ORDINANCE, 1909.

REGULATION under section 9 of the Contagious Diseases (Animals) Ordinance, 1909, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by the said section 9 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

REGULATION.

The regulations published by Notification in the *Gazette* of February 27, 1925, are hereby amended in the regulations under the heading "I.—Regulations relating to Cattle and Animal Diseases."—

(1) by the substitution of the following new regulation for regulation 9 :—

"9. (a) Any officer appointed under the Ordinance, who is authorized in writing by the Government Agent for the purpose, or any other person so authorized may destroy—

- (i.) any animals or cattle affected with any disease other than tuberculosis ;
- (ii.) any animals or cattle suspected to be affected with any disease other than tuberculosis ;
- (iii.) any animals or cattle affected with tuberculosis ; and
- (iv.) any animals or cattle suspected to be affected with tuberculosis.

(b) No animal or head of cattle falling within class (iii.) or (iv.) of paragraph (a) shall be destroyed until the market value of such animal or head of cattle has been agreed upon in writing between the Government Agent and the owner of such animal or head of cattle, or where they are unable so to agree, until such market value has been determined by some person appointed by the Government Agent. Such person shall give to the Government Agent and to the owner a certificate in writing of the market value of such animal or head of cattle as determined by him. The cost of any valuation under this paragraph shall be borne by the Government Agent subject to the provisions in that behalf in regulation 10A (c), (i.) and (ii.).

(c) For the purposes of these regulations, the "market value" of any animal or head of cattle shall be the price which might reasonably have been obtained from a purchaser in the open market who had no knowledge of the existence or suspected existence in such animal or head of cattle of the disease, except such knowledge thereof as might reasonably have been obtained by inspection of such animal or head of cattle." ;

(2) by the substitution of the following for paragraphs (a) and (b) of regulation 10 :—

"10. (a) Where any animals or cattle falling within class (i.) of regulation 9 (a) have been so destroyed, no compensation shall be paid to the owner in respect of such animals or cattle.

(b) Where any animals or cattle falling within class (ii.) of regulation 9 (a) have been so destroyed, compensation as provided in paragraph (c) of this regulation shall be paid to the owner out of moneys voted by the State Council." ;

(3) in paragraph (c) of regulation 10, by the substitution for the words "animal or dog" wherever those words occur collectively in that paragraph, of the words "or animal" ; and

(4) by the insertion of the following new regulation 10A between regulation 10 and regulation 11 :—

"10A. (a) Where any animal or head of cattle falling within class (iii.) or (iv.) of regulation 9 (a) has been destroyed a post-mortem examination, at which the owner of such animal or head of cattle may be present in person or by a representative, shall be held by an officer of the Government Veterinary Department.

(b) At the conclusion of such examination, a certificate of the result of the examination shall be given to the Government Agent and to the owner or his representative by the officer who carried out the examination.

(c) Compensation out of moneys voted by the State Council shall be paid to the owner for the destruction of any animal or head of cattle falling within class (iii.) or (iv.) of regulation 9 (a) at the following rates :—

- (i.) if the certificate shows that the animal or head of cattle was suffering from tuberculosis, not being advanced tuberculosis, a sum equal to three-fourths of the market value of the animal or head of cattle, after deducting from such sum half the cost of any valuation under regulation 9 (b) shall be paid ;
- (ii.) if the certificate shows that the animal or head of cattle was suffering from advanced tuberculosis, a sum equal to one-fourth of the market value of the animal or head of cattle, after deducting from such sum half the cost of any valuation under regulation 9 (b) shall be paid ;
- (iii.) if the certificate shows that the animal or head of cattle was not suffering from tuberculosis a sum equal to the market value of the animal or head of cattle shall be paid.

(d) For the purpose of this regulation an animal or a head of cattle shall be deemed to have been suffering from advanced tuberculosis—

- (i.) when there is Miliary tuberculosis of both lungs, or
- (ii.) when lesions of tuberculosis are present on both the pleura and peritoneum, or
- (iii.) when lesions of tuberculosis are present in the muscular system or in the lymphatic glands embedded in or between the muscles or where the infection of the lymphatic gland is sufficient to indicate that the disease is widespread, or
- (iv.) when in addition to the presence of lesions of tuberculosis in the respiratory and digestive tracts there are also lesions present in the substance or membranes of any two of the following :—spleen, kidney, uterus, ovary, testicle, brain, and spinal cord."



