(1) Under the heading “ 1—GENERAL.”—

(a) by the substitution, for the words “ will not fire the Annual Rifle Course in addition to the L. A. or or M. G. Course ” occurring in paragraph 5, of the words “ will only fire Table A, Part II., Practices 5, 6, and 10 ”;

(b) by the addition of the following new paragraph 6A immediately after paragraph 6 :—

“ 6A. The S. A. A. allotted as C. Os. Pool will be expended at the direction of the C. O. ”; and

(2) Under the heading "2—ANNUAL RIFLE COURSE."—

(a) by the substitution of the following paragraph for the existing paragraph 11 of the section headed "(b) C. G. A. and C. E.":—

"11. *Trained Soldiers.*—Soldiers in their second and subsequent years will fire Table A, Part II., Practices 5, 6, and 10 only. They will not be classified."

(b) by the deletion of the words "At the discretion of the C. O., selected cadets may be permitted to fire the Trained Soldiers' Rifle Course." occurring in paragraph 13 of the section headed "(c) C. C. B."

AIR NAVIGATION.

THE CARRIAGE BY AIR (PARTIES TO CONVENTION)
ORDER, 1935.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 21st day of
February, 1935.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS a Convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air was on the twelfth day of October, nineteen hundred and twenty-nine, signed at Warsaw on behalf of His Majesty:

And whereas provision is made by the Carriage by Air Act, 1932(a) for giving effect to the said Convention:

And whereas by sub-section (2) of section one of the said Act His Majesty may by Order in Council from time to time certify who are the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention, in respect of what territories they are respectively parties and to what extent they have availed themselves of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention:

And whereas, since the date of the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1934,(b) certain additional ratifications of or accessions to the said Convention have been deposited or notified, and it is therefore expedient that the said Order of 1934 should be superseded by a more comprehensive Order:

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

1. It is hereby certified that the High Contracting Parties to the said Convention and the territories in respect of which they are respectively parties are as specified in Part I of the Schedule to this Order, and that the only High Contracting Party who has availed himself of the provisions of the Additional Protocol to the said Convention is the High Contracting Party specified in Part II of the said Schedule, who has availed himself of those provisions to the extent specified in the said Part.

2. The Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1934, is hereby revoked.

3. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Parties to Convention) Order, 1935.

WHEREAS a Convention for the unification of certain rules relating to international carriage by air was, on the 12th day of October, 1929, signed at Warsaw on behalf of His Majesty :

And whereas by sub-section (1) of Section 1 of the Carriage by Air Act, 1932, as extended by the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates and Mandated Territories) Order, 1934, to the Colonies and other territories mentioned in the second schedule to that Order, it is provided that

as from such day as His Majesty may by Order in Council certify to be the day on which the said Convention comes into force as regards the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid, the provisions of the said Convention as set out in the first annex to the first schedule to the said Order shall, so far as they relate to the rights and liabilities of carriers, passengers, consignors, consignees, and other persons and subject to the provisions of that Section, have the force of law in the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid in relation to any carriage by air to which the said Convention applies :

Now, therefore, His Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows :—

1. It is hereby certified that the said Convention comes into force as regards the Colonies and other territories mentioned as aforesaid, on the 3rd day of March, 1935.

2. This Order may be cited as the Carriage by Air (Colonies, Protectorates, and Mandated Territories) (Date of Coming into Force of Convention) Order, 1935.

Division No. 1.—Gotatuwa.

West.—From the last mentioned point north-westwards along the western limit of the Urban District Council area to the starting point of the northern limit of the division.

Division No. 6.—Weragoda.

PENSION RULES.

1. (a) No officer shall be deemed to have an absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or allowance under these rules, and the Board reserves to itself the power to dismiss an officer without compensation.

(b) No pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance shall be granted on retirement to any officer without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. (1) Subject to the provisions and exceptions herein-after contained every officer holding a permanent office in the service of the Board and drawing a salary of not less than Rs. 400 per annum may be granted a pension calculated at the rate of 1/20th of the salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service counting for pension, provided that he has completed not less than 120 months' gross service, and provided further that no pension awarded under these rules shall exceed 480/720ths of the salary upon which the pension is computed.

