THE RUBBER CONTROL ORDINANCE, No. 6 OF 1934.

Notification No. 47.

REGULATIONS under sections 45 and 50 of the Rubber Control Ordinance, No. 6 of 1934, made by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands.

Notification No. 44 published in the *Government Gazette* of October 4, 1935, is hereby cancelled.

REGULATIONS

The regulations for replanting published by Notification No. 15 in the *Gazette* of May 25, 1934, are hereby rescinded and the following substituted therefor:—

1. In these regulations the expression "total acreage" used with reference to the proprietor of a registered estate or small holding means that area of all his registered estates or small holdings which, in the opinion of the Controller, was planted with rubber plants at the date of the commencement of the Ordinance.

2. The proprietor of a registered estate or small holding shall, subject to his compliance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed, be entitled to replant in any year of control an area, in any one or more registered estates or small holdings of which he is the proprietor, equivalent to ten per centum of his total acreage: Provided that the aggregate area so replanted by that proprietor during the operation of the Ordinance shall not exceed twenty per centum of his total acreage.

3. The proprietor of a registered estate or small holding shall not in any year of control exercise in that estate or small holding any replanting rights arising from any other part of his total acreage until he shall have first exercised in that estate or small holding the entirety of the replanting rights arising therefrom.

4. If at any time during the operation of the Ordinance a change occurs in the proprietorship of a registered estate or small holding, and the person registered as the proprietor thereof immediately prior to such change has, under regulation 2, exercised any part of the replanting rights arising from that estate or small holding, the person next subsequently registered as proprietor of that estate or small holding shall be entitled, subject to his compliance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed, to exercise in that estate or small holding only such rights to replant as the person previously registered as proprietor had at the date of such change and by virtue of his proprietorship of that estate or small holding only:

Provided that such subsequent proprietor shall also be entitled, subject to his compliance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed, to exercise in that estate or small holding in accordance with regulations 2 and 3 any replanting rights arising from any other estate or small holding of which he is the registered proprietor.

5. If at any time during the operation of the Ordinance a change occurs in the proprietorship of a registered estate or small holding, and the person registered as the proprietor thereof immediately prior to such change has in accordance with regulations 2 and 3 exercised in that estate or small holding any replanting rights arising from any other part of his total acreage, he shall be entitled, subject to his compliance with the conditions hereinafter prescribed to exercise in that other part of his total acreage only such replanting rights arising therefrom as have not been exercised prior to such change.

6. The proprietor of a registered estate or small holding who desires to replant in any year of control any part of a registered estate or small holding of which he is proprietor shall make written application to the Controller accompanied by a return in the form J hereinafter prescribed for a permit to replant. Every permit to replant shall be in the form K hereinafter prescribed.

7. The proprietor of a registered estate or small holding shall attach in duplicate to every application made by him in form J a sketch or plan showing the position and extent of the area of the estate or small holding which he desires to replant.

8. The proprietor of a registered estate or small holding to whom a permit to replant has been issued in the form K shall notify to the Controller the date on which he begins to lop or fell any rubber plants under that permit.

9. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person or persons whose names and addresses may have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

6. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from a seizure.

BY-LAWS.

1. (1) An ordinary meeting of the Committee shall be held on the third Monday of each of the months of February, April, June, August, October, and December, unless the Chairman by written notice of not less than one week prior to the date appointed for any meeting, gives information to the members that for want of sufficient business such meeting will not be held, or that it will be held on some other date specified in the notice.

(2) A special meeting may be summoned by the Chairman by written notice, setting out the nature of the proposed business, served on the members not less than one week before the date selected by him for such meeting.

(3) The Chairman shall record in a minute book the proceedings of each meeting in the order in which they occur and shall cause a copy of the minutes of every meeting to be sent to each member as early as may be convenient after such meeting.

(4) If the Chairman is absent on leave or owing to ill-health or any other cause, the remaining members of the Committee may elect one of themselves to perform all the duties of the Chairman during his absence.

2. (1) The whole of the Education District of Matara, including the areas within the administrative limits of the Matara and Weligama Urban District Councils, is hereby declared to be an area within which efficient provision has been made for elementary education by means of schools recognized by the Department of Education.

(2) In these by-laws the term "school" shall mean any one of the schools within this district that have already been or may hereafter be recognized by the Department of Education.

