PASSED ORDINANCES.

Ordinance enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof.

No. 13 of 1935.

An Ordinance to make provision for the relief of the Coconut Industry and for the Marketing and Exportation of the products of the Coconut Palm.

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An Ordinance to make provision for the relief of the Coconut Industry and for the Marketing and Exportation of the products of the Coconut Palm.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Coconut Products Ordinance, No. 13 of 1935, and shall come into operation on a date to be appointed by the Governor by proclamation in the Gazette.

Ceylon Coconut Board.

2 (1) For the purposes of this Ordinance, there shall be established a board styled "The Ceylon Coconut Board" which shall consist of a Chairman and eleven other members all of whom shall be appointed by the Governor.

(2) The Board shall be a body corporate and shall have perpetual succession and a common seal.

(3) The seal of the Board shall be authenticated in the prescribed manner and when so authenticated shall be judicially noticed.

(4) The Board may sue and be sued under the name and style of "The Ceylon Coconut Board".

(5) The Board shall appoint a Manager and a Secretary.

(6) Service on the Board of all legal processes and notices may be effected by service on the Secretary of the Board. In civil proceedings, it shall be lawful for the Secretary to sign proxies on behalf of the Board.

(7) Five members of the Board excluding the Chairman or other presiding member shall form a quorum thereof; but subject to the provisions of this sub-section the Board may act notwithstanding any vacancy in their number.

(8) The Chairman and every other member of the Board shall, upon appointment, hold office for a period of three years ; but the Governor may, notwithstanding the term of any such appointment, remove the Chairman or any other member of the Board from office at any time :

Provided that it shall be lawful for the Chairman or any other member of the Board to resign therefrom at any time.

(9) Any person ceasing to be a member of the Board shall be eligible for re-appointment thereto.

(10) The Chairman shall preside at all meetings of the Board at which he is present. In the absence of the Chairman from any meeting, the members present at the meeting may, subject to the provisions of sub-section (7), elect one of their own number to be Chairman at that meeting.

(11) The Chairman may summon a meeting of the Board at any time and shall summon a meeting upon receipt of a requisition therefor signed by three members of the Board.

(12) All questions shall be decided by a majority of the members voting at a meeting of the Board. The Chairman or presiding member shall have an original vote on all questions as well as a casting vote if the votes be equally divided.

(13) A member of the Board who is absent without reasonable cause from three consecutive meetings of the Board may, by resolution of the Board passed at a meeting of which notice has been duly given, be held to have vacated his office ; and, upon the passing of any such resolution, the member affected by that resolution shall cease to be a member of the Board.

(14) The Board may regulate its own procedure in any matters not provided for in this Ordinance or in the regulations made thereunder.

3 The Board shall have full power and authority—

- (1) to acquire and hold property, movable or immovable, and to sell, transfer, lease, mortgage or otherwise dispose of such property ;
- (2) to appoint, employ and remunerate and control its officers and servants and to direct and decide all matters connected with the administration of its affairs ;
- (3) to take such steps as it may consider necessary both in and outside the Island, to advertise Ceylon coconut products, to create, promote, encourage and further the demand for such products in the markets of the world, and to initiate, finance, support and supervise propaganda work for such purposes or for other purposes connected therewith or incidental thereto ;
- (4) to take such steps as it may consider necessary for the development or welfare of the coconut industry by organising, assisting or participating in exhibitions or fairs in or outside the Island ;
- (5) to aid and finance local associations or co-operative societies formed for the advancement and support of the coconut industry ;
- (6) to promote and subsidise the erection or extension of factories in which coconut products are manufactured or used ;
- (7) to investigate questions relating to freights and the export or transport of coconut products and to make recommendations thereon to the Executive Committee ;
- (8) to formulate for the consideration of the Executive Committee, schemes for the establishment, supervision, control and financial support of such institutions as may be or become necessary for the amelioration of the conditions of the coconut industry ;
- (9) to receive and disburse moneys for the accomplishment of the objects for which it is established ;
- (10) to raise funds or capital and to borrow money whether on the security of its assets or otherwise ;
- (11) to establish, manage, supervise and support Sales Rooms and agencies for the sale of coconut products both within and outside the Island ;
- (12) to formulate schemes to give effect to the objects and purposes of this Ordinance ;
- (13) to enter into contracts and generally to do all such things as may be necessary for the due exercise of the powers conferred and for due compliance with the duties imposed upon it by this Ordinance or by the regulations made thereunder.

Powers and duties of the Board.

- Allowance for expenses of members of the Board.** **4** No member of the Board shall receive any remuneration, reward or fee for his services as a member of the Board or as an officer thereof except such amount as may be prescribed by way of an allowance to meet expenses which he may incur in the discharge of his duties as a member or as an officer of the Board including the expenses of travelling to and from the meetings of the Board.
- General control of Executive Committee.** **5** Save as is otherwise expressly provided in this Ordinance and in the regulations made thereunder, the Board shall be under the general direction and control of the Executive Committee.
- Sales Room.** **6** (1) The Board shall establish in Colombo a Sales Room for the auction and sale of coconut products and may establish similar Sales Rooms elsewhere.
- (2) The establishment of a Sales Room in Colombo shall not for a period of three months reckoned from the date of such establishment affect or invalidate any forward contract made prior to the date of the coming into operation of this Ordinance for the delivery or sale of copra at a price fixed definitely in that contract in money or money's worth.
- Regulations shall be made for the registration of forward contracts by the Board and for the measures to be taken and the procedure to be adopted in order to give effect to the provisions of this sub-section.
- (3) Auction sales shall be held in the Sales Room in Colombo daily except on Sundays :
- Provided that the Board may, after due notice to the public in the prescribed manner, order that no auction sales shall be held in that Sales Room on a public holiday or on any other specified day or date.
- Registration of auctioneers and brokers.** **7** (1) The Board shall keep a register of approved auctioneers and brokers.
- (2) Regulations may be made prescribing—
- (a) the form of the register of auctioneers and brokers ; and
- (b) the procedure whereby an auctioneer or a broker may be approved and registered by the Board.
- Sales to be conducted by registered auctioneers.** **8** No coconut products shall be offered or put up for sale at a Sales Room except through a registered auctioneer or an officer of the Board who is an auctioneer.
- Shippers, dealers and millers.** **9** Regulations may be made providing for the registration of shippers, dealers and millers and prescribing the terms and conditions upon which a person may be registered as a shipper, or a dealer, or a miller, as the case may be.
- Stock books to be kept by shippers, dealers and millers.** **10** The Board may require any shipper, dealer or miller to keep in the prescribed form a stock-book containing the prescribed particulars relating to coconut products purchased, kept, stored, sold or shipped by him.
- Returns.** **11** The Board may require any shipper, dealer or miller to furnish to the Board on the prescribed dates returns in the prescribed form containing such particulars as may be required in respect of stocks and shipments of coconut products and contracts and agreements relating to the purchase, sale, marketing, storage, import or export of such products, or to the rates of freight charged or chargeable for the transport of such products.
- Power of Board to call for information.** **12** It shall be lawful for the Board at any time to call upon any auctioneer, broker, shipper, dealer, or miller—
- (a) to furnish before a specified date such information or explanation as the Board may require in respect of any particulars stated in any return furnished by such auctioneer, broker, shipper, dealer, or miller ; and
- (b) to produce or cause to be produced before a specified date such documentary or other evidence as the Board may require for the purpose of verifying any facts or particulars stated in any return furnished by such auctioneer, broker, shipper, dealer, or miller.
- Returns to be verified by statutory declaration.** **13** (1) Every return furnished under this Ordinance shall be accompanied by a declaration that the statements contained therein are true and accurate. A similar declaration shall be attached to the documents whereby any information is supplied or explanation is offered under this Ordinance.
- (2) Every declaration referred to in sub-section (1) shall be free from stamp duty.

14 All particulars contained in any return furnished, information supplied or explanation offered under this Ordinance shall be treated as confidential by the Board and by every member, officer or servant thereof except where the person furnishing such return supplying such information or offering such explanation otherwise agrees.

Particulars in returns to be treated as confidential.

15 No information obtained under this Ordinance in regard to any person or business shall be disclosed or published by the Board or by any member, officer or servant thereof except for the purposes of this Ordinance or of any legal proceedings thereunder; and any person who knowingly discloses or publishes any such information shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction after summary trial before a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand rupees or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding two years or to both such fine and imprisonment:

Penalty for unlawful disclosure or publication of information.

Provided that nothing in this sub-section contained shall be deemed to prohibit the disclosure or publication for statistical purposes of facts and figures which make no reference to any particular individual or business.

16 (1) The Board shall, on demand, issue a sale certificate to every person who purchases copra at a Sales Room.

Sale certificates.

(2) Every sale certificate shall be in the prescribed form and shall state the name of the purchaser and the quantity of the copra purchased by him.

(3) A sale certificate shall not be transferable or negotiable.

17 (1) Every copra export licence shall be in the prescribed form and shall authorise the export by the person named in the licence of a specified quantity of copra of a standard quality fixed by the Board.

Copra export licences.

