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## PROCLAMATIONS BY THE GOVERNOR.

IN the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

### PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by the 3rd section of "The Local Board of Health and Improvement Ordinance, 1876," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be for that purpose published in the *Government Gazette*, to bring any of the towns mentioned in the schedule to the said Ordinance annexed under the operation of the said Ordinance, and to define the limits of such town or towns respectively for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such Proclamation to amend, alter, or revoke as and whenever the Governor shall, with like advice, determine:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 12th September, 1878, the town of Puttalam, in the North-Western Province, a town mentioned in the schedule aforesaid, was brought under the operation of the said Ordinance, and the limits of the said town were, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, defined in such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Proclamation of the 12th September, 1878, aforesaid, as respects the limits of the said town of Puttalam, and to re-define the limits of the said town of Puttalam for the purposes aforesaid :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, hereby amend the Proclamation of the said 12th September, 1878, aforesaid, by altering the limits of the said town as defined therein, and We do hereby proclaim, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, that the limits of the said town of Puttalam, in the North-Western Province, shall be those set out in the schedule hereto as from and after the 22nd day of July, 1895.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-second day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

SCHEDULE.

*North and North-West.*—The road reservation of 30 links north of preliminary plan 1,375 and lots 140,299 and 103,238 ; the northern boundary of lot 84,842, and a straight line taken thence in a south-westerly direction past the north-west point of the bund of Nedunkulam tank to the lake.

*East and North-East.*—The road reservation east of lots 137,595, 62,616, 62,623, 53,327, 59,384, 62,611, 137,594, 62,610, and 59,383 ; the eastern boundaries of lots 59,380, 66,038, 66,037, and thence a line taken to meet the road reservation north of lot preliminary plan 1,375.

WHEREAS by section 7 of "The Police Ordinance, 1865," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, from time to time, as occasion may require, to establish by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* a Police Force for the effectual protection of person and property within such towns as to them shall appear to require the same, and that whenever such force shall be so established within any town, the said Ordinance shall come into operation therein :

And whereas it is expedient to establish a Police Force in the town of Puttalam, in the North-Western Province, under the provisions of the said section of the said Ordinance :

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice and consent of the Executive Council, do hereby, as from and after the 1st day of January, 1896, establish a Police Force in the town of Puttalam aforesaid under the provisions of the said section of the said Ordinance, and define the limits of the said town to be those specified in the schedule hereto.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Thirtieth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.
