## RULE OF COURT.

*Rule regulating the service of process emanating from countries with which Civil Procedure Conventions have been concluded.*

In exercise of the power vested in Us by "The Courts Ordinances, 1889 and 1901," and of every other power enabling Us, We hereby make the following rule additional to those published in the *Government Gazette* of January 27, 1911:—

Where in any civil or commercial matter pending before a Court or Tribunal in any foreign country with which a Convention on that behalf has been or shall be applied to Ceylon, a Request for service of any document on a person in Ceylon is received by the Chief Secretary from the Consular or other authority of such country and transmitted by him to the Registrar of the Supreme Court, the following provisions shall, subject to any special provision contained in the Convention, be adopted:—

- (1) The service shall be effected by the delivery of the original or a copy of the document, as indicated in the request, and the copy of the translation, to the party or person by the Fiscal.
- (2) No Court fees shall be charged in respect of the service. The particulars of charges of the Fiscal shall be submitted to the Registrar, Supreme Court, who shall certify the amount properly payable in respect thereof.
- (3) The Registrar, Supreme Court, shall transmit to the Chief Secretary a certificate under the seal of the Supreme Court establishing the fact and the date of the service in person, or indicating the reasons for which it has not been possible to effect it, and at the same time shall notify to the Chief Secretary the charges certified under paragraph (2) hereof.

THE following instructions as to applications for Certificates of Naturalization by Aliens resident in Ceylon are published for general information:—

(A.)

### THE BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACT, 1914.

Instructions as to applications for Certificates of Naturalization by Aliens resident in Ceylon.

*These instructions are not applicable in the case of a woman who was a British subject previously to her marriage to an alien, and whose husband has died or whose marriage has been dissolved, or in the case of a person whose application is based upon service under the Crown. Persons in either of these classes should apply to the Hon. the Chief Secretary for special instructions.*

*Where the certificate sought comes within one of the following exceptional classes, viz., Certificates of Naturalization which the Governor is empowered to grant—*

(a) *to a person with respect to whose nationality as a British subject a doubt exists (Section 4 of the Act);*

(b) *to minors, in special cases (Section 5 of the Act); and*

(c) *to persons who have been naturalized in Ceylon prior to the 7th of August, 1914 (Section 6 of the Act),*

*these Instructions are subject to modifications, of which particulars will be furnished by the Hon. the Chief Secretary in appropriate cases.*

The Act requires an applicant to satisfy the Governor—

(a) that he has resided in His Majesty's dominions for not less than five years in the following manner, that is to say, for one year immediately preceding the application in Ceylon, and for an additional period of four years within the last eight years before the application either in Ceylon or in some other part of His Majesty's dominions;

(b) that he is of good character and has an adequate knowledge of the English language (or, in a Colony in which another language is recognized as on an equality with the English language, of that other language); and

(c) that he intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to serve under the Crown.

1. An application for the grant of a Certificate of Naturalization should be addressed to the Governor on the appropriate form. Forms of application may be obtained from the Government Recordkeeper, Secretariat buildings, Colombo, on payment of 50 cents for each form.

2. The application should include the following particulars:—

Full original name;

Private address;

Occupation and business address;

Date and place of birth;

Nationality at birth;

Full names and nationality of parents, and their address (if living);

Whether single, married, a widower, a widow, or divorced from wife/husband;

and, in addition, where applicable, details of :—

- Any previous application for naturalization ;
- Any change of name, or any other name used for private or business purposes ;
- Any change of nationality since birth, with a statement of the circumstances in which the change occurred ;
- Any criminal or civil proceedings, including bankruptcy proceedings, ever taken against the applicant in any Court of Law ;
- Date and place of marriage, full name of wife, and her nationality before marriage ; and
- Full names of any legitimate children, with date and place of birth of each, and their present residence.

*The place of birth should be stated, where possible, in the form of a postal address, showing the province or other division of the country as well as the town or district in which the applicant was born.*

*Nationality should be described accurately by reference to a Sovereign State, e.g., a Russian Pole should be described as either a Russian or a Pole, but should not be described as a Pole unless he is recognized as such by the competent Polish authorities.*

3. The application must also show that the applicant satisfies the conditions prescribed in the Act as to residence in His Majesty's dominions, character, knowledge of English (or other recognized language), and intention to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to serve under the Crown.

4. The details of residence should be clearly set out by dates and addresses as follows :—

5. If the applicant has resided entirely within His Majesty's dominions for the five years immediately preceding the application, details of his residence for that period will suffice, but if any part of that period has been spent out of His Majesty's dominions details of residence (both in those dominions and elsewhere) should be shown for the last eight years.

6. A statement should be added of the total length of the applicant's residence (a) in Ceylon, and (b) elsewhere in His Majesty's dominions.

7. For the purpose of the requirements of the Act as to residence (whether in Ceylon or elsewhere in His Majesty's dominions) residence will be taken as meaning continuous personal presence, subject to such brief and occasional periods of absence as may seem to the Governor not inconsistent with essential continuity of residence. Any period of absence, however brief, must be mentioned in the application. Where the applicant's business or private affairs necessitate repeated short absences which are consistent with continuity of residence in His Majesty's dominions, the circumstances giving rise to such absences should be explained.

8. The Governor will require a frank disclosure of any proceedings of any nature—criminal or civil—ever taken against the applicant in any Court of Law or Bankruptcy. Full particulars should be given, including the nature, date and result, of all such proceedings, even if the applicant was not convicted, fined, etc.

Any composition with creditors should also be disclosed under this heading.

9. In considering whether an applicant has an adequate knowledge of the English (or other recognized language), the Governor may have regard to his ability to read and write as well as to speak it.

10. The application must also contain a statement that the applicant intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to serve under the Crown.

11. The name of any legitimate child of the applicant who does not already possess British nationality may be included in the Certificate if granted during the child's minority, and a child whose name is so included is deemed to be a person to whom a certificate of naturalization has been granted. If it is desired that the Certificate should extend to any such children, a special request should be included in the application.

12. The statements in the application must be supported by an affidavit (which should be endorsed on the application) made by the applicant before a Justice of the Peace, a Commissioner for Oaths, or other person authorized to administer Oaths.

*The affidavit must not be sworn to or affirmed before a person who is the Solicitor, Proctor or Agent of the Applicant.*

13. The application must be supported by four persons intimately acquainted with the applicant, each of whom must be—

- (a) a natural-born British subject ;
- (b) a householder ; and
- (c) not the solicitor, proctor or agent of the applicant.

