By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### A. E. HAVELOCK.

W HEREAS by section 124 of "The Municipal Councils' Ordinance, 1887," it is enacted that no by-law, or alteration, amendment, or cancelment of, or substitution for, any by-law, shall have effect until the same is confirmed by the Governor in Excutive Council, and that notice of such confirmation shall be given by Proclamation to be made in that behalf, and that such by-laws when so confirmed and published in the Government Gazette shall be as valid and effectual as if they had been in the said Ordinance enacted:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do hereby proclaim that the following by-law made by the Municipal Council of Galle, under the provisions of section 10 of "The Carriage Ordinance, 1873," has been confirmed by the said Governor in Executive Council, and shall have effect as from and after the First day of October, 1895:—

By-Law referred to.

The following shall be the rates and fares for jinrickshas licensed to ply for hire within the Municipality of Galle:—

For the first half hour or portion of half hour For every subsequent half hour or portion thereof 25 cents 10 cents

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir Arthur Elibank Havelock, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

#### A. E. HAVELOCK.

HEREAS by the 19th section of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," as amended by the 6th section of Ordinance No. 1 of 1892, it is enacted that when the following events have occurred, viz.:-

- (a) The period fixed under section 7 of "The Forest Ordinance, 1885," for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) made within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 of the said last-mentioned Ordinance have become vested in the Crown -

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas it is expedient to constitute the Crown land specified in the schedule hereto a reserved forest:

And whereas the period fixed for preferring claims has elapsed, and no claim has been preferred:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, do by this Our Proclamation declare the following Crown lands, namely, forest lots 6,866, 6,865 $\frac{1}{2}$ , 6,870, 6,875, 6,877, 6,878, 6,879, 6,880, 6,881, Z 639, B 640, I 640, I 640 $\frac{1}{2}$ , L 640, M 640, O 640, R 640, S 640 $\frac{1}{2}$ , Y 640, Z 640, D 641, and M 641 in preliminary plan 9,971, in extent 1,727 acres 1 rood 14 perches, called Ihakada Barawa, and lots 7,684 and E 526 in preliminary plan 9,018, in extent 23 acres 3 roods 22 perches, called Kosattemukalana, in all 1,751 acres 36 perches, more particularly described in the schedule hereto, to be a reserved forest as from and after the 1st day of September, 1895, reserving, nevertheless, to the public the right of way along the following footpaths within the said forest, and described in preliminary plan 9,971:-

- (I) A 3-ft. footpath from Tunnana to Attigala passing east and west through the northern portion of the forest.
- (2) A 3-ft. footpath from Mawatagama to Panaluwa east and west, through the southern portion of the forest, and passing through the garden called Edirigewatta.
- (3) A 3-ft. footpath from north of title plan 68,173 to the south of lot X 639.
- (4) A 3-ft. footpath from south of lot E 640 to the footpath No. 1 crossing at Goda-ella.
- (5) Three-feet reservations for outlet paths marked A, B, C, D, E, and F, leading to the private lands surrounded by the forest.

Reserving also to the villagers of Tunnana and Hanwella the right of fishing in the Pusella-oya with rods and hand nets only.

HEREAS by the 6th section of "The Medical Wants Ordinance, 1880," it is enacted that the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, may, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, by Proclamation in the Gazette, group together estates into districts, and may in the same and in like manner from time to time amend the grouping of any district or districts, or abolish any district, or create a new district or new districts:

And whereas by a Proclamation dated the 28th day of January, 1895, the several estates mentioned therein were grouped together into districts for the purposes of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to abolish the several districts in the said Proclamation mentioned, and to create new districts in lieu thereof:

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation abolish the several districts set forth in the said Proclamation of the 28th January, 1895, as from and after the Twenty-third day of August, 1895; and do further by these presents as from and after the date last afore-written group together, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, the estates appearing in the schedule hereto into the districts therein set forth.

