H. Z. Fernando seconded subject to the substitution of the word “rents” for the word “rates” at the end of second line.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha agreed to this.

The Chairman explained the facts.

Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved, as an amendment, that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees.

Resolved that the matter be referred to the Four Standing Committees.

3. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of January 21, 1935, were considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER’S DEPARTMENT.

(18) With regard to the proposal to convert one of the vacant stalls in the Kotahena Market for the sale of pork, to consider :—(a) A report of the Municipal Treasurer stating that the Medical Officer of Health has no objection to a pork stall in this market and that he recommends that a vacant stall near the fish section be let for the sale of pork. (b) Plan and estimate from the Municipal Engineer. Registered No. 1,771.—Recommended :—(a) That the resolution of Council of March 12, 1924, viz., “that no pork stall be sanctioned at the existing meat stalls at Kotahena Market” be rescinded. (b) That one of the vacant stalls near the fish section in the Kotahena Market be converted at an estimated cost of Rs. 175 for the purpose of letting it for the sale of pork.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

ANNEXURE B.

MUNICIPAL PENSION RULES (PROPOSED AMENDMENTS.)

Delete the word "thirty-six" and substitute the word "sixty" instead with footnote, in Rule 2 (c)—*Thirty-six months in the case of female employees appointed before—

Delete sub-sections (1), (2) and (3) of section 2A and substitute therefor sub-section (1) as follows :—

2A. 1 (i.) An officer to whom a pension or annuity is granted under these rules may at his option, be paid, in lieu of such pension, a pension at the rate of three-fourths of such pension, together with a gratuity equal to ten times the annual value of the reduction so made in the pension.

(ii.) The option referred to above is exercisable not later than the date of retirement.

Provided that in a case where an order of retirement is retrospective in its effect the officer may exercise his option within two months of the date on which the order of retirement is communicated to him.

Provided further that the Council may authorize the acceptance of an option received at a date later than the date herein prescribed, if it is established that an officer was prevented by causes not within his control from exercising the option by the prescribed date, but in no case shall an option be accepted after a retired officer has begun to draw pension or annuity.

(iii.) The date of the exercise of the option shall be deemed to be the date of the receipt of an officer's written notification by the Chairman.

Re-number the existing sub-sections (4) and (5) as (2) and (3).

Insert the following proviso at the end of para 1 in rule 6 :—

" Provided that where an officer retires within three years of his promotion to a higher class or grade, he shall have the option of claiming either a pension calculated in manner aforesaid or a pension calculated on the salary he would have been receiving had he not been promoted to the higher class or grade."

Delete the words “(55 years)” in existing rule 13.

Delete existing pension rule 18 (1) and 18 (2), and substitute the following:—

18A. (i.) An Officer transferred after the date of the passing of this rule to or from the service of the Municipal Council from or to any other public service whose aggregate service would have qualified him, had it been wholly under the Council, for a pension under these rules, may, if he has served for a period of at least 12 months in a pensionable office under the Council on his retirement from the public service in circumstances in which he is permitted by the law or regulations of the service in which he is last employed to retire on pension or gratuity, be granted a pension of such an amount as shall bear the same proportion to the amount of pension for which he would have been eligible had his service been wholly under the Council as the aggregate amount of his pensionable emoluments during his service under the Council shall bear to the aggregate amount of his pensionable emoluments throughout his public service.

(ii.) In determining for the purposes of this section the pension for which an officer would have been eligible if his service had been wholly under the Council,

(a) the final pensionable emoluments taken shall be those of his last period of service calculated in accordance with the rules applicable thereto;

(b) no regard shall be had to rules 5 and 22;

(c) regard shall be had to the condition that pension may not exceed two-thirds of the final pensionable emoluments;

(d) no period of other public service under any Government, local Government public body, or other employing authority which does not grant a pension or gratuity to the officer shall be taken into account.

(iii.) For the purposes of this section—

(a) The aggregate amount of his pensionable emoluments shall be taken as the total amount of salary which the officer would have drawn and the total amount of the other pensionable emoluments which he would have enjoyed had he been or duty on full pay in his substantive office or offices throughout his period of public service subsequent to the attainment of the age of 16 years.

Provided that in calculating the aggregate amount of his pensionable emoluments no account shall be taken of any service under any Government, local Government public body, or other employing authority which does not grant the officer a pension or gratuity.

(b) The expression “public service” includes employment under the Crown or under a local Government public body in Ceylon which has adopted a scheme for payment of pensions to its servants.

(iv.) Where an officer who has been transferred from other public service and whose aggregate service would have qualified him, had it been wholly under the Council to retire on pension under these rules, is compulsorily retired from the service of the Council on abolition of office, he may, be granted from the funds of the Council in addition to the pension granted to him under this rule an addition to pension equal to 1-720th of his final pensionable emoluments for each complete period of four months' service included in the calculation of the pension for which he would have been eligible had the whole of his service been under the Council.

