BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. It shall be lawful for every mortgagee of any immovable property situate within the administrative limits of the Council, or for any of the heirs or the legal representative of any deceased mortgagee, to cause any such mortgage to be registered at the office of the Council.

2. Every person desiring to have a mortgage so registered shall forward or cause to be forwarded to the Chairman a statement setting out—

- the name and address of the mortgagee or of any heir or legal representative of the mortgagee, if he is deceased;
- the name and address of the mortgagor; and
- a description of the property or such particulars as may be necessary for identifying it.

3. On receipt of such statement and on payment by the applicant of a registration fee, which is hereby fixed at Re. 1, the Chairman shall cause the names and addresses and necessary particulars to be entered in the register kept for that purpose in the office of the Council.

4. In the event of any seizure, in execution for the recovery of rates, taxes, or charges due to the Council, of any property concerning which any mortgage and names and addresses may have been registered as aforesaid, the Chairman shall, at least 14 days before advertising such property for sale, serve or cause to be served on the person

or persons whose names and addresses may have been so registered, a notice in writing of the seizure, the date fixed for the sale, and the amount for the recovery of which the seizure was effected.

5. If at any time before the sale, the amount specified in the notice is paid to the Council, the property shall be released from seizure.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. In these regulations—

“Council” means the Urban District Council of Kotte.

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Council.

“Public Stand” means any space within the administrative limits of the Council which is defined and reserved for the parking of motor cabs or omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing hiring cars or omnibuses or lorries to use a public stand and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

3. No vehicle other than a hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

4. No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

5. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of omnibuses or hiring cars or lorries no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

6. No hiring car or omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

7. No hiring car, omnibus, or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

8. The driver of every hiring car, omnibus, or lorry, or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupies a public stand.

9. The driver of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a Police Officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such hiring car, omnibus, or lorry.

10. Every driver or other person in charge of any hiring car, omnibus, or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an orderly manner.

11. No hiring car shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any hiring cars entering or leaving such stand.

SCHEDULE.

Scale of Charges for the use of Public Stands.

(a) For every hiring car licensed to carry not more than 7 persons, 10 cents a day, or in the case of monthly payments, Rs. 2 a month.

(b) For every hiring car licensed to carry more than 7 persons but not more than 15 persons, 12 cents a day, or in the case of monthly payments, Rs. 2 a month.

(c) For every hiring car licensed to carry more than 15 persons, 15 cents a day, or in the case of monthly payments, Rs. 2.50 a month.

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THE MOTOR CAR ORDINANCE, 1927.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations—

“Chairman” means the Chairman of the Village Committee of Kalagam korale south.

“Public Stand” means any space within the urban area which is defined and reserved for the parking of omnibuses and lorries by a notice signed by the Chairman and exhibited at the spot.

2. The Chairman may issue permits authorizing omnibuses and lorries to use a public stand, and charge fees for the permits in accordance with the scale specified in the schedule hereto.

3. No vehicle other than an omnibus or lorry shall enter or be parked in a public stand.

4. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in any public place except in a public stand.

5. Where a public stand or any portion of a public stand is reserved for the use of any particular class of omnibus or lorry, no motor car not belonging to the class for which the stand is reserved shall enter it or be parked in it.

6. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or remain in a public stand unless its driver is in possession of a valid permit in respect of it issued under these regulations.

7. No omnibus or lorry shall enter or leave a public stand except by the respective passages provided for entrance and exit.

8. The driver of every omnibus or lorry or a person capable of driving it, shall be in charge while the omnibus or lorry occupies a public stand.

9. The driver of any omnibus or lorry occupying a public stand shall, when required to do so by a police officer or a person authorized for the purpose by the Chairman, produce the permit issued in respect of such omnibus or lorry.

10. Every driver or other person in charge of any omnibus or lorry in any public stand shall conduct himself in an ordinary manner.

11. All omnibuses and lorries parked in a public stand shall be halted facing the same direction one behind the other and shall be moved up as vacancies occur in front.

12. No omnibus or lorry shall be parked in a public stand in such a way as to obstruct any omnibuses or lorries entering or leaving such stand.

13. The regulations dated May 20, 1931, and published in the *Gazette* of May 22, 1931, are hereby rescinded.

REGULATION.