## THE IRRIGATION ORDINANCE, No. 45 OF 1917.

*Scheme for the Improvement of Village Irrigation Works.*

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to complete the following items of work free of all charges, namely, 250 cubes of earthwork in bund raising to level 113.35 with 6 feet top width and 2 to 1 side slopes, all such work being in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent.

(3) The proprietors further agree that in the event of any default on the part of any of them in contributing any uncommutable labour due under this scheme, the Government Agent may cause such labour to be performed by any other person and recover the cost thereof in the manner prescribed in Chapter VIII. of the Ordinance.

## RULE.

Rule 27 of the rules for the management and regulation of the Post Office Savings Bank deemed by virtue of section 94 of the Ceylon Post Office Ordinance, 1908, to have been made under that Ordinance, and published by Notification in the *Gazette* of December 29, 1893, is hereby deleted and the following substituted therefor:—

27. The Postmaster-General shall furnish the Trustees immediately after the end of every month with an account showing as on the last day of such month—

- the general fund of the Post Office Savings Bank and the securities in which it is invested in the names of the Trustees;
- the sum in the custody of the Postmaster-General and the bank in which it is deposited;
- the sum in the custody of the Trustees and the bank in which it is deposited; and
- the total amount in the hands of Postmasters.

## THE CEYLON TELEGRAPH ORDINANCE, 1908.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 7 of the Ceylon Telegraph Ordinance, 1908, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, and declared under the proviso to sub-section (6) of the said section 7 to be in force from March 15, 1935.

## RULES.

1. These rules may be cited as the Indo-Ceylon Telephone Rules.

2. (1) The unit period of conversation in the case of an Indian trunk call shall be three minutes and the call shall be terminated at the end of such period unless the caller has booked two unit periods in advance when he shall be advised of the lapse of the first unit period at the end of which he shall have the option of terminating the call.

(2) The maximum duration to be allowed on one call shall be six minutes. Provided, however, that in case of pressure, calls may be limited to one unit period only.

(3) No caller shall engage the trunk line for more than one call at a time to the exclusion of any other caller who may desire to use the trunk line or any portion thereof.

3. The fee to be charged for a telephone trunk call to India for each unit period of conversation or part thereof shall be made up as follows:—

(1) In respect of the section of trunk line in Ceylon up to Talaimannar, an amount calculated at the rates prescribed in rule 1 (i.) published by Notification in the *Gazette* of December 21, 1934.

(2) In respect of the section of trunk line in Submarine cable between Talaimannar in Ceylon and Rameswaram in India, Re. 1.

(3) In respect of the section of trunk line in India beyond Rameswaram—

(a) for any distance not exceeding 100 miles, an amount calculated at a rate equal in Ceylon currency to 3 annas for each unit of 12½ miles;

(b) for any distance in excess of 100 miles, an amount calculated as aforesaid for the first 100 miles, together with an amount calculated at a rate equal in Ceylon currency to 2 annas for each unit of 12½ miles of the excess.

Provided however—

(i.) that the odd cents forming part of any such amount shall be rounded off to the nearest multiple of 25 cents.

(ii.) that the fee payable in respect of this section shall not in any case exceed a maximum equal in Ceylon currency to Rs. 10 9 as., and

(iii.) that on calls made on Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and the King's Birthday, the charge in respect of this section shall be at one-half of the rate prescribed.

4. (1) The fee chargeable in respect of a personal call on the Indian trunk line, that is to say, a call to a particular person at the called number, to be specified by the caller at the time of booking the call, shall be the ordinary trunk fee prescribed in rule 3 together with a personal charge of one-quarter of such fee rounded off to the nearest multiple of 5 cents. The personal charge shall be levied on the first unit period of conversation only. Provided, however, that the personal charge leviable for any call on the Indian section of the trunk line on Sundays, Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, and the King's Birthday shall be one-fourth of the full trunk fee due on such section under paragraph (3) of rule 3.

