(1) The completion of the following items of the necessary work, namely, (a) acquisition of the field called Andapal-deniya (lots 80, 89A, and 90A in extract 1 of block survey preliminary plan No. 266, Sabaragamuwa) and (b) construction of a concrete masonry road culvert and a concrete spill sluice up to the estimated cost of Rs. 630 is undertaken by the Government.

(2) In consideration of the aforesaid undertaking on the part of the Government, the proprietors on their part undertake to clear jungle and to complete earthworks in accordance with the specifications issued by the Divisional Irrigation Engineer and to the satisfaction of the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent, and for this purpose each of the proprietors agrees—

- (a) to clear 1 acre of jungle and to complete 4/11 of a cube of earthwork and 3/55 of a cube of puddle clay in respect of each acre owned by him under the aforesaid irrigation work ;

RULES.

1. No person shall kill or catch fish by means of dynamite or other explosives or poison or by any other means not in accordance with the local custom of this subdivision.

2. No person shall for the purpose of catching fish open, block-up, or otherwise interfere with any communal canal, tank, embankment, pond, amuna, water-course or ela without the permission of the Chairman: Provided that such permission shall not be given if the Chairman, after such consultation as he may consider necessary with the Irrigation Headmen or any other officer, is of opinion that the granting of such permission is likely to be detrimental to the cultivation of land in the subdivision.

3. No person shall fish in pools or waters near vihares, pansalas, or other places in which it has hitherto not been the custom in this subdivision to fish.

4. No person shall fish in tanks, pools, or waters used for the bathing of animals.

5. (1) No person shall catch fish by means of gunny bags.

(2) No person shall use the ma-dela, nul-dela, or ara-dela or any other net which is likely to destroy ova or small fry.
