THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,
No. 13 OF 1896.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896, entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages" and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to Kataragama for the Esala Festival commencing in July, 1935.

REGULATIONS.

1. (a) The duration of the Kataragama Esala Festival, 1935, and of the stay of pilgrims at Kataragama shall be and it is hereby limited to seventeen days, namely, July 1 to 17, 1935, inclusive.

(b) Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period here prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.

2. The camp shall be under the general control of the Government Agent, Province of Uva, and under the immediate supervision of an officer designated the "Supervising Officer" who shall be assisted by a Medical Officer and by a Police Officer.

3. In the event of an epidemic breaking out at Kataragama during the festival, it shall be lawful for the Supervising Officer to declare the festival at an end, and to direct pilgrims at once to leave the village and proceed to their homes, and to prescribe the roads by which they have to travel.

4. The Supervising Officer shall have power on the line of march to and from Kataragama and at Kataragama—

(a) To appoint particular places to be exclusively used by the pilgrims for washing and bathing, for drawing water and drinking and for natural offices;

(b) To appoint places for the occupation of each class of pilgrims;

(c) To prescribe routes for the journey of any body of pilgrims;

(d) To regulate the distribution of all food given to pilgrims;

(e) To fix separate places of abode for pilgrims who fall ill, to prohibit communication with them and to detain them if unfit to travel.

Any person disobeying any lawful order given for any of these purposes by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

5. For the purpose of these rules camp shall mean—

(a) the area within half a mile of the Maha Dewala at Kataragama in every direction.

(b) the area within a quarter of a mile of the Pillayar Kovil at Sella Kataragama in every direction.

6. The Police are empowered and required to seize and destroy all food condemned as unwholesome on the march or in the camp, by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police; and any person resisting or obstructing the Police in the discharge of this or of any other duty prescribed by these rules shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person bringing any cattle or cart-bulls within one quarter of a mile of the camp without a permit from the Supervising Officer or any person authorized by him to issue such permits shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The issue of such permits shall be subject to compliance by the permit-holder with such conditions as may be imposed by the Supervising Officer for the purpose of enforcing sanitation, maintaining the health of the camp, and regulating traffic.

9. (1) (a) Any person exposing commodities of any description for sale in camp in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

(b) Any person selling food condemned as unwholesome by the Supervising Officer or by the Medical Officer, or in their absence, by the chief officer of Police shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) (a) All eating-houses and tea and coffee boutiques shall be kept clean and sanitary to the satisfaction of the Supervising Officer.

(b) All cakes, sweetmeats, and other cooked food exposed for sale shall be kept in properly constructed fly-proof glass cases.

(c) No waste tea, coffee, or milk or remnants of food, cooking waste or refuse shall be thrown on the ground, but shall be collected in the receptacle hereinafter prescribed and be kept at all times ready for removal by the sanitary authorities.

(d) Every building, structure, or premises used as a place of trade or business shall be provided with a metal or wooden dust bin not less than $4\frac{1}{2}$ cubic feet in capacity in which shall be stored all the garbage and waste matter of the said premises; and except when garbage or waste matter is being deposited or taken from the said bin, it shall at all times be covered with a metal or wooden cover.

10. Any person who shall, during the occupation of the camp, use any other place for offices of nature than that provided for the purpose by Government, or shall fail to cover the deposit with earth or sand, and any person who shall during the same period bathe in or enter the river above the spot appointed by the Supervising Officer shall be guilty of an offence.

11. Any person suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease and not reporting the same to the Supervising Officer or to the Medical Officer or the chief officer of Police, and any person aiding or abetting in the concealment of such disease shall be guilty of an offence.

12. All persons shall take up the quarters assigned to them by the Supervising Officer or the chief officer of Police at the halting places and in the camp and any person declining or neglecting to do so shall be guilty of an offence.

13. Any person who, without the previous sanction of the Supervising Officer, constructs any booth or extends any building so as to encroach on the main streets of the camp shall be guilty of an offence.

PENSION RULES.

1. (a) No officer shall be deemed to have an absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or allowance under these rules, and the Board reserves to itself the power to dismiss an officer without compensation.