Each such person should sign at the end of the application a statement that he is so qualified, that he supports the application from personal knowledge of and intimate acquaintance with the applicant, and that he can vouch for the applicant's good character and loyalty. The period for which he has known the applicant should be stated.

14. An applicant is also required to insert on two occasions in a newspaper or newspapers circulating in the district in which he resides an advertisement in the following form :—

"Notice is hereby given that \_\_\_\_\_ of \_\_\_\_\_ is applying to the Governor for naturalization, and that any person who knows any reason why naturalization should not be granted should send a written and signed statement of the facts to \_\_\_\_\_."

Any advertisement so inserted must include the full name and postal address of the applicant.

15. When completed, the application should be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor accompanied by a copy of each newspaper containing the advertisement, which should be clearly marked. The preliminary fee of Rs. 10 (see paragraph 17) should also accompany the application.

16. The statements in the application and the references will be made the subject of independent enquiry directed by the Governor.

17. The total fee payable in respect of the grant of a Certificate of Naturalization is Rs. 100, of which Rs. 10 is payable on the submission of the application. No application will be considered until the preliminary fee of Rs. 10 is paid ; this preliminary fee will not in any circumstances be refunded. The remaining sum of Rs. 90 is not payable until an intimation is received that the Certificate will be granted.

18. Other expenses necessarily involved are the usual stamp duty payable on swearing the affidavit and a fee of Re. 1.25 payable on taking the Oath of Allegiance.

19. When the Certificate is granted, further instructions will be issued as to taking the Oath of Allegiance and its registration.

20. The grant of a Certificate of Naturalization to an alien does not confer British nationality upon his wife. If his wife desires to become a British subject, it will be necessary for her to make a declaration to that effect. The necessary form of declaration will be supplied by the Hon. the Chief Secretary when the Certificate of Naturalization is sent to the applicant in order that the Oath of Allegiance may be taken. The fee of Rs. 5 which is payable in respect of the declaration should be forwarded to the Hon. the Chief Secretary with the declaration. It is also subject to a stamp duty of Re. 1.

21. After an application has been submitted, His Excellency the Governor should be informed by letter of any material circumstance which occurs before a certificate is issued and which may affect the accuracy of the particulars represented in the application. A certificate, if granted, may be revoked if it is afterwards found to have been obtained by false representations or by concealment of material circumstances.

*N.B.—If the foregoing instructions are not closely and accurately observed, it may be necessary to return the application for amendment, thus causing delay and possibly additional expense.*

THE following instructions as to an application for a Certificate of Naturalization by a woman resident in Ceylon are published for general information :—

(B.)

### THE BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACT, 1914.

Instructions as to an application for a Certificate of Naturalization by a woman resident in Ceylon, who being a British subject before her marriage, lost her British Nationality on marriage to an alien, and whose husband is dead or whose marriage has been dissolved.

*These instructions are not applicable in the case of a woman whose former husband was at the date of the marriage a British subject.*

1. An application for the grant of a Certificate of Naturalization should be addressed to the Governor on the appropriate form. Forms of application may be obtained from the Government Recordkeeper, Secretariat buildings, Colombo.

2. The application should include the following particulars :—

Full name;  
Private address;  
Occupation (if any);  
Date and place of birth;  
Full names and nationality of parents;  
Date and place of marriage;  
Name and nationality of former husband;  
Date and place of husband's death or of the final decree of dissolution of the marriage;

and in addition, where applicable :—

Full names of any legitimate children, with date and place of birth of each and their present residence.

Unless it appears from the above particulars that the applicant was before her marriage a natural-born British subject, the application must also show how she became a British subject.

*The place of birth should be stated, where possible, in the form of a postal address, showing the province or other division of the country as well as the town or district in which the applicant was born.*

*Nationality should be described accurately by reference to a Sovereign State, e.g., a Russian Pole should be described as either a Russian or a Pole but should not be described as a Pole unless recognized as such by the competent Polish authorities.*

3. The name of any legitimate child of the applicant who does not already possess British nationality may be included in the certificate if granted during the child's minority, and a child whose name is so included is deemed to be a person to whom a certificate of naturalization has been granted. If it is desired that the certificate should extend to any such children, a special request should be included in the application.

4. The statements in the application must be supported by an affidavit (which should be endorsed on the application) made by the applicant before a Justice of the Peace, a Commissioner for Oaths, or other person authorized to administer Oaths.

*The affidavit must not be sworn or affirmed to before a person who is the Solicitor, Proctor or Agent of the applicant.*

5. The application must be supported by two persons intimately acquainted with the applicant, each of whom must be :—

- a natural-born British subject;
- a householder; and
- not the solicitor, proctor or agent of the applicant.

Each such person should sign at the end of the application a statement that he is so qualified, that he supports the application from personal knowledge of and intimate acquaintance with the applicant, and that he can vouch for the applicant's good character and loyalty. The period for which he has known the applicant should be stated.

6. When completed, the application should be forwarded to His Excellency the Governor.

7. The statements in the application and the references will be made the subject of independent enquiry directed by the Governor.

The applicant may be required to produce certificates (if available) of her birth and marriage, and of the death of her husband (or documentary evidence of the dissolution of her marriage).

*An applicant whose marriage was dissolved by a decree of divorce granted by a Court outside Ceylon, should if she has not previously done so, submit the decree or a certified copy of it to His Excellency the Governor with her application, with a view to showing that the dissolution of the marriage would be recognized as valid by the Courts in Ceylon.*

8. The fee in respect of the grant of a certificate of naturalization is Rs. 100 which is not payable until an intimation is received that the certificate will be granted.

9. Other expenses necessarily involved are the usual stamp duty payable on swearing the affidavit and a fee of Re. 1.25 payable on taking the Oath of Allegiance.

10. When the certificate is granted, further instructions will be issued as to taking the Oath of Allegiance and its registration.

11. After an application has been submitted, His Excellency the Governor should be informed by letter of any material circumstance which occurs before a certificate is issued and which may affect the accuracy of the particulars represented in the application. A certificate, if granted, may be revoked if it is afterwards found to have been obtained by false representations or by concealment of material circumstances.

*If the foregoing instructions are not closely and accurately observed, it may be necessary to return the application for amendment, involving delay and possibly additional expense.*

N.B.—As a general rule, an applicant must be resident in Ceylon and must intend to continue to reside within His Majesty's dominions.

### THE BRITISH NATIONALITY AND STATUS OF ALIENS ACT, 1914.

Instructions as to applications for Certificates of Naturalization by Aliens in the service of the Crown.

