WHEREAS it is enacted by section 34 (1) of "The Ceylon Railways Ordinance, 1902," that it shall be lawful for the Governor from time to time to declare by Proclamation any road or path which the railway may cross to be a "minor crossing" and whether such "minor crossing" shall be closed by gates or not:

And whereas it is deemed expedient to declare the road crossed by the railway between Madawachchi Station in the North-Central Province and Vavuniya Station in the Northern Province a "minor crossing

THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927.

REGULATIONS for the Urban area comprised within the administrative limits of the Municipality of Colombo, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 53 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations-

"the Chairman" means the Chairman of the Municipal

Council of Colombo; "public stand" means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cars by a notice exhibited at the spot by, or by the authority of, the Chairman.

2. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of any class of motor car specified in the notice exhibited at that stand, no motor car not belonging to that class shall enter it or be parked in it.

3. Where a public stand or any portion thereof is reserved for omnibuses proceeding to a particular destination, no omnibuses other than those proceeding to that destination shall be parked in such stand, or portion thereof.

4. Without a licence in that behalf issued by the

Chairman, no omnibus or motor cab shall be parked in a public stand reserved for omnibuses or motor cabs.

Where separate passages for entrance and exit have been provided, and indicated by notice or signboard, at a public stand for omnibuses or motor cabs, no omnibus or motor cab shall enter or leave that public stand except by the appropriate passage.

All omnibuses or motor cabs parked in a public stand where chains or posts or both chains and posts have been provided, shall be halted facing the same direction and one behind the other in the order of their arrival, and shall at the request of any police officer be moved up in due order as vacancies occur in front.

7. No omnibus or motor cab shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any other omnibus or

motor cab entering or leaving the stand.

8. No person, other than the driver or the conductor or a bona fide passenger, shall remain or be allowed to remain in any omnibus or motor cab while it is parked in a public stand.

The driver of any omnibus or motor cab occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the licence issued in respect of such omnibus or motor cab under the foregoing regulation 4.

10. Every driver or other person in charge of any omnibus or motor cab in any public stand, shall conduct

himself in an orderly manner.

Goonesinha, M.S.C., presented a potition signed by the President and the Secretary of Sri Punyaloka Abhayadana Society of Slave Island, stating that at a meeting held by the Society it was decided to make a request to this Council to suspend the slaughtering of animals on Wesak Full Moon Day, and requested that the petition be submitted to the appropriate Committee for consideration and report.
- Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved: "With reference to the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees regarding the appointment of the City Microbiologist which was confirmed by the Council on March 6, 1935, I move that applications be also invited from candidates in Ceylon and that both sets of applications be placed together before the appropriate Committees for consideration." Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

Dr. S. Muttiah wished to know whether the motion was in order in view of the fact that the Council decided this

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of April 9, 1935, was considered.

- (1) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, Municipal Council, regarding an inquiry from the Controller of Labour as to whether the Municipal Council will undertake to contribute half of the cost of wages to be paid to unemployed labour on a projected scheme for reclaiming a part of the Bloemendahl Swamp. Registered No. 456.—Recommended that the Controller of Labour be informed as follows:—(a) Council reiterates its disclaimer of responsibility for dealing with the unemployment problem which it insists should be regarded as a national and not a local problem; (b) Council does not regard the provision of Relief Works, or the system of employing unemployed labour on essential works which would ordinarily absorb labour at current rates of pay as a satisfactory method of dealing with the unemployment problem; (c) On the basis that the project is to be regarded as a make-shift and emergency measure which will last long enough to allow Government time to introduce a system of Poor Law and Unemployment Relief on a national basis, Council is prepared to assist in the Bloemendhal Reclamation scheme on the following terms:-
 - (1) The Municipal Council's contribution to be restricted to a share of the cost of wages of unemployed labour employed on the scheme and in no case to include any part of the cost of acquisition, transport, overhead charges, plant, or skilled labour.

