RULES AND REGULATIONS.

- Rule 21 of the rules under section 21, published by Notification in the Gazette of June 8, 1934, is hereby amended as follows:
 - (1) in paragraph (1), by the substitution for the words in paragraph (1), by the substitution for the words "scheduled or non-scheduled trees and timber", of the words "scheduled or non-scheduled trees or timber or stone, coral, peat, surface soil, or minerale,".
 by the deletion of paragraph (2) and the substitution of the following new paragraph therefor:—

 (2) Every ten grant of scheduled or non-scheduled trees or timber shall be covered by a
 - - licence substantially in the Forms $\frac{A}{1}$ and $\frac{A}{2}$, and

every grant of stone, coral, peat, surface soil, or minerals by a licence substantially in the Form C, in the schedule hereto, and marked 'Free Grant Licence '.'

- 2. The regulations under section 62, published in the Gazette of June 8, 1934, are hereby amended as follows:-
 - (I) in regulation 3-
 - (a) by the substitution for the words "Government

Agent or Assistant Government Agent", of the words "by a duly authorized Forest Officer, such Officer"; and

(b) by the substitution for the words "Headmen's Reward Fund" wherever they occur, of the words "Headmen's Reward Fund or the Police Reward Fund";

(2) by the renumbering of regulation 4 as regulation 5, and the insertion of the following new regulation 4 :-

> "4. The court convicting any person of any forest offence, may order any portion not exceeding one hundred rupees of any fine that may be recovered from that person, to be paid into the Headmen's Reward Fund or the Police Reward Fund or to any person or persons on whose information the offence was detected and proved.',

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

The cattle-pound at Perumatotam shall be the spot in which the licensed butchers of the urban area of Weligama shall, as required by section 12 (1) of the Ordinance, expose for public view cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs intended for slaughter for a period of not less than 24 hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.

2. The public slaughter-house proclaimed under section 22 of the Ordinance shall be in charge of the Sanitary Inspector of the Weligama Urban District Council, who shall be responsible for its discipline and sanitary condition.

No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house except between 7 A.M. and 9 A.M., nor until after it has been inspected and approved by the officer appointed for the purpose by the Council as fit to be slaughtered for human food.

4. Any animal rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

5. The Medical Officer, Weligama, or the officer appointed by the Council may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if after it has been approved as aforesaid, and before slaughter it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human food.

6. If after the slaughter of any animal which has been approved as aforesaid, the carcase shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent it

being exposed for sale or used for human food.

7. The officer in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 5.

8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the direction of the Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, any meat which has been declared as unfit for human food.

9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of other animals, or until the carcase of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleansed.

The following fees shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughter-house :-