The Act requires an applicant to satisfy the Governor—

(a) that he has been in the service of the Crown for not less than five years within the last eight years before the application;

(b) that he is of good character and has an adequate knowledge of the English language (or, in a Colony in which another language is recognized as on an equality with the English language, of that other language); and

(c) that he intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to continue in the service of the Crown.

1. An application for a Certificate of Naturalization must be addressed to the Governor.

2. The application must show the following particulars :—

Full Name; \*  
Address;  
Trade or occupation;

\* If the applicant is known by a name other than his original name, both should be stated thus—"A.B. (original name), commonly known as C.D."



Place\* and date of birth (where known);  
Nationality; †  
Married, single, or widower [widow];  
Name of wife;  
Date of marriage;  
Names and nationality of parents.

The application must also show—

(a) that the applicant has fulfilled the conditions with respect to service under the Crown required by the Act (see above), the post in which he has served being specified, and the details of the service being shown as follows:—

(b) that the applicant intends, if his application is granted, either to reside in His Majesty's dominions or to continue in the service of the Crown.

3. If the applicant desires that the Certificate should extend not only to him personally but also to any legitimate child or children of his, being minors and resident with him, who do not already possess British nationality, the application should contain a statement to that effect, and should give the full name, the date and place of birth, and the present place of residence of any child whose name is sought to be included in the Certificate.

4. The statements in the application must be supported by an affidavit (which should be endorsed on the application) made by the applicant before a Justice of the Peace, Commissioner for Oaths, or other person authorized to administer Oaths.

The affidavit must not be sworn or affirmed to before a person who is the Solicitor, Proctor or Agent of the applicant.

5. The total fee payable in respect of the grant of a Certificate of Naturalization is Rs. 100, of which Rs. 10 is payable on the submission of the application. No application will be considered until the preliminary fee of Rs. 10 is paid; this preliminary fee cannot in any circumstances be refunded.

The remaining sum of Rs. 90 is not payable until an intimation is received that the Certificate will be granted.

6. When a Certificate is granted, further instructions as to taking the Oath of Allegiance and its registration will be issued.

7. The grant of a Certificate of Naturalization to an alien does not confer British nationality upon his wife. If his wife desires to become a British subject, it will be necessary for her to make a declaration to that effect. The necessary form of declaration will be supplied by the Hon. the Chief Secretary when the Certificate of Naturalization is sent to the applicant in order that the Oath of Allegiance may be taken. The fee of Rs. 5 which is payable in respect of the declaration should be forwarded to the Hon. the Chief Secretary with the declaration. It is also subject to a stamp duty of Re. 1.

8. After an application has been submitted, His Excellency the Governor should be informed by letter of any material circumstance which occurs before a certificate is issued and which may affect the accuracy

## RULES.

1. The Settlement Officer shall take into account all evidence supporting the claim to the land, and all other matters placed before him for consideration, whether of law or of equity, and make such offer as to him may seem just in the circumstances of each case.

2. If the Settlement Officer is satisfied that the land is paraveni chena land, and that it has been periodically cultivated by the claimant and his predecessors in title for



a period of not less than 30 years, he shall offer the land, or other land of equivalent extent or of equivalent value, to the claimant at the rate per acre representing the cost of survey and settlement, set out in the schedule hereto.

Provided that this rule shall not apply to any portion of the said land, which the Settlement Officer may deem it necessary, in the public interest, to reserve for

(a) the conservation of any spring or other source of water, or of any river, stream, canal, channel, or water-course, or of any lake, tank, or reservoir; or

(b) the maintenance or improvement of any existing road within the meaning of the Road Ordinance, 1861, or for the provision, maintenance, or improvement of the means of access to any land.

Provided further, that in the case of village claimants the sum demanded shall not exceed Rs. 15 an acre.

And provided also, that the Settlement Officer may, in special cases of poverty, waive the whole or any part of the amount payable by any claimant.

3. If the Settlement Officer is satisfied that the claimant and his predecessors in title have been in uninterrupted possession of any land for a period of not less than 10 years by maintaining thereon a permanent plantation or by effecting and maintaining thereon any permanent improvements he shall offer the land to the claimant at a rate not exceeding the amount such land would have been worth if it had remained unimproved at the time of such offer.

Provided that this rule shall not apply to any land which has been declared, under the Waste Lands Ordinances, 1897 to 1903, or the Land Settlement Ordinance, 1931, to be the property of the Crown, or to any land which, in the opinion of the Settlement Officer, is required in the public interest to be reserved for any of the purposes mentioned in the first proviso to the foregoing rule 2.

"Permanent plantation" in this rule means all plantations other than those made in the ordinary course of chena cultivation.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the space within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose, by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

BY-LAWS.

1. (1) An ordinary meeting of the Committee shall be held on the third Monday of each of the months of February, April, June, August, October, and December, unless the Chairman by written notice of not less than one week prior to the date appointed for any meeting, gives information to the members that for want of sufficient business such meeting will not be held, or that it will be held on some other date specified in the notice.

(2) A special meeting may be summoned by the Chairman by written notice, setting out the nature of the proposed business, served on the members not less than one week before the date selected by him for such meeting.

(3) The Chairman shall record in a minute book the proceedings of each meeting in the order in which they occur and shall cause a copy of the minutes of every meeting to be sent to each member as early as may be convenient after such meeting.

2. (1) The whole of the Education District of Puttalam including the area within the administrative limits of the Puttalam Urban District Council, is hereby declared to be an area within which efficient provision has been made for elementary education by means of schools recognized by the Department of Education.

(2) In these by-laws the term "school" shall mean any one of the schools within this district that have already been or may hereafter be recognized by the Department of Education.

(3) Within this Education District it shall be the duty of—

(a) the parent of every boy of not less than 6 and not more than 14 years of age, and

(b) the parent of every girl of not less than 6 and not more than 12 years of age,

to cause such boy or girl to attend school, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless the Chairman of the Committee has exempted such boy or girl on the ground of poverty or illness from attendance at school:

Provided however that such attendance at school shall not be compulsory—

(a) for Muslim and Tamil girls of over 10 years of age or

(b) for any boy under 14 years of age or any girl under 12 years of age, who is the holder of a certificate issued by an Inspecting Officer of the Department of Education to the effect that such boy or girl has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the examination prescribed by the Code for the Fifth Standard, and who is engaged in some remunerative employment or other beneficial occupation to the satisfaction of the Chairman; or

(c) for any boy under 8 years of age or any girl whose home or place of residence is more than one mile distant, or for any boy over 8 years of age whose home or place of residence is more than two miles distant, along the shortest route from any school.