(2) In the case of a personal call—

(a) The caller shall have the option of giving two names at the called number at the time of booking a call. A caller shall also have the option of naming an alternative number at the same place in which case the number at which the called person is more likely to be found shall be mentioned first. The call shall be treated as effective if either of the named persons is obtained at either of the numbers given.



(b) If the number or particular person called refuses a trunk connection after being rung up, the charge provided for an ordinary call of three minutes' duration shall be made against the caller.

(c) Only the personal charge and any reduced Disturbance Fee prescribed by Notification in the *Gazette* of September 13, 1912, in respect of Ceylon Exchanges shall be levied in the following cases:—

(i.) If there is no answer from the calling number after the called number has been secured.

(ii.) When the call is ineffective due to the caller giving a wrong number.

(iii.) When the called person is unobtainable after communication has been established with the called number.

(d) Only the reduced Disturbance Fee prescribed by Notification in the *Gazette* of September 13, 1912, in respect of Ceylon Exchanges shall be levied in the following cases:—

(i.) When there is no answer from the called number.

(ii.) When the call is cancelled after it has been passed to the Controlling Exchange in India and before the attention of the called subscriber has been obtained.

(e) No charge shall be made in the following cases:—

(i.) When the called line or calling line after booking a call gets out of order.

(ii.) When a called number has been disconnected.

5. Telephone Trunk Calls to India shall be available between the hours of 10 A.M. and 6.30 P.M. on week days and 8 A.M. and 10 A.M. on Sundays and Ceylon Post Office holidays from such exchanges and call offices as shall be determined by the Postmaster-General. The disturbance fees prescribed by Notification in the *Gazette* of September 13, 1912, shall be payable on calls made from and through exchanges and call offices in Ceylon which are closed during any part of the periods mentioned.

6. Calls shall be put through in the order in which the trunk lines concerned become disengaged.

7. The commencement of a call shall be timed from the moment the called number is placed in communication with the calling number. A call shall be regarded as effective even though the person calling is not able to communicate with the actual person required at the called number. Provided, however, that a personal call shall be timed from the moment the specified person answers and is placed in communication with the caller.

8. (1) If a call cannot be effected owing to the called number refusing trunk connection after being rung up, the call shall be treated as effective and the full charge made against the calling number.

(2) When a call is non-effective owing to any of the following reasons, Disturbance Fees in respect of Ceylon exchanges shall be payable at the reduced rate prescribed by Notification in the *Gazette* of September 13, 1912:—

(a) When the attention of the called subscriber cannot be obtained;

(b) When a call is to an Indian Public Call Office and the person required is not there to receive it;

(c) When a call is cancelled after it has been passed to the controlling exchange on the Indian side and before the attention of the called subscriber has been obtained.

9. (1) In the case of Indian trunk calls taken from a call office, all charges shall be prepaid.

(2) No Indian trunk call originating from a subscriber's own telephone shall be put through unless that subscriber has deposited as security with the Post Office exchange with which his telephone is connected—

(a) in the first instance, the sum of Rs. 25, and

(b) if at any time the average amount due from that subscriber in respect of two weeks' Indian trunk calls exceeds Rs. 25, an amount equal to that average.

10. Bills on account of Indian trunk calls will be rendered weekly and subscribers shall settle them in full within seven days, failing which Indian trunk facilities shall be withdrawn without further notice. Inland trunk facilities may also be withdrawn until any outstanding Indian trunk account is settled, in addition to any other steps the Postmaster-General may take under the relevant conditions in the Telephone Agreement.

The type of all packages and linings shall be declared together with the weight or gauge of the linings, and except in the case of Fannings and Dusts the absence of any declaration to the contrary in the case of Lead-lined packages shall imply that suitable paper linings is used between the Tea and Lead."

5. *Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale of Rubber—Appendix "H".*—The following bye-laws numbered 16 to 33 were substituted for the present bye-laws numbered 16 to 38 governing contracts for Standard Quality:—

16. A Standard Qualities Committee shall be appointed consisting of eight persons of whom four shall be sellers of rubber elected by ballot by sellers only being members of the Association and four shall be buyers of rubber elected by the Colombo Rubber Buyer's Association.

17. The Standard Qualities Committee shall have power at any time and from time to time to fill any vacancy occurring on the Standard Qualities Committee, by the appointment of any partner, director, manager, or employee of a firm or company which is a member of the Association, but any person so appointed by the Committee shall only hold office until the next ballot for members of the Committee.