(2) If such an officer retires on account of illness or age before completing 120 months' gross service, he may receive a gratuity calculated at the rate of 1/12th of a month's salary of the office or offices held by him at retirement for each month of service.

3. Any officer may be required to retire from the service of the Board on or after attaining the age of fifty-five years; but retirement shall be compulsory on his attaining the age of sixty years, unless the Governor decide that his services shall be retained.

4. No pension shall be granted to an officer retiring before he attains the age of fifty-five years, unless a Medical Board, consisting of two Medical Practitioners nominated by the Chairman, certifies that the officer is unfit to discharge the duties of his office owing to infirmity either of mind or body, and unless he shall have theretofore discharged such duties to the satisfaction of the Chairman.

5. The Chairman may call upon an officer, who is below the limit of age entitling him to retire on pension, to retire from the service on the ground of his inability to discharge efficiently the duties of his office. In such a case the Board may by special resolution, subject to the approval of the Governor, grant such retiring allowance or gratuity as is considered just and proper, but in no case exceeding the amount for which the length of service of the officer would qualify him.

6. In the case of the abolition of any pensionable office, the pension or gratuity grantable to the officer holding such office will be that which would have been payable to him, had he retired on grounds of ill-health.

7. No pension or gratuity granted under these rules shall be assignable or transferable.

8. (1) The service to be reckoned for pension shall be calculated from the date on which the officer commences to draw salary in respect of his first permanent appointment, whether pensionable or not. Acting service in an office carrying claims to pension shall, when continuous with permanent employment, count as service for pension, provided no other officer was earning pension for the same period in respect of the same office. The service of an officer under 16 years of age shall not in any case count for pension.

(2) An officer is entitled to reckon as service for pension the whole period of absence on vacation leave, and half the period of absence on leave with half salary. Absence without salary will not count as service for pension.

9. (1) The pension or gratuity awarded to an officer shall be computed upon the salary drawn by him, at the time of his retirement, in respect of the permanent office or offices then held by him, provided that he shall have held such office or offices or an office or offices, to which the same fixed salary or incremental scale of salary is attached, for at least three years, otherwise the pension or gratuity shall be calculated upon the average of the salaries attached to the permanent offices held by such officer during the three years next preceding the date of his retirement.

(2) For the purposes of these rules, salary will include, in addition to the salary of the permanent office or offices held by him, any allowance voted to him by resolution of the Board as a pensionable allowance, but no other emolument whatsoever.

10. The rates of pension, retiring allowance, and gratuity above set forth shall be granted only in cases of faithful and meritorious service. Where the testimony as to good conduct is in any way defective, a deduction may be made from the pension or gratuity, and where the misconduct of an officer has been of a serious nature, the pension or gratuity may be entirely withheld.

11. The service in respect of which pensions or gratuities are granted ought in all cases to have been continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or by temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation. Service prior to a break of service may, however, be allowed to count for pension together with service subsequent to such break, if the whole of the intervening period has been spent in some employment under Government or under another statutory local authority.

12. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance is convicted of any offence in any Court in the Island and sentenced to death or to any term of rigorous imprisonment exceeding six months, the payment of such pension or allowance shall be forthwith discontinued, unless such person shall within three months of such conviction receive an unconditional pardon, or unless the Board with the approval of the Governor in any case for special reasons otherwise decides.

13. If any person to whom a pension, annuity, or allowance has been granted under these rules becomes a bankrupt, such pension, annuity, or allowance shall forthwith cease; but it shall be lawful for the Board, with the approval of the Governor, from time to time during the remainder of such person's life or during such shorter

period or periods, whether continuous or otherwise, as may be necessary, to pay all or any part of such pension, annuity, or allowance to, or to apply the same for the maintenance and personal support or benefit of, such person and his wife and children jointly or any one or more of them exclusively, as may in the circumstances of each case be necessary or expedient.

14. No person may at any time draw from the funds of the Board an amount of pension which, when added to the amount of any pension or pensions drawn in respect of other public service, exceeds two-thirds of the highest pensionable emoluments drawn by such person at any time in the course of his service under the Board or in such other public service.