The following new regulation is hereby substituted for Regulation I in the Fourth Schedule to the Ordinance:—

Routes. 1. (1) No omnibus shall ply or stand for hire except on routes approved by the licensing authority and endorsed on the motor car licence for that omnibus.

(2) A licensing authority shall not refuse to approve any proposed route on any ground other than the following:—

(a) that the omnibus, owing to its weight, size, or construction, cannot safely be used on the proposed route; or

(b) that the proposed route is, owing to the condition of the route, including width and grade, unsuitable for omnibus traffic; or

(c) that the proposed route is already so congested by traffic that additional omnibus traffic cannot safely be allowed thereon; or

(d) that the approval of the proposed route is likely in the opinion of that authority to lead to a breach of the peace or to endanger the safety of other traffic or of the public along that route.

(3) A licensing authority shall not approve any route outside its area except with the consent of the licensing authority within whose area such route lies.

(4) The licensing authority may, if it thinks fit—

(a) on the application of a licensee alter from time to time any route endorsed on his licence; or

(b) on the application of a police officer not below the rank of Superintendent, cancel or temporarily withdraw the approval of any route endorsed on a licence, if it is satisfied that the use of that route by the licensee is likely

to lead to a breach of the peace or to endanger the safety of other traffic or of the public along that route; and

(c) where the approval is so withdrawn temporarily, hold any further inquiry it may deem necessary and renew or cancel the approval as the circumstances may require.

NOTICES CALLING FOR TENDERS.

Sale of Right to collect and remove Timber from Crown Forests for Sleeper Supplies to the Railway and for Trading Purposes.

SEALED tenders for the right to fell trees, convert them into sleepers, timber in the log, sawn timber, &c., and collect and remove these from the areas referred to in the annexed schedule, at the rates shown for the respective classes offered for sale, will be received by the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, Colombo, up to midday on Tuesday, November 26, 1935.

2. All tenders should be in duplicate and sealed under one cover and should be addressed to the Chairman, Tender Board, General Treasury, P. O. Box 500, Colombo.

3. Tenders should either be deposited in the tender box in the General Treasury, Room No. 223, Second Floor, Galle Face Secretariat, Colombo, or be sent through the post preferably under registered cover.

4. Tenders should be marked "Tender for the right to Exploit Crown Forests for Sleeper Supply, &c." in the left hand top corner of the envelope and should reach the General Treasury not later than midday on Tuesday, November 26, 1935. *Each area shown separately in the annexed schedule should be tendered for separately.*

5. Tenders are to be made upon forms which are to be supplied upon application at any of the Divisional Forest Offices concerned, or the Head Office, and no tender will be accepted unless it is on the recognized form.

6. All alterations and erasures in tenders must be initialled by the tenderers.

7. A deposit of Rs. 50 must be made either in the Office of the Conservator of Forests or in a Kachcheri, and a receipt produced for same before any form of tender is issued. If a person to whom a tender form has been issued fails for no satisfactory reason to submit his tender within the time fixed in Condition 4 above, his tender form deposit of Rs. 50 will be liable to be forfeited at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests.

8. A tenderer shall, before making his tender, preferably at the time of obtaining a tender form, examine in the office at which he obtains the tender form, a copy of the agreement he will be required to execute in the event of his tender being accepted and shall sign and deliver a statement to the effect that he has fully acquainted himself with the terms of such agreement and that in the event of his tender being accepted he will, within the time fixed in Condition 15 below, execute an agreement in terms of the specimen agreement. As evidence of his having examined the specimen agreement the tenderer shall sign his name on it in the space provided for the purpose.

9. A tenderer who has not previously held a Forest Department contract, when applying for tender forms, should furnish the Officer issuing the forms with a written statement giving his full name and permanent address, stating in which district or districts he owns landed property or other interests. The extent of landed property and the nature and extent of other interests should also be given. A tenderer who has carried out contracts with the Department but not in the Division or Districts concerned in the notice calling for tenders, should state in which Division or District or Divisions or Districts he has held contracts. A tenderer, who has carried out Government contracts with any other department should state the name of such department and the District in which the service was rendered, as well as the other information required.

10. No tender will be considered unless the conditions laid down above have been strictly complied with. The Government reserves to itself the right without question to reject any or all offers and to accept any portion of an offer. No offers will be entertained from persons whose names appear on the list of defaulting contractors or the list of persons to whom licences are to be refused.

