THE text of an Agreement between His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom and the Turkish Government respecting Trade and Payments (with Protocol and Protocol of Signature) which was signed at Angora on June 4, 1935, is set out hereunder for general information.

Text.

AGREEMENT BETWEEN HIS MAJESTY'S GOVERNMENT IN THE UNITED KINGDOM AND THE TURKISH GOVERNMENT RESPECTING TRADE AND PAYMENTS, WITH PROTOCOL AND PROTOCOL OF SIGNATURE.

Angora, June 4, 1935.

The Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Turkey, desiring to facilitate the commercial relations between the two countries and having regard to the exceptional economic conditions which have made it necessary for Turkey to apply to all other countries the principle of the balance of payments, have agreed as follows :—

ARTICLE I.

(1) The United Kingdom goods enumerated in the First Schedule to this Agreement will be permitted to be imported into Turkey without any restriction as to quantity, and the United Kingdom goods enumerated in the Second Schedule to this Agreement will be permitted to be imported into Turkey up to the quantities specified in the Schedule for each article.

(2) United Kingdom goods other than those specified in the preceding paragraph will enjoy the benefit of the general quota régime in force in Turkey.

(3) In addition—

(a) All United Kingdom goods landed on Turkish territory before the 15th May, 1935, and not cleared through the Turkish Customs at that date, and

(b) all United Kingdom goods, other than goods prohibited to be imported under the general quota régime in force, landed on Turkish territory between the 15th May, 1935, and the date of the coming into force of this Agreement, and not cleared through the Turkish Customs at the latter date,

owing to insufficiency or absence of quotas will be permitted to be imported into Turkey, when this Agreement comes into force, without any restriction as to quantity and independently of the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article.

With regard to (a) and (b) above, goods of the kinds enumerated in the List "V" annexed to the Turkish Decree No. 2/2004 of the 17th February, 1935, will only be permitted to be imported into Turkey under permits issued by the Turkish Government Departments concerned.

ARTICLE 2.

The Government of the United Kingdom undertake that, in the event of their deciding to regulate the quantity of the imports into the United Kingdom of any agricultural products of Turkey, they will not make allocations between countries of total permitted imports without first giving the Turkish Government an opportunity of discussing the matter with a view to the allocation to Turkey of an equitable share of the permitted foreign imports.

ARTICLE 3.

United Kingdom goods purchased by the Turkish Government or by the Departmental and Municipal Authorities in Turkey will be permitted to be imported into Turkey without any restriction as to quantity, provided that the importation of goods of the kind in question is not prohibited under the general quota régime in force, and provided that any necessary prior permit from the Turkish Government Department concerned is obtained.

ARTICLE 4.

(1) The Turkish goods enumerated in the Third Schedule to this Agreement shall not on importation into the United Kingdom from whatever place arriving be subjected to duties or charges other or higher than those specified in that Schedule.

(2) The Turkish Government will consider sympathetically any proposal of the Government of the United Kingdom for replacing in whole or in part by specific duties any of the *ad valorem* duties or by an *ad valorem* duty the specific duty set out in the said Schedule.

ARTICLE 5.

(1) All United Kingdom goods exported to Turkey after the coming into force of the present Agreement must, in order to be permitted to enter Turkey, be accompanied by a certificate of origin in duplicate, conforming to the specimen annexed to this Agreement, issued by a Chamber of Commerce or other competent authority in the United Kingdom and visaed by a Turkish Consul.

(2) The certificate of origin will indicate the f.o.b. value of the goods in the United Kingdom.

(3) One copy of the certificate of origin will be stamped by the Turkish Customs and sent to the Central Bank of Turkey, which will make payment to persons in the United Kingdom to whom the payments for the goods are due in accordance with the provisions of Articles 6 and 7 of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 6.

