GOD SAVE THE KING.

BY-LAW.

By-law 10 (iii.) of the "Municipal Leave By-laws" published in the *Gazette* of June 17, 1921, is hereby repealed and the following substituted therefor:—

"10. (iii.) If an officer requires leave in any year on account of sickness or on other reasonable grounds beyond the period of vacation and accumulated vacation leave for which he is eligible, he may at the discretion of the Council be granted further leave for a period equal to any lapsed vacation leave he may have available in respect of his past service; Provided that in no case shall such lapsed vacation leave be granted for a period exceeding three months in all."

IT is hereby notified that regulation 61 of the Public Service Regulations published by Notification dated June 30, 1931, in *Government Gazette Extraordinary* No. 7,865 of June 30, 1931, has been deleted and the following new regulation substituted therefor:—

“When an officer appointed on probation is confirmed in his appointment, the confirmation will date as from his first appointment. An extension of the probationary period will operate as a deferment of increment by the period of such extension.”

Note.—Where an officer's incremental date is not the same as the date of his appointment (as may happen under F. R. 847 in the case of officers promoted on probation), the effect of an extension of the probationary period will be to defer by the period of such extension the next increment even though this increment may fall due after the expiry of the extended probationary period.”

Uniform of Headmen and Persons holding Ceylonese Ranks.

THE following instructions regarding the wearing of Uniform by Headmen, Presidents of Village Tribunals, and persons holding honorary or ex-officio rank are published for general information. All previous Notifications on the subject are hereby cancelled:—

- (1) All headmen and other persons holding titular ranks, and their attendants, must, on any public occasion at which they attend officially, wear such uniform as is specified below.
- (2) Medals should be worn by those who have received them from Government, but persons who have inherited Government medals from their ancestors may only wear them on permission being first obtained from His Excellency the Governor. Medals otherwise obtained must not be worn on official occasions.
- (3) Medals which have been inherited, and which the possessor has the permission of His Excellency to wear, should be worn on the *right* breast to distinguish them from those received from Government by an officer personally, which should be worn on the *left* breast. (This rule applies only to such medals as are attached to the coat, and not to those hung round the neck.)
- (4) The Maha Mudaliyar and Headmen of the Governor's Gate or of the Guard are entitled to the services of the lascar screens of the guard, and Headmen of the Atapattu and of the Korales to those of the lascar screens of the Atapattu, as their attendants, respectively.

BY-LAW.

The by-laws under section 27 of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915, published by Notification in the *Gazette* of September 23, 1927, as amended by Notification in the *Gazette* of February 24, 1928, are hereby further amended as follows :—

- (1) in paragraph (d) of by-law 2, by the deletion of the word "dairy" wherever that word occurs in that paragraph;
- (2) by renumbering by-law 11 as by-law 12; and
- (3) by the insertion of the following new by-law between by-law 10 and renumbered by-law 12 :—

"Dairies".

"11. From and after the Seventeenth day of April, 1935, within the Municipal limits of Colombo—

- (a) no new building shall be erected for the keeping of cattle for any of the purposes of a dairy: Provided that in any commercial area the Chairman may at his discretion permit the erection of any such building for the keeping of not more than 15 head of cattle for any such purpose;
- (b) no existing building, other than a building in which cattle are housed at that date for any of the purposes of a dairy shall be used for any such purpose: Provided that in any commercial area the Chairman may at his discretion permit the housing in any such building of not more than 15 head of cattle for any such purpose; and
- (c) no addition or extension for any of the purposes of a dairy shall be made to any existing building where cattle are housed for any such purpose: Provided that in any commercial area the Chairman may at his discretion permit the addition to or the extension of any such building for the housing of not more than 15 head of cattle for any such purpose."

THE CEMETERIES AND BURIALS ORDINANCE, 1899.

BY-LAWS under section 38 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, for burial grounds within the administrative limits of the Weligama Urban District Council, made by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the said Weligama Urban District Council, and confirmed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 39 of the said Ordinance and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground within the area specified in the schedule hereto, shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Urban District Council to have the same registered as such, stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of keeper of such burial ground.

2. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then, and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial ground is made shall be deemed to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of regulations in respect of that ground.

3. In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected except on the special permission of the Chairman of the Urban District Council, or in his absence, of his deputy.

4. No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial ground or to the Chairman or to his deputy, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation is authorized by the Chairman or his deputy under by-law 3.

5. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out in the premises of which he is the keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the Office of the Urban District Council.

6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban District Council or any person authorized by him in writing for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial ground, and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

7. All registered burial grounds shall be kept properly fenced and kept free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

8. No grave shall be less than 5 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 2 feet from any other grave.

Schedule referred to.

The whole urban area bounded on the north by the Midellawela Kumburuyaya Pahalawela, Medawela, Ihala-wela, Patawatta, Hapuawagewatta, Tandalaowita, Kotudurageliyadda, Indipelawatta, and Godellawatta; on the east by the Dutch canal, Polwatta-ganga, Bandarakella, Denipitiya, Gandaharawatta, and Pelabandarawatta; on the south by the seashore from Pelabandarawatta to Managewellahena; on the west by Managewellahena, Thummuniyamulla, the culvert on the high road, Hellawa, Manawanagahakumbura, Medahena, Ambagahakanatdeniya, Deniyewatta, Talbot estate, Epitawatta, Usgodawatta, Acharigewatta, Orawalawatta, Upasakagoda, Korahakumbura, Medagodahena, and the path from Medagodahena to Dempeyaya.
