**GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.****Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, April 26, 1935, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated April 16, 1935.**

*Present* :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo ; and Mr. C. H. Bradley.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of March 15, 1935, and of the Special Meeting of April 2, 1935, copies thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. A petition was presented by Mr. A. C. Mohammedo from the residents of Pettigalawatta regarding the road drains of Pettigalawatta. This was tabled and the Chairman said that it would receive consideration.

3. To sanction the following supplemental votes :—(a) Rs. 290 for repairs to the bathing well at the Victoria Park, (b) Rs. 2,000 under Head 19, Infectious Diseases.—Sanctioned.

Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka suggested that tenders be invited for the supply of food to the contacts in the Segregation Camp.

Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka suggested that the present practice do continue.

After some discussion the Chairman stated that he would table for discussion the petition received from a resident of Katugoda who was a contact in the Segregation Camp, *re* food supplied, and connected papers.

4. To submit the Audit Report for the year ended December 31, 1934 :—Resolved that the report be circulated to the members who have not seen it.

The Chairman commended the staff for good work done during the year.

5. To consider an application from the Municipal Inspectors for an allowance whilst engaged in dealing with the outbreak of smallpox :—Resolved that all the Municipal Officers and labourers be paid  $\frac{1}{2}$  subsistence allowance for the period during which they were engaged in dealing with the outbreak of smallpox.

6. Considered an application for 26 working days leave from the Medical Officer of Health :—Resolved that the leave be allowed and that the Council do pay the substitute a salary of Rs. 7.50 per working day.

The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

*7. Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 30, 1935.*

(2) Considered 10 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(3) Considered an application from the Public Service Recreation Club for the lease of a site in Victoria Park for the purpose of laying down 2 tennis courts.—Recommended.

(4) Considered the following estimates :—(a) Rs. 28,000 for maintenance of roads.—Recommended that the total estimate be passed with the exception of the estimate for the reconditioning of Ward street and the Dickson road junction ; and that the Municipal Engineer be asked to submit a fresh estimate for sett paving Ward street and the Dickson road junction. (b) Rs. 1,950 for building and supplying 3 double-bullock carts and 3 single-bullock scavenging carts.—Recommended that one of each be ordered at a cost of Rs. 650.

(5) Considered Mr. E. A. Paulas motion at the General Meeting of Council on July 26, 1934, *viz.* :—That the swamp at Kandewatta adjoining the Railway line to Colombo and the Kandewatta road be acquired for the purpose of reclaiming with the sweepings of the town.—Recommended the acquisition of the land and the garage and not the houses.

(6) Considered Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka's motion at the General Meeting of Council on July 26, 1934, viz. :—That the block of land between the awasa and the property of the late Collector Jayasinghe situated at Minuwangoda and bordering on the Wakwella road be acquired for a playground.—Recommended that consideration be deferred.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (3) it was resolved to defer consideration till the next meeting of Council. The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

8. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 30, 1935.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Wards 3, 4, 5A, 6, and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Considered a proposal to waive the rates for 3rd quarter, 1934, amounting to Rs. 15.08 and the rates for 4th quarter, 1934, amounting to Rs. 7.98 on the evacuated buildings in the plague area in Ward No. 3.—Recommended that the rates for 3rd quarter, 1934, amounting to Rs. 15.08 and the rates for 4th quarter, 1934, amounting to Rs. 7.98 on the evacuated buildings in the plague area in Ward 3 be waived.

(4) Considered the rate of payment for the destruction of stray dogs by the Municipal Dog Shooter.—Recommended that Re. 1 be paid for each dog shot and buried by the Municipal Dog Shooter.

(5) Considered an application from Mrs. K. S. Mohideen Lebbe, widow of the late Shroff, for a gratuity under the Municipal Pension Rules.—Recommended, under rule 24 of the Municipal Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 1,225 being three months' pay of the office to the widow and one month's pay for each of the minor children.

(6) Considered the present system of charging for electricity supplied in cases where a consumer goes into occupation of a house towards the end of the month.—Recommended that where a consumer goes into occupation of a house within 3 days of the end of the month the electricity consumed for the month in such cases be included in the bill for the following month.