THE following draft rules proposed to be framed under section 5 of the Draft Ordinance to provide for the protection of person and property from the risks incidental to the supply and of electricity for lighting and other purposes, published in the Gazette of April 11, 1895, are published for general information :-

1. In these rules, unless the context otherwise requires—

(1) Expressions used in the rules have the same meaning as in the Ordinance.

(2) "Electric supply line" means a wire or wires, conductor, or other means used for the purpose of conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity for light or power, with any casing, coating, compering, tube, pipe, or insulator enclosing, surrounding, or supporting the same or any part thereof, or any apparatus connected therewith for the purpose of conveying, transmitting, or distributing electricity or electric currents for light or power.

(3) "Main" means a conductor used to convey electricity from the source of supply to the point

or points where it is distributed for use.

(4) "Lead" means a conductor used to distribute electricity from the mains to the various appliances in which it is to be used.

(5) "Switch" means any appliance for permitting, arresting, or changing the flow of electricity in conductors.

(6) "Commutator" means any appliance for regulating or diverting the flow, or for altering the

direction of electricity in conductors.

(7) "Cut-out" means any appliance for confining the flow of electricity to conductors capable of

safely carrying it when its amount rises accidentally above the normal.

(8) "Transformer" means any appliance by means of which electricity of high potential is converted to electricity of lower potential, or vice versâ.

Rules for the protection of Person and Property from injury by reason of contact with, or the proximity of, appliances or apparatus used in the generation or supply of Electricity.

2. Whenever notice has been given under section 4 of an intention of any person to undertake the business of supplying electricity or to use electricity for a public purpose or in a public place, or such other place as is referred to in clause (b) of that section, the Police Magistrate or Superintendent of Police receiving such notice shall forthwith report the circumstance to the Government, who may thereupon authorize an officer, either by name or in virtue of his office, to enter, inspect, and examine any place, carriage, or vessel in which the officer has reason to believe any appliances or apparatus used in the generation or supply of electricity are, and any building or place to and in which electricity is to be supplied and used.

3. The Government shall, if necessary, instruct the Postmaster-General as to the roads or public places in which overhead electric supply lines are not to be allowed, and the persons undertaking the supply of electricity or using the same shall attend to any orders of these officers in this

respect.

4. The person or persons who intend to undertake the business of supplying electricity, or intend to use the same for the purpose or in a place indicated in rule 2, shall provide all means for testing the appliances or apparatus used in the generation or the supply and use of electricity.

5. The supply of electricity delivered to the consumer's terminals shall be at low pressure, that is, at or under 300 volts for continuous currents, or at or under the equivalent of 150 volts for

alternating currents.
6. The variation of pressure at any consumer's terminals shall not exceed at any time 4 per

cent from the declared constant pressure.
7. Conductors must have a sectional area and conductivity so proportioned to the work they have to do that their temperature shall not be raised by the maximum working current to greater extent than 30° Fahrenheit.

8. The conductors or their casings must be placed in sight as far as possible, and they must always be as accessible as circumstances will permit.

9. Within buildings the conductors must all be insulated, and this rule applies equally to all

conductors and parts of fittings which may have to be handled.

10. Whatever insulating material is employed, it must not soften until a temperature of 170°

Fahrenheit has been reached, and in all cases the material must be damp-proof.

11 When leads pass through roofs, floors, walls, or partitions, and where they cross or are liable to touch metallic substances, such as bell-wires, iron girders, or pipes, they must be thoroughly protected by suitable additional covering; and where they are liable to abrasion from any cause or from the depredations of rats or mice, they must be encased in some suitable hard material.

12. In the case of portable fittings with which flexible leads are used, special precautions

must be taken.

13. Conductors must be kept as far apart as circumstances will permit, the spacing between them being governed by their potential difference.

14. When conductors are carried in very inflammable structures, precautions must be taken

to insulate them therefrom.