(b) No pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance shall be granted on retirement to any officer without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions and exceptions hereinafter contained every officer holding a permanent office in the service of the Board and drawing a salary of not less than Rs. 400 per annum may be granted a pension calculated at the rate of $1/720$ th of the salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service counting for pension, provided that he has completed not less than 120 months' gross service, and provided further that no pension awarded under these rules shall exceed $480/720$ ths of the salary upon which the pension is computed.

(2) If such an officer retires on account of illness or age before completing 120 months' gross service, he may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of $1/12$ th of a month's salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service.

3. Any officer may be required to retire from the service of the Board on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years; but retirement shall be compulsory on his attaining the age of sixty years, unless the Governor decide that his services shall be retained.

4. No pension shall be granted to an officer retiring before he attains the age of fifty-five years, unless a Medical Board, consisting of two Medical Practitioners nominated by the Chairman, certifies that the officer is unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or body, and unless he shall have theretofore discharged such duties to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

5. The Chairman may call upon an officer, who is below the limit of age entitling him to retire on pension, to retire from the service on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office. In such a case the Board may by special resolution, subject to the approval of the Governor, grant such retiring allowance or gratuity as is considered just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which the length of service of the officer would qualify him.

6. In the case of the abolition of any pensionable office, the pension or gratuity grantable to the officer holding such office will be that which would have been payable to him, had he retired on grounds of ill-health.

7. No pension or gratuity granted under these rules shall be assignable or transferable.

8. (1) The service to be reckoned for pension shall be calculated from the date on which the officer commences to draw salary in respect of his first permanent appointment, whether pensionable or not. Acting service in an office carrying claims to pension shall, when continuous with permanent employment, count as service for pension, provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office. The service of an officer under 16 years of age shall not in any case count for pension.

(2) An officer is entitled to reckon as service for pension the whole period of absence on vacation leave, and half the period of absence on leave with half salary. Absence without salary will not count as service for pension.

9. (1) The pension or gratuity awarded to an officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him, at the time of his retirement, in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices, to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years, otherwise the pension or gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such officer during the three years next preceding the date of his retirement.

(2) For the purposes of these rules, salary will include, in addition to the salary of the permanent office or offices held by him, any allowance voted to him by resolution of the Board as a pensionable allowance, but no other emolument whatsoever.

10. The rates of pension, retiring allowance, and gratuity above set forth shall be granted only in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a deduction may be made from the pension or gratuity, and where the misconduct of an officer has been of a serious nature, the pension or gratuity may be entirely withheld.

11. The service in respect of which pensions or gratuities are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or by temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation. Service prior to a break of service may, however, be allowed to count for pension together with service subsequent to such break, if the whole of the intervening period has been spent in some employment under Government or under another statutory local authority.

12. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance is convicted of any offence in any Court in the Island and sentenced to death or to any term of rigorous imprisonment exceeding six months, the payment of such pension or allowance shall be forthwith discontinued, unless such person shall within three months of such conviction receive an unconditional pardon, or unless the Board with the approval of the Governor in any case for special reasons otherwise decides.

13. If any person to whom a pension, annuity, or allowance has been granted under these rules becomes a bankrupt, such pension, annuity, or allowance shall forthwith cease; but it shall be lawful for the Board, with the approval of the Governor, from time to time during the remainder of such person's life or during such shorter period or periods, whether continuous or otherwise, as may be necessary, to pay all or any part of such pension, annuity, or allowance to, or to apply the same for the maintenance and personal support or benefit of, such person and his wife and children jointly or any one or more of them exclusively, as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary or expedient.

14. (1) Every officer who is transferred to a post under Government or under another statutory local authority with the approval of the Board, shall be entitled on ultimate retirement to pension for the service rendered to the Board, provided that he retires from the latter service in circumstances which would entitle him to pension under these rules. In all such cases the amount contributed by

the Board by way of pension shall be based only on the service under the Board, and the final salary drawn from the Board.