(2) The Municipal Council's contribution to consist of $\frac{1}{2}$ cost of wages paid to unemployed labour

The land to be improved is Government land and objects (a) and (b) named in paragraph (1) of Controller of Labour's letter under reference are of national advantage the major cost of which fall on the taxpayer rather than on the ratepayer.

(3) The Municipal Council's liability for the Relief of unemployment during the continuance of the scheme

to be restricted to its contribution in respect of the scheme. (4) That the annual commitment of the Municipal Council in respect of such contribution do not exceed

Rs. 150,000. (5) That the existing system of selection and investigation continue and that Council be under no obligation

to relieve any persons excluded under this system.

(6) That the arrangement be reviewed after 2 years.

The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on April 27, 1935, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the notice dated April 23, 1935.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on March 23, 1935, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

The following documents were submitted:

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1934 to March 31, 1935, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to the same date.

(c) Health Officer's report for March, 1935.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of March, 1935.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ended April 27, 1935.

Resolved that the statement (a) together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of "The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910", be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the Government Gazette.

3. The following papers were laid on the table:—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during March, 1935. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on

With regard to item (b) Ratwatte Adigar suggested that Katugastota-Inigolla path might be included in the list of drives as it is a public path which the Council should maintain.

Mr. Abhayanayake suggested that necessary repairs might be effected to Lady Torrington road.

Chairman agreed to issue instructions accordingly. the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

- (c) On Mr. Beven's suggestion the Chairman agreed to take steps for the destruction of flying foxes damaging the trees on the Island in the lake.
- Petitions: --Mr. Wijayatilake presented a letter dated April 26, 1935, addressed to him by Mr. M. Nagoor Pitche of No. 73, Public Market, Kandy, for permission to establish a mutton stall at premises No. 189, Katukele.

 Resolved that the petition be referred to the Markets Committee for consideration.

 5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Abhayanayake asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:—
- Q.—(1) With reference to the replies to my questions No. 1 (d)-(e) asked at the last meeting of Council, will the Chairman be pleased to state—(a) What is the limit of satisfaction to be reached by the Officers referred to? A.—An officer appointed on probation must prove himself to be amenable to instructions and reasonably efficient before he can be confirmed. He must not be found guilty of any act which throws any doubt on his honesty or general conduct, during the period of probation, and he must not be in debt.

Q.—(b) Is there a definite standard of efficiency laid down at present for officers appointed on probation setting out clearly the requirements to be fulfilled by such officers before their appointments could be confirmed? A.—No.

Q.—(c) If the answer to (b) above is in the affirmative, what are these requirements? A.—This does not arise.
Q.—(d) If the answer to (b) above is in the negative will the Chairman be pleased to lay down such a definite standard for the future in the case of such appointments? A.—I consider that it would be impracticable to lay down a definite standard which could be applied to every case.

(2) Will the Chairman be pleased to ascertain what the total cost would be to this Council to complete the work of the Sports Pavilion on the Bogambara Grounds with its necessary drainage, lavatories, water service, furniture, lighting arrangements, &c., and other conveniences generally expected by the Sporting Public? A.—A sum of Rs. 768 for lavatories, drainage, &c., has yet to be spent out of the vote allowed for the building. pleted and furniture supplied. The lavatories are in course of construction. Water supply has been com-

Electric lights have not been provided for, but if deemed necessary, the Municipal Electrical Engineer can be asked

to furnish an estimate.

In connection with the administration of the Bogambara Recreation Grounds, I am addressing various Clubs, on instructions of the Works Committee, and I shall take that opportunity to invite suggestions as to any further conveniences

necessary at the Pavilion.

Q.—(3) With reference to the petition from the Muslim Population of Mavilmada, Nittawela, Siyambalagastenne, and Watapuluwa, presented by me regarding the damage caused to their Mosque by the Municipal drain passing by it, will the Chairman be pleased to have at least the portion of this drain opposite the Mosque protected from further erosion?

