KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on March 23, 1935, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated March 19, 1935.

Present:—Mr. R. M. Davies, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. Walter Beven; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Dr. D. T. de Kretser; Mr. D. M. de S. Abhayanayake.

- The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on February 16, 1935, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman,
 - The following documents were submitted:—
 - (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1934 to February 28, 1935, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to January 31, 1935.

Health Officer's report for February, 1935.

- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of February, 1935.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended March 23, 1935.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

- The following papers were laid on the table:—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during February, 1935. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.
- 4. Petitions:—Mr. Wijayatilake presented (1) petition dated March 21, 1935, from vegetable dealers praying that owing to inconveniences they undergo in the new Market Fair Site, they be allowed to hold the Fair in the old site. (2) Letter dated March 13, 1935, from Mudaliyar N. Wickremaratne addressed to Mr. Wijayatilake complaining that the complaining that the second of the complaining that the complaining that the second of the complaining that the complaining tha Council's officers have refused to accept a cheque sent by him on February 28, 1935, in payment of taxes and that payment is demanded now with costs.
- Mr. Abhayanake presented (3) Letter dated March 11, 1935, from Mr. L.H. S. Pieris protesting against the erection of a night soil storing shed in Lady Longdon's Drive. (4) Letter dated March 15, 1935, from Sister Suddhramachari asking that taxes levied on the Upasekarama in Katukele be waived.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented (5) Petition dated March 2, 1935, from Mr. O. L. M. Abdul Rahim praying that the fine imposed on him by the Municipal Magistrate as licence duty on Motor 'Bus E—483 be waived, or other relief be given to him.

As regards item (1), with the leave of Council Mr. Wijayatilake moved that permission be given to traders to occupy the old site temporarily. Mr. Abhayanayake seconded.—Carried.

As regards items (2) to (5) the Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.

- 5. Correspondence:—(1) Copy of letter No. J 190/34 of March 13, 1935, addressed by the Hon. the Chief Secretary to Mr. R. M. Davies informing him that he has been appointed to act as Chairman of the Municipal Council of Kandy from about March 16, 1935, during the absence on sick leave of Mr. T. A. Hodson.—Tabled.
- (2) (a) Letter dated March 14, 1935, from the President, H. M. the King's Silver Jubilee and Birthday Celebrations Fund, stating that at a public meeting held on March 11, it was decided to ask the Municipal Council to make a grant of Rs. 500 towards the cost of the local celebrations scheme, and to carry out an illumination scheme of the town, at the expense of the Council, and applying for the Grant mentioned, and (b) Letter No. N of March 14, 1935, from the Government Agent, Central Province, Kandy, stating that Government is not making any provision for the illumination of buildings in connection with the Silver Jubilee Celebrations in Kandy on May 6, 1935, and in view of the fact that the Council is being asked to carry out an illumination scheme of the town at its cost, suggesting that the United Services Library, the Octagon, Police Court and Land Registry be included therein, as they form important parts in any illumination scheme owing to their central position. (O 567).—Tabled.

Resolved—(1) To make a grant of Rs. 500 towards the cost of the general celebrations; (2) to vote Rs. 500 to carry out illuminations inclusive of Government Buildings, and (3) to vote Rs. 100 for presenting a loyal address to H. M. King George V.

- 6. Pursuant to notice Mr. Abhayanayake asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:--
- (1) Will the Chairman be pleased—
- Q.—(a) To ascertain what it would cost the Council to construct a public bath at the permanent spout lying between the Railway line and the ela immediately behind the Commercial Co. buildings at Getambe?
 - A.—It is reported that water from this source is used both for drinking and bathing purposes.

A storage tank will be necessary to harness the water.

The water from this tank can be drawn for drinking purposes and the overflow can feed two small cisterns for bathing purposes—one for males and one for females.

The cost inclusive of 2 shelters for keeping the clothes of the bathers is estimated at Rs. 1,200.

- Q.—(b) To take necessary steps to cause the construction of a desirable bath at this spot in view of the large number of residents using this spout at present for bathing purposes?
 - A.—The estimate will be submitted to the Works Committee for consideration.
 - (2) Will the Chairman be pleased to state-
- Q.—(a) How many times the New Sports Pavilion at Bogambara (known as Ratwatta Pavilion) has been booked for use by Clubs or other members of the public since it was declared open by H. E. the Governor on July 7, 1934?
- A.—Three bookings have been made during this month. The pavilion was equipped only in January last. Before that date its use was allowed on two occasions, free of rent. It may be noted that Bogambara Grounds were not available for regular use for the last five months owing to the work on drains, and applications for the use of the Pavilion could not be expected.
 - Q.—(b) What income the Council has so far derived thereby?
 - A.—Rs. 10.
 - Q.—(c) What it has cost the Council to date to maintain the said Pavilion?
 - A.—Rs. 191·93 as pay of Caretaker up to February 28, 1935.
- Q.—(3) In view of the very insanitary condition of the drain leading from the Katugastota Public latrine into the Mahaweliganga and its attendant danger to the health of the residents of the place, will the Chairman be pleased to have at least the bed of this drain paved so as to allow a free flow of the sewage direct into the river?
- A.—Estimated cost of paving bottom of drain to a length of approximately 500 feet is Rs. 1,190. The Municipal Engineer suggests that paving without side walls to protect the embankment from silting the drain can hardly be regarded as an improvement. The cost inclusive of side walls is Rs. 10,850. I shall place these estimates before the next Works Committee for consideration.

Arising from item 6 (2) Mr. de Silva asked the following supplementary question to which the Chairman replied-

Q.—(c) If the suggestion at (b) above is practicable, will the Chairman kindly indicate what the cost would be for such a service direct from Peradeniya Wells as opposed to supply of water from the lake?

