 19, 1934, from the Director of Agriculture, stating that a great deal of inconvenience is being experienced by the officers of his department for want of regular water supply and asking for Council's approval to engage three labourers at a wage of 50 cents per diem for each for the purpose of drawing water from a well and supplying the bungalows.—Recommended vote for Rs. 159 to meet wages of labourers as from September 17, 1934.

(14) To obtain sanction for a vote for Rs. 345.57 to meet the loss on unserviceable articles found in the Municipal Stores disposed of in terms of Municipal Council Resolution of April 21, 1934.—Recommended.

(15) To obtain approval for the transfer of Rs. 75 under Head 10, Estimate 34, Maintenance of Fountains, to Head 10, Estimate 36, Removal of Moss from the reservoir.—Recommended.

(16) To obtain supplementary votes under the following estimates :—Head 8 (a), Estimate 1b—Upkeep of Pavements, Rs. 82 ; (b) Estimate 3—Alutgantota and Lady Anderson roads, Rs. 150 ; (c) Estimate 4—Udawattakele roads, Rs. 250 ; (d) Estimate 19—Repairs to Approach road to Lewella ferry, Rs. 36. Head 23 (e), Estimate 48—Constructing side drain in Matale road, Rs. 25 ; (f) Estimate 45/31—Constructing Night Soil depots, Rs. 10.—Recommended.

(17) Application from the Municipal Engineer for an additional vote of Rs. 900 for supply of water by cart during the drought.—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on December 15, 1934.

(18) Papers *re* tenders received for the construction of drains at Mahaiyawa Model Tenements. (W/M 210).—Recommended acceptance of Mr. B. William's tender.

(19) Application from the Municipal Engineer for permission to carry out the remainder of the work of repairing drains at the Mahaiyawa Labour Lines on tender rates, the total expenditure not exceeding the balance amount of Rs. 1,700.50 of the vote of Rs. 2,125 provided for the purpose. (W/M 19/34).—Recommended.

(20) Application from the Proprietor of the Royal Theatre, Katukelle, for a water service to the theatre premises.—Recommended a metered service.

(21) To obtain approval for the construction of earth closet for the house put up on land at the head of the lake for the use of Miss M. S. Fernando and other members of her family and to utilize the sum of Rs. 20 available in the vote provided by the Council for putting up a dwelling house for them for the purpose.—Recommended.

(22) Application dated November 1, 1934, from the President of the Y. W. C. A. for the lease of land belonging to the Council in Gregory road for the construction of a Hostel and Hall. (O 555).—Recommended.

Resolutions of the Council on the Standing Committee—Recommendations :—

Resolution on item (1). Mr. Wijayatilake moved—That the supply be allowed free of charge. Mr. Abhayanayake seconded.—Carried.

Resolution on item (3). Mr. Wijayatilake moved—That the overhead main be extended to enable Mr. Perera to obtain a connection to his bungalow and the sum of Rs. 4.40 as per Municipal Electrical Engineer's estimate of September 27, 1934, be voted for the purpose. Mr. Abhayanayake seconded.—Carried.

Resolution on item (7). Resolved to reply in the negative as the Chairman is of opinion that the building cannot be separated into self-contained units for purposes of separate assessments.

Resolution on item (9). Resolved to grant the loan on the usual terms.

Resolution on items (2), (4) to (6), (8) and (10) to (22). Resolved that the recommendations be adopted, the terms of lease under item (22) being the same as in the first lease to the Young Men's Muslim Association.

7. Supplemental Budget No. 3 of 1934.

Resolved that the Supplemental Budget be adopted.

8. To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 500 to meet the expenditure in connection with the recent case of smallpox.

Resolved that the vote be granted.

9. To consider final arrangements in regard to the new fair market area at the Market Grounds. Market Renter's letter dated January 17, 1935, was read.

Resolved to vote Rs. 95 for provision of lights in the new area.

10. To consider Chairman's proposal for the appointment of a 4th Distraining Inspector temporarily to expedite action on the outstanding arrears, the pay of the three Distraining Inspectors being divided among the four of them.

Resolved to defer consideration and in the meanwhile circulate a statement showing the work done by the Distraining Inspectors for the last six months.

11. Acting Municipal Engineer's letter dated January 18, 1935, asking for a supplementary vote for the supply of water during the drought.

Resolved that a vote of Rs. 1,500 be allowed.

12. To obtain sanction for the following excess expenditure on votes for the year 1934 amounting to Rs. 433.38 :—

 (b) Special Committee to consider village improvements, specially road improvements, and to make its recommendations to the Works Committee : Ratwatte Adigar, Messrs. Soysa and Abhayanayake.
 (c) Special Committee to go into the question of reconstructing the Public Market, and to submit definite proposals to the Council for the purpose : Ratwatte Adigar, Mr. O. T. Nettelton, Mr. Abhayanayake, Dr. de Kretser, and the Chairman.
 (d) Special Committee to formulate a Playground Scheme for Kandy : Messrs. De Silva, Wijayatilake, and Ismail.

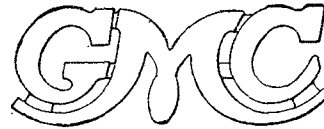