(2) A copra export licence shall not be transferable or negotiable.

(3) The Board shall, on application in the prescribed form, issue to applicant a copra export licence authorising the export by that applicant of a specified quantity of a standard quality of copra if the Board or a prescribed officer of the Board is satisfied—

- (a) that the applicant has purchased at a Sales Room a like quantity of copra and has produced a sale certificate as evidence of such purchase; or
- (b) that the copra for the export of which such licence is required was manufactured on an estate and is being exported by the proprietor of that estate on his own account; or
- (c) that the copra for the export of which such licence is required was purchased in any other manner or circumstances prescribed by regulation:

Provided that the Board or a prescribed officer of the Board may refuse to issue a copra export licence if in the opinion of the Board or of that officer the copra sought to be exported on the licence is inferior to copra of that standard of quality which may from time to time be fixed by the Board as the lowest exportable standard of copra for the Island; and provided further that an appeal shall lie to such authority or tribunal as may be prescribed and subject to such regulations as may be made for the purpose against any refusal by the Board or a prescribed officer of the Board to issue a copra export licence under this section.

18 (1) On and after a date to be declared by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette, no copra shall be exported from the Island through the port of Colombo except upon a copra export licence issued by the Board.

Copra not to be exported except on licence after declared date.

(2) The Governor may by Proclamation in the Gazette and with effect from a date to be appointed in that Proclamation extend the provisions of this section to any port or ports in the Island in addition to the port of Colombo.

19 (1) Every coconut oil export licence shall be in the prescribed form and shall authorise the export by the person named in the licence of the quantity of coconut oil specified therein.

Coconut oil export licence.

(2) The Board shall, on application in the prescribed form, issue to the applicant a coconut oil export licence—

(a) in exchange for sale certificates issued to the applicant in accordance with the provisions of section 16 and surrendered by him to the Board in the prescribed manner; or

(b) if the Board or a prescribed officer thereof is satisfied that the coconut oil to be exported on that licence was manufactured—

(i) from copra obtained by the applicant from coconuts produced on an estate of which that applicant is the proprietor; or

(ii) from parings or shavings or from fresh coconuts; or

(iii) in an area other than an area prescribed for the purpose of section 21; or

(iv) from copra purchased before a prescribed date or in any manner or circumstances prescribed by regulation.

(3) A coconut oil export licence shall not be transferable except to a shipper. Regulations may be made prescribing the circumstances in which and the conditions subject to which a shipper may be entitled to the transfer of a coconut oil export licence and to export coconut oil on that licence.

Coconut oil not to be exported except on licence after declared date.

20 (1) On and after a date to be declared by the Governor by Proclamation in the Gazette, no coconut oil shall be exported from the Island through the port of Colombo except upon a coconut oil export licence issued by the Board.

(2) The Governor may by Proclamation in the Gazette and with effect from a date to be appointed in that Proclamation extend the provisions of this section to any port or ports in the Island in addition to the port of Colombo.

Purchase of copra for manufacture of oil.

21 On and after a date to be declared by the Governor by notification in the Gazette, no person shall within any prescribed area manufacture coconut oil from copra purchased by or for him unless such copra was purchased at the Sales Room.

Notification and registration of coconut products exported from ports other than Colombo.

22 (1) Every person who exports any coconut products, in respect of which a cess is levied under section 23, through any port in the Island other than the port of Colombo, shall notify to the Board in the prescribed manner the prescribed particulars relating to that consignment.

(2) The Board shall register in the prescribed manner all particulars notified under sub-section (1).

Coconut cess.

23 (1) In order to provide an income for the Board there shall be charged, levied and paid in addition to the export duties imposed under any written law other than this Ordinance, an export duty of two and a half cents on every hundredweight of copra, four cents on every hundredweight of coconut oil, and three and a half cents on every hundredweight of desiccated coconut and so in proportion for any less weight of any of those coconut products.

(2) The State Council may by resolution duly passed at any public session of the Council and sanctioned by the Governor impose an export duty on any coconut product not mentioned in sub-section (1) and may from time to time by like resolution increase, reduce, alter or abolish the amount of the duty imposed under sub-section (1) or under this sub-section.

(3) The duty imposed under this section shall not be taken into account in estimating the export duty levied on coconut products under the law of Ceylon for the purposes of section 31 of the Income Tax Ordinance, 1932.

(4) This section shall have effect as though it formed part of Ordinance No. 17 of 1869, and the provisions of that Ordinance shall apply accordingly.

(5) Pending the accrual from the export duty levied under this Ordinance of funds sufficient to defray the expenses incurred or likely to be incurred by the Board, it shall be lawful for the Financial Secretary to advance to the Board out of the public revenue of the Island such sums as the Governor may authorise him to advance from time to time.

(6) No interest shall be payable by the Board on any sums advanced by the Financial Secretary under sub-section (5). Such sums shall be repaid by the Board in such instalments as the Governor may determine.

(7) Nothing in this section contained shall be deemed to preclude the Board from receiving, whether by way of addition to its income or for a specified purpose or generally for the relief of the coconut industry, such moneys as may be voted or provided by the State Council by resolution duly passed at a public session of the Council and sanctioned by the Governor.

24 (1) The Executive Committee shall prepare the first budget of the Board. Such budget shall contain a statement of the estimated income and expenditure of the Board from the date of the commencement of this Ordinance to the end of the year in which that date occurs.

Estimates of
income and
expenditure.

(2) In the month of November in each year the Board shall submit to the Minister a budget of the estimated income and expenditure of the Board for the next succeeding year.

(3) Every budget of the Board shall be laid on the table of the State Council for the information of the members thereof.

(4) Not later than the thirty-first day of March in each year the Board shall submit to the Minister a statement, duly audited, of the moneys received and disbursed by the Board during the immediately preceding year. Each such statement shall be laid on the table of the State Council for the information of the members thereof.

25 The Manager or any person authorised by him in writing may at any reasonable time during the day enter any store, godown, factory, shed, estate or premises for the purpose of inspection, or for the purpose of verifying stocks or any particulars furnished in any return made or information given to the Board, or for the purpose of examining the stock-books of shippers, dealers and millers.

Right of
inspection.

26 No action shall be instituted against the Board or the Chairman or any other member of the Board or the Manager, Secretary or other officer of the Board, or any person acting in compliance with any direction or requirement of the Board or the Chairman or the Manager or Secretary or other officer of the Board, to charge him, them or any of them in respect of any act which may have been done or which may have been left undone in good faith in pursuance or supposed pursuance of his or their powers or duties under this Ordinance.

Protection of
officers.

27 If in the operation of this Ordinance any case shall arise in which in the opinion of the Executive Committee substantial hardship is likely to be caused to any person by reason of an unintentional failure on the part of such person to observe any formality prescribed by this Ordinance or by any regulations made thereunder, the Executive Committee may give such directions as may be necessary to mitigate or prevent such hardship.

Cases of
hardship.

28 (1) Any person who—

- (a) commits a breach of any of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulation made thereunder; or
- (b) resists or obstructs any person in the performance of the duties imposed or in the exercise of the powers conferred upon him by this Ordinance; or
- (c) omits or refuses when lawfully called upon by the Board under this Ordinance—
 - (i) to furnish a return or to produce or cause to be produced such documentary or other evidence as the Board may require for the purpose of verifying any fact stated in any such return; or
 - (ii) to supply any information or offer any explanation; or
- (d) knowingly makes any false statement in any declaration or return furnished by him under this Ordinance or knowingly offers any false explanation or supplies any false information when lawfully called upon by the Board to offer an explanation or to supply any information; or

Offences and
penalties.

- (e) exports or attempts or conspires to export coconut products in contravention of the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulation made thereunder

shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction after summary trial before a Police Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding one thousand rupees or to imprisonment of either description for a period not exceeding six months or to both such fine and imprisonment.

(2) No prosecution for any offence under this Ordinance or a regulation made thereunder shall be instituted except with the written sanction of the Attorney-General.

Regulations.

29 (1) The Executive Committee may make regulations for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to the principles and provisions of this Ordinance.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred by sub-section (1), the Executive Committee may make regulations for or in respect of all or any of the following matters :—

- (a) all matters stated or required in this Ordinance to be prescribed ;
- (b) the registers and books which shall be kept for the purposes of this Ordinance, the forms of such registers and books and the particulars to be entered therein ;
- (c) the forms of all returns, notices, certificates, licences, declarations, and documents required to be made, certified, issued or used for the purposes of this Ordinance ;
- (d) the inspection of stores, godowns, estates, factories, sheds or premises of shippers, dealers and millers, and the verification of stocks of shippers, dealers and millers ;
- (e) the payment or recovery of fees, allowances or other charges ;
- (f) the method of dealing with cases in which monetary advances have been given prior to the commencement of this Ordinance or will thereafter be given against deliveries of copra to be made subsequent to the date of such advances.
- (g) the examination and grading of coconut products, the establishment of standard qualities for such products and the issue of certificates of quality ;
- (h) the conduct of sales and auctions in a Sales Room, the conditions applicable to such sales and auctions, and the regulation of the use of a Sales Room ;
- (i) the notification of the minimum price at which copra and other coconut products shall be sold from time to time in a Sales Room ;
- (j) the regular publication of the maximum prices realized in a Sales Room on the sale of the various classes of coconut products ;
- (k) the resale or disposal in a Sales Room of coconut products previously sold for export in the Sales Room and not exported ;
- (l) the determination of the amount of coconut oil for which export licences may be issued against a surrender of sale certificates ;
- (m) the erection, establishment, maintenance and control of store houses, collecting stations, warehouses and godowns for coconut products ;
- (n) the grant of monetary advances against coconut products in the custody of the Board and against coconut products which have been sold or are awaiting sale ;
- (o) the collection of statistics relating to the coconut industry ;
- (p) all matters incidental to or connected with the matters or subjects specifically referred to in this sub-section.

