The proprietor or (it leased) the resco of the ground used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient, to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

10. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be

guilty of an offence.

#### BY-LAWS RELATING TO THE TAX ON VEHICLES AND ANIMALS.

The returns required to be furnished under section 179 of the Ordinance by an owner or other person whether resident within the Urban area or outside and liable or deemed to be liable to pay taxes in respect of animals or vehicles shall be made in the form supplied by the Council for that purpose and shall be filled up and returned by the person to whom such form is addressed.

(1) If any person, after having filled up and returned such return acquires, keeps, or uses any vehicle or animal, not mentioned in such return, he shall within one month of acquiring any such vehicle or animal, notify.
Chairman in writing of the fact of such acquisition, kee or use, and further furnish true and correct information respect of every such vehicle or animal so acquired, kept, or

(2) Whoever fails or neglects to notify the Chairman or to furnish information as required by the foregoing paragraph of this by-law shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding twenty-five rupees.

3. Subject to the provisions of section 175 of the Ordi-

nance every person who has furnished the return referred to in by-law 1 shall without further notice be liable, in respect of every vehicle or animal entered in such return, to pay the tax for the year for which such return is furnished and every person who has sent the written notice required by by law 2 shall be liable to pay the tax on every vehicle or animal referred to in such notice for the year in which such vehicle or animal was acquired by him or otherwi came into his possession.

Any person who has furnished the return required by by-law 1 or the written notice required by by-law 2 may by written notice given to the Chairman claim to be exempted from the liability to pay any tax in respect of a vehicle or an animal which has been in his possession for less than 30 days in any year and is entered in or referred to in such

return or notice.

5. The annual tax prescribed under the provisions of section 175 of the Ordinance shall be paid on or before the thirty-first day of March in every year in respect of all vehicles, other than those exempted by the Ordinance, and in respect of every horse, pony, or mule kept or used within the administrative limits of the Ratnapura Urban

District Council.

The annual tax aforesaid shall be paid by the persons liable to pay the same at the Office of the Ratnapura Urban District Council whether the same shall have been demanded or not; and any person failing or neglecting to pay such tax after it shall have become due from him shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

7. On payment of the annual tax the Chairman shall issue or cause to be issued in respect of every vehicle for which such tax is paid a metal plate with distinguishing letters for the several kinds of vehicles as specified in the schedule hereto and with figures denoting the year for which the plate is issued and the corresponding number in the register of vehicles. Such property shall be fixed on a conspicuous part of the vehicle in spect of which the plate was

issued. Provided that when any plate becomes indistinct or defaced by use or otherwise, the owner shall return it to the Chairman and shall be entitled, on making a payment of 25 cents to receive a fresh plate; and provided further that the Chairman may, on his being satisfied by affidavit or otherwise that any plate has been lost or stolen, issue a fresh plate on the application of the owner and on payment by him of 50 cents.

8. Where the plate prescribed by these by-laws has not been duly affixed to any vehicle kept or used within the administrative limits of the Ratnapura Urban District Council the owner or person in charge of that vehicle shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding

fifteen rupees.

(2) In these regulations-

"Council" means the Urban District Council of Gampola.

- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Council.
  "Public Stand" means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.
- (3) The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

(4) No vehicle other than a hiring car or omnibus or

lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

(5) No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall be parked in any

public place except in a public stand.

- (6) Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.
- (7) No hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.
- (8) No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.
- (9) The driver of every hiring car, omnibus, or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupies a public stand.

(10) The driver of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupying a public stand, shall when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman produce the permit issued in respect of such

hiring car, omnibus, or lorry.
(11) Every driver or other person in charge of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry in any public stand shall conduct

himself in an orderly manner.

#### REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires-

- "Chairman" means the Chairman of the Badulla Urban
  District Council;
  "public stand" means any space vithin the urban area
  of Badulla which may om the to time be defined and reserved for the parking of hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.
- 2. No lorry shall be halted on any highway within the urban area of Badulla on which long traffic is permitted, except-
  - (a) for such time as may be necessary for effecting essential repairs in the event of a breakdown; or
  - (b) for such time as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading goods.
- 3. No motor vehicle shall be parked on the following roads:
  - (1) Jubilee road.
  - (2) Jail lane.
  - (3) Dewale street.
  - (4) Lower Kings street.
  - (5) Riverside road.
  - (6) Gurendawatte road.
  - (7) Mosque road.(8) North lane.
  - (9) South lane. Vihara lane.
  - (11) Taldena road between its junctions with the Cemetery road and the Batticaloa road.
- No motor vehicle using Market road shall enter that road at any point other than its junction with the Badulla-Bandarawela road near the Wesleyan Chapel, or re-enter the Badulla-Bandarawela road from the Market road at any point other than their junction with the road leading to the District Court.

5. No motor vehicle other than a hiring car shall enter

or be parked in a public stand.

6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved, by an authorized notice exhibited at the spot, for the use of motor cabs or of omnibuses or of any other specified class of hiring cars, no motor vehicle not belonging to the class specified in the notice shall enter, or be parked in, that stand or portion of that stand.
7. (1) No hiring car shall enter or be parked in a public

stand unless its driver is in possession of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Chairman authorizing the

use of that stand by that car.

(2) A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule to these regulations shall be levied and paid for

each such permit.
8. No hiring car shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit and indicated as such by appropriate notices or signs.

- (1) All hiring cars using a public stand shall—
- (a) be halted facing the same direction, and
- (b) in accordance with such notice or sign as may be exhibited therein, be parked either parallel to each other or one behind the other in the order of their
- (2) All hiring cars parked one behind the other in a public stand, shall be moved up in due order as vacancies occur in front
- The driver of every hiring car occupying a public stand, or a person capable of driving the car, shall be in charge of it throughout the time it is parked in that stand.
- The driver of every hiring car occupying a public stand shall, whenever required so to do by a Police Officer or by a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of that
- 12. The driver or other person in charge of every hiring car occupying a public stand, shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

  13. The following regulations are hereby repealed:—

3. The successful tenderer will be required to furnish cash security of Rs. 250 and to sign the bond given in the tender for the fulfilment of the contract; also to furnish with each tender a letter in duplicate signed by two

responsible persons whose addresses must be given, engaging to become additional security for the due performance of the contract. The amount deposited for tender forms will form part of the security.

4. No tender will be considered unless all the conditions

above laid down have been strictly fulfilled.

5. The Government reserves to itself the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting

any portion of a tender.

6. No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other persons to whom the Sanitary Engineer, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice

of his objection in writing.
7. The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Sanitary Engineer, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous sanction of the Sanitary Engineer. Sanction will not be given for any transfers including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the

defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor shall be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish all labour implements, tools, and materials found necessary for the full and complete performance of the contract including the erection and maintenance of all temporary embankments, diversion channels, fences; and he shall in like manner furnish lights and watchmen and everything necessary for securing the public safety.

10. The contractor shall provide at all times during the construction of the work all pegs required for the proper setting out of the works and of all forms, sight rails and labour for fixing and adjusting same entirely at his own expense and to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer and must allow for same in the rates submitted in his

tender.
11. The contractor shall further, provide the Engineerin-Charge with all necessary labour he may require from time to time in measuring up and checking the work during its progress.

12. The contractor will be held responsible for the proper protection of all pegs, sight rails, &c., and shall be liable for deductions being made against the value of works carried out by him to cover the cost of additional expense incurred by the Sanitary Engineer owing to neglect in this respect.

13. All pegs shall be of palu or other approved hardwood not less than 2 ft. in height and be of 2 in. by 2 in. section. No round timber pegs shall be used except when specially authorized. Sight rails and forms to be of

6 in. by 1½ in. timber.

14. The contractor shall not absent himself from the work without leaving a fully authorized English speaking Agent to act in his absence and he shall not re-let, sub-let or assign this contract or any portion of it without the assent of the Sanitary Engineer in writing. The contractor at all times must keep an English speaking foreman on the

works.
15. The contractor shall be held responsible for any. trespass on lands and for damages to property arisings out of his contract and in the event of accident to any person or persons damage to property, injury to cattle or damage or injury of any description to any person thing, the contractor shall indemnify the Government from all claims on account thereof; and if the Govern is called upon to pay any money in respect thereof, and sum so paid shall be charged to the contractor as money paid to him on account of his contract and the contractor shall not be at liberty to dispute or question the right of the Government to make such payment for him or on his account, notwithstanding the same may have been made without his consent or authority any decision or determination in law or otherwise to the contrary not-

withstanding.