11. The tenderer should quote a lump sum (or premium) both in words and in figures, which shall indicate and include the amount of money the tenderer is prepared to pay for the exclusive right to exploit the area in question, but shall not include the value of the material which the purchaser of the right shall pay to the Forest Department at the time of removal at the reduced royalty rates specified in the schedule annexed. The attention of tenderers is specially drawn to the minimum premium for each area shown in the annexed schedule.

12. Tenderers should, before tendering, satisfy themselves as to the timber contents of the area of exploitation, no representations as to adequacy or quality of such contents will be entertained after an offer has been accepted for the right to exploit the area.

13. The successful tenderer for each area shall, within ten days of being informed in writing that his tender has been accepted, pay in full the amount of his offer and enter into the necessary agreement. He shall also deposit, before signing the agreement, 5 per cent. of the reduced royalty value of the estimated yield of sleepers as security for the due and punctual performance of the agreement. Failure to comply with these requirements may result in the forfeiture of the tender form deposit and the offer of the right to another tenderer. Notice of acceptance of the tender will be deemed to have been received by the tenderer if it has been sent by post addressed to, or left at, the address given by the tenderer.

14. The contract or agreement shall be entered into by the contractor with the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation lies, acting for and on behalf of His Majesty the King, and the designation of such officer shall mean and include the officer for the time being holding such office and his successors in office for the time being under the Government of Ceylon.

15. After execution of the agreement, the successful tenderer (hereafter called the contractor) may commence the felling and conversion of trees and the collection of timber at the wayside Depots established by him in the area with the consent of the Divisional Forest Officer and referred to in the agreement, where subject to reservation specified in special condition 3 payment must be made at the reduced royalty rates referred to in the attached schedule, for the respective classes. Final removal will only be permitted on removal permits in the prescribed form, under the hand of a Forest Officer, and only in respect of timber which bears the Government hammer mark "S." Material transported outside

the area of operations shall bear a distinctive property mark indicating ownership of such material by the contractor who shall register such property mark with the Divisional Forest Officer at the time of signing the agreement. The material found in the area will, for purposes of payment be divided into the following classes :—

A.—Railway Sleepers.

- (i.) Broad Gauge : Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, and na.
- (ii.) Narrow Gauge : Ditto.

B.—Timber in the Log.

- (i.) Ebony (cleaned).
- (ii.) Satinwood, nedun, jak.
- (iii.) Palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, na, margosa, hulanhik, kumbuk, kolon, tamarind, pihimbiya, kon.
- (iv.) Other species.

C.—Timber converted in the Forest.

- (i.) Satinwood, palu, milla, ranai, halmilla, na, margosa, hulanhik, kumbuk, kolon, tamarind, pihimbiya, kon, nedun, jak.
- (ii.) Other species.

D.—Firewood.

- (i.) Firewood.

Reduced royalty, at rates laid down in the annexed schedule will be recovered on A (Sleepers) at a rate per Broad or Narrow Gauge Sleeper of the following dimensions :—

Narrow Gauge	5 ft. by 9 in. by 4½ in.

On B (Timber in the log) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the square of the quarter girth (measured midway between the two ends of the log) by the length; on C (Converted timber) at a rate per cubic foot calculated by multiplying the length, breadth, and thickness; and on D (Firewood) at a rate per cubic yard.

16. No contract or agreement may be assigned or sublet without the authority of the Tender Board. In the event of the Tender Board refusing to authorize assignment or subletting of a contract and the contractor not being prepared to carry on work on his own, the right of exploiting the area shall be readvertised and on its resale the contractor's rights shall automatically cease, and he shall not be entitled to refund of any sums paid by him or to any claim whatsoever on account of the resale. The right is reserved to the Conservator of Forests to refuse to recognize a power of attorney issued by a contractor to any person authorizing him to carry on the contract on the contractor's behalf, or to refuse to recognize a power of attorney if he is not satisfied with the reasons for its issue.

17. The Conservator of Forests may, for reasons which appear to him sufficient, give notice in writing of his objection to the employment by the contractor of any person specified in such notice, and no such person shall be employed by the contractor.