(3) Every regulation made by the Executive Committee shall be brought before the State Council by a motion that such regulation shall be approved and if so approved, shall be

submitted to the Governor for ratification. No regulation made by the Executive Committee shall have effect until it has been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor. Notification of such approval and ratification shall be published in the Gazette.

(4) A regulation made by the Executive Committee when approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor shall upon the notification of such approval and ratification in the Gazette be as valid and effectual as if it were herein enacted.

30 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires— Interpretation.

“auctioneer” means an auctioneer licensed under the Surveyors, Auctioneers and Brokers Ordinance, 1889;

“Board” means the Ceylon Coconut Board established under section 2;

“broker” means a broker licensed under the Surveyors, Auctioneers and Brokers Ordinance, 1889;

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Board;

“coconut products” include copra, desiccated coconut and coconut oil;

“dealer” means a dealer in coconut products;

“estate” means any land on which the coconut palm is grown;

“Executive Committee” means the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce;

“manufactured” with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions means manufactured for the purposes of trade and not for the personal or domestic use of the manufacturer;

“Manager” means the Manager appointed by the Board;

“miller” means a manufacturer of desiccated coconut or coconut oil;

“prescribed” means prescribed by this Ordinance or by the regulations made thereunder;

“proprietor” means the owner, lessee or usufructuary mortgagee of an estate and includes the local agent of an owner who is absent from the Island;

“registered” means registered under this Ordinance or the regulations made thereunder;

“regulation” means a regulation made by the Executive Committee under this Ordinance;

“sale” includes a sale by sample or grade and a sale for immediate or future delivery;

“Sales Room” means a Sales Room established under section 6;

“Secretary” means the Secretary of the Board;

“Shipper” means a person who exports coconut products from the Island or obtains shipping facilities to enable another person so to export coconut products.

31 Nothing in this Ordinance shall affect or be deemed to affect the rights of His Majesty the King, His Heirs and Successors, or of any body politic or corporate, or of any other person except such as are mentioned in this Ordinance and those claiming by, from or under them.

Saving of the rights of the Crown, &c.

**An Ordinance to provide for the Registration and
Control of Trade Unions.**

An Ordinance to provide for the Registration and Control of Trade Unions.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

CHAPTER I.

Preliminary.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Trade Unions Ordinance, No. 14 of 1935, and shall come into operation on such date as the Governor may appoint by proclamation in the Gazette.

Short title and commencement.

2 In this Ordinance, unless the context otherwise requires,—

Interpretation.

“executive” means the body, by whatever name called, to which the management of the affairs of a trade union is entrusted and includes the president, the secretary and the treasurer of any trade union ;

“lock-out” means the closing of a place of employment or the suspension of work, or the refusal by an employer to continue to employ any number of persons employed by him in consequence of a dispute, done with a view to compelling those persons, or to aid another employer in compelling persons employed by him, to accept terms or conditions of or affecting employment ;

“officer”, when used with reference to a trade union, includes any member of the executive thereof, but does not include an auditor ;

“prescribed” means prescribed by regulations made under section 46 of this Ordinance ;

“register” means the register of trade unions maintained by the Registrar under section 7 ;

“registered office” means that office of a trade union which is registered under this Ordinance as the head office of the trade union ;

“registered trade union” means a trade union registered under this Ordinance ;

“Registrar” means the person for the time being appointed by the Governor under section 3 by name or by office to be or to act as Registrar of Trade Unions, and includes any person appointed by the Governor under section 4 to be or to act as an Assistant Registrar of Trade Unions ;

“regulation” means a regulation made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce, under section 46 ;

“strike” means the cessation of work by a body of persons employed in any trade or industry acting in combination, or a concerted refusal, or a refusal under a common understanding of any number of persons who are, or have been so employed, to continue to work or to accept employment ;

“trade dispute” means any dispute or difference between employers and workmen, or between workmen and workmen connected with the employment or non-employment, or the terms of the employment, or with the conditions of labour, of any person ;

“trade union” means any association or combination of workmen or employers, whether temporary or permanent, having among its objects one or more of the following objects :

(a) the regulation of relations between workmen and employers, or between workmen and workmen or between employers and employers ; or

(b) the imposing of restrictive conditions on the conduct of any trade or business ; or

(c) the representation of either workmen or employers in trade disputes ; or

(d) the promotion or organization or financing of strikes or lock-outs in any trade or industry or the provision of pay or other benefits for its members during a strike or lock-out ;

and includes any federation of two or more trade unions ;

“workman” means any person who has entered into or works under a contract with an employer in any capacity, whether the contract is express or implied, oral or in writing, and whether it is a contract of service or of apprenticeship, or a contract personally to execute any work or labour and includes any person ordinarily employed under any such contract, whether such person is or is not in employment at any particular time.

CHAPTER II.

Appointment of Registrar and other officers.

Appointment of Registrar.

3 (1) The Governor shall appoint a Registrar of Trade Unions who shall be responsible for the due performance of the duties and functions assigned to him as Registrar under this Ordinance.

(2) In the exercise of his powers and in the discharge of his duties under this Ordinance, the Registrar shall be subject to the general direction and control of the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce.

Appointment of Assistant Registrars and other officers.

4 The Governor may appoint one or more Assistant Registrars of Trade Unions and such other officers as may from time to time be required for the purposes of this Ordinance.

All officers to be public servants.

5 All officers appointed under sections 3 and 4 of this Ordinance shall be deemed to be public servants within the meaning of the “Ceylon Penal Code”.

Protection of public servants.

6 No suit shall lie against any public servant acting under this Ordinance for anything done or omitted to be done by him in good faith.

CHAPTER III.

Registration.

Register of trade unions.

7 (1) The Registrar shall keep and maintain in such form as may be prescribed, a register of trade unions in which shall be registered the prescribed particulars relating to any registered trade union and any alteration or change which may from time to time be effected in the name, rules, officers or executive thereof or in the situation of the registered office thereof, and all such other matters as may be required to be registered therein under this Ordinance.

(2) A certified copy of any entry in the register shall be conclusive proof of the facts specified therein as on the date of such certified copy.

Necessity for registration.

8 (1) Every trade union established before the date of the commencement of this Ordinance shall apply to be registered under this Ordinance within a period of three months reckoned from that date.

(2) Every trade union established after the commencement of this Ordinance shall apply to be registered under this Ordinance within a period of three months reckoned from the date on which it was so established.

(3) The Registrar may, if he thinks fit, from time to time grant an extension of the periods respectively specified in sub-sections (1) and (2), provided that neither of such periods shall, in any particular case, be so extended as to exceed a period of six months in the aggregate.

(4) For the purposes of this Ordinance, a trade union is established on the first date on which any workmen or employers agree to become or to create an association or combination for the furtherance of any one or more of the objects specified in the definition of a trade union in section 2.

(5) For the purpose of prosecuting any trade union which fails to apply for registration in accordance with the provisions of this section, the date of establishment of that trade union shall, in the absence of proof of the date referred to in sub-section (4), be deemed to be—

- (a) the date on which any person is proved to have been accepted or admitted as a member of that trade union ; or,
- (b) the date on which any act is proved to have been done by that trade union in furtherance of any one or more of the objects specified in the definition of a trade union in section 2 ;

and, in a case where proof is available of both the dates referred to in paragraphs (a) and (b), the earlier of such dates shall be deemed so to be the date of the establishment of that trade union.

9 (1) Every application for registration of a trade union shall be made to the Registrar in the prescribed form and shall be signed by at least seven members of the union, any of whom may be officers thereof.

Application for registration.

(2) Uncancelled stamps to the value of one rupee shall be affixed to every such application which shall be accompanied by a copy of the rules of the trade union and a statement of the following particulars, namely :

- (a) the names, occupations and addresses of the members making the application ;
- (b) the name of the trade union and the address of its head office ; and
- (c) the titles, names, ages, addresses and occupations of the officers of the trade union.

(3) A trade union established before the commencement of this Ordinance shall deliver to the Registrar, together with its application for registration, a general statement of the assets and liabilities of the trade union prepared in such form and containing such particulars as may be prescribed.

10 The Registrar, if he is satisfied that a trade union applying for registration has complied with the provisions of this Ordinance and of the regulations made thereunder and that the objects, rules and constitution of the union do not conflict with any of such provisions and are not unlawful, shall register the trade union in the prescribed manner :

Registration.