16. The Sanitary Engineer shall have full power to make any additions, omissions or variations in any part of the works during the progress thereof which he may deem proper and the contractor is hereby bound to make such additions, omissions or variations when required to do so by the Sanitary Engineer; and if such additions omissions or variations shall entail extra expense on the contractor either in labour or materials, the same shall be allowed to the contractor or should it be a saving to the contractor either in labour or materials the same shall be deducted from the amount of the contract; in either case the amount is to be determined by the Sanitary Engineer, who shall value all additions, omissions, or variations according to the contract rates submitted. But no such additions, omissions, or variations, shall in anywise have the effect of suspending, superseding, annulling, or resoinding the said contract, which shall continue to subsist notwithstanding such additions, omissions, or variations being made. And every such addition, omission, or variation shall be performed and made by the contractor; under and subject to the conditions, stipulations, and covenants expressed in the contract as if such addition, omission, or variation had been expressed and specified in the terms of the contract; and no additions, omissions, variations or extra work whatever shall be done without the written authority of the Sanitary Engineer, given prior to the execution of such work, nor will any allowance or payment be made for the same in case it should be done without such authority.

17. Any person employed by the contractor on the works, who in the opinion of the Sanitary Engineer is considered incompetent or who shall act in an improper manner, may be discharged by the Engineer, and such person shall not be again employed upon the works without written permisd it be deemed necessary on account of the inclusions of the inclusions of the inclusions.

inclemency of the weather or from any other cause to suspend the works or any portion of them, the Sanitary

Engineer or Officer-in-Charge or works shall have power to direct such delay without any extra allowance being demanded by the contractor, but the period during which such works may be suspended shall be allowed to the contractor in computing the time for the completion of the work.

19. If the contractor shall not execute the work in a sound and workmanlike manner or with due diligence, or if he shall not regularly proceed with the works to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer, it shall be lawful for the Government to give the contractor notice in writing signed by the Sanitary Engineer requiring him forthwith to proceed with the due execution of the works, and in ease the contractor shall fail to satisfy these requirements within seven days after the service of such notice, the Sanitary Engineer shall be at liberty to proceed with the

work as he thinks fit.

20. If the contractor shall be declared bankrupt or petition any court having jurisdiction in bankruptcy for the liquidation of his affairs by arrangement or composition or for otherwise arranging or compounding with his creditors, it shall be lawful for the Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works to take possession on behalf of the Government of all plant, implements, tools, and materials upon the works belonging to the contractor, and to employ any other contractor, workmen, or other person by contract, piece work, day work or otherwise, and to proceed with and complete the works. On the expiration of the said notice or on such bankruptcy or petition, or arrangement as the case may be, the contract shall, at the option of the Government, become void as to the contractor, without prejudice to any right of action which the contractor may be subject unto for not proceeding with the works in accordance with the speci-

fication.

21. The work will be measured up montly by the Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works whose measurements will be final. Only the net measurements of work will be allowed notwithstanding any local or other

usage or custom to the contrary.

22. The Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works will certify monthly, on account, and the final certificate will be made out upon measurements based on he actual quantities and of the works executed according

to the accepted contract rates.
3. The contractor shall maintain at his own expense and keep in proper repair to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer, the whole of the works for a period of three

calendar months after the completion of same.

24. Payments for works will be made monthly on the basis of 85 per cent. of the estimated value of the work executed, the balance 15 per cent. will be retained in the hands of Government until the completion of the work, and will be forfeited by way of liquidated and ascertained damages to the Government should the contractor fail to complete his contract to the entire satisfaction of the

Sanitary Engineer.
25. The cash security will be retained until the maintenance period has been completed and the works handed over. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader wished to know whether the property owners whose interests would be affected by the amendment to the street lines would be entitled to compensation.