18. Special rules for felling, conversion, and removal of material which are to be observed by the contractor, are more fully outlined in the Special Conditions given below. Nothing in these Special Conditions will exempt the contractor from liability under the Forest Ordinance, No. 16 of 1907, should he be responsible for the commission of a Forest Offence.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS.

(1) The Forest Department will, as far as possible, assist contractors in disposing of material extracted from their areas. The Railway Department will buy direct from the contractors, subject to stipulations shown below, sleepers of the correct specification (copy attached), in respect of species, quality and dimensions, brought from the felling area to the railway line sides or station yards. The Railway Department will pay the contractors for all accepted sleepers at the following approximate rates :—

Broad Gauge sleeper delivered on Broad Gauge line	Rs. 5·00
Do. on a Narrow Gauge line	Rs. 4·50
Narrow Gauge sleeper delivered do.	Rs. 2·25
Do. on a Broad Gauge line	Rs. 2·00

It should be understood by tenderers that no guarantee is held out that payment will be made by the Railway Department at the above rates as they are subject to revision. Narrow Gauge sleepers should not be converted except on the orders of the Forest Department which will issue such orders after ascertaining the requirements of the Railway Department. The contractor must supply, as far as possible, the full quantity of sleepers which his area is estimated to contain. Failure to supply at least 75 per cent. of the estimated quantity of sleepers will render contractors liable to suffer forfeiture of security in part or in full.

(2) A Forest Department representative will pass all sleepers for species at the same time that the Railway Department's Inspecting Officer passes them for specification and payment; and the Forest Department will generally advise the contractor during the course of the work as to the specification and standard of sleepers required, but the onus of supplying sleepers which comply with the Railway Department's specification rests on the contractor alone.

(3) Reduced royalty at the rates given in the schedule, fixed after taking into consideration the accessibility of the forest, will be recovered on timber in the log, converted material other than sleepers and firewood at the Wayside Depot, as and when required by the Divisional Forest Officer, and in any case at intervals of not longer duration than one month. The time and place of recovery of reduced royalty on sleepers will be fixed by the Conservator of Forests and his decision on all aspects of this question shall be final.

(4) Sleepers should be delivered at an agreed point on the line side or station yards in batches or parcels of not less than 600, and as sufficient quantities become available for handing over, the Forest Department will intimate the Railway Department to this effect.

(5) The contractor shall, if required by the Divisional Forest Officer, deposit with that officer such sum of money as may be required to secure the due payment of the reduced royalty; and in case of default being made in the payment at the prescribed time of any reduced royalty accrued under the agreement the sum so accrued may be withdrawn by the said officer from the sum deposited and shall then be credited to Forest Revenue.

(6) A plan will be attached to the agreement showing the working area delineated by a red outline. The boundaries of the area and subdivisions of it, as the Divisional Forest Officer may deem necessary, shall be demarcated by the contractor and work shall be confined to such subdivisions as the Divisional Forest Officer may from time to time lay down.

(7) The conditions regarding felling operations, &c., are as follows :—

- (a) In areas which are not Reserved Forests or Proposed Reserves and in areas which are released for the requirements of the Revenue Officer, halmilla trees which exceed 3 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height and all other trees which exceed 4 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height may be felled. All sound trees of sleeper species over 4 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height *must* be felled.
- (b) In Reserved Forests and Proposed Reserves no tree may be felled which has not been previously stamped for felling by a Forest Officer.
- (c) *Satinwood*.—All felled satinwood trees over 4 ft. 6 in. in girth at breast height and up to 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end shall be sawn into sleepers without further authority, unless specially demanded by the Divisional Forest Officer for a particular indent. Felled satinwood trees over 5 ft. 6 in. in girth at butt end shall not be sawn into sleepers or otherwise disposed of by the contractor until passed by the Divisional Forest Officer within whose jurisdiction the area of operation is, or by an officer deputed by him for such conversion or other disposal. From such trees the Forest Department may select logs

for the Central Timber Depot or for supply to Government departments. The contractor shall convert and trim such selected logs and supply them at the nearest railway station loaded into railway trucks, for which service he shall be paid at the following rates :—

Grade I. logs over 6 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.75 per c. ft.
Grade II. logs over 5 ft. and up to 6 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.50 per c. ft.
Grade III. logs under 5 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.25 per c. ft.

