RULE.

The rules dated August 22, 1912, published in the *Gazette* of September 6, 1912, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (1) in rule 6, by the substitution for the words "two members of the Board of Commissioners", of the words "the Chief Commissioner and the Secretary"; and

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

(1) The regulations made for the Local Board of Gampola and published in *Government Gazette* No. 7,744 of November 8, 1929, are hereby repealed.

(2) In these regulations—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Gampola.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.

“Public Stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

(3) The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

(4) No vehicle other than a hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

(5) No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

(6) Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

(7) No hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

(8) No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

(9) The driver of every hiring car, omnibus, or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupies a public stand.

(10) The driver of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupying a public stand, shall when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car, omnibus, or lorry.

(11) Every driver or other person in charge of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations, unless the context otherwise requires—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Badulla Urban District Council;

“public stand” means any space within the urban area of Badulla which may from time to time be defined and reserved for the parking of hiring cars by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. No lorry shall be halted on any highway within the urban area of Badulla on which lorry traffic is permitted, except—

- for such time as may be necessary for effecting essential repairs in the event of a breakdown; or
- for such time as may be reasonably necessary for the purpose of loading or unloading goods.

3. No motor vehicle shall be parked on the following roads:—

- Jubilee road.
- Jail lane.
- Dewale street.
- Lower Kings street.
- Riverside road.
- Gurendawatte road.
- Mosque road.
- North lane.
- South lane.
- Vihara lane.
- Taldena road between its junctions with the Cemetery road and the Batticaloa road.

4. No motor vehicle using Market road shall enter that road at any point other than its junction with the Badulla-Bandarawela road near the Wesleyan Chapel, or re-enter the Badulla-Bandarawela road from the Market road at any point other than their junction with the road leading to the District Court.

5. No motor vehicle other than a hiring car shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

6. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved, by an authorized notice exhibited at the spot, for the use of motor cabs or of omnibuses or of any other specified class of hiring cars, no motor vehicle not belonging to the class specified in the notice shall enter, or be parked in, that stand or portion of that stand.

7. (1) No hiring car shall enter or be parked in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a permit issued by or under the authority of the Chairman authorizing the use of that stand by that car.

(2) A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule to these regulations shall be levied and paid for each such permit.

8. No hiring car shall enter or leave a public stand, except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit and indicated as such by appropriate notices or signs.

9. (1) All hiring cars using a public stand shall—
 (a) be halted facing the same direction, and
 (b) in accordance with such notice or sign as may be exhibited therein, be parked either parallel to each other or one behind the other in the order of their arrival.
- (2) All hiring cars parked one behind the other in a public stand, shall be moved up in due order as vacancies occur in front.
10. The driver of every hiring car occupying a public stand, or a person capable of driving the car, shall be in charge of it throughout the time it is parked in that stand.
11. The driver of every hiring car occupying a public stand shall, whenever required so to do by a Police Officer or by a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce for inspection the permit issued in respect of that car.
12. The driver or other person in charge of every hiring car occupying a public stand, shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.
13. The following regulations are hereby repealed:—
 (1) Regulations dated January 3, 1929, published in the *Gazette* of January 4, 1929; and
 (2) Regulations dated June 29, 1933, published in the *Gazette* of July 7, 1933.

- The Government reserves to itself the right of rejecting any or all tenders, and the right of accepting any portion of a tender.
- No contract shall be entered into with any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors either individually or jointly with any other person, nor shall the contractor employ any person whose name is on the list of Crown defaulting contractors, or any other persons to whom the Sanitary Engineer, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, objects after giving due notice of his objection in writing.
- The contract shall be entered into by the contractor with the Sanitary Engineer, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.
- Contracts may not be assigned, sublet, or otherwise transferred without the previous sanction of the Sanitary Engineer. Sanction will not be given for any transfers including powers of attorney in favour of persons in the

defaulting contractors' list. No defaulting contractor shall be employed on any service connected with the contracts or the tenders.

9. The contractor shall at his own cost and charges furnish all labour implements, tools, and materials found necessary for the full and complete performance of the contract including the erection and maintenance of all temporary embankments, diversion channels, fences; and he shall in like manner furnish lights and watchmen and everything necessary for securing the public safety.