The Chairman drew the attention of Mr. Abdul Cader to the proviso attached to the recommendation.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

(3) With reference to the resolution of Council of April 10, 1935, in connection with the projected scheme for reclaiming a part of the Bloemendahl swamp to consider:—(a) Letter No. P 9/7 of April 24, 1935, from the Acting Controller of Labour, conveying the opinion of the Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce that this Council should be requested to contribute half cost of wages paid to unemployed "as in other cases" and inquiring whether Council is prepared to agree to this condition. (b) A report thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 882.—Recommended that the Council agree to this condition, provided the remaining conditions laid down by the Council in its resolution of April 10, 1935, and conveyed to the Controller of Labour in Chairman's letter No. 419/456 of April 12, 1935, are accepted.

#### PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(8) To consider the following motion of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.M.C., in Council on April 10, 1935:—"With reference to the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees regarding the appointment of the City Microbiologist which was confirmed by the Council on March 6, 1935, I move that applications be also invited from candidates in Ceylon and that both sets of applications be placed together before the appropriate Committees for consideration."—Registered No. 278.—Recommended to await applications from the United Kingdom and to place the application of Dr. Kahawita before the Committees considering applications.

#### WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(10) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman dated April 26, 1935, regarding the filling up of the post of Waterworks Engineer. Registered No. 760.—Recommended that the Assistant Waterworks Engineer, Mr. T. B. Stewart, be promoted to the post of Waterworks Engineer, on a salary of Rs. 15,000—Rs. 600—Rs. 18,000 (scale I of 1924 Salaries Scheme) and be placed on the 2nd incremental step of that scale, *i.e.*, Rs. 16,200 a year, on his assuming the duties of the post when it falls vacant on July 6, 1935.

The cost will be met, in the first instance, from Advance Account, Purchase of Stores, and then debited to sanctioned votes as and when the drugs are drawn for use. Funds are available. Registered No. 906.—Recommended
- (27) To reconsider:—(a) An application dated January 25, 1935, from the Assistant City Microbiologist, Public Health Department, for a travelling allowance of Rs. 50 per mensem; (b) Memoranda thereon of the Acting City Microbiologist; (c) Reports thereon of the Medical Officer of Health, the Municipal Treasurer, and the Chairman. Registered No. 220.—Recommended.
- (28) To consider:—(a) A memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health dated April 12, 1935, recommending that an experimental survey of milk be made from 20 representative dairies and that a sum of Rs. 250 be sanctioned by Council for the purpose; (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer stating that supplementary provision is required. - "(3) Considered an application from the Public Service Recreation Club for the lease of a site in Victoria Park for the purpose of laying out two tennis courts.—Recommended." Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting.
  - 5. Considered the following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 30, 1935.
- "(9) Considered a revised scale of charges for electricity supplied for power purposes.--Recommended that the following charges be adopted from May 1, 1935:—(a) Domestic heating and cooking on the double tariff meter: 10 cents per unit during off peak load, i.e., between 9.30 P.M. on one night and 6.15 P.M. the next night, and ordinary lighting rate during peak load, i.e., 6.15 p.m. to 9.30 p.m. Meter rent Re. 1 per month. Resolved that the above recommendation be adopted with effect from May 1, 1935, but that a rate of 20 cents per unit be charged during "peak load", i.e., from 6.15 P.M. to 9.30 P.M.
- 6. At this stage Mr. A. M. Saheed inquired whether the Chairman had made any arrangements with regard to the disposal of the electric bulbs used for the purpose of illuminating the town on the occasion of the King's Jubilee. The Chairman replied that the Superintendent of the Electricity Department had submitted a memorandum on the subject and that the matter was being considered.—Resolved that the bulbs and holders used for the Jubillee illuminations be hired out to the public at 5 cents per set (i.e., lamp, holder, and connected wire), for the first day, 3 cents for the second

day, and 2 cents for each subsequent day, and that a deposit of half the amount due be taken in advance.

The Chairman proposed a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Jansen, the Superintendent of the Electricity Department, for the brilliant scheme of illuminations which he had set up in the town on the occasion of the King's Jubilee.—Carried