Provided that the number of 720ths of final pensionable emoluments grantable as addition to pension under the first part of this sub-section shall not exceed the number of months by which the officer's age at retirement falls short of 55 years or 60-720ths, whichever is less.

Provided further that the officer who is thus retired shall be liable to be recalled to the service of the Council for re-employment.

(v.) An officer, who has been transferred to other public service from a pensionable post under this Council and has retired from other public service before completing ten years public service in all in circumstances in which he is permitted by the law or regulations of the service in which he is last employed to retire on pension or gratuity, may be awarded a gratuity calculated in accordance with rule 2 based upon his salary and total length of service under the Council.

ANNEXURE C.

LEAVE BY-LAWS APPLICABLE TO MUNICIPAL OFFICERS AND SERVANTS APPOINTED TO THE MUNICIPAL SERVICE ON AND AFTER JANUARY 1, 1935.

1 (N. E.) to 5 (N. E.) As in existing by-laws 1 to 5.

6 (N. E.) Periods of leave to be granted by Chairman and Council.

It shall be lawful for the Chairman to grant leave to all Officers and servants of the Council, provided that no leave for a period exceeding one month on full pay or half-pay or both shall be granted by the Chairman without sanction of the Council.

7 (N. E.) and 8 (N. E.) As in existing By-laws 7 and 8.

9 (N. E.) *Annual Full Pay Leave*.—Vacation leave on full pay may be granted for periods not exceeding one month in respect of any year.

10 (N. E.) *Accumulation*.—(i.) Vacation leave may be accumulated for two years only, and subject to the requirements of the service, an officer will be allowed accumulated vacation leave for not more than two months in respect of the leave due to him for the year preceding and the year in which he takes the leave.

Vacation leave may be accumulated for three years for purposes of leave out of the Island, other than leave preparatory to retirement.

(ii.) An officer who has taken his accumulated vacation leave of two months in any year may nevertheless, subject to section (11) be granted one month's vacation leave in the following year.

(iii.) If an officer requires leave in any year on account of sickness or on other reasonable grounds beyond the period of vacation and accumulated vacation leave for which he is eligible, he may at the discretion of the Council be granted whatever lapsed vacation leave he may have available in respect of his past service provided such lapsed leave does not exceed two months in all.

(iv.) As in existing by-law 10 (iv.).

11 (N. E.) “*Continuous Duty*” Rule.—As a general rule, officers will be required to perform nine and eighteen months continuous duty before vacation leave on full pay for one month and two months respectively can be granted to them.

12 (N. E.) As in existing by-law 12.

13 (N. E.) As in existing by-law 13.

14 (N. E.) *Casual Leave*.—Short periods of leave, not exceeding seven days in any year may be granted to an officer by the Chairman, provided that such officer can be conveniently spared from his duties. Such leave is not accumulative, and in no case can it be granted to prolong the period for which the ordinary leave is granted. Such leave will not be counted in calculating the amount of vacation leave on full pay for which an officer is eligible when he is proceeding on long leave.

15 (N. E.) As in existing by-law 15.

16 (N. E.) *Calculation of Casual and Vacation Leave*.—In calculating casual or vacation leave to be spent in the Island or in South India, Sundays and holidays need not be included and the equivalent of one month's and two month's leave should be reckoned as 24 and 48 working days respectively except in the case of officers of departments who are required to work seven days in the week when one month's and two months' leave should be reckoned as 28 days and 56 days respectively. In calculating vacation leave to be spent out of the Island (except South India) Sundays and holidays must be included, the equivalent of 3 months' leave being reckoned as 91 days.

17 (N. E.) (i.) *Leave to Minor Employees.*—Minor employees classed in scales 15 to 19 (inclusive) of the Salaries Scheme sanctioned on November 7, 1934 (excluding firemen and motormen of the Fire Brigade and Ambulance Department) may be granted short periods of casual leave on full pay not exceeding seven days in any calendar year.

Provided that in the case of illness the leave may be allowed up to the maximum of seven days.

(ii.) As in existing by-law 17 (ii.).

(iii.) As in existing by-law 17 (iii.).

17A (N. E.) (i.) *Leave to Daily-paid Employees.*—Any daily-paid Overseer or Sub-overseer who has served the Council satisfactorily for two years and upwards may, upon the recommendation of the Head of the Department in which he is employed for the time being, be granted leave on full-pay not exceeding seven days in any one calendar year.

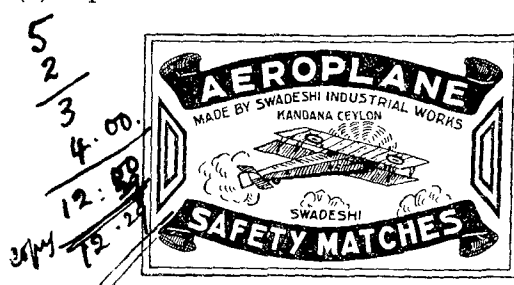
