PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir ARTHUR ELIBANK HAVELOCK, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

WHEREAS by "The Courts Ordinance, 1889," it is amongst other things provided that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof, or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is by the said Ordinance divided for the purposes of the administration of justice, for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence—

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such sessions commencing at Galle on the 25th day of April and the 15th day of September in every year:

And whereas it appears to Us expedient that a Criminal Session of the Supreme Court should be holden in the month of September next at Tangalla, a place within the said Southern Circuit in the said Ordinance mentioned:

Now therefore know Ye that We, the said Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do hereby direct and appoint that a Session of the Sepreme Court in its criminal jurisdiction shall be held at Tangalla in the month of September next.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Twenty-ninth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

WHEREAS by section 8 of "The Road Ordinance, 1861," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to declare that any road, canal, or river shall be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare for the purposes of the said Ordinance, and such road, canal, or river shall, from the time specified in such Proclamation, be deemed to be a principal thoroughfare accordingly :

And whereas it is expedient to declare the roads appearing in the schedule hereto, and situated in the Province of Uva, principal thoroughfares for the purposes the said Ordinance :

Now know Ye that We, the said Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this Our Proclamation declare that the roads appearing in the schedule hereto, and situated in the Province of Uva, shall, for the purposes of the said Ordinance, be deemed to be principal thoroughfares from and after the First day of October, 1895.

108. Should the person so appointed by the Governor to a vacant office be required at the same time to perform the duties of his own office, he may be allowed half the salary of the temporary office together with the whole salary of his own office; but as a general rule no person should be appointed to discharge at the same time the duties of two distinct offices, whenever any other arrangement may be practicable; and unless the offices are distinct and separate offices in different Departments of the Service, or offices not standing to one another in any intimate relation of superiority and subordination, such as two Police Magistracies, only half salary of each office can be allowed.