(2) An officer who has been transferred to the service of the Board from some other employment under Government or under another statutory local authority may if he retires from the service of the Board after completing 10 years' public service in all, but before completing 10 years' service under the Board, be awarded, in lieu of a gratuity an annuity based on service and salary under the Board, calculated in the manner prescribed by rule 2 (1).

15. No person may at any time draw from the funds of the Board an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service, exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such person at any time in the course of his service under the Board or in such other public service.

16. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance from the Board returns to the service of the Board, he may be allowed to retain his pension or retiring allowance during the period of his re-employment, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement no award whatever under these rules; or he may be required to forego the pension or retiring allowance then drawn by him, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement a pension or retiring allowance based on his aggregate service and the highest salary drawn by him at any time during that service. The Chairman shall decide the terms on which a former servant of the Board may be re-employed in any particular case.

17. Any employee of the Board drawing a salary of less than Rs. 400 per annum, retiring on account of illness after serving continuously for a period of 15 years and upwards may, if the Board be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board that he is unfit to discharge efficiently the duties of his office owing to infirmity of body or mind, be awarded such long service allowance not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem as the Board may think just and proper. In the case of employees who retire after attaining the age of 55 years or over, no Medical Board need be appointed. Any employee in receipt of daily pay, who has completed not less than 20 years' service, retiring in similar circumstances, may be awarded a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/36th of a month's pay for each month's service.

18. In the event of any officer or servant, whether in a pensionable or non-pensionable office or on daily pay, dying while in the service of the Board, it shall be competent to the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, to grant to the widow or next-of-kin of such officer or servant, a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay, and in addition one month's pay for each minor child.

19. If any case not covered by these rules shall arise which in the opinion of the Board merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report setting out the circumstances of such case, together with the recommendation of the Board, shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Controller of Establishments, General Treasury, to the Governor for his decision as to the nature and the amount of the compensation, if any, that may be awarded.

Report for the Year 1933-34.

THE annual report of the Local Loans and Development Commissioners for the year 1933-34 is submitted together with the Statement of Accounts and Balance Sheet duly audited and certified by the Auditor-General.

Loans.—The number of loans made during the year amounted to Rs. 702,501 made up as follows:—

Repayments.—During the year a sum of Rs. 519,709·95 has been received in repayment of principal.

Interest.—Interest received during the year amounted to Rs. 250,163·23.

Rate of Interest.—The rate of interest on loans to local authorities was four per centum per annum and to Co-operative Societies and Government servants for building houses was five per centum per annum.

Loans Outstanding.—The total amount of loans outstanding at September 30, 1934, was Rs. 4,569,692·46 made up as follows:—

The net expenditure charged to the fund was therefore Rs. 999·19.

The Council failed to meet its obligations on the due dates and the Commissioners resolved to take action in terms of section 17 of Ordinance No. 22 of 1916. The matter was accordingly reported to the Hon. the Financial Secretary for necessary action.

Co-operative Societies.—The delay in the settlement of the loans granted to the White Burley Tobacco Sale Society is due to the difficulty experienced by the Crown Agents in the disposing of the tobacco in London.

Certain societies to which loans have been granted are now in liquidation and in consequence the settlement of the loans is overdue.

Government Servants.—There is one case only of default in the payment of loan charges and the Board's legal advisers have taken the necessary action to put the bond in suit.

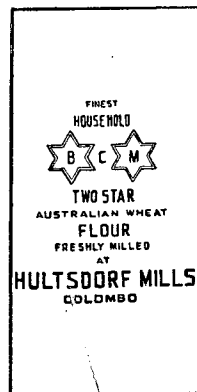

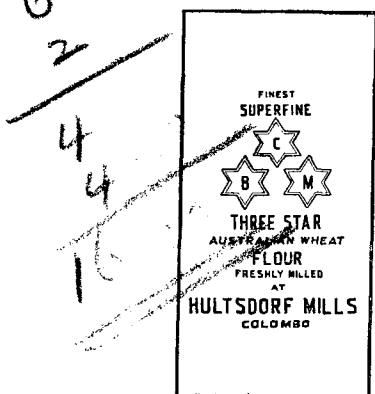