(d) No ebony logs shall be transported to Colombo without the approval of the Conservator of Forests. All cleaned ebony logs measuring 2 ft. and upwards in girth shall, if so required, be delivered to the Forest Department and the contractor will be paid for such logs at a rate per cubic foot agreed upon between him and the Divisional Forest Officer at the time of supply; this rate shall be subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests.

(e) Supplies of other hardwoods for other Government departments will be obtained from coupes by the Forest Department which will pay the contractor at the following rates :—

Grade I. logs over 6 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.50 per c. ft.
Grade II. logs 5 ft. and up to 6 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.25 per c. ft.
Grade III. logs under 5 ft. in mid-girth	Re. 1.25 per c. ft.

The contractor shall deliver such supplies loaded into railway trucks at the Railway Station nearest his coupe. He shall also comply strictly with specifications, &c., connected with each supply. The placing of orders for these supplies shall be entirely at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests. Any logs not so ordered may be otherwise disposed of by the contractor.

(8) (i.) If an agreement-holder in the performance of his agreement does anything contrary to its terms or omits to do anything required thereby, the Conservator of Forests may—

(a) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a serious irregularity, cancel the said agreement and forfeit, for the use of the Crown, the agreement-holder's security deposit and all timber in the area and the wayside depot, whether paid for or not;

(b) in any case in which he is of opinion that such act or omission is a minor irregularity, fine the agreement-holder.

(ii.) The Conservator of Forests may give the agreement-holder time to pay such fine. If such fine be not paid within the time allowed for its payment, it will be recovered from the security deposited under General Condition No. 13.

(9) The agreement-holder shall make good any deductions made from the security deposit within such time as the Conservator of Forests may fix. If he fails to do so the Conservator of Forests may cancel his agreement and forfeit the balance of the said deposit.

(10) The Contractor shall be liable to pay, at rates obtaining under the contract, for logs left lying in the area at the termination of the contract, which in the opinion of the Divisional Forest Officer are marketable or capable of being converted.

Any trees which stand unfelled in the coupe at the termination of the contract shall be the property of the Crown and the contractor shall have no claim whatever to them.

(11) In the event of an area not yielding the full quantity of estimated yields of sleepers, the question of granting additional area or areas to make up the total estimated yield will be decided by the Conservator of Forests. Only trees for sleepers shall be extracted from additional areas, and for sleepers extracted from such areas either royalty in excess of the same reduced royalty or full royalty prescribed under the Forest Ordinance shall be recovered. The rate to be recovered shall be at the sole discretion of the Conservator of Forests. Scantlings may only be sawn from logs from which at least one sleeper has been sawn.

(12) The Forest Department is prepared to assist the contractor in securing orders for supplies to other Government departments (other than those under Special Condition 8 (c) or to the Trade.

All demands for timber and firewood in the vicinity of an area under working shall be met from that area and the contractor will be required to meet those demands and will be allowed to charge any rate not in excess of Full Royalty prescribed by law, for standing timber or firewood. The contractor shall issue licences for felling and removal on his own printed forms, which shall be subject to the approval of the Conservator of Forests. Materials thus sold shall, bear the Government "S" hammer mark and the contractor's property mark side by side.

(13) All produce removed by the contractor or his licensee may be stopped and examined by any Forest Officer, anywhere, and, if there is reason to believe that money is payable to Government in respect of any portion of it, may be detained until such money is paid, or until inquiry regarding it has been made.

(14) The contractor shall have the right to appeal to the Conservator of Forests in the event of the enforcement of any of the penalties specified in those conditions and the decision of the Conservator of Forests shall be final and binding.

(15) Felling, conversion, collecting, and removal rights under this sale shall commence on January 1, 1936, or the date of signing the agreement whichever is later.

The first consignment of not less than 600 Broad Gauge Sleepers must be ready for delivery to the Railway not later than March 31, 1936. In the case of delay a penalty of Rs. 25 will be imposed for every month or part of a month, after March 31, and until the first consignment is ready for delivery. The rights shall cease on August 31, 1936. Applications for extensions will only be considered in exceptional circumstances and only granted at the discretion of the Conservator of Forests, whose decision will be final. Such extension will be subject to payment by the Contractor for each month's operations of 10 per cent. of the minimum premium for the coupe in question stated in the schedule to this Notice. The Conservator of Forests shall, however, have the power to waive this payment in full or in part, at his sole discretion, but this power will only be exercised in cases where the contractor has displayed commendable zeal and energy, or where his operations have been hindered by circumstances outside his control.