3. (1) The period of daily attendance of any child for the purpose of these by-laws shall be the entire period during which the school is open daily for the instruction of children of similar age: Provided however that any child may be excused attendance during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of the Ordinance.

4. Any parent failing to observe the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 for the second and each subsequent day during which the offence continues.

(1) An ordinary meeting of the Committee shall be held on the third Monday of each of the months of February, April, June, August, October, and December, unless the Chairman by written notice of not less than one week prior to the date appointed for any meeting, gives information to the members that for want of sufficient business such meeting will not be held, or that it will be held on some other date specified in the notice.

(2) A special meeting may be summoned by the Chairman by written notice, setting out the nature of the proposed business, served on the members not less than one week before the date selected by him for such meeting.

(3) The Chairman shall record in a minute book the proceedings of each meeting in the order in which they occur and shall cause a copy of the minutes of every meeting to be sent to each member as early as may be convenient after such meeting.

2. (1) The whole of the Education District of Chilaw including the area within the administrative limits of the Chilaw Urban District Council, is hereby declared to be an area within the which efficient provision has been made for elementary education by means of schools recognized by the Department of Education.

(2) In these by-laws the term "school" shall mean any one of the schools within this district that have already been or may hereafter be recognized by the Department of Education.

(3) Within this Education District it shall be the duty of—

(a) the parent of every boy of not less than 6 and not more than 14 years of age, and

(b) the parent of every girl of not less than 6 and not more than 12 years of age,

to cause such boy or girl to attend school, unless he has made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless the Chairman of the Committee has exempted such boy or girl on the ground of poverty or illness from attendance at school:

Provided however that such attendance at school shall be compulsory—

(a) for Muslim and Tamil girls of over 10 years of age or

(b) for any boy under 14 years of age or any girl under 12 years of age, who is the holder of a certificate issued by an Inspecting Officer of the Department of Education to the effect that such boy or girl has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the examination prescribed by the Code for the Fifth Standard, and who is engaged in some remunerative employment or other beneficial occupation to the satisfaction of the Chairman; or

(c) for any boy under 8 years of age or any girl, whose home or place of residence is more than one mile distant, or for any boy over 8 years of age whose home or place of residence is more than two miles distant, along the shortest route from any school.

3. (1) The period of daily attendance of any child for the purposes of these by-laws shall be the entire period during which the school is open daily for the instruction of children of similar age:

Provided however that any child may be excused attendance during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of the Ordinance.

4. Any parent failing to observe the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 for the second and each subsequent day during which the offence continues.

TENDERS are hereby invited (*vide* notice appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 8,130 of June 21, 1935) for the supply to the Ceylon Government Railway of 150,000 tons of best locomotive coal, 10 per cent. more or less at the option of the General Manager, to be delivered between October 1, 1935, and September 30, 1936. All coal shipped shall be of large size, free from stone, shale, and other foreign matter, Indian coal shall be inspected by the Officers of the Mining Engineer's Department of the Railway Board of India, who shall reject any coal which in their opinion is inferior to that contracted for. *The fees for inspection must be paid by the contractors.*

2. Tenders for coals in respect of which samples and laboratory test reports have not been furnished will be treated as informal and rejected (*vide* notice appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 8,101 of January 25, 1935).

3. Should the use of any particular coal involve structural alterations to locomotives in order to produce the best results, the expense involved in making such alterations may necessitate the rejection of a tender. The standard firebar air space of Ceylon Government Railway locomotives is one inch.

4. The tenders should give the trade name of the coal, the name of the colliery or collieries, the number or numbers of the seams, the percentage of coal from each colliery and seam, and the references to the Indian Coal Grading Board list or similar list of the country of origin, and the price per ton delivered over ship's side in Colombo Harbour. The price tendered must be net, but it is to be distinctly understood that should any further rebates come into operation between the date of receipt of tenders and the date of completion of deliveries, such rebates shall be credited to buyer's account.

5. The coal is to be shipped in approximately equal quantities each month. All doors between cargo holds and stoke holds of steamers must be sealed before the cargo is loaded. Dates of arrival must be so arranged that only one ship will be discharging coal for the Railway at one time. The first cargo to arrive in Colombo early in October, 1935, and delivery of the whole quantity to be completed by September 30, 1936.

6. The quantity of each shipment of Indian coal will be determined by Marine Surveyors appointed by the General Manager. In the case of South African coal the following documents should be furnished:—

- (a) Coal Grader's Certificate from the Fuel Research Institute of South Africa on the quality of coal shipped.
- (b) Colliery Certificate on the quantity of coal shipped from each colliery and seam.
- (c) Certificate from the Port Manager, South African Railways and Harbours on the total quantity of coal shipped.

A survey report or other proof of correct shipment must be furnished by the suppliers in the case of coal from other sources. Payment will be made to the contractor for each separate shipment within seven days of completion of discharge in Colombo according to the quantity specified in the bill of lading, but deducting therefrom an amount equal to 2 per cent. for wastage. For the purpose of comparing deliveries with the quantity provided for under the contract the bill of lading figures shall be used.

7. The suppliers shall inform the General Manager by telegraph immediately the steamers commence to load stating the probable date of sailing, and shall again telegraph immediately the vessel has sailed. Plans showing the various holds and the quantity of coal in each bill of lading and invoice must be transmitted by the contractor to the Railway Storekeeper immediately the vessels are ready for sea. The bills of lading are to be prepared in accordance with the terms of the contract.

8. The coal must be delivered over ship's side free of all freight and charges, into craft, steamer, floating depot, or pier in Colombo Harbour as the General Manager may direct. The General Manager reserves the right to appoint the discharging stevedores.

9. Should the General Manager of the Railway require it, the coal shall be discharged from the steamers at the rate

of not less than 1,000 tons per working day, but the General Manager shall not be bound to accept delivery at the rate of more than 500 tons per day, nor shall he be required to take delivery of any coal on Sundays or the days called charter party holidays defined in the calendar published by the Ceylon Chamber of Commerce.

10. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover, and should be addressed to the Chairman of the Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

11. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury (Room No. 223, 2nd Floor, Galle Face Secretariat, Colombo), or be sent through the post under registered cover.

12. Tenders should be marked "Tender for Supply of Locomotive Coal to the Railway" in the left hand top corner of the envelope, and should reach the Chairman of the Tender Board not later than midday on Tuesday, July 16, 1935.