10. The contractor shall provide at all times during the construction of the work all pegs required for the proper setting out of the works and of all forms, sight rails and labour for fixing and adjusting same entirely at his own expense and to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer and must allow for same in the rates submitted in his tender.

11. The contractor shall further, provide the Engineer-in-Charge with all necessary labour he may require from time to time in measuring up and checking the work during its progress.

12. The contractor will be held responsible for the proper protection of all pegs, sight rails, &c., and shall be liable for deductions being made against the value of works carried out by him to cover the cost of additional expense incurred by the Sanitary Engineer owing to neglect in this respect.

13. All pegs shall be of palu or other approved hardwood not less than 2 ft. in height and be of 2 in. by 2 in. section. No round timber pegs shall be used except when specially authorized. Sight rails and forms to be of 6 in. by 1½ in. timber.

14. The contractor shall not absent himself from the work without leaving a fully authorized English speaking Agent to act in his absence and he shall not re-let, sub-let or assign this contract or any portion of it without the assent of the Sanitary Engineer in writing. The contractor at all times must keep an English speaking foreman on the works.

15. The contractor shall be held responsible for any trespass on lands and for damages to property arising out of his contract and in the event of accident to any person or persons damage to property, injury to cattle or damage or injury of any description to any person or thing, the contractor shall indemnify the Government from all claims on account thereof; and if the Government is called upon to pay any money in respect thereof, the sum so paid shall be charged to the contractor as money paid to him on account of his contract and the contractor shall not be at liberty to dispute or question the right of the Government to make such payment for him or on his account, notwithstanding the same may have been made without his consent or authority any decision or determination in law or otherwise to the contrary notwithstanding.

16. The Sanitary Engineer shall have full power to make any additions, omissions or variations in any part of the works during the progress thereof which he may deem proper and the contractor is hereby bound to make such additions, omissions or variations when required to do so by the Sanitary Engineer; and if such additions omissions or variations shall entail extra expense on the contractor either in labour or materials, the same shall be allowed to the contractor or should it be a saving to the contractor either in labour or materials the same shall be deducted from the amount of the contract; in either case the amount is to be determined by the Sanitary Engineer, who shall value all additions, omissions, or variations according to the contract rates submitted. But no such additions, omissions, or variations, shall in anywise have the effect of suspending, superseding, annulling, or rescinding the said contract, which shall continue to subsist notwithstanding such additions, omissions, or variations being made. And every such addition, omission, or variation shall be performed and made by the contractor; under and subject to the conditions, stipulations, and covenants expressed in the contract as if such addition, omission, or variation had been expressed and specified in the terms of the contract; and no additions, omissions, variations or extra work whatever shall be done without the written authority of the Sanitary Engineer, given prior to the execution of such work, nor will any allowance or payment be made for the same in case it should be done without such authority.

17. Any person employed by the contractor on the works, who in the opinion of the Sanitary Engineer is considered incompetent or who shall act in an improper manner, may be discharged by the Engineer, and such person shall not be again employed upon the works without written permission from the Sanitary Engineer.

18. Should it be deemed necessary on account of the inclemency of the weather or from any other cause to suspend the works or any portion of them, the Sanitary

Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of works shall have power to direct such delay without any extra allowance being demanded by the contractor, but the period during which such works may be suspended shall be allowed to the contractor in computing the time for the completion of the work.

19. If the contractor shall not execute the work in a sound and workmanlike manner or with due diligence, or if he shall not regularly proceed with the works to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer, it shall be lawful for the Government to give the contractor notice in writing signed by the Sanitary Engineer requiring him forthwith to proceed with the due execution of the works, and in case the contractor shall fail to satisfy these requirements within seven days after the service of such notice, the Sanitary Engineer shall be at liberty to proceed with the work as he thinks fit.

20. If the contractor shall be declared bankrupt or petition any court having jurisdiction in bankruptcy for the liquidation of his affairs by arrangement or composition or for otherwise arranging or compounding with his creditors, it shall be lawful for the Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works to take possession on behalf of the Government of all plant, implements, tools, and materials upon the works belonging to the contractor, and to employ any other contractor, workmen, or other person by contract, piece work, day work or otherwise, and to proceed with and complete the works. On the expiration of the said notice or on such bankruptcy or petition, or arrangement as the case may be, the contract shall, at the option of the Government, become void as to the contractor, without prejudice to any right of action which the contractor may be subject unto for not proceeding with the works in accordance with the specification.