15. If any person in receipt of a pension or retiring allowance from the Board returns to the service of the Board, he may be allowed to retain his pension or retiring allowance during the period of his re-employment, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement no award whatever under these rules; or he may be required to forego the pension or retiring allowance then drawn by him, in which case he shall receive on his ultimate retirement a pension or retiring allowance based on his aggregate service and the highest salary drawn by him at any time during that service. The Board shall decide the terms on which a former servant of the Board may be re-employed in any particular case.

16. Any employee of the Board drawing a salary of less than Rs. 400 per annum, retiring on account of illness after serving continuously for a period of 15 years and upwards may, if the Board be satisfied from the report of a Medical Board that he is unfit to discharge efficiently the duties of his office owing to infirmity of body or mind, be awarded such long service allowance not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem as the Board may think just and proper. In the case of employees who retire after attaining the age of 55 years or over, no Medical Board need be appointed. Any employee in receipt of daily pay, who has completed not less than 20 years' service, retiring in similar circumstances, may be awarded a gratuity calculated at a rate not exceeding 1/36th of a month's pay for each month's service.

17. In the event of any officer or servant, whether in a pensionable or non-pensionable office or on daily pay, dying while in the service of the Board, it shall be competent to the Board, subject to the approval of the Governor, to grant to the widow or next-of-kin of such officer or servant, a gratuity not exceeding three months' pay, and in addition one month's pay for each minor child.

18. If any case not covered by these rules shall arise which in the opinion of the Board merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance, or gratuity, a report setting out the circumstances of such case, together with the recommendation of the Board, shall be forwarded through the Commissioner of Local Government and the Controller of Establishments, General Treasury, to the Governor for his decision as to the nature and the amount of the compensation, if any, that may be awarded.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle held at the Municipal Office on Friday, March 15, 1935, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated March 9, 1935.**

Present :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; and Mr. C. H. Bardley.

1. The Minutes of the meeting held on Friday, February 15, 1935, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Arising out of item 13 of the Minutes, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya stated that nothing had yet been done with regard to the re-conditioning of Morris road, and inquired what action was being taken in the matter. The Chairman explained that there had been a little delay owing to the fact that the estimate had to be scrutinized by the Provincial Engineer and amended in accordance with his advice. This had now been done and the work would be put in hand as early as possible.

3. In connection with item 3 of the Minutes and the resolution of the Council contained therein, the Chairman informed the meeting that Mr. J. E. Perera, had submitted, in terms of by-law 26 of Chapter 2, a written dissent from the opinion of the majority of the Council. This was tabled, and the Chairman directed the Secretary to make an entry of the same in the minutes of the meeting to which the dissent referred. Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna and Thomas Amarasuriya stated that they wished to associate themselves with the dissent.

4. Two petitions were presented by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna and one by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya. The Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

5. Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka inquired whether the Chairman intended making a statement about the outbreak of smallpox in Galle. The Chairman replied that he had received from the Medical Officer of Health a full report on the situation and that this report would be circulated to the members. He further stated that eleven cases had occurred up to date including one in the Fort, which had been brought there from Katugoda.

Mr. Dahanayaka also mentioned the necessity for a proper motor ambulance as the present ambulance cart, being an antiquated one, was not at all satisfactory. He had noticed he said, school boys and others following the cart while patients were being removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital, and also that no Sanitary Inspector or Police Officer accompanied the cart or appeared to be in charge of it. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna said he agreed with the remarks made by Mr. Dahanayaka and stated further that during the last epidemic of smallpox he believed it had been agreed that as far as possible patients should be removed to the Infectious Diseases Hospital only during the night.

The Chairman undertook to investigate the matter.

6. To consider an application from the Public Service Recreation Club for the lease of a site in Victoria Park for the purpose of laying out two tennis courts.—Resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration.

7. To consider the Supplemental Budget for 1934.—Resolved that the Supplemental Budget for 1934 be passed.

8. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 300 for expenses in connection with Anti-Natal work of the Child Welfare Clinic.—Sanctioned.

9. To consider the work done for the Council by its Lawyer.—The Chairman moved the Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee.

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that the Council's Lawyer be informed that if at any time after July 1, 1935, his monthly allowance is seized under a prohibitory notice, his services will *ipso facto* be terminated.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted.