13. The tenders are to be made upon forms which will be supplied upon application at the Office of the Railway Storekeeper, and no tender will be considered unless it is on the recognized form. Tenderers who have not previously held this contract should apply for tender forms not less than one week in advance of the date mentioned in clause 12. All alterations or erasures in tenders should bear the initials of the tenderers, otherwise the tenders may be treated as informal and rejected.

14. Tenderers should give an address to which orders and correspondence relating to the tenders and contract are to be sent. Any change of address should be notified to the General Manager forthwith.

15. A deposit of Rs. 100 in favour of the General Manager will be required to be made at the Railway Chief Accountant's Office, Maradana, or at any Kacheheri outside Colombo, and a receipt produced for the same before any form of tender is issued. Should any person decline or fail to enter into the contract and bond, or fail to furnish approved security within ten days of receiving notice in writing from the Head of the Department, or his duly authorized representative, that his tender has been accepted, such deposit will be forfeited to the Crown, and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of a contract.

16. Each tender must be accompanied by a letter signed by two responsible persons, whose addresses must be given, engaging to become security for the due fulfilment of the contract. All other necessary information can be had on application at the office referred to in clause 13.

17. Sufficient sureties will be required to join in a bond for the due fulfilment of the contract. The amount of security required will be Rs. 10,000 in cash or fixed deposit.

18. The security should be furnished within ten days of acceptance of tender being notified.

19. Tenderers who have not previously held Government contracts should, when applying for tender forms, furnish the officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving their full names and permanent addresses stating in which district or districts they own landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given.

20. In the case of persons who have carried out Government contracts with departments other than the Railway Department the name of such department and the district in which the service was rendered should be stated.

21. In the case of persons who have carried out contracts with the Railway Department, but not in the division or district concerned in this notice, they should state in which division or district or divisions or districts they held contracts.

22. Tenderers must satisfy the General Manager that they are in a position to execute the contract in a satisfactory manner, documentary or other evidence being produced for the purpose if called for, and, in the case of tenderers who are not resident in the Island, by a duly constituted agent specially empowered in that behalf.

23. Tenders from tenderers not resident in the Island will not receive consideration, unless submitted by a duly constituted agent resident in the Island specially empowered to tender for the same and to execute a valid contract in that behalf and to fulfil all the terms of the contract. In the case of local firms tendering as "duly constituted" agents of colliery firms in India, South Africa, and elsewhere outside Ceylon, they should hold a power of attorney from their principals to enable them to enter into a contract, should their tender be accepted.

24. No tender will be considered unless in respect of it all the conditions herein laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

25. The Ceylon Government reserves to itself the right, without question, of rejecting any or all tenders, and of accepting any portion of a tender. If any special conditions attach to the acceptance of part of a tender or of lots in numbers other than those specified, they must be clearly laid down in the tender.

26. If any of the coal supplied is objected to by the General Manager as not being of the quality contracted for, or as being inferior in quality to the sample submitted, the General Manager shall be at liberty to deduct from the price such sums as he may consider justifiable by reason of the inferior quality, or he may reject such coal. The basis of comparison as to correspondence in quality of the coal supplied with that of the sample submitted for testing shall be the Ceylon Government Railway's service tests and the decision of the General Manager thereon shall in all cases be final, conclusive, and binding. Whenever any coal is so rejected the contractor shall, at his own cost and expense, remove the rejected coal, and pending removal the coal shall remain and be at the risk of the contractor, and the contractor shall, in addition to any other penalty, be liable to refund to the General Manager the cost incurred in landing such rejected coal, and the cost so incurred, when certified under the hand of the General Manager, shall be deemed final and conclusive.

27. Should the contractor fail to supply coal in the quantities and the time agreed upon, or should he supply coal inferior in quality to the sample submitted, or should he commit a breach of any of the covenants of the contract, the General Manager shall be at liberty by notice in writing to forthwith determine the contract, and thereupon the contractor will be liable to pay to the General Manager all costs and expenses incurred by the failure to supply coal or by the breach of any other covenant of the contract, and, shall in addition be liable to forfeit the sum of Rs. 10,000 deposited by him as security, which said sum of Rs. 10,000 shall be paid and forfeited as liquidated damages and not by way of a penalty and shall not be deemed to include the costs and expenses hereinbefore referred to.

28. Should the contractor at any time during the execution of the contract find that he will be unable to deliver the full quantity of coal or any portion of it within the period named, he shall at once give notice accordingly to the General Manager of the Railway, who shall have an absolute discretion either to grant an extension of time or to determine the contract and recover damages as provided hereinbefore in condition 27.

29. The purchase price of any coal delivered to and accepted by the General Manager after September 30, 1936, shall be subject to a deduction as damages of 10 per cent. on their value, and such deduction shall be regarded as a reasonable pre-estimate of actual damage which the General Manager will and may sustain by reason of the default of the contractor to complete delivery within the specified time, and shall for all purposes be deemed to be and regarded as liquidated damages and not as a penalty.

30. In the case of failure on the part of the contractor to supply the entire quantity of coal before September 30, 1936, it shall be lawful for the General Manager in his discretion, by reason of such default and breach of contract on the part of the contractor, either to grant the contractor once or oftener an extension of time for the delivery of such quantity of coal as the contractor has failed to supply (subject to a deduction of 10 per cent. on their purchase price) or to purchase in the open market at whatever price he may deem fit and reasonable such quantity of coal as the contractor has failed to supply before September 30, 1936. If the coal so purchased in the open market costs more than the contract price, such excess cost shall be recovered in addition to the forfeiture of the security money as provided for hereinbefore in clause 27.

31. In the event of the General Manager in his discretion electing not to grant the contractor an extension of time, but to purchase or cause to be purchased in the open market such quantity of coal, as the contractor shall have failed to deliver before September 30, 1936, the General Manager shall give to the contractor 30 days' notice in writing of his intention so to purchase in the open market.

32. It shall be considered sufficient delivery of any notice or notices aforesaid if they are posted to the registered office of the contractor, and if the said contractor shall change his office he shall forthwith notify to the said General Manager such change and till such notification the post of notice or notices to the original address shall be deemed sufficient delivery of such notice.

33. If subsequent to the issue of the notice of intention to purchase in the open market and within the period of 30 days covered by such notice the contractor shall deliver to the General Manager the entire quantity of coal then remaining undelivered or any part of such quantity it shall be lawful for the General Manager for good cause shown or otherwise to his appearing to accept such quantity of coal or any part thereof, and in the event of the General

Manager within the said period of 30 days accepting a part only of the quantity of coal remaining undelivered such acceptance shall in no way be deemed to be or construed as a waiver of the written notice hereinbefore referred to, which said notice shall despite such acceptance be deemed to be for all purposes valid and effectual with a view to enabling the General Manager lawfully to purchase in the open market such quantity of coal as shall yet remain undelivered at the expiration of the period of 30 days covered by the said notice.