Copy of Railway Department's Specification for Sleepers.

(a) The broad gauge sleepers are for the 5 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 9 feet long, 10 inches wide, and 5 inches deep, subject to a variation in length of 1 inch. The narrow gauge sleepers are for the 2 ft. 6 in. gauge lines and are to be 5 feet long, 9 inches wide, and 4½ inches deep, subject to a similar variation in length.

(b) All sleepers shall be cut from well matured trees of the true species of timber. Sleepers must be sawn, and shall be of good sound timber free from heartwood, sapwood, except as provided in (c), dry rot and knot holes shall be cut square out of winding and straight.

(c) Allowance may be made for small surface sunshakes, end shakes up to 6 inches; a few pin holes but not in groups, sound and firm knots up to 2 inches in diameter; sap or wane must not exceed 2 inches on either face and not come under the rail seat.

(d) The sleepers shall not be cut on full quarter and shall be cut with an allowance of ¼ inch in width and ½ inch, in thickness to allow for shrinkage and no further allowance on account of size, except as provided above for length, shall be made.

Resolved that item (1) be considered with the Budget, item (2) be referred to the Electricity Committee, item (3) be looked into by the Chairman in consultation with the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, item (4) be considered by the Works Committee, item (5) be considered by the Finance Committee, and in regard to item (6) the papers be circulated.

6. Letter from the Honorary Secretary, Ceylon Orchid Society (Kandy Branch), enquiring if the Council will be willing to allow the use of the Island in the Lake to the Society for the purpose of establishing an Orchid Nursery and Flower Garden (0608).

The Secretary of the Society (Mr. V. J. C. Jonklaas) who was present at the meeting by invitation explained his scheme.

Resolved that the proposal to establish an Orchid Nursery on the Island and to plant Orchids on trees on the Lake Bund be approved subject to precautions being taken by the Society against pollution of the Lake and unsightly structures being avoided on the Island, and that a grant of Rs. 30 per mensem be made to the Society for six months towards the pay of a gardener and other incidental expenses.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. Soysa asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied :—

Q.—(1) Will the Chairman kindly state what steps have been taken to erect 3 electric lamp posts on Bahirawakande road, via Katukelle lake road, as per petition presented by me dated July 6, 1934 ?

A.—An estimate for extending lights amounting to Rs. 475 was prepared and tabled at the Meeting of Council on November 17, 1934. It was brought up with the Budget for 1935, but was not included.

Q.—(2) If no action has been taken yet, will the Chairman kindly cause necessary steps to be taken without delay for the erection of same ?

A.—The estimate will be submitted at to-day's Meeting of the Electricity Committee, and if recommended the work will be included in the Budget for 1936.

8. Pursuant to notice Mr. Wijayatilake moved—"That the road passing by the Model Tenements at Deyannawela be so extended as to connect it to the Hospital road on the one side and on the other side to the new road that is proposed to be constructed by Government through the villages of Bowala and Suduhumpola, and that the Municipal Engineer be asked to submit a plan and an estimate for the purpose." Mr. Usoof Ismail seconded.

After some discussion the Council agreed to ask the Municipal Engineer to prepare plans and estimates for a section of the road from Deyannawela up to Hantane road.

9. Pursuant to notice Mr. Marikar was to move—"Some of the rate payers having failed to pay the taxes due on their properties owing to the prevailing unprecedented economic depression and the malaria epidemic and the said properties having been advertised for sale by public auction, this Council is of opinion that the said sales be postponed on payment of the Auctioneer's charges as a final concession to the said defaulters and that they be granted a final opportunity of liquidating the arrears due in reasonable instalments".

The Chairman ruled the motion out of order on the ground that sanction for the sale of the properties in question was given by the Council by a resolution passed at the Meeting of Council, held on June 15, 1935, and that it was not competent for a member to propose a motion which was the same in substance within a period of six months under by-law 19A.