(7) Considered the question of writing off rates for 1935, on the ground of poverty of the owners.—Recommended that the rates for 1935 be written off on the properties mentioned in the annexed lists amounting to Rs. 325.43 on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(8) Considered the question of appointing a permanent office labourer.—Recommended that a permanent office labourer be appointed on a monthly salary of Rs. 15 as from May 1, 1935.

(9) Considered a revised scale of charges for electricity supplied for power purposes.—Recommended that the following charges be adopted from May 1, 1935.

(a) *Domestic heating and cooking.*—On the double tariff meter :—10 cents per unit during off peak load, *i.e.*, between 9.30 P.M. on one night and 6.15 P.M. the next night, and ordinary lighting rate during peak load, *i.e.*, 6.15 P.M. to 9.30 P.M. Meter rent Re. 1 per month.

(b) *Domestic refrigerators, small motors with a maximum of ½ H.P., and battery charging.*—A flat rate of 15 cents per unit inclusive of meter rent and subject to a minimum monthly charge of Rs. 5. On consumption of over 100 units per month the ordinary industrial power rate to apply.

(c) *Industrial motive power.*—For motive power the following scale to apply during "off peak load". Automatic Time Switch to cut off motive current during "peak load". Minimum charge Rs. 40 per month. Rent of meter and Time Switch Rs. 2 per month :—1 to 100 units at 14 cents per unit, 101 to 200 units at 13 cents per unit, 201 to 300 units at 12 cents per unit, 301 to 400 units at 11 cents per unit, 401 to 500 units at 10 cents per unit, 501 units and over at 9 cents per unit.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (4) it was resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committee do take effect from May 1, 1935.

With regard to item (6) it was resolved that no meter rent be charged for the 3 day period.

With regard to item (9) (a) it was resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

9. *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of March 30, 1935.*

(2) Considered papers relating to the licensing by the Council of vehicles and animals from outside Municipal limits.—Recommended that the procedure of the Kandy Municipal Council be adopted, *i.e.*, the Inspector of Vehicles and Animals keeps notes of vehicles kept outside Municipal limits but used within the town for purposes of taxation.

(3) Considered the question of amending Regulation No. 31 of the Water Service By-laws in order to enable the Council to supply water used for domestic purposes free of charge to premises which are exempted by law from the payment of rates.—Recommended that the draft regulation be adopted.

(4) Considered the question of extending the present Police limits.—Recommended that the area bounded on the North by an imaginary line eastwards 3 chains north of Kumbalwella road up to its junction with Hirimbura road, thence along an imaginary line 3 chains north of Hirimbura Cross road up to its junction with Hirimbura road and thence Hirimbura road up to its junction with Morris road; East—from the last mentioned point southwards for a distance of 3 chains, thence westwards along an imaginary line 3 chains south of Hirimbura road and Hirimbura Cross road up to the junction of Hirimbura Cross road with Hirimbura road, and thence southwards along an imaginary line 3 chains to the east of Hirimbura road up to its junction with Circular road; South—an imaginary line westwards 3 chains north of Cripps road from its junction with Hirimbura road up to its junction with Elliott road; West—an imaginary line northwards 3 chains east of Elliott road from its junction with Cripps road to its junction with Kumbalwella road, shall be subjected to an assessment rate of 8½ per cent. and a lighting rate of 3¼ per cent. from January 1, 1936.

(5) Considered papers relating to latrine on premises No. 21, Magalle.—Recommended that consideration be deferred.

*Resolution.*

With regard to item (2) resolved that consideration be deferred and to inquire from the Medical Officer of Health whether all the Ward Inspectors can keep notes of Vehicles kept outside Municipal limits but used within the town for purposes of taxation.

With regard to item (4) resolved that consideration be deferred, and the sketch of the area be circulated.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

10. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Resolved that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Friday, May 10, 1935, at 2 P.M.

11. At the conclusion of the meeting the Chairman moved Council into Committee.

The Chairman stated that the report of the Medical Officer of Health on Smallpox had been published in the press without his authority and appealed to the members to co-operate with him in preventing a repetition.