Provided that if any one of the objects of such trade union is unlawful, the registration of the trade union shall be void.

11 The Registrar, on registering a trade union under section 10, shall issue to the trade union a certificate of registration in the prescribed form and that certificate, unless proved to have been cancelled or withdrawn, shall be conclusive evidence for all purposes that the trade union has been duly registered under this Ordinance.

Certificate of registration.

12 The Registrar may call for further information for the purpose of satisfying himself that any application complies with the provisions of section 9 or that the trade union is entitled to registration under this Ordinance.

Power of Registrar to call for further particulars.

13 If the name under which a trade union is proposed to be registered is identical with that by which any other existing trade union has been registered or, in the opinion of the Registrar, so nearly resembles such name as to be likely to deceive or mislead the public or the members of either trade union, the Registrar shall require the persons applying for registration to alter the name of the trade union stated in the application, and shall refuse to register the trade union until such alteration has been made.

Power of Registrar to require alteration of name.

14 The Registrar may refuse to register any trade union if he is not satisfied that the trade union has complied with the provisions of this Ordinance or of any regulations made thereunder, or if he is of opinion that any one of the objects or rules, or the constitution of the union is unlawful or conflicts with any such provision.

Refusal of registration.

Cancellation or withdrawal of registration.

15 (1) A certificate of registration of a trade union may be withdrawn or cancelled by the Registrar—

- (a) at the request of the trade union upon its dissolution to be verified in such manner as the Registrar may require ;
- (b) if he is satisfied,
 - (i) that the certificate of registration was obtained by fraud or mistake ;
 - (ii) that any one of the objects or rules of the trade union is unlawful ;
 - (iii) that the constitution of the trade union or of its executive is unlawful ;
 - (iv) that the trade union has wilfully and after notice from the Registrar contravened any provision of this Ordinance or allowed any rule to continue in force which is inconsistent with any such provision, or has rescinded any rule providing for any matter, for which provision is required by section 32 ;
 - (v) that the funds of the trade union are expended in an unlawful manner or on an unlawful object or on an object not authorised by the rules of the union ;
 - (vi) that the trade union has ceased to exist.

(2) Except in a case falling within sub-section (1) (a), not less than two months' previous notice in writing specifying the ground on which it is proposed to withdraw or to cancel its certificate of registration shall be given by the Registrar to a trade union before such certificate is withdrawn or cancelled.

(3) A trade union served with a notice under sub-section (2) may, at any time within a period of two months reckoned from the date of such notice, show cause in writing against the proposal to withdraw or to cancel its certificate of registration, as the case may be ; and, if such cause is shown, the Registrar may hold such enquiry as he may consider necessary in the circumstances.

(4) The Registrar may, after the expiration of the period of two months referred to in sub-section (3), withdraw or cancel the certificate of registration of any trade union which has failed duly to show cause under that sub-section, or which, having so shown cause, has failed to satisfy him that its certificate of registration should not be withdrawn or cancelled, as the case may be.

(5) An order made by the Registrar under this section withdrawing or cancelling the certificate of registration of any trade union shall be dated as of the date on which it was made and shall forthwith be served on the trade union affected thereby.

Appeal to District Court.

16 (1) Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the Registrar to register a trade union or by an order made by the Registrar under section 15, may appeal against such refusal or order by filing a petition of appeal in the District Court within a period of thirty days reckoned from the date of such refusal or order.

(2) Every petition of appeal under sub-section (1) shall—

- (a) name the Registrar as respondent ;
- (b) state the grounds of appeal and the date of the refusal or order against which the appeal is preferred ;
- (c) be signed by the appellant ; and
- (d) be stamped with a stamp of one rupee.

(3) It shall be competent for the District Court in appeal—

- (a) to direct the appellant or the Registrar to furnish further information ;
- (b) to hold an inquiry and to take and record such evidence as it may deem necessary ;
- (c) to allow the appeal and to order the registration of the trade union or to reverse any order made by the Registrar under section 15 ;
- (d) to dismiss the appeal ; or
- (e) to make such order as it shall consider just and to give such directions as it may consider necessary, including directions as to the costs of the appeal and the procedure to be observed at the hearing of the appeal.

(4) Save as is otherwise in this section provided, an appeal to the District Court against a refusal of the Registrar to register a trade union or against an order made by the Registrar under section 15 shall be deemed to be a civil action of the value of three hundred rupees for the purposes of the Stamp Ordinance, 1909, and of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889.

(5) In this section, "District Court", in the case of an appeal against the refusal of the Registrar to register a trade union, means the District Court having local jurisdiction over the place sought to be registered as the place of the head office of the trade union in the application for registration made under section 9; and, in the case of an appeal against an order made by the Registrar under section 15, means the District Court having local jurisdiction over the place where the registered office of the trade union affected by that order is situated.

17 An appeal shall lie to the Supreme Court against an order made by a District Court under section 16 and the provisions of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, shall apply accordingly in all matters relating to or connected with such appeal.

Appeal to
Supreme
Court.

18 If any trade union does not apply for registration in due time, or if the registration of any trade union is refused, withdrawn, or cancelled, then—

Consequences of
failure to
register or of
cancellation of
registration.

- (a) the trade union shall be deemed to be an unlawful association and shall cease to enjoy any of the rights, immunities, or privileges of a registered trade union, but without prejudice to any liabilities incurred or to be incurred by the trade union which may be enforced against the union and its assets;
- (b) the trade union shall not, nor shall any of its officers or agents on behalf of the union, take part in any trade dispute or promote, organize or finance any strike or lock-out, or provide pay or other benefits for its members during a strike or lock-out;
- (c) the trade union shall be dissolved and its funds shall be disposed of in accordance with the rules of the union; and
- (d) no person shall, except for the purpose of defending proceedings against the union or dissolving the union and disposing of its funds in accordance with the rules, take any part in its management or organisation, or act or purport to act on behalf of the union or as an officer of the union.

CHAPTER IV.

Rights and liabilities of trade unions.

19 A trade union shall not enjoy any of the rights, immunities or privileges of a registered trade union until it is registered.

Disabilities of
unregistered
union.

20 No action or other legal proceeding shall be maintainable in any civil court against any registered trade union or any officer or member thereof in respect of any act done in contemplation or in furtherance of a trade dispute to which a member of the trade union is a party on the ground only that such act induces some other person to break a contract of employment, or that it is in interference with the trade, business or employment of some other person or with the right of some other person to dispose of his capital or of his labour as he wills.

Immunity from
civil action in
certain cases.

21 An action against a trade union or against any members or officers thereof on behalf of themselves and all other members of the trade union in respect of any tortious act alleged to have been committed by or on behalf of the trade union in contemplation or in furtherance of a trade dispute shall not be entertained by any court.

Liability in
tort.

22 Every trade union shall be liable on any contract entered into by it or by an agent acting on its behalf: provided that a trade union shall not be so liable on any contract which is void or unenforceable at law.

Liability in
contract.

23 The objects of a registered trade union shall not, by reason only that they are in restraint of trade be deemed to be unlawful so as to render any member of such trade union liable to criminal prosecution for conspiracy or otherwise or to render void or voidable any agreement or trust.

Objects in
restraint of
trade not
unlawful in

trade union.

24 (1) A registered trade union may sue and be sued and be prosecuted under its registered name.

Proceedings by
and against
trade unions.

(2) An unregistered trade union may be sued and prosecuted under the name by which it has been operating or is generally known.

(3) A trade union whose registration has been cancelled or withdrawn may be sued and prosecuted under the name by which it was registered.

(4) Execution for any money recovered from a trade union in civil proceedings may issue against any property belonging to or held in trust for the trade union other than the benevolent fund of a registered trade union.

(5) Any fine ordered to be paid by a trade union may be recovered by distress and sale of any movable property belonging to or held in trust for the trade union in accordance with the provisions of the Criminal Procedure Code, 1898.

(6) It shall be competent for a registered trade union to file a proxy in any court or in any civil or other judicial proceedings provided that the proxy is signed by at least two of the trustees of that registered trade union.

CHAPTER V.

Constitution.

Membership of minors.

25 A person under the age of twenty-one, but above the age of sixteen, may be a member of a registered trade union, unless provision be made in the rules thereof to the contrary, and may, subject to the rules of the trade union, enjoy all the rights of a member except as herein provided, and execute all instruments and give all acquittances necessary to be executed or given under the rules, but shall not be a member of the executive or a trustee of a registered trade union.

Officers of trade union.

26 (1) Not less than one-half of the total number of the officers of every registered trade union shall be persons actually engaged or employed in an industry or occupation with which the trade union is connected.

(2) The Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may, by special or general order published in the Gazette, declare that the provisions of this section shall not apply to any registered trade union or class of registered trade unions specified in the order.

Change of name.

27 Any registered trade union may, with the consent of not less than two-thirds of the total number of its members and subject to the provisions of section 28, change its name.

Amalgamation.