18. On the 31st December in each year, two members of the Standard Qualities Committee shall retire from office. The members to retire shall be the members who have been the longest in office and as between members of equal seniority, the members to retire shall be selected from among them by lot.

19. The vacancies to be caused by the retirement of members appointed by the Standard Qualities Committee during the year as provided in Rule 17 hereof, and by the retirement in rotation of two members of Committee as provided in Rule 18 hereof shall be filled during the month of December in each year in accordance with Rule 16.

20. Retiring members of the Standard Qualities Committee shall be eligible for re-election and a list of the names of such Committee indicating the names of those members to retire in accordance with these rules, shall be circulated with notice of the annual ballot.

21. The Standard Qualities Committee shall elect its own Chairman and Deputy Chairman from among its members, one of whom shall preside at all meetings of the Committee. The Chairman presiding at any meeting shall, in the event of an equality of voting on any matter brought before the Committee, have a second or casting vote.

22. Any member of the Standard Qualities Committee who shall absent himself from five consecutive meetings shall cease to be a member of the Committee.

23. The Standard Qualities Committee shall meet at the office of the Association at such time and notice as the occasion may require.

24. At any meetings, a quorum shall consist of not less than three members.

25. The individual members of the Standard Qualities Committee may receive such remuneration as shall be decided upon by the Committee of the Association.

26. It shall be the aim of the Standard Qualities Committee to establish a Standard Quality for Crepe and Sheet and for this purpose the following standards and relative conditions have been adopted:—

(a) Ceylon Standard First Latex Crepe shall be well prepared dry rubber of good quality, of even pale colour, and free from all stains, spots or traces of oxidization.

(b) Ceylon Standard Ribbed Smoked Sheet shall be clean tough rubber, free from mould, rust, dampness, under or oversmoked sheets and not massed. Slight traces of air bubbles may be allowed subject to the discretion of the Standard Qualities Committee.

(c) Lots of a mixed character (from various estates) bulked into one parcel shall not constitute Standard Quality, and in all cases estate names must be furnished.

(d) The Standard Qualities Committee shall have power to vary the foregoing standards in accordance with prevailing conditions.

(e) Only rubber which is for tender as Standard Quality, and not rubber which has been tendered as such, shall be submitted for adjudication by the Standard Qualities Committee.

(f) An award by the Standard Qualities Committee shall remain in force for a period of 16 running days from the date of the award (and no rubber shall be catalogued or sold in auction as bearing such award).

(g) An award or arbitration over the matter of Standard Quality shall only be valid for the purpose of transactions under these Bye-laws and Conditions of Sale if made by members of the Standard Qualities Committee.

27. Only members of the Association may submit lots for award. ## KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on February 16, 1935, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated February 12, 1935.

*Present* :—Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. O. T. Nettleton; Mr. D. M. de S. Abhayanayake.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on January 19, 1935, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1934 to January, 1935, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to December 31, 1934.

(c) Health Officer's report for January, 1935.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of January, 1935.

(e) Reservoir readings for the week ended February 16, 1935.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this Meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, stamp presses and house service taps inspected during January, 1935. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Soysa presented (1) petition from Mr. D. D. Jayasooriya dated February 8, 1935, praying for the restoration of warm water bathing facilities near the Power Station.

Mr. Abhayanayake presented (2) petition from Mr. S. Rajaratnam and several others dated February 7, 1935, asking the Council to maintain in a proper state of repair the path branching off from Kandy-Haragama road to Mahaweliganga in Talwatte; (3) petition from Mr. E. Dias and several others dated February 13, 1935, stating that the Gansabhawa path in Dodanwela is in a state of disrepair and asking that it be attended to; (4) petition from Mr. Cyril Jayawardane dated February 1, 1935, suggesting that the Council should take over the maintenance of Bogambara recreation grounds from the Kandy Sports Club; (5) petition from Mr. Una Assen dated February 13, 1935, stating that he was entitled to preference in the matter of the licence for running a beef stall at Ampitiya; (6) petition from the Bose Sangam dated February 16, 1935, inquiring on what grounds Government has disapproved of the grant of Rs. 50 proposed to be made by the Council towards their free reading room.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented (7) petition from the vegetable traders dated February 14, 1935, pointing out the inconvenience they undergo in the new Fair Market area and asking for permission to occupy the former site.