34. If any difference or dispute shall arise between the parties of this contract as to the true intent and meaning of any of the conditions herein contained, such difference or dispute shall be referred to a board of arbitrators, of which each party shall appoint one arbitrator, and the two arbitrators so appointed shall, before proceeding with the reference, appoint an umpire. The award of the arbitrator and umpire, or of the majority of them, shall be conclusive and binding on both parties hereto. The losing party shall bear the costs of the arbitration.

35. The General Manager of the Railway may deduct from sums payable to the contractor all sums payable to the Ceylon Government by the contractor under his contract, or such sums may be recovered by action at law.

36. Contracts may not be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. The Government reserves to itself the right to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf.

37. A Government contractor must not issue a power of attorney to a person whose name is in the list of Crown defaulting contractors authorizing him to carry on the contract.

38. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other person to whom the General Manager, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after having given due notice of his objection in writing.

39. The decision of the General Manager of the Railway as to whether the contractor has been guilty of any breach of his contract, and upon all questions arising out of or incidental to the contract, shall be final and conclusive, and the contractor shall be bound thereby.

40. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Head of the Department acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

41. In the event of war, or disturbance, or strike, or lockout of pitmen, or labourers, or pestilence, or epidemical sickness, or earthquakes, fires, storms, or floods, or other hindrances affecting the contract, being the act of God or beyond the control of the parties to this contract, the contract shall be subject to such modification as the circumstances may warrant.

2. Should any person decline to enter into the contract and bond or fail to furnish approved security within 10 days of receiving notice in writing of the acceptance of the tender, such deposits will be forfeited to the Crown; and the defaulter will render himself liable to be included in the list of defaulting contractors precluded from having any concern in a Government contract. All other deposits will be returned upon signature of the contract. No deposits for tender forms will be accepted at the Office of the Division of Sanitary Engineering.

3. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish cash security of Rs. 500 and to sign the bond given in the tender for the fulfilment of the contract; also to furnish



with each tender a letter in duplicate signed by two responsible persons whose addresses must be given, engaging to become additional security for the due performance of the contract. The amount deposited for tender forms will form part of the security.

4. No tender will be considered unless all the conditions above laid down, have been strictly fulfilled.

5. The Government reserves to itself the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.

6. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other persons to whom the Sanitary Engineer for reasons which appear to him sufficient objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.

7. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Sanitary Engineer, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

8. Contracts may not be assigned, sublet or otherwise transferred without the previous sanction of the Sanitary Engineer. Sanction will not be given for any transfers including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor shall be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

9. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish all labour implements, tools, and materials found necessary for the full and complete performance of the contract including the erection and maintenance of all temporary embankments, diversion channels, fences, and he shall in like manner furnish lights and watchmen and everything necessary for securing the public safety.

10. The contractor shall provide at all times during the construction of the work all pegs required for the proper setting out of the works and of all forms, sight rails, and labour for fixing and adjusting same entirely at his own expense and to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer and must allow for same in the rates submitted in his tender.

11. The contractor shall further provide the Engineer in charge with all necessary labour he may require from time to time in measuring up and checking the work during its progress.

12. The contractor will be held responsible for the proper protection of all pegs, sight rails, &c., and shall be liable for deductions being made against the value of works carried out by him to cover the cost of additional expense incurred by the Sanitary Engineer owing to neglect in this respect.

13. All pegs shall be of palu or other approved hardwood not less than 2 ft. in height and be of 2 in. by 2 in. section. No round timber pegs shall be used except when specially authorized. Sight rails and forms to be of 6 in. by 1½ in. timber.

14. The contractor shall not absent himself from the work without leaving a fully authorized English-speaking Agent to act in his absence and he shall not relet, sublet, or assign this contract or any portion of it without the assent of the Sanitary Engineer in writing. The contractor at all times must keep an English-speaking foreman on the works.

15. The contractor shall be held responsible for any trespass on lands and for damages to property arising out of his contract and in the event of accident to any person or persons damage to property, injury to cattle or damage or injury of any description to any person or thing, the contractor shall indemnify the Government from all claims on account thereof; and if the Government is called upon to pay any money in respect thereof, the sum so paid shall be charged to the contractor as money paid to him on account of his contract and the contractor shall not be at liberty to dispute or question the right of the Government to make such payment for him or on his account, notwithstanding the same may have been made without his consent or authority any decision or determination in law or otherwise to the contrary notwithstanding.

16. The Sanitary Engineer shall have full power to make any additions, omissions or variations in any part of the works during the progress thereof which he may deem proper and the contractor is hereby bound to make such additions, omissions or variations when required to do so by the Sanitary Engineer; and if such additions, omissions or variation shall entail extra expense on the contractor either in labour or materials, the same shall be allowed to the contractor or should it be a saving to the contractor either in labour or materials the same shall be deducted from the amount of the contract; in either case the amount is to be determined by the Sanitary Engineer, who shall value all additions, omissions, or variations according to

the contract rates submitted. But no such additions, omissions or variations, shall in anywise have the effect of suspending, superseding, annulling or rescinding the said contract, which shall continue to subsist notwithstanding such additions, omissions or variations being made. And every such addition, omission or variation shall be performed and made by the contractor; under and subject to the conditions, stipulations, and covenants expressed in the contract as if such addition, omission or variation had been expressed and specified in the terms of the contract; and no additions, omissions, variations or extra work whatever shall be done without the written authority of the Sanitary Engineer, given prior to the execution of such work nor will any allowance or payment be made for the same in case it should be done without such authority.

17. *Present* : Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman ; Ratwatte Adigar ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. Beven ; Mr. O. T. Nettleton ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser ; Mr. D. M. de S. Abhayanayake.

Before proceeding with the business on the agenda, Ratwatte Adigar moved—“ That this Council place on record its sense of sorrow at the death of the Rt. Rev. Dr. Bede Békmeier, O.S.B., Bishop of Kandy. Mr. de Silva seconded. The motion was carried all members standing.