(1) The undermentioned sums due from persons in Turkey to persons in the United Kingdom shall be deposited in Turkish pounds on the due date in a special account at the Central Bank of Turkey:—

(a) the balance remaining to be paid under the exchange of Notes of the 1st April, 1935, between His Majesty's Ambassador at Angora and the Minister for Foreign Affairs of the Republic of Turkey, for United Kingdom goods of the kinds enumerated in List "A" annexed to Turkish Decree No. 148 and exported from the United Kingdom before the 15th February, 1935;

(b) sums due in respect of United Kingdom goods imported into Turkey under the provisions of paragraph (3) of Article 1 of this Agreement; and

(c) sums due in respect of United Kingdom goods exported to Turkey after the coming into force of this Agreement.

(2) The sums in Turkish pounds thus deposited will remain blocked in favour of persons in the United Kingdom entitled thereto until such time as transfer to such persons is effected through the sub-Account A referred to in Article 7. Any difference of exchange between the day of deposit and the day of transfer will, except in the case of payments in respect of the goods referred to in sub-heading (a) of paragraph (1) of this Article, be credited or debited to the debtor in Turkey, who will thus pay the full sterling amount due.

ARTICLE 7.

(1) All sums due from persons in the United Kingdom to persons in Turkey in respect of Turkish goods imported into the United Kingdom shall be payable in sterling on the due date to a bank in the United Kingdom designated by the Central Bank of Turkey, and shall thereupon be credited to a special non-interest bearing account (hereinafter referred to as the "Sterling Account") to be opened by the Central Bank of Turkey at the said bank. The Turkish Government will do their best to secure that any such sums which, notwithstanding the provisions of this paragraph, are paid direct to persons in Turkey shall also be credited to the Sterling Account, it being understood that the Turkish Government will not be liable in this connection for any loss arising out of difference of exchange between the date of payment of any sum and the date it is credited to the Sterling Account.

(2) Of the sums received into the Sterling Account, 70 per cent. will be transferred to a sub-Account A and the remaining 30 per cent. to a sub-Account B.

(3) The sums referred to in Article 6 of this Agreement shall be transferred in sterling to the persons in the United Kingdom entitled thereto in the chronological order of their deposit, and within the limits of the sums available in sub-Account A.

(4) The sums transferred to sub-Account B shall be at the free disposal of the Central Bank of Turkey.

ARTICLE 8.

(1) The Turkish Government will arrange that the persons in Turkey referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 7 of this Agreement shall notify their respective debtors in the United Kingdom that the debts for which they are liable will be deemed to have been satisfied by payment in accordance with that paragraph.

(2) The United Kingdom Government will take steps to bring the above procedure to the knowledge of the persons concerned in the United Kingdom and will use their influence to promote the general adoption of the procedure.

ARTICLE 9.

The Central Bank of Turkey will, at the end of each month, supply to the bank in the United Kingdom selected by the Central Bank of Turkey for the purposes of Article 7 of this Agreement full particulars of the amounts deposited in the Central Bank in accordance with Article 6 of this Agreement and of the amounts still awaiting transfer to persons in the United Kingdom. The said bank in the United Kingdom will be authorised to communicate these particulars and also the details of sub-Account A to the United Kingdom Government.

ARTICLE 10.

Any sums standing to the credit of sub-Account A or sub-Account B on the termination of this Agreement will be utilised as provided in paragraphs (3) and (4) of Article 7 of this Agreement.

ARTICLE 11.

(1) Subject to the provisions of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article, the Turkish goods enumerated in the Fourth Schedule to this Agreement and any United Kingdom goods will be permitted to be the subject of private compensation transactions between persons in Turkey and persons in the United Kingdom.

(2) In respect of each transaction under paragraph (1) of this Article, the f.o.b. value of the United Kingdom goods imported into Turkey shall not exceed 70 per cent. of the f.o.b. value of the Turkish goods imported into the United Kingdom, the balance of 30 per cent. being payable by the persons in the United Kingdom concerned into the sub-Account B referred to in Article 7 of this Agreement.

(3) Such private compensation transactions will be subject to any quantitative restrictions on imports which are or may be imposed in conformity with the provisions of Articles 1 and 2 of this Agreement, and also subject to the laws and regulations in the United Kingdom and Turkey affecting the goods concerned.