Mr. Soysa presented (8) petition from K. O. M. Mohammed Othuman & Bros., and other traders in Castle Hill street stating that the Police do not allow buses to halt opposite their boutiques to load and unload goods, and

Mr. Abhayanayake presented (9) petition from Mr. S. Rajaratnam and several others in Hewahetta-Talwatta, dated February 15, 1935, asking that the revised assessments be not enforced until the people are relieved from malaria and the trade depression.

The Chairman agreed to refer the petition to the Heads of Departments concerned for report and to take necessary action.

5. Correspondence :—Copy of letter addressed by the Hon. the Chief Secretary to Mr. T. A. Hodson informing him that he has been appointed as Chairman of the Kandy Municipal Council, in addition to his own duties as Government Agent, Central Province, from February 7, 1935, in succession to Mr. E. T. Dyson.—Tabled.

5A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake asked :—Will the Chairman be pleased to state what steps have been taken to improve the path leading from near the Railway Station to the Deyannewela road, Kandy?

The Chairman replied as follows :—A vote of Rs. 500 was granted for improvements to this path in the Budget for 1934. It was necessary to take over three blocks of private land before the improvement could be effected. The survey plans of the three blocks were completed on September 1, 1934, and the owner of the first block was approached by the Acting Municipal Engineer with a view to secure the land free. The owner refused it. The matter could not be proceeded with further by the acting Municipal Engineer owing to pressure of work. A revote of the amount is now asked for and necessary steps will be taken and if acquisition becomes necessary I shall bring the matter before the Council for a supplementary vote.

5B. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Wijayatilake moved :—“That the Council do take immediate steps to build a further section of the Meda-ela”. Mr. Ismail seconded.

The Chairman referred to an estimate prepared in 1930, for Rs. 46,500, and the Council agreed to ask Government for assistance to carry out the work.

## GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, February 15, 1935, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated January 9, 1935.

*Present* :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Mr. S. N. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. C. H. Bradley; and (by invitation in connection with item 3) Capt. S. G. Nottley, Superintendent of Police.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting held on January 12 and of the Special Meeting held on January 28, 1935, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read, and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, and one by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya. The Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. With the permission of the Council the following item on the agenda was first taken up for consideration—

To consider what action should be taken to relieve the present congestion at the Bus Stand in Main street :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

After an informal discussion in Committee Council resumed, and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo moved that a new bus stand be constructed on the site proposed by the Chairman, *i.e.*, on the Minor Esplanade alongside China Garden Front road. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded. Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that consideration of the matter be deferred and that a sub-committee be appointed to investigate the question of a suitable site and report to the Council. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka spoke in favour of the motion. The Chairman said that he had carefully considered the matter and in his opinion the site suggested by him was the only possible one. He did not, however, wish to discourage the mover of the amendment, and if the members desired to think the matter over he had no objection to a postponement. The amendment was first put to the meeting and declared lost—5 voting for and six against.

At this stage Mr. E. M. Karunaratna rose to a point of order and objected to the motion being put to the meeting on the ground that sufficient notice of the question at issue has not been given to the members. The objection was overruled by the Chairman.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried by 6 votes to 4.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka asked the following questions :—(1) What is the generating cost of a unit of electricity? (2) What is the standing cost of a unit of electricity? (3) What is the amount paid by the General Revenue for a unit of electricity for street lighting?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) 8½ cents. (2) 12¼ cents. (3) The General Revenue pays the Electricity Department 25 cents per unit on an assessed basis for street lighting.

5. The Chairman moved, in terms of Rule 14 of the Municipal Pension minute, the grant of an additional pension of Rs. 81·82 per annum with effect from January 1, 1935, to Mr. O. L. Jansz in respect of his services as Cemetery-keeper from May 1, 1920, to December 31, 1934. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

6. To submit letter No. G. A. 1,606/34 from the Superintendent of Police, S. P., on the question of the beggar nuisance in Galle :—Submitted.