3. Within this Education District it shall be the duty of—

- (a) the parent of every boy of not less than 6 and not more than 14 years of age, and
- (b) the parent of every girl of not less than 6 and not more than 12 years of age,

to cause such boy or girl to attend school, unless he has, in the opinion of the Chairman, made other adequate and suitable provision for the education of such boy or girl, or unless the Chairman of the Committee has exempted such boy or girl on the ground of poverty or illness from attendance at school:

Provided however that such attendance at school shall not be compulsory—

- (a) for Muslim and Tamil girls of over 10 years of age; or
- (b) for any boy under 14 years of age or any girl under 12 years of age, who is the holder of a certificate issued by an inspecting officer of the Department of Education to the effect that such boy or girl has passed in Reading, Writing, and Arithmetic the examination prescribed by the Code for the Fifth Standard, and who is engaged in some remunerative employment or other beneficial occupation to the satisfaction of the Chairman; or
- (c) for any boy under 8 years of age or any girl whose home or place of residence is more than 1 mile distant, or for any boy over 8 years of age whose home or place of residence is more than 2 miles distant, along the shortest route from any school.

4. (1) The period of daily attendance of any child for the purposes of these by-laws shall be the entire period during which the school is open daily for the instruction of children of similar age: Provided, however, that any child may be excused attendance during the time when religious instruction is given, as provided by section 15 (2) of the Ordinance.

5. Any parent failing to observe the provisions of these by-laws shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 5 and in the case of a continuing offence with an additional fine not exceeding Re. 1 for the second and each subsequent day during which the offence continues.

(b) That the vote of Rs. 14,000 provided in supplemental Budget 1929, under Vote I-118 "Acquisition of land near Price park for a playground" and sanctioned by Council on October 2, 1929, be cancelled.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Registered No. 972.—Recommended that the proposed reply to the Director of Public Works as embodied in the memorandum of Chairman, dated July 23, 1935, be approved.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(14) With reference to the resolution of the Four Standing Committees of June 26, 1935, that Dr. L. F. Hirst be requested to report on the question of the area necessary to be acquired for the augmentation scheme in view of the representation made by the Acting City Microbiologist to consider :—(a) A letter, dated August 6, 1935, from Dr. L. F. Hirst stating that he is prepared to report on the question of the extent of land that should be acquired for a fee of Rs. 500. Registered No. 1,558.—Recommended.

MUNICIPAL ASSESSOR'S DEPARTMENT.

(16) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Municipal Assessor, dated January 15, 1935, regarding buildings used for religious purposes. (b) The opinion of Mr. E. J. Samarawickrema, K.C. Registered No. 88.—Dr. E. A. Coorey, M.M.C., handed to the Chairman a letter, dated August 28, 1935, signed by Rev. K. Ratnasara Nayaka Thero, Principal, Maligakanda Vidyodaya Oriental College.—Recommended that the Municipal Assessor be instructed to act in accordance with the opinion expressed by Mr. E. J. Samarawickrema, K.C.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding Housing and Town Improvement of August 30, 1935, was considered.

(5) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer, dated August 15, 1935 (supported by the Municipal Treasurer), forwarding a plan showing provisional apportionment, and also a detailed estimate of Rs. 6,440, regarding the proposed Sewer in Gower street, Wellawatta. Registered No. 1,724.—Recommended that the following resolution be adopted :—“That Gower street” not being a public street, has not been ‘constructed’ to the satisfaction of the Council under section 25 (1) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, in respect of its sewerage. That the Council, therefore, serve notices through the Chairman under section 25 (2) of the same Ordinance, proposing to construct a sewer along the said “Gower street” at a probable cost of Rs. 6,440, plan and particulars of the said work to be available for inspection at the office of the Municipal Engineer, Town Hall, Colombo, in order to afford an opportunity for hearing by the Chairman for submission to the Council, of objections to the proposed work or apportionment of the estimated expenditure thereof provided that such objections are received by the Chairman within 14 days of the service of such notices.”

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of August 30, 1935, was considered.

(2) To consider :—(a) A report of the Charity Commissioner, dated August 1, 1935, submitting two lists of 44 and 14 names of those working at the Unemployment Relief Scheme who are old and infirm and incapable of doing a reasonable day's work. (b) A memorandum of the Chairman, dated August 30, 1935, stating that it would appear that approximately 60 men unfit for work have to be dealt with. Registered No. 1,619.—Recommended :—(a) That a special contribution of Rs. 1,000 be granted to the F. I. N. S. to assist the Society in affording relief where necessary to such of the 60 men proposed to be discharged from Unemployment Relief Works as are found to be destitute. (b) That supplemental provision of Rs. 1,000, under Vote A. Non-effective Charges, item No. 6—“Contribution to F. I. N.S.” of 1935 Budget, be sanctioned.