- 15. Conductors which are protected on the outside by lead or metallic armour of any kind require the greatest care in fixing on account of the large conducting surface which would become connected to the core in the event of metallic contact between them.
- 16. In cases where conductors pass into a building, from one building to another, or from one room to another, precautions must be taken to prevent the possibility of fire or water passing along the course of the conductors.
- 17. All joints must be mechanically and electrically perfect to prevent heat being generated at these points. When soldering fluids are used in making joints, the latter must be carefully

washed and dried before insulation is applied.

- 18. Under all circumstances complete metallic circuits must be employed. Gas and water pipes must never form part of the circuit, as their joints are rarely electrically good, and therefore • become a source of danger.
  - 19. Overhead conductors, whether passing over or attached to buildings, must be insulated at their points of support. Precautions must be taken to obviate all risk of short circuiting where they are likely to touch a building or other overhead conductors and wires, either by their own falling or being fallen upon by other conductors.

20. In the case of overhead wires, every main conductor must have a lightning protector at

each point where it enters or branches into a building.

21. Metal fastenings for fixing conductors must be avoided.

The insulation of a system of distribution must be such that the greatest leakage from any conductor to earth (and in case of parallel working, from one conductor to the other, when all branches are switched on, but the lamps, motors, &c., removed) does not exceed one five-thousandth part of the total current intended for the supply of the said lamps, motors, &c., the test being made at the usual working pressure.

23. It is desirable as a means for the prevention of accidents for the positive lead to be

coloured differently to the negative, or made otherwise distinguishable.

24. Every switch or commutator must be of such construction as to comply with the following condition, namely, that, when the handle is moved or turned to, and from the positions of "on" and "off" it is impossible for it to remain in any intermediate position or to permit of a permanent

The handle of every switch must be completely insulated from the circuit.

26. The main switches of a building must be placed as near as possible to the point of entrance of the conductors, or to the generators of the current if they are within the building itself. Switches must be provided on both leads.

Switch boards must bear clear instructions for their use by the inexperienced. .

Switches, commutators, resistances, bare connections, lamps, &c., must be mounted on incombustible bases. Cut-outs mounted on bases of wood rendered uninflammable are admissible. Vulcanite bases are undesirable in damp situations. The cracking of porcelain and earthenware fittings is a source of danger which can be avoided by precautions in fixing.

29. All circuits must be protected with cut-outs; and all leads from the mains or small

conductors from larger ones must be fitted with cut-outs of their branching points.

30. Where fusible cut-outs are used, the section must so be situated within its frame that the fused metal cannot fall where it may cause a "short circuit" or an ignition.

31. For all main conductors a cut-out must be provided for both the "flow" and "return," and the two fusible sections must not be in the same compartment.

32. The flexible leads of portable fittings must in all cases be protected by cut-outs at their fixed points of connection.

33. Arc lamps must always be guarded by lanterns or netted globes, so as to prevent danger from ascending sparks and from falling glass and incandescent pieces of carbon.

34. All parts of the lamps and lanterns which are liable to be handled (except by the persons employed to trim them) must be insulated.

35. The armatures and field magnet coils of dynamo-machines must be thoroughly insulated. Dynamo-machines must always be fixed in dry places; and they must not be exposed to dust flyings or other industrial waste products carried in suspension in the air. They must not be permitted in the working rooms of mills, where the liability to such dangers exists, or where any inflammable manufactures are carried on, or inflammable materials are stored.

36. When transformers are used to transform either continuous or alternating currents of high pressure, that is, over 300 volts for the former and the equivalent of 150 volts for the latter, they, together with their switches and cut-outs, must be placed in a fire and moisture-proof structure, preferably outside the building for which they are required. No part of such apparatus must be accessible except to the person in charge of its maintenance.

37. Motors must be subject to the same conditions; but when it is necessary to use them in positions such as those referred to, they must be securely cased in, such cases having a non-combus-

tible lining.

Both primary and secondary batteries must be placed and used under the same precautions as prescribed for dynamo-machines; and the room in which they are placed must be well ventilated. The batteries themselves must be well insulated.