21. The work will be measured up monthly by the Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works whose measurements will be final. Only the net measurements of work will be allowed notwithstanding any local or other usage or custom to the contrary.

22. The Sanitary Engineer or Officer-in-Charge of the works will certify monthly, on account, and the final certificate will be made out upon measurements based on the actual quantities and of the works executed according to the accepted contract rates.

23. The contractor shall maintain at his own expense and keep in proper repair to the satisfaction of the Sanitary Engineer, the whole of the works for a period of three calendar months after the completion of same.

24. The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice dated May 8, 1935.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 10, 1935, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved:—"That this Council wishes to place on record its sense of loss on the occasion of the death of Mr. S. W. Dassenaike, who was a Councillor, and to express its sympathy with his relatives in their bereavement. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded. Carried in silence all present standing.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Friday, May 10, 1935, at 2 p.m., pursuant to notice dated May 3, 1935.

Present :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Mr. D. I. Durham; Mr. A. M. Saheed; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. A. Paulas; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of April 26, 1935, were amended as regards item 8 (4) by the addition of the following under the heading "Resolution" :—"With regard to item (4) it was resolved that the recommendations of the Standing Committee do take effect from May 1, 1935."

The Minutes as amended, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna presented a petition from the residents of Bopa, regarding the closure of meat stalls and the prohibition of the slaughter of cattle on Wesak days. The Chairman said that it would receive consideration.

3. The report of the Auditor-General for the year ended December 31, 1934, was submitted.

4. Considered the following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of March 30, 1935.

“(3) Considered an application from the Public Service Recreation Club for the lease of a site in Victoria Park for the purpose of laying out two tennis courts.—Recommended.” Resolved that consideration be deferred till the next meeting.

5. Considered the following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of March 30, 1935.

“(9) Considered a revised scale of charges for electricity supplied for power purposes.—Recommended that the following charges be adopted from May 1, 1935 :—(a) Domestic heating and cooking on the double tariff meter : 10 cents per unit during off peak load, i.e., between 9.30 P.M. on one night and 6.15 P.M. the next night, and ordinary lighting rate during peak load, i.e., 6.15 P.M. to 9.30 P.M. Meter rent Re. 1 per month. Resolved that the above recommendation be adopted with effect from May 1, 1935, but that a rate of 20 cents per unit be charged during “peak load”, i.e., from 6.15 P.M. to 9.30 P.M.

6. At this stage Mr. A. M. Saheed inquired whether the Chairman had made any arrangements with regard to the disposal of the electric bulbs used for the purpose of illuminating the town on the occasion of the King's Jubilee. The Chairman replied that the Superintendent of the Electricity Department had submitted a memorandum on the subject and that the matter was being considered.—Resolved that the bulbs and holders used for the Jubilee illuminations be hired out to the public at 5 cents per set (i.e., lamp, holder, and connected wire), for the first day, 3 cents for the second day, and 2 cents for each subsequent day, and that a deposit of half the amount due be taken in advance.

The Chairman proposed a hearty vote of thanks to Mr. Jansen, the Superintendent of the Electricity Department, for the brilliant scheme of illuminations which he had set up in the town on the occasion of the King's Jubilee.—Carried unanimously.

7. With regard to item 8 (6) of the Minutes of the General Meeting of April 26, 1935, it was resolved that the resolution of the Council contained therein do take effect from June 1, 1935.

With the permission of Council the following item which did not appear on the agenda was next taken up for consideration :—

8. To consider the question of filling the vacant post of Chief Clerk and Accountant.—Resolved that the matter be placed on the agenda for the next meeting and that meanwhile the present arrangements do continue.

9. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting be held on Saturday, June 15, 1935, at 9.30 A.M.

10. The following documents were laid on the table :—

(2) Progress report of works done on estimates during April, 1935.

(3) Report of the Inspector of Vehicles on carriages plying for hire during April, 1935.
