THE LABOUR ORDINANCE, No. 1 OF 1923.

IT is hereby notified that in pursuance of the powers conferred upon the Governor by Regulation 1A in Chapter I. of the regulations made under section 14 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1923, dated July 12, 1923, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,339 of July 13, 1923, as amended by the Regulations dated October 24, 1923, and published in *Gazette* No. 7,358 of October 26, 1923, His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased to fix the quarterly instalments of acreage fees payable to the Comptroller of Labour by employers of Indian Immigrant labourers on estates of the description named in schedule A attached to the said regulations in respect of the quarter ending September 30, 1935, and of all subsequent quarters in respect of which this Notification shall remain in force and of effect on the following scale, viz. :—

THE CEYLON IMPORTATION OF TEXTILES (QUOTAS) ORDER IN COUNCIL, 1934.

REGULATIONS made by the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor by Article 10 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Order in Council, 1934.

Regulations.

1. From and after midnight of October 31, 1935, no textile goods of any of the classes described in the first column of the schedule to the Proclamation issued under Article 4 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Order in Council, 1934, and published in the *Government Gazette* No. 8,069 of July 31, 1934, shall be deemed to be exempt from regulation under the Order in Council on the ground that they were manufactured in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland unless the importer thereof shall, at the time of importation, submit to the Principal Collector of Customs a declaration of origin substantially in Form H. in the schedule hereto, endorsed by or on behalf of any Chamber of Commerce of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland which may be approved by the Principal Collector

of Customs by notification in the *Gazette* : Provided that during the period of three months after the coming into operation of this regulation, imports of such textiles may at the discretion of the Principal Collector of Customs, subject to such conditions as he may impose either generally or in any particular case as to subsequent submission of evidence of origin, be admitted without the submission of such a declaration of origin.

2. Notwithstanding anything in any other written law contained, no stamp duty shall be levied or payable in respect of any declaration of origin which is substantially in Form H.

Present :

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by an Order in Council bearing date the 20th day of March, 1931, and known as the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, provision was made for the election of members to serve in the State Council of Ceylon :

And whereas His Majesty reserved to Himself, His Heirs and Successors, power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, to revoke, alter or amend the said Order in Council as to Him or Them should seem fit :

And whereas it is expedient to amend the said Order in Council as hereinafter is set forth :

Now, therefore, it is hereby ordered by His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, as follows :—

1. This Order may be cited as the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Amendment Order in Council, 1935. It shall be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and shall come into operation on the date of such publication.

2. Clause (1) of Article 10, Article 13, Article 15, and Clause (1) of Article 17 of the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, are hereby revoked as from the date of the coming into operation of this Order, but without prejudice to anything lawfully done thereunder, and from and after such date the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, shall be read and construed as if the following Articles and Clauses had been inserted therein in place of the said Articles and Clauses—

10. (1) A person shall be entitled to have his name entered in accordance with this Order on any register for which he is qualified, but he shall not vote at a general election in more than one electoral district.

Short title and commencement. * Amendment of the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931.

13. On or before the first day of August in each year, the Governor shall cause a notification to be published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette* and in one or more newspapers circulating in the Island calling upon every person who, being qualified to be registered in accordance with Article 8 or Article 9 of this Order and not being already registered in any register of voters is desirous of having his name inserted in any such register, or who being registered in respect of a qualification which has ceased to have effect is desirous of having his name entered on the register in respect of some other qualification, to forward his application to the registering officer of the electoral district in which the applicant resides so as to reach the registering officer on or before the fifteenth day of September next following.

15. (1) Each registering officer shall in each year revise the register of voters of his electoral district on or before the first day of October or such later date in that year as the Governor may appoint for the purpose by notification published in the *Ceylon Government Gazette*.

(2) In revising the register, the registering officer shall expunge therefrom the name of any person who is dead or has become disqualified or no longer resides in the electoral district to which the register relates and shall insert therein—

(a) the name of every person who, not being already registered in the register nor otherwise disqualified, is domiciled in Ceylon and appears to the registering officer to be qualified under Article 7 of this Order to have his name entered in the register by reason of the fact that he is domiciled in Ceylon; and

(b) the name of every person who, not being already registered in the register nor otherwise disqualified, appears to the registering officer to be qualified under Article 8 or Article 9 of this Order to have his name entered in the register and from whom an application made in accordance with the requirements of Article 14 has been received within the time prescribed by Article 13.

The registering officer may also correct any mistake or supply any omission which appears to have been made in the register, provided that he shall not insert therein the name of any person on the ground that such person is qualified under Article 8 or Article 9 of this Order to have his name entered in the register unless an application made by that person in accordance with the requirements of Article 14 was duly received by the registering officer within the time prescribed by Article 13 of this Order.

(3) A registering officer who expunges the name of any person from the register on the ground of disqualification or non-residence or rejects the application of any person to have his name entered on the register of voters, shall give such person notice of the fact.

(4) For the purpose of revising the register or of satisfying himself as to the qualification of any person for registration or of determining whether the name of any person should be inserted or retained on the register, or expunged therefrom, a registering officer may make such house to house or other inquiry as he may deem necessary either by himself or through any person appointed by him.

(5) All officers in the service of the Government of Ceylon other than officers in the Income Tax Department, and all local authorities are hereby authorized and required to furnish to a registering officer all such information as he may require to enable him to revise a register of voters.