7. To consider an estimate of Rs. 200 for the construction of two permanent sheds to be used as stores—one at the rear and one on the side of the Municipal Engineer's Office :—Resolved that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote be sanctioned for the purpose.

8. To consider what action should be taken to accord a fitting reception to His Excellency the Governor on the occasion of his forthcoming visit to Galle on March 18 and 19.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

*Council in Committee.*

Council in Committee recommended (1) that an illuminated address enclosed in a suitable casket be presented to His Excellency the Governor at the Pavilion; (2) that a sum of Rs. 600 be voted for the necessary expenses; (3) that a sub-committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. D. I. Durham, and Mr. A. M. Saheed be appointed to draft the address.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

9. To consider the supplemental Budget for 1934 :—Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

10. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 19, 1935.*

(2) To consider 8 applications for water service.—Recommended that applications be allowed.



(3) To consider the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 625 for improvements to the approach road to the Victoria Park.—Recommended.

(b) Rs. 400 for chlorination of water mains.—Recommended.

(c) Rs. 255·86 being Factory Estimates No. 419 for supplying the following enamelled licence plates for issue in 1936 :—1,000 private cart plates, 200 hiring rickshaw plates, and 25 private rickshaw plates.—Recommended.

(d) Rs. 276·75 for providing an electric light on the road connecting Hallsroad with Talapitiyaroad.—Recommended that the estimate be passed and that a supplemental vote be sanctioned for the purpose.

(5) To consider Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka's motion at the General Meeting of Council of November 24, 1934, viz., that the electric lighting scheme be extended to the Gintota Bridge and to the Kalegana area.—Recommended that detailed estimates be prepared accordingly and that in addition an estimate be prepared for the extension of the electric lighting scheme along Morris road from Labuduwa Junction to Milidduwa.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of January 19, 1935.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 2, 5A, and 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) To consider the following applications :—(a) Application from G. L. Hinni Babun, Overseer, Rat Campaign, to be placed on an incremental scale of salary and to have his post declared pensionable.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(b) Application from M. J. Don Alexander, Peon in charge of the Circulating work of the Council, for a bicycle allowance.—Recommended by 2 votes to one the payment of a bicycle allowance of Rs. 2·50 per mensem with effect from January 1, 1935.

(c) Application from Mr. A. Wickremasinghe, Draughtsman, Works Department, to be placed on an incremental scale of salary.—Recommended by 2 votes to 1, that the application be refused as the Committee see no reason for making and change.

(d) Application from the daily-paid workman of the Electricity Department for an increase of pay.—Recommended that for the present the increase recommended by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department and set out in the statement annexed, be paid and that investigations be made with a view to placing these workmen on a permanent and satisfactory basis of salary. Recommended, further, that the following supplemental votes be sanctioned to meet the increased expenditure :—Rs. 700 under Head E 5, Rs. 300 under Head E 7, and Rs. 100 under Head E 9.

(e) Application from P. V. Charles and L. G. Sarnelis, Watchers in the Electricity Department, for an increase of salary.—Recommended that the application be refused.

(4) To consider the scale of salary to be attached to the post of Cemetery-keeper.—Recommended that with effect from January 1, 1935, the salary attached to the post of Cemetery-keeper be fixed at Rs. 35 permensem without increments.

(5) To consider an application from the Chairman, Galle Municipal Education District Committee, supported also by the Medical Officer of Schools, for an annual grant for the free supply of midday meals to needy children attending non-English Schools within the Municipality.—Recommended that the application be refused unless it is possible to effect a saving on one of the votes under "Works Extraordinary." The Committee considers that the most suitable vote is No. 57, Bathing place in Fort. Rs. 1,000.

(6) To consider the question as to whether any concession should be given for installing Overhead service mains in the case of new consumers.—Recommended that, with a view to obtaining more consumers, the first 30 feet or overhead service main be given free and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,000 be sanctioned for this purpose under Head E 10—Materials for service mains.