39. Transformers must be so constructed that under no circumstances whatever should a

contact between the primary and secondary coils occasion high pressure within a building.

40. If it should happen that a connection exist between a consumer's wires and the earth, the electric inspector of the person or persons who supply the consumer with electricity, may, after giving one hour's notice of his intention to do so, enter upon the consumer's premises, disconnect such wires from the mains if the insulation resistance of each is less than 5,000 ohms, and thereby

discontinue the supply of electricity until the defect is remedied by the consumer.

41. All conduits, pipes, casings, and street boxes used as receptacles for electric lines shall be of durable material and of ample strength to prevent damage from heavy traffic. They shall be so constructed as to prevent the influx of gas or water either from the adjacent soil or by means of any pipes, and shall be ventilated. The covers of street boxes which contain high pressure conductors shall be connected to the ground by strips of metal laid underneath the roadway or pavement.

42. Transformers which, under normal conditions of load, heat about 150 degrees Fahrenheit must not be permitted to remain in use.

43. No repairs nor alterations must be made when the current is "on."

44. Full particulars of the proposed installation must be furnished when required to the officer authorized by the local Government under rule 2.

These particulars must include a statement of the maximum current to be sent by means of the various conductors, the pressure of the current, and the nature of the current (whether direct or alternating) that is to be employed. Samples of the conductors to be used must be furnished that their conductivity and the quality of their insulation may be ascertained. Specimens of the cut-outs, protectors, and switches may be required if considered necessary by such officer.

Reles for preventing Telegraph and Telephone lines from being injuriously affected by any appliances or apparatus used in the generation or supply of Electricity.

45. Any person supplying or using electricity shall not lay down any electric supply line, or do any other work for the supply or use of electricity, whereby any telegraph or telephone line established by, or by license from, the Governor in Council is or may be injuriously affected. Before any such electric supply line is laid down, or work is done within ten yards of any part of such telegraph or telephone line (other than repairs or the laying of connections with the mains where the direction of the electric supply lines so laid down crosses such telegraph or telephone line at right angles at the point of shortest distance and continues the same for a distance of six feet on each side of such point), the person or his agent shall, not more than twenty-eight nor less than fourteen clear days before commencing such work, give written notice to the Telegraph authority, specifying the course and nature of the work, including the gauge of any electric supply lines, and the person and his agent shall conform with such reasonable requirements, either general or special, as may from time to time be made by the Telegraph authority for the purpose of preventing any telegraph or telephone lines established by, or by license from, the Governor in Council from being injuriously affected by the said work.

46. Any difference which arises between the Telegraph authority and the person supplying or using electricity or his agent with respect to any requirements so made, shall be referred to the

Government for decision, and the orders of the Government shall be final.

Only one side or the middle of any street must be occupied by aërial electric supply lines. The minimum headway of aerial lines in public places must be 18 ft. and at road-crossings **48.** 30 feet.

49. A card of instructions is to be hung in a conspicuous place in electric supply stations, by which the means of resuscitation in cases of injury by electric shock may be indicated. All reasonable and usual precautions against such injury are to be taken in the case of work people who are liable to handle generating machines and conductors and the fittings belonging to them.

50. For the purposes of the foregoing rules, a telegraph or telephone line shall be deemed to be injuriously affected by a work if communication by means of such line is, whether through induction or otherwise, in any manner affected by such work, or by any use made of such work.

51. Electric supply lines must throughout their entire lengths and in all localities be so constructed as to avoid contact with telegraph and telephone lines, and if carried overhead, must be so placed as to enable such lines at any future time to be carried in any street on posts of 24 feet

in height without contact with or interference from such electric supply lines.

52. If a person or persons supplying electricity make default in complying with any of the preceding regulations, he or they shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 100 for every such default, and to a daily penalty not exceeding Rs. 100. The imposition of any penalty under this regulation shall not affect the liability of the undertakers to make compensation in respect of any damage or injury which may be caused by reason of such default.