In this Article "local authority" means a Municipal Council, a District Council constituted under the Local Government Ordinance, No. 11 of 1920, a Local Board, a Sanitary Board, and a Village Committee.

17. (1) Every person who is qualified in accordance with this Order to have his name entered in a register of voters and whose name has been omitted from such register, or whose name has been expunged from a register, and who claims to have it inserted therein (in this Order called "the claimant"), may apply to the registering officer to have his name inserted therein: Provided that no person shall be entitled to claim to have his name inserted in the register on the ground that he is qualified under Article 8 or Article 9 of this Order unless an application made by that person in accordance with the requirements of Article 14 was duly received by the registering officer within the time prescribed by Article 13 of this Order.

3. Form A in the Second Schedule to the Ceylon (State Council Elections) Order in Council, 1931, is hereby cancelled and the Form in the Schedule to this Order is substituted therefor.

4. His Majesty hereby reserves to Himself, His Heirs, and Successors, power, with the advice of His or Their Privy Council, to revoke, alter or amend this Order as to Him or Them shall seem fit.

THE BUTCHERS' ORDINANCE, 1893.

REGULATIONS made by the proper authority, to wit, the Assistant Government Agent of the District of Kegalla in the Province of Sabaragamuwa under section 23 of the Butchers' Ordinance, 1893, and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor by the said section and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in respect of the public slaughter-house at Yatiyantota proclaimed in *Gazette* No. 6,403 of September 23, 1910.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house, except between the hours of 6 A.M. and 7 A.M.

2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle for 24 hours before slaughter shall be the premises known as the "Cattle Pound," and situated in the town of Yatiyantota.

3. (1) Every licensed butcher shall produce for inspection before the Sanitary Inspector at 8 A.M. any head of cattle, sheep, or goats he desires to slaughter.

(2) The Sanitary Inspector shall, in the case of cattle, certify on the voucher produced whether the head of cattle is fit or unfit for human consumption.

(3) In the case of sheep or goats which are in his opinion fit for human consumption, the Sanitary Inspector shall issue a written permit for their slaughter.

(4) No head of cattle which is not so certified as fit for human consumption, and no sheep or goat for the slaughter of which a permit is not so issued, shall be slaughtered for human consumption.

4. If, on any animal being slaughtered, the carcase appears to the Sanitary Inspector to be diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall forthwith notify the fact to the District Medical Officer, Karawanella, who shall without delay personally inspect, or depute the District Medical Assistant to inspect the carcase. If in the opinion of the District Medical Officer or District Medical Assistant the whole carcase or any portion of the carcase is unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the same to be buried and report the matter to the Assistant Government Agent.

5. The carcases of animals slaughtered shall be flayed, cleaned, and hung up the same day in the place provided for the purpose, and no meat shall be removed for sale except with the permission of the Sanitary Inspector until 8 A.M.

6. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house shall pay the following fees:—

7. All fees shall be paid in advance to the Sanitary Inspector.

8. It shall be the duty of each butcher or other person using the slaughter-house to cause the slaughter-house and the premises to be thoroughly cleaned immediately after use, and to bury or cause to be buried all blood, refuse, and offal, according to the directions of the Sanitary Inspector.

9. No person shall slaughter any animal in the public slaughter-house in the presence of other animals or until the carcase of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house, except between the hours of 6 A.M. and 7 A.M.

2. The place appointed for the exposure of cattle for 24 hours before slaughter shall be the premises known as the 'Cattle Pound,' and situated in the town of Dehiowita.

3. (1) Every licensed butcher shall produce for inspection before the Sanitary Inspector at 8 A.M. any head of cattle, sheep, or goats he desires to slaughter.

(2) The Sanitary Inspector shall, in the case of cattle, certify on the voucher produced whether the head of cattle is fit or unfit for human consumption.

(3) In the case of sheep or goats which are in his opinion fit for human consumption, the Sanitary Inspector shall issue a written permit for their slaughter.

(4) No head of cattle which is not so certified as fit for human consumption, and no sheep or goat for the slaughter of which a permit is not so issued shall be slaughtered for human consumption.

4. If, on any animal being slaughtered, the carcase appears to the Sanitary Inspector to be diseased or unfit for human consumption, he shall forthwith notify the fact to the District Medical Officer, Karawanella, who shall without delay personally inspect, or depute the District Medical Assistant to inspect, the carcase. If in the opinion of the District Medical Officer or District Medical Assistant the whole carcase or any portion of the carcase is unfit for human consumption, he shall cause the same to be buried and report the matter to the Assistant Government Agent.

5. The carcases of animals slaughtered shall be flayed, cleaned, and hung up the same day in the place provided for the purpose, and no meat shall be removed for sale except with the permission of the Sanitary Inspector until 8 A.M.

6. Every butcher or person using the slaughter-house shall pay the following fees :—

7. All fees shall be paid in advance to the Sanitary Inspector.

8. It shall be the duty of each butcher or other person using the slaughter-house to cause the slaughter-house and the premises to be thoroughly cleaned immediately after use, and to bury or cause to be buried all blood, refuse, and offal, according to the directions of the Sanitary Inspector.

9. No person shall slaughter any animal in the public slaughter-house in the presence of other animals or until the carcase of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleaned.

10. The rules and regulations dated January 8, 1923, and published in the *Gazette* of January 12, 1923, are hereby revoked.

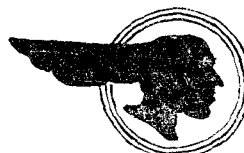
