CODE OF REGULATIONS FOR ASSISTED VERNACULAR
AND BILINGUAL SCHOOLS.

THE following amendments to the Code of Regulations for Assisted Vernacular and Bilingual Schools, which have been approved by the Board of Education, are hereby published for general information in accordance with section 10 (2) of Ordinance No. 1 of 1920.

AMENDMENTS REFERRED TO.

Clause 25.—Amend to read as follows :—

(a) A Training School course shall consist of a first year, a second year, and a final year course.

(b) The aim of the first year class shall be the study of the subjects of the school curriculum up to the standard of the Teachers' Certificate examination together with Elementary Principles of child study and observation.

The aim of the second year class shall be a study of the Principles of Teaching (with special emphasis on the methods of teaching the Kindergarten and Primary School subjects) together with special training in the Arts, Handwork, and Physical Development.

The aim of the final year class shall be an advanced study of the Principles of Teaching in relation to the Principles of Psychology, of methods of teaching the school subjects, together with the study of Language and Literature and training in practical occupations. Each student in the second and final year courses shall be given, under the supervision of the Training School staff, practice in the art of teaching for a minimum of 90 hours during each of the last two years of his course. In the case of registered teachers, the minimum may be reduced to 60 hours.

(c) Students will be selected for admission to the first year class after interview by the authorities of the Training Schools, from among those who hold the Senior School Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil). Students must be over 16 years of age at the time of admission to this class.

Students will be selected for admission to the second year class after interview by the authorities of the Training Schools, from among those who have completed the first year course referred to above or who hold a Teachers' Certificate (Sinhalese or Tamil), or who have passed the Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Senior School Certificate (English) with Sinhalese or Tamil. Students must be over 17 years of age at the time of admission to this class.

Clause 27.—In line 5 alter "the second of these being" to "The final year examination shall be". In line 10 alter "first" to "first or second". In line 12 alter "second" to "final".

Clause 29.—Delete lines 4-7 "save . . . years" and substitute "except as a maintained school (see clause 32A)".

Clause 32 (iii).—In line 8 after "Manager" insert "or proves unsatisfactory".

Clause 36.—Add a new paragraph as follows :—

The salaries of teachers in Vernacular and Bilingual schools under private management shall be paid direct by the Department.

Clause 60 (a).—Delete second paragraph.

Clause 66 (c).—Delete and substitute the following :—

If additional teachers are required for this purpose, such teachers may be approved at the rate of one teacher for every 30 units of average attendance in each occupation. Fractions of over one half the quota shall count for an additional teacher up to a maximum of 3 teachers for each occupation. The salary of such teachers shall be at the rates laid down in the salary scale. The attendance of a child taking two or more occupations may not count towards the salary of more than one teacher. The time table must be so arranged that the teacher is occupied in teaching the occupation for at least 4 hours a day. In special cases part time teachers may be employed. Re. 1 per pupil may be approved for waste of material in the first stage of each occupation.

Clause 76.—Add the following to paragraph 2 :—

Satisfactory service as a second class certificated teacher prior to entering a Training School will be counted for this purpose.

The time table must be so arranged that the teacher is occupied in teaching the occupation for at least 4 hours a day. In special cases part time teachers may be employed. Re. 1 per pupil may be approved for waste of material in the first stage of each occupation.

Preliminary Report on the Vital Statistics of Ceylon, 1934.*(N.B.—Figures are subject to revision.)*

The following are the main features of the vital statistics of 1934 :—

- (a) the marriage rate, 11·0, is the highest recorded after 1929 ;
- (b) the birth rate, 37·2, is the lowest recorded since 1921 with the exception of the year 1932, when it was 37·0 ;
- (c) the death rate, 22·9, is the highest after 1930 ;
- (d) the infant mortality rate, 173, is the highest recorded since 1930.

Population.

2. The estimated population of the Island on December 31, 1934, was 5,637,200. The excess of births over deaths was 79,442, and of immigrants over emigrants, 94,534.

Marriages.

3. The number of General and Kandyan marriages registered during the year was 28,476 (22,415 under the General Marriage Ordinance, and 6,061 under the Kandyan Law), and corresponded to a rate of 11·0 per 1,000 of the population (excluding Muslims) as against 10·2 in 1933. There were 1,333 Muslim marriages which were equivalent to an approximate rate of 7·1 per 1,000 of the Muslim population, the same rate as last year. There were 157 divorces under the General, and 607 under the Kandyan Law.

Births.

4. The number of births registered was 206,512, of which 105,298 were males and 101,214 females. The birth rate was 37·2 per 1,000 of the population, as against 38·6 in the previous year, and the sex ratio was 1,040 males to 1,000 females. The birth rate in the City of Colombo was 32·1 per 1,000 of the population as against 32·6 in 1933. There were 26,034 births on estates as against 26,978 in the previous year.

Deaths.

5. 127,070 deaths (63,256 males and 63,814 females) were registered in 1934. These corresponded to a rate of 22·9 per 1,000 of the population as compared with 21·2 in the previous year. The death rate of the City of Colombo was 28·7 as against 27·1 last year. There were 14,946 deaths on estates as against 12,865 in 1933.

Infant Mortality.

6. The deaths of infants under one year of age amounted to 35,719, or 28 per cent. of the total deaths registered. The infant mortality rate was 173 per 1,000 births as against 157 in the preceding year. The large increase may be attributed mainly to the malaria epidemic. The rate in the City of Colombo was 189 and on estates 200 as against 173 and 184, respectively, in 1933.

7. The births, deaths, and infantile mortality of each quarter of the year are shown below :—

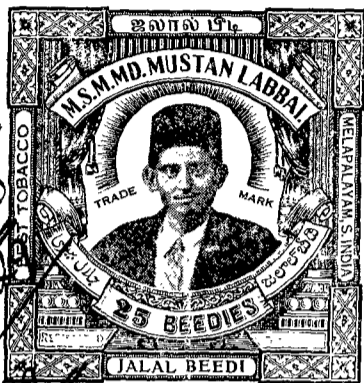

RULE.

The rules dated June 14, 1892, and published in *Gazette* No. 5,147 of June 17, 1892, as last amended by Notification in *Gazette* No. 8,032 of February 6, 1934, shall be further amended by the deletion of rule 13 of Chapter I. and the substitution of the following therefor:—

13. It shall be lawful for the ex-officio members of the Committee of Management at their discretion to grant to any member a loan or loans not exceeding in the aggregate amount of such loan or loans outstanding at any time, if such member is of less than two years' standing, the monthly salary or pension of such member, and, if such member is of two years' or more than two years' standing, two months' salary or pension of such member. A member desiring a loan under this rule shall make his application in such form as may from time to time be prescribed by the Committee of Management. Provided that such loan shall not be granted unless the applicant shall reasonably satisfy the said ex-officio members of the Committee of Management that it is required for the purpose of relieving him in a time of sickness or distress, or of aiding him in pecuniary difficulties; and provided further that no more than four such loans as aforesaid shall be granted within any period of twelve calendar months. Such loan or loans shall be granted subject to the following conditions:—

- (a) Each such loan shall be repayable in not more than ten consecutive monthly instalments (provided that no such instalment shall be recovered in the month of December) or in fewer instalments if the applicant shall so elect.
- (b) Interest shall be payable from the date of issue of any such loan at the rate of 6 per cent. per annum on the amount outstanding during any calendar month.
