An Ordinance to amend the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1935.

Amendment of section 117 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

2 Section 117 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance"), is hereby amended—

(1) in sub-section (1), by the substitution for all the words from "shall be entered every year" to the end of the sub-section of the words "shall be entered on or before the first day of December in each year and shall give public notice on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year that such book may be inspected at a place to be specified in the notice, and that written objections to any assessment entered in such book will be received at the Municipal Office not later than the thirty-first day of January next following. The notice required by this sub-section shall be published (a) in the Government Gazette, (b) in a local newspaper published in English, (c) in Sinhalese in a local newspaper published in Sinhalese and (d) in Tamil in a local newspaper published in Tamil." ;

(2) in sub-section (3)—

(a) by the substitution for the words "The Chairman shall cause a notice of assessment in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil" of the words "On or before the thirty-first day of December in each year the Chairman shall cause a notice of assessment for the year commencing on the first day of January next following" ; and

(b) by the substitution for the words "and the said notice" of the words "and the said notice shall be in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil and" .

Objects and Reasons.

1. Section 117 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, provides—

- (a) that the annual assessment of immovable property for rates and taxes should be entered in an Assessment Book ;
- (b) that notice should be given of the fact that the Assessment Book has been prepared and is open to inspection by members of the public ; and
- (c) that a notice of assessment should be served on the occupier of every land or building assessed.

2. No dates are fixed by the Ordinance for the various steps required to be taken under section 117 and, in a case where a notice does not reach the owner until several days after service upon the occupier, or does not reach the owner at all, the owner may have either insufficient time in which to object to the assessment or no knowledge that an assessment has been made. It is considered desirable that dates should be fixed by law for the various steps which have to be taken each year by the Municipality and by the owner, so as to ensure a greater degree of certainty regarding the date on which an assessment becomes final.

3. The object of this Bill is to amend section 117 of the principal Ordinance by providing—

- (1) that the Assessment Book should be entered on or before the 1st December in each year, and that public notice in the Gazette and in one English, one Sinhalese, and one Tamil newspaper should be given on or before the 31st December that the book is open to inspection and that objections to any assessment entered in that Book should be made before the 31st January next following (Clause 2 (1)) ;
- (2) that the notice of assessment should be served on or before the 31st December, and that, irrespective of the date of service, time should be allowed for objections until the 31st January next following (Clause 2 (2) and (3)).

As it is proposed that public notice of not less than one month should be given of the final date for objections, provision is made in Clause 2 (5) that an assessment is not to be invalidated by reason only of the non-service of the notice, if the public notice required by Clause 2 (1) has been duly given.

4. The provisions of existing section 117 are applied to assessments made under section 124A of the principal Ordinance in the case of new buildings erected in the course of the year. The dates inserted in section 117 by the amendments introduced in this Bill are inapplicable to assessments made under section 124A. Clause 3 accordingly amends section 124A so as to preserve the existing practice in regard to special assessments made under that section.

Although the amending and consolidating Ordinance No. 17 of 1929 relating to Poisons, Opium, and Dangerous Drugs was passed in September, 1929, and assented to by the Governor in the month following, the proclamation of it had to be postponed pending an investigation of the difficulties anticipated in the actual working of section 47, which provides that dangerous drugs should be imported into Ceylon only by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. The difficulties, on examination, turned out to be very real, and an amendment of the section was found to be necessary. Advantage has been taken of the opportunity thus provided, to improve the various definitions and to make other points in the Ordinance clearer, to introduce the alterations that have become necessary as a result of the recent changes in the Constitution, and also to bring the Ordinance into conformity with certain resolutions, which were in the meantime passed by the Health Committee of the League of Nations, and which the Government of Ceylon is bound, under the provisions of the Geneva Opium Convention of 1925, to observe.

2. Accordingly Clauses 2 to 9, 21, 22 and 24 of this Bill seek to effect verbal and other alterations in the respective sections they deal with, so as to make those sections, and the Ordinance as a whole, clearer and more precise. For the same purpose it is proposed in Clauses 10 to 13 to re-arrange the provisions of sections 37 to 40 in a more logical order, omitting such of them as are no longer necessary. Clauses 2 (2), 14, 20, and 26 are intended to effect the deletion of references to the old Executive Council, rendered necessary by the change in the Constitution.

3. As a number of new drugs have been marked out, since 1929, for special treatment under the International Opium Convention as dangerous drugs, and as the list is liable to alteration from time to time in the light of the investigations that are made by the League of Nations, the process of effecting amendments in the list has to be simplified. Clause 16 therefore seeks to substitute for the existing definition of dangerous drugs in section 46, a new definition to be read in conjunction with a new Part I of the Third Schedule, in which there are classified in groups the drugs which are totally prohibited or are permitted subject to control and regulation; and Clause 29 to give the necessary power to amend the schedule by regulations.

4. The provisions of sections 47 and 48 relating to the importation and exportation of dangerous drugs are similarly to be replaced, as proposed in Clauses 17 and 18, by new sections which take in by reference the appropriate groups in the schedule and introduce a system of permits by which the importation and exportation of dangerous drugs may be controlled. The trade in dangerous drugs within the Island is dealt with in Clauses 19 and 23 which make provision for regulations for the control of that trade. The necessary amendment of the regulations connected with section 47 will be effected by means of fresh regulations under the Ordinance as soon as it comes into operation.

5. Owing to the insufficiency of the powers of search for which provision is made in section 73 (3), further power similar to that given to Excise Officers by the Excise Amendment Ordinance, No. 3 of 1933, is now to be taken to use any reasonable degree of force or any reasonable device for stopping a suspected vessel boat or vehicle which is not brought to a halt in compliance with the usual signals or orders (Clause 27).

6. In order to ensure that the punishment awarded on a summary conviction under the Ordinance is in each case adequate, Clause 28 proposes to give Police Magistrates power to impose terms of imprisonment as well as fines, and Clause 29 to enable Police Courts and District Courts to inflict any of the penalties prescribed in the amended section 74, notwithstanding the limits placed on their ordinary jurisdiction and also to order the confiscation of any vessel boat or vehicle used for the conveyance of any article which is the subject of an offence.

**An Ordinance to amend the Births and Deaths
Registration Ordinance, 1895.**

THIS Ordinance may be cited as the Births and Deaths
Registration Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1935.

Short title.

2 Section 52 of the Births and Deaths Registration
Ordinance, 1895, is hereby amended in sub-section (2) thereof
by substituting for the words "Justice of the Peace", the
words "Justice of the Peace, a Commissioner for Oaths,".

Amendment of

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to amend section 52 (2) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, so as to enable declarations required by that Ordinance to be made within the Island before a Commissioner for Oaths. The omission of a reference to a Commissioner for Oaths in section 52 (2) is due to the fact that there were no Commissioners for Oaths in Ceylon when that section became law in 1907.