ARTICLE 12.

(1) The Treaty of Commerce and Navigation, signed at Angora, on the 1st March, 1930,⁽¹⁾ shall be amended by the

deletion of Article 16, and by the substitution of the following for the first two paragraphs of Article 39 thereof:—

“ Article 39.

“ The present Treaty shall be ratified and the ratifications shall be exchanged at Angora as soon as possible. It shall come into force immediately on the exchange of ratifications, and shall remain in force until terminated by either High Contracting Party by a two months' notice given through the diplomatic channel, provided that no such notice shall take effect while the Agreement signed at Angora on the 4th day of June, 1935, relating to trade and payments, is still in operation.”

(2) Subject to the two amendments mentioned in the preceding paragraph of this Article, the said Treaty will remain in force until terminated by a fresh notice given in accordance with the amended text of Article 39 thereof.

ARTICLE 13.

(1) It is understood that in this Agreement the term “ foreign imports ” means imports from countries not being territories under the sovereignty of His Majesty the King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, or under His Majesty's suzerainty, protection or mandate.

(2) For the purposes of the present Agreement—

- (a) “ persons ” means individuals, firms and corporations (including State organisations and institutions).
 (b) “ Turkish goods ” means goods produced or manufactured in Turkey.
 (c) “ United Kingdom goods ” means goods produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom.

ARTICLE 14.

The present Agreement shall be ratified and shall enter into force immediately on the exchange of ratifications. It shall remain in force for nine months after the date of its coming into force and, unless two months before the expiry of the said period of nine months notice of termination shall have been given by one of the Contracting Governments to the other, the Agreement shall remain in force until the expiry of two months from the date on which a notice of termination is given.

PROTOCOL.

At the moment of signing the Agreement of this day's date between the Government of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland and the Government of the Republic of Turkey relating to trade and payments, the undersigned, being duly authorised to that effect, declare that they have agreed on the provisions set out in this Protocol, which shall form an integral part of the above-mentioned Agreement.

Ad Article 6.

(a) As regards United Kingdom goods imported into Turkey up to the date of the coming into force of the Agreement (except the goods referred to in sub-heading (a) of paragraph (1) of Article 6 of the Agreement), payments in respect of them falling due before that date will benefit by the régime in force prior to the signature of the Agreement.

(b) As regards United Kingdom goods exported to Turkey before the coming into force of the Agreement (except the goods referred to in paragraph (3) of Article 1 of the Agreement), payments falling due after the coming into force of the Agreement will benefit by the aforesaid régime up to a total amount of fifty thousand pounds sterling. The procedure laid down in paragraph (3) of Article 7 of the Agreement will apply to payments in excess of fifty thousand pounds sterling.

(iii.) the maintenance of all cisterns, tanks, and other receptacles for water in good repair, keeping them at all times so closed or covered as to make them mosquito-proof and emptying them at least once every week;

(iv.) in the event of there being on the land any artificial pond so constructed as to be capable of being emptied, emptying it at least once every week;

(v.) the maintenance of all water-courses, streams, canals, or channels passing through the land, in a condition capable of preventing the formation of pools along their course;

(vi.) the draining of any casual collection of water in any court-yard, garden, or other part of the land; and

(vii.) the removal of scrub or undergrowth and of all vegetation, other than that grown for the purposes of food or of ornament, from all that part of the land which is within a radius of fifty yards of any building or structure used as a human dwelling.

4. *Right of Entry for Purposes of Inspection.*—It shall be lawful for the proper authority, or any officer or officers authorized by him thereto in writing, to enter any land between the hours of sunrise and sunset and to inspect any part of it, for the purpose of ascertaining—

(i.) whether the requirements of regulation 3 have been complied with by the occupier thereof; or

(ii.) what measures, if any, are necessary for destroying mosquitoes and preventing the further breeding of mosquitoes therein.