28 Any two or more registered trade unions may become amalgamated together as one trade union with or without dissolution or division of the funds of such trade unions or either or any of them, provided that the votes of at least one-half of the members of each or every such trade union entitled to vote are recorded, and that at least sixty per centum of the votes recorded are in favour of the proposal.

Notice of change of name or amalgamation.

29 (1) Notice in writing shall be given to the Registrar of every change of name and of every amalgamation, signed, in the case of a change of name, by the secretary and by seven members of the trade union changing its name, and, in the case of an amalgamation, by the secretary and by seven members of each and every trade union which is a party thereto.

(2) If the proposed name is identical with that by which any other existing trade union has been registered or, in the opinion of the Registrar, so nearly resembles such name as to be likely to deceive the public or the members of either trade union, the Registrar shall refuse to register the change of name.

(3) Save as is provided in sub-section (2), the Registrar shall, if he is satisfied that the provisions of this Ordinance in respect of change of name have been complied with, register the change of name in the prescribed manner, and the change of name shall have effect from the date of such registration.

(4) If the Registrar is satisfied that the provisions of this Ordinance in respect of amalgamation have been complied with and that the trade union formed thereby is entitled to registration under section 10, he shall register the trade union in the prescribed manner and the amalgamation shall have effect from the date of such registration.

(5) Any person aggrieved by the refusal of the Registrar to register either a change of the name of a registered trade union or the trade union formed by the amalgamation of any two or more registered trade unions, may appeal against such refusal by filing a petition of appeal in the District Court within a period of thirty days reckoned from the date of such refusal.

(6) Every petition of appeal under sub-section (5) shall—

- (a) name the Registrar as respondent ;
- (b) state the grounds of appeal and the date of the refusal against which the appeal is preferred ;
- (c) be signed by the appellant ; and
- (d) be stamped with a stamp of one rupee.

(7) It shall be competent for the District Court in an appeal under sub-section (5)—

- (a) to direct the appellant or the Registrar to furnish further information ;
- (b) to hold an inquiry and to take and record such evidence as it may deem necessary ;
- (c) to allow the appeal and reverse the order made by the Registrar ;
- (d) to dismiss the appeal ; or
- (e) to make such order as it shall consider just and to give such directions as it may consider necessary, including directions as to the costs of the appeal and the procedure to be observed at the hearing of the appeal.

(8) Save as is otherwise in sub-section (6) provided, an appeal to the District Court under sub-section (5) shall for the purposes of the Stamp Ordinance, 1909, and of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, be deemed to be a civil action of the value of three hundred rupees.

(9) In this section, “ District Court ”, in the case of an appeal against the refusal of the Registrar to register a change of the name of a registered trade union, means the District Court having local jurisdiction over the place where the registered office of that trade union is situated ; and, in the case of a refusal by the Registrar to register a trade union formed by the amalgamation of two or more registered trade unions, “ District Court ” means the District Court having jurisdiction over the place sought to be registered as the place of the head office of the trade union formed as a result of such amalgamation.

(10) An appeal shall lie to the Supreme Court against an order made by the District Court under sub-section (7), and the provisions of the Civil Procedure Code, 1889, shall apply accordingly in all matters relating to or connected with such appeal.

30 (1) A change in the name of a registered trade union shall not affect any rights or obligations of that trade union or render defective any legal proceeding by or against the trade union, and any legal proceeding which might have been continued or commenced by or against it under its former name may be continued or commenced by or against it under its new name.

Effect of
change of
name or
amalgamation.

(2) An amalgamation of two or more registered trade unions shall not prejudice any right of either or any such trade unions or any right of a creditor of either or any of them.

31 (1) Every registered trade union shall have a registered office to which all communications and notices may be addressed.

Registered
office.

(2) Notice of the situation of such registered office, and of any change therein, shall be given to the Registrar and shall be registered by him, and the trade union shall not be deemed to have complied with the provisions of this Ordinance until such notice has been given.

(3) Every trade union which—

- (a) operates without having a registered office, or without giving notice of the situation of its registered office as hereinbefore required ; or

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(b) operates at any place to which its registered office may have been removed, without having given notice of the change in the situation thereof to the Registrar,

shall, on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding ten rupees for every day during which it is so in operation ; and every officer of any such trade union shall be liable to be convicted and fined a like amount in respect of the same offence.

Rules.
First
Schedule.

32 (1) The rules of every registered trade union shall provide for all the matters specified in the First Schedule.

(2) A copy of the rules for the time being in force of any registered trade union shall be prominently exhibited at the registered office thereof and shall be furnished by the secretary of such trade union to any person on demand on payment of a sum not exceeding fifty cents.

(3) A copy of every new rule and of every alteration made in the rules of a registered trade union shall be sent to the Registrar within seven days of the making of such rule or alteration and shall be registered by the Registrar on payment of the prescribed fee.

(4) The rules of a trade union may be made in English, or Sinhalese, or Tamil. Where a copy of any rule or of any alteration of any rule is sent to the Registrar, such copy shall, if the rule or alteration has not been made in English, be accompanied by a correct translation into English of such rule or alteration as the case may be.

Notification
of change of
officers, &c.

33 Notice of all changes of officers or of the title of any officer shall be prominently exhibited in the registered office of every registered trade union, and shall, within seven days after the change, be sent to the Registrar by such trade union together with the prescribed fee, and the Registrar shall thereupon correct the register accordingly.

Notification
of dissolution.

34 When a registered trade union is dissolved, notice of the dissolution signed by seven members and by the secretary of the trade union shall, within fourteen days of the dissolution, be sent to the Registrar and shall be registered by him if he is satisfied that the dissolution has been effected in accordance with the rules of the trade union ; and the dissolution shall have effect from the date of such registration.

Trustees.

35 (1) The rules of a trade union shall provide for the appointment or election of trustees and for the filling of vacancies in the office of trustee so that, as far as may be, there shall always be at least three trustees of the union.

(2) Any officer or member of a registered trade union may be a trustee thereof.

CHAPTER VI.

Property.

All property
vested in
trustees.

36 All property, movable or immovable, of a registered trade union shall be vested in its trustees for the use and benefit of the union and its members and shall be under the control of the trustees.

Devolution
of property.

37 Upon any change in the office of the trustee, the property of a registered trade union shall vest in the trustee or trustees for the time being of the union for the same estate and interest as the former trustee had therein, and subject to the same trusts, without any conveyance or assignment.

Purchase or
lease of land
or buildings.

38 Subject to any provision in its rules, it shall be lawful for a registered trade union to purchase or to take upon lease for the purposes of the union and in the names of its trustees any land not exceeding one acre in extent or any buildings and, subject to any written or other law which may be applicable, to sell, exchange, hypothecate or lease any such land or building which may be so purchased.

CHAPTER VII.

Funds and accounts.

39 The funds of a registered trade union may, subject to the rules thereof and to the provisions of this Ordinance, be applied for any lawful object for which that trade union has been established.

Application
of funds.

40 The funds of a registered trade union shall not be applied either directly or indirectly in payment of the whole or part of any fine or penalty imposed upon any person by sentence or order of a court of justice.

Prohibition
of payment
of fines or
penalties.

41 (1) A registered trade union may constitute a separate fund, hereinafter in this Ordinance called "the political fund", from contributions separately levied for or made to that fund, from which payments may be made, for the promotion of the civic and political interests of its members, in furtherance of any of the objects, hereinafter in this Ordinance called "political objects" specified in sub-section (2).

Political
objects and
political fund.

(2) The political objects referred to in sub-section (1) are:—

- (a) the payment of any expenses incurred either directly or indirectly by a candidate or prospective candidate for election as a member of the State Council or to any public office, before, during, or after the election, in connection with his candidature or election; or,
- (b) the holding of any meeting or the distribution of any literature or documents in support of any such candidate or prospective candidate; or,
- (c) the maintenance of any person who is a member of the State Council or who holds a public office; or,
- (d) the compilation or revision of any register of electors, the registration of electors, or the selection of a candidate for membership of the State Council or for any public office; or,
- (e) the holding of political meetings of any kind, or the distribution of political literature or political documents of any kind.

In this sub-section, "public office" means the office of any member of any Municipal Council, District Council, Local Board, Sanitary Board, Village Committee or any other local authority constituted by or under any written law and which has or may have the power to raise money, either directly or indirectly, by means of the imposition or levy of any tax, rate or fee.

(3) No political fund shall be created by any registered trade union unless a resolution in favour of the creation of a political fund is passed by a majority of the members of the union present and voting at a general meeting specially convened for the purpose. The voting at a general meeting so convened shall be by ballot held in the prescribed manner.

(4) No payment in furtherance of any political object shall be made by any registered trade union except out of the political fund of that union.

(5) No member of a registered trade union shall be liable to contribute to the political fund of that union unless he has signed and delivered at the registered office thereof a notice substantially in the form contained in Part I of the Second Schedule of his willingness to contribute to that fund and has not withdrawn such notice by signing and delivering at the registered office of the union a notice substantially in the form contained in Part II of that Schedule.

(6) A notice under sub-section (5) may be delivered personally or by an agent or servant, and shall be deemed to have been duly delivered if it is sent by registered post addressed to the secretary of the registered trade union at its registered office.