#### Report on the Working of the Public Service Mutual Guarantee Association for the Year 1894-95.

N June 30, 1895, there were on the books of the Association 398 Members, as against 360 on June 30, 1894, showing an increase of Membership of 38.

2. The total amount of contributions received from the Members of the Association during

the year was Rs. 11,399.79, as against Rs. 9,212.18 in the preceding year.

3. During the year under review the Association was called upon to make good a sum of Rs. 2,647.73 in respect of defalcations, by two Associates employed in the Railway and Medical Department. This was partly met by the forfeiture of their contributions, which amounted to Rs. 214:16, the net loss to the Association being reduced to Rs. 2,433:57.

4. A sum of Rs. 1,399-99 in the aggregate has been refunded to Associates on withdrawal

from the Association.

5. The accounts of the Association for the period under review are attached.

IIS EXCELLENCY THE GOVERNOR has been pleased to direct that the following copy of an Order of the Queen in Council making rules under section 8, sub-section 3, of The Mail Ships Act, 1891," and which is to be cited as "The Mail Ships (Rules) Order in Council, 1895," be published for general information.

At the Court at Windsor, the 11th day of May, 1895.

#### PRESENT:

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty.

Lord President. Lord Chamberlain. Lord Kensington. Speaker of the House of Commons. Mr. Arnold Morley.

Whereas section 8 (3) of "The Mail Ships Act, 1891," provides that it shall be lawful for Her Majesty in Council to make rules for carrying into effect, as respects British Possessions, the provisions of that Act with respect to the security given by mail ships, and in particular with respect to the commencement of a legal proceeding by service of a writ or process in the Possession, and to the notice to be given to arresting authorities in the Possession, and the evidence to be receivable by such authorities of the security having been given or withdrawn, and the application of the security in discharge of any damages, fine, debt, claim, sum, or forfeiture, where the same are or is recovered or payable either in the British Possession, or under proceedings pending concurrently in that British Possession and in any other British Possession or the United Kingdom:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:—

#### Notices of Exemption.

I. Any rules of the High Court of Justice in England made under the provisions of "The Mail Ships Act, 1891" (hereinafter referred to as "the Act"), shall be transmitted by a Secretary of State to the Government of every Possession to which the Act is applied for the purpose of a Convention, and shall be published by such Government in the Gazette of the Possession, and also in such local official Gazettes published in the Possession as the Government of the Possession may prescribe.

2. A copy of every notice and list published by the Board of Trade under the Act, or under any rules of Court made under the Act, shall be transmitted by a Secretary of State to the Government

of every Possession to which the Act is applied for the purpose of a particular Convention.

3. A copy of every such notice and list, signed by a Secretary to the Government of the Possession, or other prescribed officer, shall be published in the official Gazette of the Possession, and a copy of such Gazette Notification shall be kept publicly exhibited in the Court-room of every Colonial Court of Admiralty in the Possession, and a copy of the said Gazette containing any such Notification shall be receivable in evidence by every arresting authority in the Possession.

4. If, notwithstanding its exemption, an exempted mail ship is arrested in the Possession, the Government of the Possession, on being informed by the owner of such arrest and of the arresting authority, and on being satisfied that the ship is an exempted mail ship, shall forthwith send a special notice to the arresting authority, informing him that the ship is an exempted mail ship, and as such

entitled to release.

#### Actions Against Exempted Ships.

5. An action may be commenced against the owners of an exempted mail ship in the like cases, in the same manner, and subject to the same rules as an Admiralty action in rem, and in any Colonial Court of Admiralty in the Possession in which such an action might have been brought if the ship were not an exempted mail ship.

Orders, by Courts in British Possessions, for Application of the Security.