Mr. D. I. Durham seconded—Carried.

The following extracts from the minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

10. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of February 23, 1935 :—

(2) To consider 8 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(3) To consider the following estimates :—(b) Rs. 400 for improvements to the culvert opposite premises No. 57 at Cripps road—Recommended.

(e) Rs. 435 for constructing an outlet drain from the culvert near the Pirivena at Minuwangoda on the Wakwella road.—Recommended.

(f) Rs. 6,250 for constructing side drains along Kong Tree road.—Recommended (1) that the semi-circular type of drain be adopted and that the estimate be passed subject to certain alterations which the Municipal Engineer has been instructed to make, (2) that tenders be invited for the work.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

11. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of February 23, 1935.*

(2) To consider the purchase of a new Clayton Fumigating Machine.—Recommended that a Clayton Fumigating Machine, Type "M", be obtained from the Local Agents at a cost of Rs. 1,600 and that the vote of Rs. 1,000 already provided for this purpose be increased accordingly.

(3) To consider a petition from the scavenging labourers asking for an increase of pay.—Recommended that the request be refused as the Committee considers that the present rate of pay is adequate.

(4) To consider the question of inaugurating an assisted wiring scheme in Galle.—Recommended (1) that an assisted wiring scheme be introduced on the lines proposed by the Superintendent of the Electricity Department; (2) that a loan from Government of Rs. 11,000 for this purpose be applied for.

(5) To consider Mr. F. Magdon Ismail's motion at the General Meeting of Council of November 24, 1934, viz., that the clearing of the bucket chambers may be made part of the duty of the conservancy labourers. Recommended that no change be made in the present system as the Committee considers that the clearing of bucket chambers is a special service for which the rate payers should pay.

(6) To consider the question of appointing a Food Inspector for the town.—Recommended that no special Food Inspector be employed but that an additional trained Ward Inspector be appointed.

(7) To consider what equipment should be issued to the Inspectors and other officers of similar rank.—Recommended (1) that with effect from 1935 six uniform suits and a boot allowance of Rs. 8 be given annually to each of the Inspectors, the Supervisor, Antiplague Campaign, and the Manager, Conservancy Department, and as regards the issue of helmets and rain coats that no change be made in the present arrangements; (2) that a supplemental vote of Rs. 100 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(8) To consider a letter from the Vice Principal, Richmond College, on the question of the manufacture of soap. Recommended, in view of the explanation given, that no licence fee be demanded.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

12. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Friday, April 26, 1935, at 2 P.M.

With the permission of Council the following three items which did not appear on the agenda were next taken up for consideration:—

13. Purchase of a new 55 K. W. Engine set in lieu of replacement of Campbell Vertical Engine:—The Chairman informed the meeting that on January 12, 1935, the Council resolved to purchase a complete Crossley 55 K. W. set consisting of Engine and Generator at a cost of Rs. 26,750 and to retain the existing Campbell Vertical Engine as a standby. The Chairman, Local Loans and Development Fund, had now intimated that, as recommended by the Chief Engineer and Manager, Electrical Undertakings, the Commissioners are prepared to grant a loan of Rs. 20,000 only for the replacement of the Campbell Engine by a Crossley Engine to be used with the Generator of the existing set.—Resolved that the present Campbell Vertical Engine be scrapped and that it be replaced by a Crossley Engine to be purchased from Messrs. Walker & Greig, the Crossley Agents, at a cost of Rs. 20,000 and to be used with the Generator of the existing set—as recommended by the Chief Engineer and Manager, Electrical Undertakings.

14. Silver Jubilee Celebrations of His Majesty the King.—Resolved (1) that an address be presented at a cost not exceeding Rs. 100; (2) that the casket already obtained be utilized; (3) that a total supplemental vote of Rs. 3,600 be sanctioned, including the sum of Rs. 3,500 previously voted for illuminating the town.

15. To consider an application for water service to premises No. 107, Kumbalwella (Mahinda College Hostel). Resolved that the application be allowed.

16. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman stated that he had been requested by His Excellency the Governor to express his regret to the members of the Council for any inconvenience caused to them by the cancellation of His Excellency's tour. He added that His Excellency hoped to visit Galle in January or February next year.