5. *Special Anti-Malarial Measures.*—(1) It shall be lawful for the proper authority, after such inspection as he may deem necessary by notice in writing to direct the occupier of any land to take or adopt with respect to that land, within such time as may be specified in the notice, any one or more of the following precautions or measures:—

(i.) the repair of all gutters, downpipes, and drains;

(ii.) the construction or reconstruction of any cistern, tank, or artificial pond required by the occupier, in such manner as may make it capable of being emptied periodically;

(iii.) the temporary draining and the clearing of any such cistern, tank, or pond, and the closing thereof when it is no longer required by the occupier;

(iv.) the filling up or the draining of any disused well, cesspit, pond, or other collection of water;

(v.) the filling up of natural pits and hollows and low-lying parts of the land;

(vi.) the filling up, or the draining, or the treatment with larvicide, of swamps and water-logged parts of the land.

(2) Service of any such notice may be effected upon an occupier either personally or by leaving the notice with some adult person living with the occupier or by posting up the notice on some conspicuous part of the land.

(3) It shall be the duty of every person so served with a notice, to comply with the directions set out within the time specified therein.

6. *Arrangements during Temporary Absence of Occupier.*—It shall be the duty of the occupier of every land to make arrangements for due compliance with the requirements of regulation 3 or with the directions set out in any notice served on him under regulation 5, during any period when he is temporarily absent from the land; and no plea of temporary absence shall be accepted as a lawful excuse for any neglect, failure, or default with which he may be charged.

7. *Owner's Liability during Interval between Tenancies.*—The owner, lessee, or other person by whatever right entitled to the rent or produce of any land which is habitually let or sub-let to other persons, shall be held liable for any neglect or failure to comply with the requirements of regulation 3 during the period intervening between the termination of one tenancy and the commencement of the next tenancy.

8. *Liability of Co-owners in Joint Occupation.*—Where any land is in the joint occupation of two or more co-owners, each of the co-owners shall be severally liable for any neglect or failure to comply with the requirements of regulation 3 or with the directions set out in any notice duly served under regulation 5 on any one of them.

9. *Right of Entry for carrying out Works.*—It shall be lawful for the proper authority, or any officer or servant authorized thereto by him in writing, to enter any land between the hours of sunrise and sunset for the purpose

REGULATIONS.

1. *Short Title.*—These regulations may be cited as the Malaria (Epidemic) Regulations, 1935.

2. *Interpretation.*—In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

“land” includes any house, building, or structure, and the bed of any pond, tank, lake, water-course, channel, canal, or stream, situated thereon;

“occupier” means the person in occupation of any land or having the charge, management, or control thereof, whether on his own account or as agent of another, but does not include a lodger;

“proper authority” means the Director of Medical and Sanitary Services acting through the Provincial Surgeon of a province or the Medical Officer of Health of a district for the Island as a whole; or in any area within the administrative limits of a Municipal Council, Urban District Council, Local Board, or Sanitary Board the Chairman of that Council or Board, and in any area where there is no such Council or Board, the Government Agent or Assistant Government Agent within whose province or district that area is situated.

3. *Ordinary Anti-Malarial Measures.*—It shall be the duty of the occupier of any land to take or adopt each of the following measures for preventing the breeding of mosquitoes upon that land:—

(i.) the removal and destruction or other effective disposal of all open tins, bottles, vases, boxes, coconut shells, split coconuts, and other articles capable of holding accumulations of stagnant water;

of carrying out on any part thereof, at the expense of the proper authority, such works or measures as may be necessary for destroying mosquitoes and for preventing the further breeding of mosquitoes upon that land.

10. *Resistance to Officers or Servants.*—No person shall knowingly or wilfully resist or obstruct the proper authority or any authorized officer or servant of the proper authority in the lawful exercise of his duty under any of these regulations.

BY-LAWS.

The by-laws published by Notification in the *Gazette* of April 16, 1930, are hereby amended as follows:—

- (a) by the insertion of the words “ hair-dressing saloon, barber’s shop, ” after the word “ factory, ” and before the word “ or ” in line 3 of by-law 2; and
- (b) by the addition of the following by-laws after those regarding “ Public Bathing Places ”:—

HAIR-DRESSING SALOONS OR BARBERS’ SHOPS.