(7) No member shall be compelled or required to make a contribution to the political fund unless he is liable for such contribution.

(8) Where a member of a registered trade union is liable to contribute to the political fund of that union, every demand made to that member for a contribution to the funds of the union shall specify separately the amount, if any, demanded from him as a contribution to the political fund; and every receipt issued to any member of a registered trade union for any contribution made by that member to the funds of that union shall specify separately what sum, if any, out of the total amount of such contribution was received from that member on account of the political fund.

(9) No assets of a trade union, other than the contributions of members liable to contribute to the political fund and voluntary contributions to the political fund received from non-members, shall be credited to the political fund; and no assets of a trade union not forming part of the political fund shall be directly or indirectly applied in furtherance of any political object.

(10) A member of a registered trade union who does not contribute to the political fund thereof shall not be expelled therefrom nor be excluded from any benefits of that trade union nor be placed in any respect either directly or indirectly under any disability or at any disadvantage as compared with other members of that trade union (except in relation to the control or management of the political fund) by reason of his not contributing to that fund; and a contribution to the political fund shall not be made a condition for admission to the trade union.

Injunction
to restrain
misuse of funds.

42 An injunction restraining any unauthorised or unlawful expenditure of the funds of a registered trade union may be granted on the application of any person having a sufficient interest in the relief sought, or of the Attorney-General.

Treasurer
to render
accounts.

43 (1) Every treasurer of a registered trade union and every other officer thereof who is responsible for the accounts of the union or for the collection, disbursement, custody or control of the funds or moneys thereof, shall, upon resigning or vacating his office and at least once in every year at such time as may be specified by the rules of the union and at any other times at which he may be required to do so by a resolution of the members of the union or by the rules thereof, render to the union and its members a just and true account of all moneys received and paid by him during the period which has elapsed since the date of his assuming office, or if he has previously rendered an account, since the last date upon which he rendered such account, and of the balance remaining in his hands, at the time of rendering such account and of all bonds, securities, or other property of the trade union entrusted to his custody or under his control.

(2) The form of account may be prescribed by regulation.

(3) The account shall be verified by affidavit, and the union shall cause the account to be audited by some fit and proper person approved by the Registrar.

(4) After the account has been audited, the treasurer or other officer referred to in sub-section (1) shall forthwith hand over to the trustees of the union, if required by them to do so, such balance as appears to be due from him, and also, if so required, all bonds, securities, effects, books, papers, and property of the union in his hands or custody, or otherwise under his control.

Annual
returns.

44 (1) The secretary of every registered trade union shall furnish annually to the Registrar on or before the prescribed date in each and every year a general statement audited in the prescribed manner, of all receipts and expenditure during the period of twelve months ending on the thirty-first day of March next preceding such prescribed date, and of the assets and liabilities of the trade union as at such thirty-first day of March. The statement shall be accompanied by a copy of the auditor's report and shall be prepared in such form and shall comprise such particulars as may be prescribed.

(2) Together with the general statement referred to in sub-section (1), the secretary of each registered trade union shall furnish to the Registrar a copy of all alterations or amendments of rules, and of all new rules, and a list of all changes of officers, made by the union during the period of twelve months preceding the said thirty-first day of March, and a copy of the rules of the trade union in force on that day.

(3) In the case of a registered trade union which was established before the commencement of this Ordinance, it shall be lawful for the Registrar, on application made to him in that behalf, by writing under his hand to substitute the day on which the financial year of that trade union ends for the thirty-first day of March mentioned in sub-sections (1) and (2) and, if necessary, some other date for the date prescribed for the purposes of sub-section (1); and all the provisions of this section shall thereupon apply accordingly in the case of that registered trade union as though the date and the day so substituted were respectively the date referred to in sub-section (1) and the day referred to in sub-sections (1) and (2).

(4) Every member of a registered trade union shall be entitled to receive free of charge a copy of the general statement referred to in sub-section (1) and the secretary of each registered trade union shall deliver a copy of such statement to every member of his union who makes application to him therefor.

(5) Any secretary of a registered trade union who fails to comply with any of the requirements of this section shall be guilty of an offence, and shall, on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.

(6) Every person who wilfully makes or orders or causes or procures to be made any false entry in or omission from any general statement, copy or list delivered to the Registrar under sub-sections (1) and (2) shall be guilty of an offence and shall be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees, or to imprisonment of either description for a term not exceeding three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

45 The account books of a registered trade union and a list of the members thereof shall be open to inspection by any officer or member of the trade union at such times as may be provided for in the rules of the trade union.

Inspection of accounts and documents.

CHAPTER VIII.

Regulations.

46 (1) The Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may make regulations for the purpose of carrying out or giving effect to the principles and provisions of this Ordinance.

Regulations.

(2) In particular and without prejudice to the generality of the powers conferred by sub-section (1), the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may make regulations for or in respect of all or any of the following matters :—

- (a) all matters stated or required in this Ordinance to be prescribed ;
- (b) the books and registers to be kept for the purposes of this Ordinance and the forms thereof ;
- (c) the manner in which trade unions and the rules of the trade unions shall be registered and the fees payable on registration ;
- (d) the manner in which, and the qualifications of persons by whom, the accounts of registered trade unions or of any class of such unions shall be audited ;
- (e) the conditions subject to which inspection of documents kept by the Registrar shall be allowed and the fees which shall be chargeable in respect of such inspections ;
- (f) the due disposal and safe custody of the funds and moneys of a trade union ;
- (g) the creation, administration, protection, control and disposal of the benevolent funds of registered trade unions and all matters connected therewith or incidental thereto ; and
- (h) generally for all matters incidental to or connected with the matters or subjects specifically mentioned in this sub-section.

(3) The Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce may by regulation declare that any regulation made under head (g) of sub-section (2) shall apply to a specified trade union only or that any particular trade union or class of trade union shall be exempt from the operation of any regulation made under that head of that sub-section.

47 (1) No regulation made under section 46 shall have effect unless it has been approved by the State Council and ratified by the Governor. Notification of such approval and ratification shall be published in the Gazette.

Approval by State Council and ratification by Governor.

(2) Every regulation made by the Executive Committee of Labour, Industry and Commerce shall, upon the publication of a notification of the approval and ratification of that regulation as provided for in sub-section (1), be as valid and effectual as if it were herein enacted.

CHAPTER IX.

Offences and penalties.

48 (1) Where, on complaint made by a member of a registered trade union, it is shown to the satisfaction of a Police Magistrate that any officer or member of that union has in his possession or control any property of the union except in accordance with the rules of the union, or has unlawfully expended or withheld any money of the union, the Magistrate shall, if he considers the justice of the case so requires, order such officer or member to deliver all such property to the trustees of the union and to pay to them the money so unlawfully expended or withheld.

Penalty for misuse of money or property of a registered trade union.

(2) A complaint made under sub-section (1) shall not be entertained unless the Police Magistrate is satisfied that the complainant is, on the date of that complaint, a member of the registered trade union in respect of the property of which such complaint is so made.

(3) Any person bound by an order made under sub-section (1) who fails to comply with the terms thereof and the directions given therein within a time to be specified in such order shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding five hundred rupees.

(4) An order under sub-section (1) shall not affect or prevent a prosecution of, or civil proceedings against, any such officer or member.

Supplying false information regarding trade unions.

49 Any person who, with intent to deceive, gives to any member of a registered trade union or to any person intending or applying to become a member of such trade union any document purporting to be a copy of the rules of the trade union or of any alterations thereto which he knows, or has reason to believe, is not a correct copy of such rules or alterations as are for the time being in force, or any person who, with the like intent, gives a copy of any rules of an unregistered trade union to any person on the pretence that such rules are the rules of a registered trade union, shall be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees or to imprisonment of either description for any period not exceeding three months, or to both such fine and imprisonment.

Failure to submit returns.

50 If default is made on the part of any registered trade union in doing any act, in giving any notice, or in sending any statement, return or other document as required by this Ordinance or by the regulations made thereunder, every officer or other person bound by the rules of the trade union or under the provisions of this Ordinance or the regulations made thereunder to do such act, or to give such notice, or to send such statement, return or document, or, if there is no such officer or person, every member of the executive of that registered trade union shall severally be guilty of an offence and shall on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate be liable to a fine not exceeding fifty rupees.

General penalty

51 (1) Every person who, and every trade union which, contravenes any provision of this Ordinance or any regulation made thereunder shall be guilty of an offence and shall, on conviction after summary trial by a Police Magistrate, be liable to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees unless some other punishment is provided for such offence by this Ordinance.

(2) Upon conviction of an unregistered trade union under sub-section (1), every person proved to have been a member of the executive of that trade union at any time after the commencement of this Ordinance shall be deemed severally to be guilty of the offence for which the trade union was so convicted and the Police Magistrate shall, after necessary enquiry, declare in his judgment and verdict the name of each person so deemed to be guilty and shall pass sentence upon him according to law.

Limitation of prosecutions.

52 No prosecution shall be instituted under this Ordinance except by, or at the instance of, or with the written consent of, the Attorney-General.

