KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers vested in Us by section 3 of the Seashore Protection Ordinance, 1911, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim those parts of the seashore of this Island which are specified and defined in the schedules hereto as areas from or over which no sand, stone, coral, or other substance shall be removed from and after the date hereof.

SCHEDULE A.

That part of the sea and seashore lying between a point 150 yards west and a point 440 yards east of the Koerimalai spring at Keerimalai in the Valikamam North and East division of the Jaffna District, and bounded as follows :-

On the east by a straight line drawn from a point on the high water mark of the sea 440 yards east of the Keerimalai spring due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the south by the high water mark of the sea from the said point 440 yards east of the Keerimalailspring westward to a point 150 yards west of the same spring.

On the west by a straight line drawn from the said point on the high water mark of the sea 150 yards west of the Keerimalai spring due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the north by a straight line joining the northern extremities of the eastern and western boundaries.

SCHEDULE B.

That part of the sea and seashore lying between a point 100 yards west of the Infectious Diseases Hospital and a point 100 yards east of the Resthouse at Kankesanturai in Valikamam North and East division, Jaffna District, and bounded as follows :-

On the east by a straight line drawn from a point on the high water mark of the sea 100 yards east of the Kankesantural Resthouse due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the south by the high water mark of the sea from the said point 100 yards east of the Kankesanturai Resthouse westward to a point 100 yards west of the Infectious Diseases Hospital at Kankesanturai.

On the west by a straight line drawn from the said point on the high water mark of the sea 100 yards west of the said Infectious Diseases Hospital due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the north by a straight line joining the northern extremities of the eastern and western boundaries.

SCHEDULE C.

That part of the sea and seashore lying between the channels running northward from culvert No. 13/1 and culvert No. 13/2 on the Point Pedro-Punnalai road, adjoin-ing the Kankesanturai Sanatorium in Mayiliddi Coast in the Valikamam North and East division of the Jaffna District, and bounded as follows :-

On the east by a straight line drawn from the point where the channel running from culvert No. 13/1 meets the high water mark of the sea due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the west by a straight line drawn from the point where the channel running down from culvert No. 13/2 meets the high water mark of the sea due northward to a distance of 1 mile.

On the south by the high water mark of the sea between the said points where the channels running from culverts Nos. 13/1 and 13/2 meet the high water mark of the sea.

On the north by a straight line joining the northern extremities of the eastern and western boundaries.



The rules for the management and regulation of the Post The rules for the management and regulation of the Post Office Savings Bank published by Notification dated December 29, 1893, in *Government Gazette* No. 5,264 of December 29, 1893, as amended by Notification dated September 26, 1913, in *Government Gazette* No. 6,583 of October 3, 1913, and Notification dated April 8, 1931, in *Government Gazette* No. 7,841 of April 10, 1931, are hereby further amended as follows :

By the deletion of rules 3, 7, 8, 9, and 17 and the substitution of the following new rules therefor :-


3. (1) At the time when the first deposit is made the depositor shall make and sign a declartion in the following form :-

DECLARATION BY DEPOSITOR.

- (full name including all Christian and ge I, names) ——— (occupation) of ——— (address in full), do hereby declare to the Postmaster-General that I am desirous of becoming a depositor on my own behalf in the Post Office Savings Bank.

I do further declare that no money has been deposited by me or any other person for my benefit in any other account in the Post Office Savings Bank.



(2) Every such declaration shall be signed in the

presence of and be attested by (a) the officer appointed by the Postmaster-General

to receive deposits, or (b) a person known to that officer, or (c) a Justice of the Peace.

7. (1) (a) Subject to the approval of the Postmaster-General, deposits may be made in the name of one person as Trustee for another person as beneficiary.

(b) The names of both Trustee and beneficiary shall be entered in the title of the account.

(2) At the time when a first deposit is so made a declaration in the following form shall be made by the Trustee :

(3) Upon the application of any beneficiary the Postmaster-General may, in his discretion, remove the name of the Trustee from the title of the account and either substitute the name of another person as Trustee or continue the account in the name of the beneficiary alone.

(4) Where the name of a new Trustee is substituted under the foregoing paragraph, such Trustee shall make the declaration prescribed in paragraph (2) of this rule.

(5) An application to withdraw money so deposited shall be made-

- (a) jointly by both the Trustee and the beneficiary, or (b) where the account is continued in the name of the
- beneficiary alone, by the beneficiary, or (c) where the Trustee or beneficiary is dead, by the survivor of them, or
- (d) where both Trustee and beneficiary are dead, either by the executor or administrator of that one of them who survived the other, or where such survivor dies intestate and his estate is of such value that it is not required by law to be administered, by the person or persons entitled under the law of inheritance to the property of such intestate.

(6) The Postmaster-General may require proof of survivorship to his satisfaction.

(9) Where either the Trustee or the beneficiary has

been adjudged to be of unsound mind, or adjudicated an insolvent, the Postmaster-General may in his discretion pay the deposits to the other, and a receipt given by such other person shall be a valid discharge to the Postmaster-General for the sum so paid.

8. (1) Deposits may be made by and in the name of a minor of the age of seven years and upwards. (2) Deposits may be made on behalf and in the name

of a minor under seven years of age by any person.