I.—*Conditions of Issue of Licence.*

No person shall be entitled to keep a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop unless the premises to be licensed comply with the following conditions:—

1. That the building is of permanent materials, well lighted and well ventilated, with a floor space of not less than 120 square feet. The walls shall be lime-plastered and lime-washed; the roof provided with a wooden or other similar ceiling painted white; and the floor shall be cemented, with rounded corners at its junction with the walls.
2. That it is provided with adequate drainage and latrine accommodation.
3. That the living quarters, if any, attached to a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop conform to the requirements of the Housing and Town Improvement Ordinance, No. 19 of 1915.
4. That a sufficient supply of water is available at all times on the premises.
5. That the saloon or shop is provided with means for securing a supply of boiling water adequate for the purpose of sterilizing implements and washing the appliances in daily use.

6. That a sufficient supply of towels and overalls is available for the use of the customers.

7. That facilities are provided for the barbers to wash their hands during the course of their work.

8. That the saloon or shop is provided with a sufficient number of spittoons which shall be kept by the seats readily available to customers and employees.

9. That for the reception of hair and sweepings a movable sanitary bin made of galvanized iron or other equally suitable and impervious material is provided and kept covered with a close-fitting lid.

10. That each washstand is provided with a vessel for a disinfectant for sterilizing razors, scissors, clippers, or other instruments.

11. A tray with disinfectants shall be kept in the saloon for keeping the instruments and combs after use.

II.—*Regulations for Licensed Hair-dressing Saloons.*

1. Every licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall keep affixed in a conspicuous position on the outside of his premises a board with the words “ Licensed Hair-dressing Saloon ” or “ Licensed Barber’s Shop ”.

2. Every licensee of a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall cause a copy of these regulations in English, Sinhalese, and Tamil to be framed and hung up in a prominent place on the premises.

3. The walls of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall be lime-washed and the ceiling painted twice a year in the months of June and December.

4. No Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall be used as a place for sleeping or eating during the night or day.

5. No person suffering from or who has recently been in attendance on any person suffering from any infectious or contagious disease shall enter a Hair-dressing Saloon, or Barber’s Shop or be employed therein in any capacity. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall submit himself for examination by the Medical Officer of Health and obtain a certificate from him to the effect that such person is free from any infectious or contagious disease. The certificate will be issued free of charge.

6. Every person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall observe the utmost cleanliness in his work. He shall keep his person and his wearing apparel clean and in a sanitary condition. He shall keep his finger-nails short and clean and shall wash his hands with soap and water immediately before attending each customer.

7. The floor, walls, ceiling, furniture, and fixtures of every Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall be kept clean at all times.

8. The razors, scissors, and other implements shall be disinfected immediately after each occasion on which they are used and before they are employed for another customer by dipping them in boiling water or by any other method approved of by the Medical Officer of Health.

Such razors, scissors, and other implements, when not in use, shall be kept in the tray with disinfectants provided for the purpose.

9. All spittoons shall always be maintained in a clean and sanitary condition. Each spittoon shall be emptied and cleansed once daily, or more frequently if necessary, with a disinfectant approved by the Medical Officer of Health, and a small quantity of disinfectant left in the spittoon.

10. Hair-brushes and combs shall be thoroughly washed, cleaned, and sterilized every day before use and kept in a clean and sanitary condition at all times.

11. Shaving mugs, cups, and shaving brushes shall be thoroughly rinsed in hot water after each occasion on which they are used.

12. The use of styptic pencils, powder puffs, and sponges is forbidden. Alum or other material used to stop bleeding shall be applied in powder or liquid form.

13. Every licensee shall supply each customer with fresh clean towels and overalls. All towels or overalls shall be boiled and laundered after each occasion on which they are used.

14. No person shall expectorate within the premises except into a spittoon provided for the purpose.

15. No person employed in a Hair-dressing Saloon or Barber’s Shop shall attend on any customer who is suffering from an infectious skin disease or any other infectious ailment.