Saving of offences under other written law.

53 The offences and penalties specifically defined and provided in this Ordinance are in addition to and not in substitution of those defined and provided in any other written law.

CHAPTER X.

Miscellaneous.

Ordinance not to affect certain agreements.

54 This Ordinance shall not affect—

- (1) any agreement between partners as to their own business ; or
- (2) any agreement between an employer and those employed by him as to such employment ; or
- (3) any agreement in consideration of the sale of the good will of a business or of instruction in any profession, trade or handicraft.

55 The following Ordinances, namely :

- (a) The Joint Stock Companies Ordinance, 1861,
- (b) The Societies' Ordinance, 1891,
- (c) The Registration of Business Names Ordinance, No. 6 of 1918, and
- (d) The Co-operative Societies Ordinance, No. 34 of 1921,

Certain Ordinances not to apply to trade unions.

shall not apply to any trade union ; and the registration of any trade union under any of those Ordinances shall be void.

56 Every summons, notice or other document required to be served on a trade union in any civil or criminal proceeding shall be deemed to be duly served if it is delivered at the registered office of the trade union or if it is served personally on the president or the treasurer or the secretary or on any officer of the trade union provided that such service is otherwise in compliance with the requirements of written law.

Service of legal process.

FIRST SCHEDULE.

(Section 32.)

Matters for which provision must be made in the rules of every registered trade union.

1. The name of the trade union and the place of meeting for the business of the trade union.
2. The whole of the objects for which the trade union is to be established, the purposes for which the funds thereof shall be applicable, the conditions under which any member thereof may become entitled to any benefit assured thereby, and the fines and forfeitures to be imposed on any member thereof.
3. The manner of making, altering, amending, and rescinding rules.
4. The appointment or election and removal of an executive and of trustees, secretaries, treasurers, and other officers, of the trade union.
5. The custody and investment of the funds of the trade union, the designation of the officer or officers responsible therefor, and the annual or periodical audit of its accounts.
6. The inspection of the books and names of members of the trade union by any person having an interest in the funds of the trade union.
7. The manner of the dissolution of the trade union and the disposal of the funds thereof available at the time of such dissolution.

Short title.

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Petroleum (Amendment) Ordinance, No. 4 of 1935.

Amendment of section 3 of the principal Ordinance.

2 Section 3 of The Petroleum Ordinance, 1887, (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended by substituting the following for the definition of "Dangerous Petroleum" therein, viz. :—

"Dangerous Petroleum" means petroleum of which the flashing point is below the temperature for the time being fixed by notification in the Government Gazette by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Committee of Home Affairs.

Amendment of section 14 of the principal Ordinance.

3 Section 14 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the words "the temperature for the time being fixed by notification in the Government Gazette by the Governor with the advice of the Executive Committee of Home Affairs" for the words "one hundred and seventy five degrees of Fahrenheit's thermometer" occurring in the last two lines of the proviso.

An Ordinance to amend the Pawnbrokers
Ordinance, 1893.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice
and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Pawnbrokers (Amendment) Ordinance No. 5 of 1935. Short title.

2 Section 2 of the Pawnbrokers Ordinance, 1893 (hereinafter referred to as "the principal Ordinance") is amended by adding at the end the following :— Amendment of section 2 of the principal Ordinance.

"Month" means a period of thirty days for the purpose of charging profit or interest.

"Sign" with its grammatical variations and cognate expressions means, in the case of a person who is unable to write his name, the impression in ink or some other suitable medium of the left thumb of that person.

3 Section 6 of the principal Ordinance is hereby repealed and the following section is substituted therefor :— Repeal of section 6 of the principal Ordinance and substitution of a new section therefor.

6 (1) Every pawn ticket shall be executed in foil and counterfoil in the form prescribed in Schedule I and in accordance with the directions contained in that form. Pawn tickets. Schedule I.

(2) No article shall be or be deemed to be taken in pawn unless and until—

- (a) the pawner has signed the counterfoil of the pawn ticket ;
- (b) the pawnbroker has signed the foil of the pawn ticket and has given the foil to the pawner ; and,
- (c) the pawner has received and accepted the foil of the pawn ticket from the pawnbroker.

4 Section 8 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :— Amendment of section 8 of the principal Ordinance.

- (a) by renumbering it as Section 8 (1) ;
- (b) by the insertion of the words " , and the particulars specified in the said Schedule shall be printed in English, Sinhalese and Tamil on the back of the foil of every pawn ticket given to a pawner under Section 6 " immediately after the word " Ordinance " in the third line ; and
- (c) by deleting the words " if required " in line 10, and by inserting the words " preserving a copy thereof with the books and documents described in Schedule I " between the word " him " in line 11 and the word " and " in line 12.
- (d) by the addition of the following as Section 8 (2) :—

" (2) If, in respect of any loan on a pledge, a pawnbroker takes any profit or demands or takes any charge or sum whatever other than those specified in Schedule II to this Ordinance he shall be guilty of an offence against this Ordinance, and shall be liable on conviction to a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees."

5 Section 15 of the principal Ordinance is amended by the repeal of paragraph (6) and the substitution of the following therefor :— Amendment of section 15 of the principal Ordinance.

" (6) Enters in his book as sold a pledge which is not sold, or makes any other false entry.,".

Amendment of section 16 of the principal Ordinance.

6 Section 16 of the principal Ordinance is amended by the substitution for all the words from "The holder for the time being" to "indemnified for so doing" of the following :—

"(1) The pawner shall be entitled to redeem a pledge if he surrenders to the pawnbroker the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge and signs the foil in the presence of the pawnbroker or his agent or servant.

(2) A person other than the pawner shall be entitled to redeem a pledge if such person surrenders to the pawnbroker the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge duly endorsed with the signature of the pawner and if such person signs that foil in the presence of the pawnbroker or his agent or servant.

(3) Where by reason of the death or legal disability of the pawner, the holder of the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge (hereinafter in this section referred to as the "holder") claims to be entitled to redeem that pledge but is unable to surrender to the pawnbroker the foil of the pawn ticket duly endorsed with the signature of the pawner, the pawnbroker shall permit the pledge to be redeemed if such holder surrenders to him the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge together with a declaration in the form prescribed in Schedule IV duly made before a Justice of the Peace by such holder and by the person identifying him.

(4) Subject to the provisions of sub-sections (1), (2) and (3), the pawnbroker shall, on payment of the loan and profit, deliver the pledge to the pawner or holder as the case may be who produces the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge; and the pawnbroker is hereby indemnified in respect of such delivery of the pledge :".

Insertion of new section 16A in the principal Ordinance.

7 The following section shall be inserted immediately after section 16 of the principal Ordinance and shall have effect as section 16A of that Ordinance :—

Pawn tickets to be retained by pawnbroker after redemption or sale of pledges.

16A. (1) In a case where the foil of a pawn ticket has been surrendered to the pawnbroker for the purpose of redeeming a pledge, the pawnbroker shall retain in his possession the foil and counterfoil of that pawn ticket for a period of twelve months reckoned from the date of the redemption of that pledge.

(2) In a case where a pledge has been redeemed without the surrender of the foil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge, a pawnbroker shall retain in his possession for a period of twelve months reckoned from the date of the redemption of that pledge the counterfoil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge and the declaration delivered to him under section 19 for the purpose of such redemption.

(3) In a case where a pledge has been sold under the provisions of this Ordinance, the pawnbroker shall retain in his possession the counterfoil of the pawn ticket relating to that pledge for a period of twelve months reckoned from the date of sale.

Amendment of section 19 of the principal Ordinance.

8 Section 19 of the principal Ordinance is amended in sub-section (1) thereof as follows :—

(1) in line 2, by substituting for the words "the ticket" the words "the foil of the pawn ticket";

(2) in line 3, by substituting for the words "a pawn ticket" at the end of that sub-section the following :—

"the foil of the pawn ticket :

Provided that for the purpose of redeeming a pledge he shall sign the counterfoil of the pawn ticket and not the foil thereof as required by section 16."

Amendment of section 23 of the principal Ordinance.

9 Section 23 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended by the insertion of the following paragraph immediately after paragraph (8) thereof and before the words "he shall be deemed to be guilty of an offence" :—

"(9) does any act in contravention of the provisions of this Ordinance ;"

Amendment of section 26 of the principal Ordinance.

10 Section 26 of the principal Ordinance is amended by substituting the words "may after the first conviction and shall after the second" for the words "shall if he thinks fit" in line 4.

11 Section 29 of the principal Ordinance is hereby amended as follows :—

Amendment of section 29 of the principal Ordinance.

- (a) by the substitution of the words "Sub-Inspector and any Chief Headman" for the word "Inspector" in the second line ; and
- (b) by the insertion of the words " or Chief Headman " immediately after the word " police " in the sixth line.

An Ordinance to amend the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895.

Short title.

THIS Ordinance may be cited as the Births and Deaths Registration Amendment Ordinance, No. _____ of 1935.

Amendment of
section 52 (2)
of Ordinance
No. 1 of 1895.