6. Any order of a Court in a British Possession directing any security to be applied shall recite the name of the Court and of the action or proceeding, the cause of action, and the judgment debt, and shall comprise a certificate by the Judge of the Court that the ship in respect of which the judgment is given is an exempted mail ship, and might but for such exemption have been arrested and sold in execution thereof, and that the judgment debt is still unsatisfied, and is payable out of the security lodged in respect of the ship in the High Court of Justice in England.

7. The order may require payment to be made either in London to a named agent of the execution-creditor, or in the Possession to some named officer of the Court from which the order

issues.

8. Every such order shall be sealed with the seal of the Court, and shall be drawn up in duplicate, addressed to the Admiralty Registrar, Royal Courts of Justice, London, and shall be transmitted under cover to the prescribed officer of the Government of the Possession.

9. The said duplicate orders when received by the prescribed officer shall be countersigned by him, and shall be forthwith transmitted to a Secretary of State, who shall cause one of such orders to be delivered to the Admiralty Registrar, and the Admiralty Registrar shall, subject to any

direction of the High Court, make an order upon the Paymaster-General for payment of the required

sum out of the security in accordance with these rules.

10. Unless the High Court shall otherwise order, and subject to existing rights of priority of liens, orders for the application of any security shall be paid in the order in which they are received by the Admiralty Registrar; but where two or more orders are received at the same time, they shall be paid in the order of their respective dates.

11 Where the order requires payment to a named agent of the execution-creditor in London, the money shall be payable at the rates of exchange current on the day on which the order is received by the Secretary of State.

12. If the order requires payment to be made to a named officer of the Court from which the order issues, such an amount shall be paid out by the Paymaster-General to a person nominated by the Secretary of State, as will at the rates of exchange current on the day on which the order is received by the Secretary of State be necessary to purchase a draft for the amount of the order payable at sight in the Possession, and such draft shall be in favour of the said named officer of the

said Court.

13. Where any action or proceeding against the owners of an exempted mail ship is pending in a Court in a British Possession, involving a claim against the security lodged in the High Court in England, the Court in a British Possession shall transmit to the Admiralty Registrar notice of the pendency of such action or proceeding, stating the nature and amount of the claim and the proceedings taken in regard thereto; and in case of the subsequent discontinuance or other conclusion of such action or proceeding, whereby the security ceases to be affected, the Court shall transmit notice of such discontinuance or conclusion. Every such notice shall be sealed, drawn up, addressed, and transmitted to the Admiralty Registrar in like manner as an order for the application of the security.

#### Miscellaneous Provisions.

14. In every British Possession to which these rules apply, the Governor in Council may, by order, prescribe any matter directed by these rules to be prescribed, or necessary for carrying them into effect.

15. In the application of these rules to British India, the following provisions shall have

effect :-

(a) The Presidencies of Madras and Bombay, the lower Provinces of Bengal, and the Province

of Burmah shall be deemed to be separate British Possessions.

The expression "Government of the Possession" and "Governor in Council" respectively shall mean the Lieutenant-Governor of Bengal and the Chief Commissioner of Burmah, with respect to the territories administered by them respectively.

(c) All orders made in pursuance of rule 14 with respect to any part of British India shall be made with the previous sanction of the Governor-General in Council.

16. In the application of these rules to any British Possession in which there is a Vice-Admiralty Court, and no Colonial Court of Admiralty, these rules shall be read as if "Vice-Admiralty Court" were Colonial Court of Admiralty.

17. In these rules "judgment debt" means any damages, fine, debt, claim, sum, or forfeiture found by any Court to be payable by the owner of a ship, and "execution-creditor" means the person entitled to a judgment debt. Other expressions have the same meaning as in the Act.

18. This Order may be cited as "The Mail Ships (Rules) Order in Council, 1895."

And the Most Honourable the Marquess of Ripon, K.G., the Right Honourable the Earl of Kimberley, K.G., and the Right Honourable H. H. Fowler, three of Her Majesty's Principal Secretaries of State, are to give the necessary directions herein, as to them may respectively appertain.