- A.—This does not arise.
- 7A. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Abhayanayake asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:-
- (1) Will the Chairman be pleased to state—
- Q.—(a) How many officers there are in the different branches of the Council's service whose appointments have not been made permanent yet?

- A.-7.
- Q.—(b) How many of these have been appointed on probation?
- A = 7.
- Q.—(c) Whether there are any such officers who have passed the original period of probation on which their appointments were made, and, if any, who they are ?
 - A.—Yes. 2—Messrs. L. M. Charles and S. A. Sinnadurai, Distraining Inspectors.
 - Q.—(d) If the answer to (c) above is in the affirmative, why their appointments have not been made permanent?
 - A.—They have not been confirmed as their work and conduct have not yet justified confirmtaion.
 - Q.—(e) When it is intended to confirm such appointments, in each case?
 - A.—They will be confirmed if they prove satisfactory.
- Q.—(2) (a) What the inexcusable delay in the completion of the Peradeniya Pumping Scheme has actually been due to ?
- A.—There was no delay except for the difficulties that arose owing to steam crane and grab not being available at the well site.

The Municipal Council at its meeting hald on March 24, 1934, after adopting the Scheme, passed the following resolution authorizing the execution only of the first stage of the Scheme:—

"Resolved to authorize immediate acquisition of the land required, the construction of three wells and—if necessary—a dry well, and the construction of approach road and erection of fencing".

Council sanctioned rates for the construction of the 3 wells at the meeting on May 19, 1934, and the contract with Mr. A. R. Suwaris was signed on June 28, 1934. The work was commenced immediately after.

In October, after the wells had been sunk to a depth of 26 feet, the use of the steam crane and grab, which the Council was bound to supply in terms of the contract, was found necessary.

Arrangements to procure a suitable crane and grab from the Colombo Government Factory had been made in September.

The additional Assistant Engineer, who inspected the Plant in Colombo in September, reported that the Plant was not suitable for the purpose. Then a steam winch and grab was arranged for from the Factory, winch the Additional Assistant Engineer, after inspection, reported to be too heavy to be transported to site without a proper road.

The Contractor by his letter dated October 8, 1934, stated that he was unable to proceed with the work without the crane and grab and suggested a rate of Rs. 100 per foot of excavations if he was required to use manual labour against Rs. 25 provided in the contract for excavations with the crane and grab.

As this rate was prohibitive, experiments were made at the instance of the Acting Municipal Engineer with the approval of the Works Committee to excavate with the use of a tripod and hand winch. The Contractor was interviewed thereafter by the Chairman on December 15 and after some correspondence he agreed to carry out the work using the hand winch and tripod subject to a rate being fixed later. He has since quoted a rate of Rs. 40.

- Q.—(b) What progress has been made in the acquisition of the lands needed for the Scheme?
- A.—Acquisition survey of the well site and approach road has been completed and the Preliminary Plan is expected in April. Arrangements have been made with the Government Valuer to assess the land as soon as the Preliminary Plan is issued.
- Q.—(c) What further steps the Chairman proposes taking to expedite this important work so that the hopes on the Scheme may be realized as speedily as possible?
 - A.—No further steps are possible at this stage.
- Q.—(3) As the level of the water in the reservoir has gone down considerably at present, will the Chairman be pleased to consider the desirability of using this opportune moment to get the reservoir cleared of accumulated silt with the help of prison or local labour?
- A.—In 1934, when the reservoir was 28 feet below spill the opportunity was taken to clear the silt by local labour. The amount of silt now coming in is small compared with the conditions of a few years ago. No action, therefore, would appear to be necessary.
- 8. Pursuant to notice Mr. Abhayanayake moved—"That this Council do exempt the ratepayers of Pata Hewahetta, Talwatte, from the new conservancy tax of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. imposed on them regardless of the facts that it is a village area annexed to the Municipality not long ago, and that not a single house in this particular area is conserved by this Council at present". Mr. de Silva seconded.

It was agreed to refer the motion to the Sanitation Committee to consider and report for the next General Meeting

- 9. Pursuant to notice Ratwatte Adigar moved—"That this Council suggest to Government the desirability of replacing the present Katugastota bridge with a new one that would suit present and future traffic conditions". Mr. Abhayanayake seconded. Carried.
- 9A. Pursuant to notice Mr. Abahayanayake was to move—" That the Municipal Engineer, Mr. J. Stanley Garment, has failed to efficiently discharge his duty towards this Council—
 - (1) in that he has failed to submit at the correct stage proper and suitable estimates for the construction of a desirable type of sports pavilion on the Bogambara Grounds, thereby committing this Council to an unexpectedly large and unintended expenditure, and
 - (2) in that he has failed to construct even at such a high cost a sports pavilion for Kandy which can be accepted as either sound in structure or useful to the public ".
 - Mr. Abhayanayake withdrew the motion with permission to bring it up at the next meeting in an amended form.
 - 10. Recommendations of Standing Committees:-

- (I) Tenders received for the construction of dry well, fencing and approach road to the site of the Minor (River). Pumping Scheme, with letter from contractor Suwaris pointing out that he would suffer loss if the work is given out on tender now, in contravention of the resolution passed by the Council in September, 1934, with tenders received later from other contractors.—Recommended to ask Suwaris if he will do the work for the rates quoted by the lowest tenderers.
- (2) Papers re concession allowed to owners of motor vehicles extending the period of licensing up to March 1, 1935, with Chairman's observations on the illegality of the procedure.—Recommended that future action should be on the lines suggested by the Chairman.

(3) Further petitions received in respect of the auction of space No. 9, public market.—(D/Sp. 9). Mr. Beven seconded.—Carried.