2 Section 52 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, is hereby amended in sub-section (2) thereof by substituting for the words “ Justice of the Peace ”, the words “ Justice of the Peace, a Commissioner for Oaths, ”.

Objects and Reasons.

The object of this Bill is to amend section 52 (2) of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895, so as to enable declarations required by that Ordinance to be made within the Island before a Commissioner for Oaths. The omission of a reference to a Commissioner for Oaths in section 52 (2) is due to the fact that there were no Commissioners for Oaths in Ceylon when that section became law in 1907.

BE it enacted by the Governor of Ceylon, with the advice and consent of the State Council thereof, as follows :—

1 This Ordinance may be cited as the Municipal Councils Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1935. Short title.

2 Section 117 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, (hereinafter referred to as “ the principal Ordinance ”), is hereby amended— Amendment of section 117 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

(1) in sub-section (1), by the substitution for all the words from “ shall be entered every year ” to the end of the sub-section of the words “ shall be entered on or before the first day of December in each year and shall give public notice on or before the thirty-first day of December in each year that such book may be inspected at a place to be specified in the notice, and that written objections to any assessment entered in such book will be received at the Municipal Office not later than the thirty-first day of January next following. The notice required by this sub-section shall be published (a) in the Government Gazette, (b) in a local newspaper published in English, (c) in Sinhalese in a local newspaper published in Sinhalese and (d) in Tamil in a local newspaper published in Tamil.” ;

(2) in sub-section (3)—

(a) by the substitution for the words “ The Chairman shall cause a notice of assessment in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil ” of the words “ On or before the thirty-first day of December in each year the Chairman shall cause a notice of assessment for the year commencing on the first day of January next following ” ; and

(b) by the substitution for the words “ and the said notice ” of the words “ and the said notice shall be in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil and ”.

(3) in sub-section (4), by the substitution for the words “ within one month of the date of service of notice ” of the words “ not later than the thirty-first day of January next following ” ;

(4) by re-numbering sub-sections (5), (6), and (7) as sub-sections (6), (7), and (8) respectively ;

“ (5) The assessment of any house, building, land or tenement shall not be deemed to be invalid by reason only of the fact that the notice of assessment in respect of that house, building, land or tenement has not been served on or left at the premises of the occupier on or before the thirty-first day of December in any year, if the public notice required by sub-section (1) has been given on or before that date.” ; and

(6) in re-numbered sub-section (6), by the substitution for the words “ all objections so received ” of the words “ all objections received under this section ”.

(5) Any person aggrieved by the decision of the Chairman on any such assessment may institute an action objecting to such decision in the manner provided in section 124, and all the provisions of that section shall apply accordingly as though the action were instituted in respect of a decision of the Chairman under section 117.”

Objects and Reasons.

1. Section 117 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, provides—

- (a) that the annual assessment of immovable property for rates and taxes should be entered in an Assessment Book ;
- (b) that notice should be given of the fact that the Assessment Book has been prepared and is open to inspection by members of the public ; and
- (c) that a notice of assessment should be served on the occupier of every land or building assessed.

2. No dates are fixed by the Ordinance for the various steps required to be taken under section 117 and, in a case where a notice does not reach the owner until several days after service upon the occupier, or does not reach the owner at all, the owner may have either insufficient time in which to object to the assessment or no knowledge that an assessment has been made. It is considered desirable that dates should be fixed by law for the various steps which have to be taken each year by the Municipality and by the owner, so as to ensure a greater degree of certainty regarding the date on which an assessment becomes final.

3. The object of this Bill is to amend section 117 of the principal Ordinance by providing—

- (1) that the Assessment Book should be entered on or before the 1st December in each year, and that public notice in the Gazette and in one English, one Sinhalese, and one Tamil newspaper should be given on or before the 31st December that the book is open to inspection and that objections to any assessment entered in that Book should be made before the 31st January next following (Clause 2 (1)) ;
- (2) that the notice of assessment should be served on or before the 31st December, and that, irrespective of the date of service, time should be allowed for objections until the 31st January next following (Clause 2 (2) and (3)).

As it is proposed that public notice of not less than one month should be given of the final date for objections, provision is made in Clause 2 (5) that an assessment is not to be invalidated by reason only of the non-service of the notice, if the public notice required by Clause 2 (1) has been duly given.

4. The provisions of existing section 117 are applied to assessments made under section 124A of the principal Ordinance in the case of new buildings erected in the course of the year. The dates inserted in section 117 by the amendments introduced in this Bill are inapplicable to assessments made under section 124A. Clause 3 accordingly amends section 124A so as to preserve the existing practice in regard to special assessments made under that section.

- Short title and commencement. **1** This Ordinance may be cited as the Poisons, Opium, and Dangerous Drugs Amendment Ordinance, No. of 1935, and shall come into operation on a day to be appointed by the Governor by Proclamation published in the Gazette.
- Amendment of section 2 of Ordinance No. 17 of 1929. **2** Section 2 of the Poisons, Opium, and Dangerous Drugs Ordinance, 1929, (hereinafter referred to as “the principal Ordinance”), is hereby amended in sub-section (1) thereof, as follows :—
- (1) in the definition of “Medical practitioner” by the omission of all the words from “And until” to “pharmacist”; and
- (2) in the definition of “Regulation” by the omission of the words “by the Governor in Executive Council”.

- (a) specifying his allowance of opium, and the opium officer from whom it may be obtained
- (b) stating whether the allowance is intended to be used for smoking or eating, and
- (c) including also such special directions or restrictions as the Governor may have given or imposed by order made in that behalf.”

- (a) part with the possession of the certificate of registration issued to him or of any opium supplied to him, or
- (b) be party or privy to the use by any other person of such certificate or opium.”

Drugs substances articles or preparations the exportation
of which is totally prohibited.

1. Diacetylmorphine, and its salts.
2. Phenanthrene alkaloids of opium.

Objects and Reasons.

Although the amending and consolidating Ordinance No. 17 of 1929 relating to Poisons, Opium, and Dangerous Drugs was passed in September, 1929, and assented to by the Governor in the month following, the proclamation of it had to be postponed pending an investigation of the difficulties anticipated in the actual working of section 47, which provides that dangerous drugs should be imported into Ceylon only by the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services. The difficulties, on examination, turned out to be very real, and an amendment of the section was found to be necessary. Advantage has been taken of the opportunity thus provided, to improve the various definitions and to make other points in the Ordinance clearer, to introduce the alterations that have become necessary as a result of the recent changes in the Constitution, and also to bring the Ordinance into conformity with certain resolutions, which were in the meantime passed by the Health Committee of the League of Nations, and which the Government of Ceylon is bound, under the provisions of the Geneva Opium Convention of 1925, to observe.

2. Accordingly Clauses 2 to 9, 21, 22 and 24 of this Bill seek to effect verbal and other alterations in the respective sections they deal with, so as to make those sections, and the Ordinance as a whole, clearer and more precise. For the same purpose it is proposed in Clauses 10 to 13 to re-arrange the provisions of sections 37 to 40 in a more logical order, omitting such of them as are no longer necessary. Clauses 2 (2), 14, 20, and 26 are intended to effect the deletion of references to the old Executive Council, rendered necessary by the change in the Constitution.

3. As a number of new drugs have been marked out, since 1929, for special treatment under the International Opium Convention as dangerous drugs, and as the list is liable to alteration from time to time in the light of the investigations that are made by the League of Nations, the process of effecting amendments in the list has to be simplified. Clause 16 therefore seeks to substitute for the existing definition of dangerous drugs in section 46, a new definition to be read in conjunction with a new Part I of the Third Schedule, in which there are classified in groups the drugs which are totally prohibited or are permitted subject to control and regulation; and Clause 29 to give the necessary power to amend the schedule by regulations.

4. The provisions of sections 47 and 48 relating to the importation and exportation of dangerous drugs are similarly to be replaced, as proposed in Clauses 17 and 18, by new sections which take in by reference the appropriate groups in the schedule and introduce a system of permits by which the importation and exportation of dangerous drugs may be controlled. The trade in dangerous drugs within the Island is dealt with in Clauses 19 and 23 which make provision for regulations for the control of that trade. The necessary amendment of the regulations connected with section 47 will be effected by means of fresh regulations under the Ordinance as soon as it comes into operation.

5. Owing to the insufficiency of the powers of search for which provision is made in section 73 (3), further power similar to that given to Excise Officers by the Excise Amendment Ordinance, No. 3 of 1933, is now to be taken to use any reasonable degree of force or any reasonable device for stopping a suspected vessel boat or vehicle which is not brought to a halt in compliance with the usual signals or orders (Clause 27).

6. In order to ensure that the punishment awarded on a summary conviction under the Ordinance is in each case adequate, Clause 28 proposes to give Police Magistrates power to impose terms of imprisonment as well as fines, and Clause 29 to enable Police Courts and District Courts to inflict any of the penalties prescribed in the amended section 74, notwithstanding the limits placed on their ordinary jurisdiction and also to order the confiscation of any vessel boat or vehicle used for the conveyance of any article which is the subject of an offence.