1. The minutes of proceedings of the meeting held on April 27, 1935, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval, and a copy thereof furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

- (a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1934, to April 30, 1935, on account of the Municipal Fund.
- (b) Progress report of works brought up to March 31, 1935.
- (c) Health Officer's report for April, 1935.
- (d) Statement of cases instituted by the several inspectors and of work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of April, 1935.
- (e) The reservoir readings for the week ended May 25, 1935.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the minutes of proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of “ The Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910 ”, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

- (a) Reports by the several inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house-service taps inspected during April, 1935.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various Drives in Kandy.

3A. Mr. Abhayanayake drew Chairman's attention to the unsatisfactory condition of Hospital road and the Old Matale road.

It was agreed to refer the matter to the Municipal Engineer.

4. Petitions :—Mr. Abhayanayake presented petition dated May 21, 1935, from the residents of Madawela road in Katugastota complaining that the water supplied to them was insufficient.

Chairman undertook to inquire into the complaint.

4A. Correspondence :—Letter No. WW 9 D of May 22, 1935, from the Director of Public Works stating that Mr. Geo. E. de Silva had inquired of him whether it would be feasible to augment the water supply to Kandy by pumping into the town mains the water from the wells already constructed at Peradeniya, and expressing his views on the question.

Council resolved into Committee to consider the letter.

Chairman read the letter and tabled Municipal Engineer's estimate for Rs. 34,250 for giving effect to the suggestions contained in Director Public Works' letter, and an alternative estimate for Rs. 1,200 for temporary measures for the immediate supply and distribution of water from the wells.

Resolved that the estimate of Rs. 34,250 be approved as the work contemplated therein is a part of the permanent scheme and the Municipal Engineer be requested to carry out the work as expeditiously as possible.

Council resumed and the resolution made in Committee was adopted.

4B. Pursuant to notice Mr. Abhayanayake asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied :—

Q.—(1) With reference to the answers given to my questions asked at the last meeting of Council regarding a standard of efficiency in the case of officers appointed on probation, will the Chairman be pleased to say whether he will consider the desirability, for future guidance, of laying down at the time of appointment definite requirements to be fulfilled by an officer so appointed before he could be confirmed ?

A.—I do not consider it desirable because it is impracticable to lay down a definite standard of efficiency at the time of appointment.

Q.—(2) Will the Chairman be pleased to ascertain what it would cost this Council to give sufficient protection from erosion to that portion of the public drain lying immediately opposite to and passing by the Mavilmada Mosque ?

A.—Rs. 160.

Q.—(3) Will the Chairman be pleased to state—(a) What is the amount of overtime paid to the officers of the Waterworks Department since the transportation of water during the period of the present drought started ?

A.—Rs. 1,612.22 since September 17, 1934.

Q.—(b) Is it not desirable to utilize the services of the unemployed youngsters of this town temporarily for this work instead of making the present staff overwork ?

A.—No.

Q.—(c) How much has been paid so far for the lorry for transporting water to bungalows during the same period mentioned in (a) above ?

A.—Rs. 1,739.60.

Q.—(d) How much has been paid so far for carts used for this purpose during the same period ?

A.—Rs. 4,105.74.

Q.—(e) How many labourers on an average per day are employed for this purpose at Council's cost ?

A.—18.

Q.—(f) Is it true that certain carters get a day's wages for transporting a single cart of water to the Military Barracks each day ?

A.—No.

Q.—(g) Has the Municipal Engineer personally investigated into the possibilities of subsidiary schemes to supply water to certain parts of Peradeniya road from the springs at Bahirawakanda and Halloluwa road near the tunnel, and, if so, what steps has he taken in this connection ?

A.—Yes. On investigation the quantity has been found insufficient to warrant the expense. In one case the water was found unfit for consumption.

4c. Pursuant to notice, Mr. Abhayanayake was to move :—“ That this Council respectfully requests the State Council to give immediate consideration to the question of reforming the present constitution of this Council so that the contemplated reforms may be given effect to simultaneously with those of the Colombo Municipal Council, with provision made for 12 elected and 2 nominated members ”.

With the leave of Council, Mr. Abhayanayake amended his motion by substituting the words “ 10 elected and 4 nominated members ” for the words “ 12 elected and 2 nominated members ”, and moved it. Mr. Soysa seconded. Carried as amended. The Chairman dissenting.

4d. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. Abhayanayake was withdrawn on the Chairman's undertaking to issue a pamphlet in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil stating the hours at which the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon's services will be available to the public :—“ That in order to secure the benefit of the services of the Council's Veterinary Surgeon to the ratepayers of Kandy and to dog owners in particular certain hours be fixed during the week for this officer to render special advice and medical aid to those in need, and to give free treatment in deserving cases at Council's expense.”

5. *Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on March 23, 1935.*

Application from Messrs. (O 284).—Recommended (1) to close down Wahalawela and Mulgampola burial grounds as soon as possible; (2) to take steps to acquire the land in Lady Blake's drive bearing No. 13, Pitakande of an extent of 17 acres for the use as a general cemetery; (3) to make provision in next year's budget for cost of acquisition and fencing; (4) to fence and proclaim as a cemetery only four acres of this land at first and to lease the remainder until required for extending the cemetery; and (5) to abandon the proposal to fence and improve the Mulgampola burial ground and to utilize the sum of Rs. 2,475 provided on this account under estimate 59/1934 towards expenditure connected with the new proposal.

(4) Proposed amendments for the revision of the existing Eating House and Bakery By-laws.—Recommended.

(5) Letter from Mr. A. Amirdeen, licensee of beef stall No. 5, Public Market, stating that he has transferred the goodwill of the business carried on in the above stall to his brother-in-law, Mr. Abdul Cader who was a co-partner of the stall, and asking that his half share of the stall be accordingly licensed in favour of the latter.—Recommended.

(6) Papers *re* investigations made as to the possibility of using steel studs for marking lines in streets for traffic control purposes. (WM 163).—Recommended for consideration with next year's budget.

(7) To obtain sanction for writing off a sum of Rs. 27·63 in respect of C. R., Kandy, case No. 13,410.—Recommended.

(8) To obtain a vote of Rs. 40 to meet the pay of the Librarian's substitute for the period April 6, 1935, to May 5, 1935, when the Librarian was on leave.—Recommended.

(9) To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 400 for removing sick and burying dead paupers.—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on April 27, 1935.*

(10) Estimate for Rs. 1,200 for constructing a public bath at Getambe.—Recommended to consider with next year's budget.

(11) Estimate for Rs. 700 from the Municipal Engineer for cutting footpaths and forming shoe flower hedges at the Mavilmada cemetery. (O 329).—Recommended to consider with next year's budget.