(7) To consider whether the sum of Rs. 1,365 provided in the Budget as an additional grant to the Galle Ayurvedic Association for the purpose of establishing and conducting an additional Free Ayurvedic Dispensary within Municipal limits should be paid to the Association, and, if so, on what conditions.—Recommended (1) that the additional Free Ayurvedic Dispensary be established so as to serve wards 3 and 4 and that the Association be requested to select an appropriate site. The Committee considers that a site on Circular road would be most suitable; (2) that the cost of equipment (Rs. 165) be paid so soon as the site has been selected and the building obtained; and (3) that the grant for upkeep be paid in advance by monthly instalments of Rs. 100.

(10) To recommend the appointment till the end of March, 1935, of a temporary office labourer at 50 cents per diem with effect from January 17, 1935.—Recommended.

11. To confirm the purchase on behalf of the Council of the following properties sold by public auction for non-payment of rates :—No. 770A, Galupiadde in Ward No. 3 and No. 70, Katugoda in Ward No. 4.—Recommended that the sales be confirmed and that steps be taken to have the properties vested in the Council.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item 3 (c) Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the question of an incremental scale of salary be considered at the next Budget Meeting. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 5 voting for and 6 against.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

With regard to item 3 (d) Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that consideration be deferred on the understanding that he would at the next meeting submit a motion dealing with the question of the pay of all daily-paid employees. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. The amendment was put to the meeting and declared lost, 3 voting for and 8 against.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted with effect from March 1, 1935.

With regard to item 5 Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that a grant of Rs. 1,000 be made for the current year and that the construction of the bathing place in the Fort be deferred till 1936. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried by 8 votes to 3.

With regard to item 6 it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted with effect from March 1, 1935.

With regard to item 7 it was resolved by 8 votes to 3 that the recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

12. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council :—Agreed that the Next General Meeting be held on Friday, March 15, 1935, at 2 P.M.

With the permission of the Council the following items which did not appear on the agenda were next taken up for consideration.

13. Re-conditioning of Morris road :—The Chairman explained that provision for the re-conditioning of Morris road, which was in a very bad state of repair, had inadvertently been omitted from the Budget, and moved as an urgent measure that a supplemental vote of Rs. 10,500 be passed in order that the work may be put in hand at once on an estimate which would be submitted to the Provincial Engineer for approval. Mr. A. M. Saheed seconded.—Carried.

14. To consider the question of illuminating the town on the occasion of the Silver Jubilee of His Majesty the King :—Resolved that a Supplemental vote of Rs. 3,500 be passed to meet the cost of illuminating the Ramparts and the Esplanade, and that the Superintendent of the Electricity Department be authorized to obtain the necessary materials.

15. The following documents were laid on the table :—

(1) Statements of receipts and disbursements to end of January, 1935.

(2) Progress report of works done on estimates during January, 1935.

(3) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on carriages plying for hire during January, 1935.

(4) Diaries of (a) the Medical Officer of Health, (b) the Municipal Engineer, (c) the Inspector of Works, and (d) the Manager, Health Department.

16. In connection with item 3 of the Minutes Mr. J. E. Perera at the General Meeting held on Friday, March 15, 1935, submitted, in terms of by-law 26 of Chapter ii., the following dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council:—

I dissent from the resolution passed at the last General Meeting of Council regarding the utilization of the open space of turfed ground opposite the Sydney Hotel and the Gymkhana Club for a bus stand on the following grounds:—

1. That sufficient notice had not been given of the resolution to the members nor was it placed in the agenda of the meeting.
2. That the item in the agenda over which the resolution was passed did not give any indication of altering a very important open space forming part of the esplanade reserved as such for the benefit of the town.
3. That the matter was not of such urgency that it could not have been deferred till the next meeting of Council especially after the special request of 4 elected members of the Council.
4. That provision is made in the by-laws for deferring a recommendation from the Standing Committees at the request of a member.
5. That sufficient thought could not have been brought to bear on the matter in the short time during which it was discussed in Council.
6. That never before had such a hasty resolution been passed in Council effecting an important open space in the Town.
7. That there was another good site for the Bus Stand, which did not occur to the members owing to the short space of time within which the resolution was discussed and passed, to wit, the side of the Wakwella road from the Gymkhana Club to Talbot Town Junction passing by the Britannia Picture Palace.
8. The fact that two elected members only out of six present voted for the resolution proved that permanent residents of the town were not satisfied of the wisdom of passing a hasty resolution effecting the alteration of part of the esplanade into a busy and noisy bus stand.