16. If it so happens that a customer with any visible skin disease has been attended to, the hands of the barber shall be immediately cleansed and the instruments used sterilized.

17. After attention to each customer all hair cuttings shall be gathered and deposited in the sanitary dust bin provided. Such cuttings shall on no account be allowed to lie about in the premises.

11. Should the successful tenderer decline or fail to enter into the agreement within 10 days of receiving notice in writing from the Conservator of Forests or his duly authorized representative to the effect that his tender has been accepted, the deposit already made on account of tender form shall be forfeited and the right to collect the produce concerned shall be resold at the risk of the original purchaser who shall be held liable to make good any deficiency in the price realized at such resale; on the other hand he shall not be entitled to participate in any profit which may accrue to the Government by such resale.

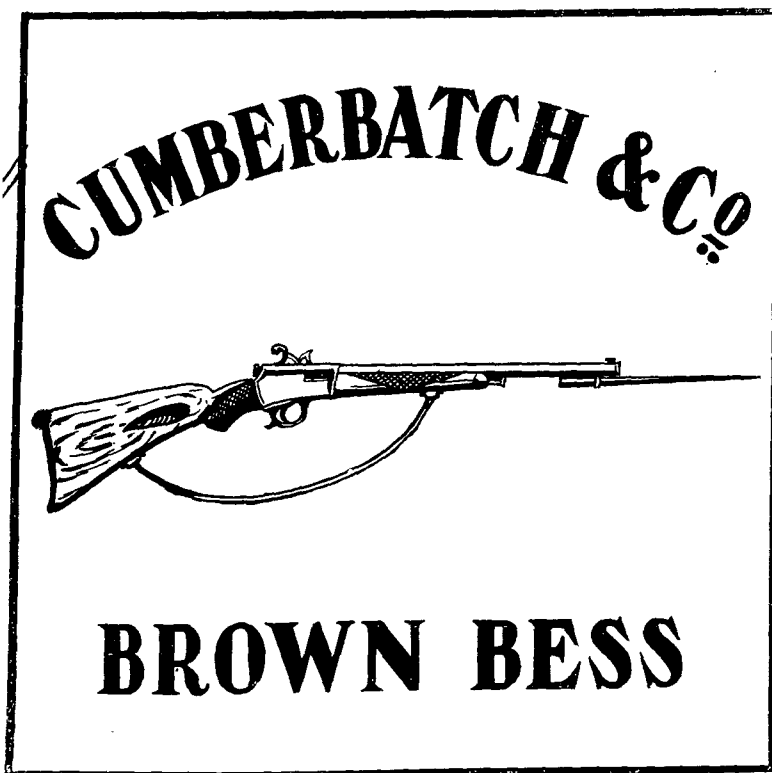

The Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899.

REGULATIONS made under sections 18 and 23 of the Cemeteries and Burials Ordinance, 1899, by the "proper authority", to wit, the Urban District Council of Weligama, in respect of the general cemeteries at Walliwela, Koodalumulla, and Mudugamuwa.

Regulations.

1. (1) All applications for graves shall be made to the keeper of the cemetery at least six hours before the time fixed for the burial: Provided that the Chairman of the Council may in his discretion entertain an application at any later time.

(2) Every application shall be accompanied by the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, 1895.

2. (1) No fee shall be payable for a burial or cremation in the Walliwela cemetery or the Koodalumulla cemetery.

(2) A fee in accordance with the rates set out in the schedule to this regulation shall be paid in advance to the keeper of the Mudugamuwa cemetery for each burial or cremation in any part of that cemetery which has not been sold or set apart by deed for the special use of any religious denomination: Provided (i.) that vagrants or unidentified persons dying in any public place or paupers shall be buried without payment of a fee on the production of a certificate from the Chairman of the Council, and (ii.) that on the production of a certificate signed either by the Mudaliyar of the Korale or a Justice of the Peace, or a Member of the Council, that the family of any deceased person are not able to pay the fees for the digging of a grave, the keeper of the cemetery shall cause a grave to be dug and the corpse to be buried therein without payment of a fee.