A.—My predecessor inspected the drain in question on November 29 last and arrived at the conclusion that there was no reason for the Municipal Council to build a stone drain.

Q.—(4) Will the Chairman be pleased to state what action has been taken regarding the petition from Mr. D. D. Jayasooriya and several others praying for facilities for waste water baths at the Power Station as had been provided sometime ago? A.—On a petition presented by Mr. Soysa at the meeting of Council held on February 16 last an estimate has been prepared for the erection of 2 bathing places and 2 shelters for males and females at the rear of premises No. 27, Peradeniya road. A small extent of private land is required and the Chief Revenue Inspector has been asked to ascertain whether the owner will give the land free. The papers will be placed before the Works Committee in due course.

5a. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Ismail asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied:—

-(1) (a) How many consumers of electrical energy there are in the Municipality whose supplies are regulated by meter?

? A.—1,142.
Q.—(b) What amount is recovered per month as meter rent? A.—Rs. 1,100.
Q.—(c) Whether the meters are cleaned and oiled, and if so, how often? A.—Yes, as the necessity arises. 101 meters were repaired, cleaned or oiled during 1934.

Q.—(d) Whether the services at (c) are rendered free; if not, what amount accrues to the Council annually from this service? A.—Service is rendered free in consideration of the meter rent paid.

Q.-(2) In view of the fact that meter rent now forms a perpetual charge on the consumer and he pays the cost of the meter over and over again as meter rent, will the Chairman kindly state if it is possible to relieve future applicants for electrical connections of this unreasonable charge by including the entire value of the meter to be supplied in the original estimate of cost of installation. A.—The present conditions of Electricity Supply and the proposed by laws for regulating supply recognize the meter to be the Council proposed for penalties for interference with the meter by any The meter being the most important factor in recording consumption it is essential that the ownership and control should remain in the hands of the Council, and I do not recommend a change in the present system. The charge of Re. 1 as meter rent is not unreasonable when all charges incidental to upkeep and reading of meters are taken into account and it is amply justified in the absence of a minimum charge as a condition of supply. I am informed that the charge of Re. 1 is in force in all the other large towns in Ceylon.

5B. Pursuant to notice Mr. Abhayanayake was to move—

"That in view of the fact that the Municipal Engineer, Mr. J. S. Garment, has been found wanting in the preparation of proper and suitable estimates at the correct stage for the construction of a desirable type of Sports Pavilion for Kandy on the Bogambara Grounds, and that he has thereby committed this Council to an unexpectedly large and unintended expenditure, this Council do censure him and take necessary action to deal with him suitably.

Chairman rules the motion out of order on the ground that resolution No. 10 (6) of the recommendations of the Standing Committees passed at the meeting of Council held on March 23, 1935, was the same in substance as the motion now proposed and that under by law 19A a period of six months should elapse from the date of the previous resolution before it could be moved.

5c. Pursuant to notice Mr. de Silva moved:-

"That tenders be called for works connected with the Mahaweliganga Pumping Scheme, other than those entrusted to the present contractor.'

Mr. Wijavatilake seconded.

The Council agreed to tenders being invited subject to (1) only two additional wells being constructed instead of three provided in the scheme, and (2) tenders being accepted only after the Director of Public Works has been satisfied as to the construction and yield of the three wells now under construction.

To consider representations made by the traders at the Market Fair and to decide on the Market Area to be allowed for the fair.

Resolved to authorize occupation of the area allowed in 1934 in lieu of the area referred to in the tender notice dated November 17, 1934, until December 31, 1935.

7. To obtain sanction to allow current for power purposes to Iceland on the same terms as to Messrs. Miller & Co., Ltd., viz. :-

Day load at 12 cents per unit and Night load at 20 cents per unit.

Resolved that the proposed rates be sanctioned provided the consumption exceeds 1,500 units per mensem.