(12) Papers *re* inquiries made as to measures for improving the dangerous condition of the approach road to the Mavilmada level crossing. (W/G 14/26).—Recommended that no further steps be taken owing to prohibitive cost.

(13) Papers *re* the proposal to alter the method of construction of barrel drains in Trincomalee street. (W/M183).—Recommended.

(14) Papers *re* improvement of drain leading from the Katugastota public latrine into the Mahaweli-ganga.—Recommended for consideration with next year's budget.

(15) To obtain a further vote of Rs. 1,000 in respect of Malaria relief works. (G 302).—Recommended.

(16) Papers *re* investigations made as to the possibility of using steel studs for marking lines in streets for traffic control purposes. (W/M 163).—Recommended for consideration with next year's budget.

(17) Municipal Engineer's memo suggesting the advisability of continuing investigations for a more permanent water supply by gravitation in addition to the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme, which is in course of construction.

Expenditure on investigations by Municipal Engineer not recommended, but the Government Agent may be asked to make preliminary inquiries as to areas irrigated by the Loolcandure stream and to report on other existing water rights.

(18) Papers *re* suggestion made by Mr. Ismail to allow current at reduced rates to consumers for the purpose of illuminations during the Jubilee celebrations.—Recommended that the following concession be made during Jubilee celebrations :—All consumers who use not less than 50 units of current for lighting during the period May 5 to 7, may, if they have previously applied to the Municipal Electrical Engineer to have their meters read, be charged at a rate of 25 cents instead of the normal rate of 45 cents per unit for current consumed.

Resolution of Council on the Standing Committee recommendations.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted.

With regard to item (10) it was agreed to ascertain as soon as possible whether the water was potable.

With regard to item (14), the Medical Officer of Health was asked to confer with Mr. Abhayanyake with a view to ascertain whether the drain in question was a public drain.

7. Auditor-General's Report on the Kandy Municipal Accounts for the year 1934. Resolved to defer consideration for next meeting.

8. To obtain a supplementary vote for Rs. 7,040·30 to meet the balance of amount required for the acquisition of land for the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme.—Resolved that the vote be allowed.

9. To obtain sanction for (1) a vote of Rs. 500 for removal of silt from the reservoir, and (2) a vote of Rs. 600 for cement plastering the inner surface of the wall supporting the lake bund.—Resolved that the votes be allowed.



10. With the leave of Council the Chairman moved that the following recommendation of the Finance Committee made at its meeting on May 25, 1935, be adopted :—To obtain sanction to pay Mr. R. Assauw, Steam Roller Driver, a gratuity of Rs. 195·63 under section 30A of the Council's Pension Rules.—Recommended.

Resolved that the recommendation be adopted.

11. On the suggestion of Ratwatte Adigar the Municipal Engineer was instructed to call for tenders immediately for transport of silt removed from the lake by lorry, instead of by bullock carts.

1. To consider and fix the compensation payable for 3 acres 3 roods 13 perches of land required for wells and roadway in connection with the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme.

Chairman tabled memo. dated May 27, 1935, and Mr. Whitelaw's letter dated May 28, 1935.

Resolved that a further sum of Rs. 1,481·25 be voted to meet the additional cost of acquisition.

2. Four tenders received for the construction of two additional wells at Peradeniya.

Resolved that Mr. Suwaris' tender of Rs. 4,398·80 per well be accepted, Mr. Ismail, who suggested acceptance of Mr. Ponweera's tender for Rs. 3,648, dissenting.

Three months time was allowed for the work.

3. Mr. Geo. E. de Silva's letter dated May 28, 1935, suggesting employment of prison labour for removal of silt from the reservoir.

The letter was withdrawn by Mr. de Silva on the Chairman's explanation that an application made previously for prison labour was turned down by Government, and that even if the application was allowed now the number of prisoners available for employment was inadequate.

The Municipal Engineer was directed to procure estate labour if possible.

**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Special Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on Wednesday, June 12, 1935, at 8 a.m. in accordance with the notice dated June 11, 1935, to consider questions connected with the Kandy Water Supply.**

*Present* : Mr. T. A. Hodson, Chairman ; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva ; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake ; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail ; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa ; Dr. D. T. de Kretser ; Mr. D. M. de S. Abhayanayake.

Various complaints made by the public with regard to the water now served for drinking purposes were referred to by the members, and after consulting the Medical Officer of Health and the Municipal Engineer, the Council was satisfied :

- (1) That the water now supplied was of good quality, the prejudice being due to the smell of chlorine in the lake water,
- (2) That the water from the wells at Peradeniya was fit for drinking, and that as an additional safeguard liquid chlorine may be added before distribution, and
- (3) That the cases of typhoid fever referred to were not attributable to the water supply.

2. After consideration of the views expressed by Captain Townsend and Mr. Wimalasurendra at their visit to the works connected with the Pumping Scheme, and the reports and estimates submitted by the Municipal Engineer, the Council resolved :

- (1) That with a view to increase supply the construction of an infiltration gallery in lieu of the two additional wells be approved, and the estimate of Rs. 10,000 prepared by the Municipal Engineer for the purpose be sanctioned,
- (2) That the Chairman be authorized to negotiate with contractor Suwaris for the cancellation of the contract entered into with him for the construction of the two additional wells, and for entrusting the contractor with the work of constructing the infiltration gallery instead for Rs. 9,000,
- (3) That a temporary pipe line be laid from the wells to Galaha road and that water from the existing wells be pumped to tanks on the road side and distributed therefrom after chlorination, and that a vote of Rs. 400 for laying the pipe line, and Rs. 840 per mensem for cost of distribution by lorry be approved,
- (4) That the contractor be requested to expedite the work on the roads by employing a larger labour force,
- (5) That the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Electrical Engineer be authorized to interview the Director of Public Works and the Manager, Electrical Undertakings, as early as possible with a view to obtain on loan necessary pumps and motors, and seek advice on the technical aspects of the extension of electric mains to the site of the wells for working motors connected with the pumps,

- (6) That the Chairman be authorized to come to an agreement with the Director of Agriculture with a view to take water from the stream supplying the Peradeniya Gardens for distribution to the town if the necessity arises,
- (7) That a daily progress statement of the labour employed and work done be circulated for the information of members, and
- (8) That the Council place on record a vote of thanks to Captain Townsend, O.B.E., and Mr. D. J. Wimalasurendra, M.S.C., for their visit to the works and advice given gratuitously.

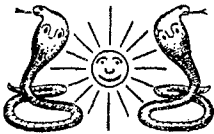