3. The Chairman moved in Committee—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

ANNEXURE A.

(As amended and adopted by the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) at their meeting of August 28, 1935.)

Principles for the City Refuge.

The City Refuge shall be an institution which affords shelter; food and clothing to destitute and infirm citizens of Colombo of both sexes as well as orphan boys under 12.

2. The Relief of Distress Committee shall be responsible for advising the Council in all matters affecting the Refuge.
3. All applications for admittance to the Refuge shall be decided by the Relief of Distress Committee.

The Superintendent.

4. The Superintendent of the Refuge shall be under the control and direction of the Charity Commissioner.

Admissions.

5. Persons of either sex who are both destitute and infirm or orphan boys under 12 may be admitted into the Refuge, after their applications have been submitted to and approved by the Relief of Distress Committee. In the case of adults only persons who have been resident in the City of Colombo for over ten years shall ordinarily be eligible for admission to the Refuge. In the case of orphan boys their parents should have resided in Colombo for over ten years.

6. No person suffering from any infectious disease shall be admitted into the Refuge.
7. On admission into the inmates' quarters the clothes of the institution shall be worn.
8. No person, who has left the Home without permission or who has been expelled shall be readmitted except after reconsideration by the Relief of Distress Committee.
9. A report on the circumstances and condition of each inmate shall be submitted every six months by the Charity Commissioner. The Relief of Distress Committee shall have power to discharge any inmate no longer considered eligible.

Accommodation.

10. The men, women, and boys shall be lodged in separate enclosures. They shall not visit each other's quarters.

Clothing and other Requisites.

11. Each inmate shall be supplied yearly with such clothes as the Relief of Distress Committee shall determine. Each inmate shall also be supplied with a bed, a mat, a pillow, a blanket, a plate and a cup, for all of which the inmate shall be responsible.

Discipline.

12. All inmates shall be required to conform to the rules of the Refuge and to obey the orders of the Superintendent.
13. The labour of inmates of both sexes shall be utilized as much as possible.
14. Reasonable facilities shall be afforded in the Refuge for religious observances by the inmates once a week.
15. No inmates shall be allowed to leave the premises without obtaining permission from the Superintendent.
16. There shall be a roll-call of the inmates every morning and evening.
17. No inmate of the Refuge shall be allowed to beg or to solicit alms in any shape from the public.
18. No inmate of the Refuge shall be allowed to have or use any intoxicating liquor or drug.
19. Any inmate neglecting to observe any rules or otherwise misbehaving shall be liable to expulsion.

Examination and Treatment of the Sick.

20. A Medical Officer shall visit the Refuge when required. All cases which in the opinion of the Medical Officer need more than ordinary care shall be despatched to hospital promptly.

Inspections.

21. A visitor for every week shall be appointed in rotation from the Members of the Relief of Distress Committee and he shall record his observations in a book. Any member of the Council visiting the Refuge may similarly record his observations in the same book. The Medical Officer of Health may inspect the Refuge at any time and draw the attention of the Charity Commissioner to any matters requiring attention.

22. A separate visitor's book shall be kept for remarks by other visitors.

23. These two visitors' books shall be placed on the table at each monthly meeting of the Relief of Distress Committee.

Duties of Officers.

24. The duties of the Superintendent, Matron, and other Officers connected with the Refuge shall be approved by the Relief of Distress Committee.

25. The Relief of Distress Committee shall submit to the Council for its approval all Rules and Regulations necessary for the proper conduct of the City Refuge.

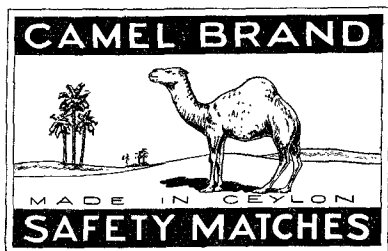

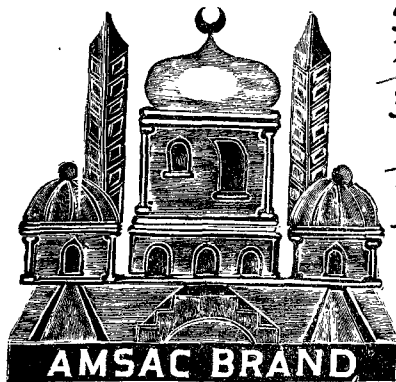