3. The receipt obtained by the applicant for a grave shall be produced to the keeper of the cemetery at the time of burial.

4. No body shall be buried in any grave in which any other body has already been buried, except after the expiry of the following periods:—

- (a) where such other body has been buried without a coffin, 12 months;
- (b) where such other body has been buried in an unlined coffin of any wood other than teak or oak, 2 years;
- (c) where such other body has been buried in a coffin of teak or oak or of any other wood lined with tin or other metal, 7 years.

5. (1) For burial in a family vault which is intended to be used for further burials, the body shall be enclosed in a hermetically sealed metal coffin, and other burials may thereafter be effected in the same vault at any time, so long as there is accommodation for such burials therein.

(2) Where any body is buried in a vault other than a family vault, it shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Council, after taking into consideration the structure of the vault and the nature of the coffin used at the last burial, to prohibit the burial of any other body therein for such time as he may think necessary to ensure that such other body may be buried in a decent manner.

6. No grave shall be less than five feet in depth, or at a less distance than 2 feet from any other grave.

7. All graves shall be dug in regular lines and shall be properly filled in.

8. The keeper of the cemetery shall indicate the line to be followed by a funeral party arriving at the cemetery, and if more than one funeral party arrive at the same time, the order in which they are to move to their respective graves, and every funeral party shall obey such directions as may be given by him in that behalf.

9. The by-laws made by the proper authority for the time being, to wit, the Sanitary Board, Matara District, in respect of the Town of Weligama, appearing in *Government Gazette* No. 7,177 of May 27, 1921, are hereby repealed.

General Clerical Examination, October, 1935.

H 1724/35

Date of Examination.

1. A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter the General Clerical Service will be held in Colombo on October 19, 1935.

Places for Competition.

2. The number of places in Class II. assigned for general competition will be 10. Appointments in Class III. will be offered, as vacancies occur, to the first 40 of those who are not selected for appointment to Class II. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Government Gazette*, and they will be given appointments as suitable vacancies occur.

Applications.

3. Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Director of Education on forms which may be obtained from his office up to September 2, 1935.

4. Applications must reach the Director of Education not later than 2 P.M. on September 9, 1935. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

5. The Director of Education will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Director of Education. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

Eligibility.

6. The examination will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

7. Candidates other than those eligible under Regulation 10 must furnish proof when forwarding their applications that they have previously passed at least the Cambridge Senior, the London Matriculation, or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination. Their applications must also bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10.

8. (i.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 22 years of age on August 1, 1935, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Director of Education, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii.) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Director of Education that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or, generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

9. Clerks who are paid directly from "Personal Emoluments" Votes in the Government Estimates (other than members of the Customs, Postal, Survey, Harbour Engineer's, or Railway Departments, Draughtsmen and Stenographers), if within the age prescribed in these Regulations will be admitted without fee, but they must have passed the examination or examinations prescribed by Regulation 7 above.

10. Clerks in Class III. of the General Clerical Service who shall have completed 3 years' service before the date of the examination, and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible for examination irrespective of age and without fee, and although they may not have passed the examination or examinations prescribed by Regulation 7 above. Their applications (in the same form) for admission to the examination must be forwarded to the Director of Education through the Heads of their Departments.

11. Clerks of the description given in Regulation 10 who fail to secure places in Class II. in the general competition will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for seven out of every thirty of the appointments offered for competition.

Withdrawals and Refunds.

12. (a) If a candidate is selected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of 3/5 the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in Regulation 12 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Education Office, Colombo, by September 19, 1935, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the Regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Education Office, Colombo, before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the approved application form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination.

13. Heads of Departments are required to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Director of Education, leave to present themselves at the examination.

14. The subjects for examination are as follows :—

15. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *Vivá Voce*. The number to be called for the *Vivá Voce* examination will be fixed by the Deputy Chief Secretary in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The *Vivá Voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

Medical Examination.

16. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.