10. To fix the rates leviable during the year, 1936, the Chairman, moved—"That the Council levy during 1936 a consolidated rate of $8\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. on the annual values of property, subject to a reduction of 8 per cent. in the area in which the general facilities afforded by the water supply are not available and a reduction of $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. in the area not benefitted by the conservancy service".

This was carried unanimously.

11. Papers on the subject of Malaria relief works and distribution of foodstuffs.

The Chairman made a statement explaining the position as regards relief works and distribution of foodstuff.

12. Recommendations of Standing Committee :—

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on August 17, 1935

(1) Papers re the sublease of the site of the Empire Theatre by Madan Theatres, Ltd., to the Associated Cinemas. (0422).

Recommended that in the document sent for completion by way of "written consent" of Council to the sublease be approved deleting the portion in brackets (except for the purpose of reconstruction or amalgamation or for the purpose of transferring the assets of the lessees to any other person or company) after the words "in the event of the lessees going into liquidation."

(2) Letter dated July 18, 1935, from Mr. S. M. Adumay requesting that Stall No. 58B, Public Market be transferred in his favour. (D/st. 58B).—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on August 17, 1935.

(3) To obtain sanction for paying Mr. Suwaris and Mr. Ponweera at the rate of Rs. 20 per diem for each of their lorries employed for the purpose of distributing water from Peradeniya wells to householders.—Recommended.

(4) Petition from residents of Mavilmada, Siyambalagastenne, Nittawela and Watapuluwa requesting the exemption of paddy fields from taxation owing to the failure of crops. (A60).—Recommended that all paddy fields whose crops have failed during the whole of 1935 (i.e. Maha and Yala crops) be exempted from payment of tax on the ground that the amount of tax is inconsiderable.

(5) To consider the question of laying a new pipe line and constructing a new tank to supply water to "Alta" bungalow, to permit of the occupation of Roseneath bungalow without danger of pollution to the stream supplying water to the "Alta" bungalow. (D 102).—Recommended.

(6) To obtain supplementary votes in the following sums for meeting the sick pay claims of the daily paid staffs of the Health and Works Department up to the end of 1935 :—

Health Department Rs. 300, Works Department Rs. 400.—Recommended.

(7) To obtain sanction for the payment of a gratuity of Rs. 1,140 under the Council's Pension Rules to the widow of Mr. Bon Thomas, late Ledger Clerk. (O 132).—Recommended.

(8) Papers re the waiver of half licensing fee in respect of the bakery at premises No. 57, Malabar street, with letter from the Auditor-General stating that in this instance he does not propose to press for the recovery of the full fee, but the Council has no power under its by-laws to waive licence fees in the future. Recommended that no action be taken to frame any by-laws unless further cases frequently occur.

(9) To obtain supplementary vote of Rs. 1,000 for destruction of dogs.—Recommended.

(10) To obtain supplementary vote of Rs. 200 for upkeep of Model Dwellings, Deyannawela.—(Whitewashing).—Recommended.

Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works held on August, 17, 1935.

(11) Estimate for Rs. 150 from the Municipal Engineer for providing tatts for the verandah of the Medical Officer of health's office to prevent rain beating in (W/M 85).—Recommended that this be considered with the Budget.

(12) To obtain a vote for Rs. 225 for meeting the cost of repairing the barrel drain in Brownrigg street. (W/M 15/35).—Recommended.

(13) Fourteen tenders received for whitewashing and cement washing the Mahaiyawa Model Dwellings.—Recommended acceptance of the tender of B. William for Rs. 450.

(14) Papers *re* schemes suggested for utilizing the water of the springs at Bahirawakande for drinking purposes (O 598).—Recommended that the Government Agent be asked that this land be vested in Council and that cisterns be built.

(15) Estimate for Rs. 60 from the Municipal Engineer for improvements to the roof of the guard room at the reservoir.—Recommended.

(16) Estimate for Rs. 330 from the Municipal Engineer for making 2 culverts in the Approach road to the Peradeniya Wells.—Recommended.

Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on August 17, 1935.

(17) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 420 for extending the electric lighting supply to a point opposite Mr. P. B. Ranaraja's bungalow in Galagedera road to enable him to have lights installed in his bungalow. (F 202).—Recommended.

Resolved that the quotations submitted by Messrs. Walker Sons & Co., Ltd., for Rs. 1,272 and Rs. 2,770 be accepted.

15. Tenders received for the supply of 8 in. and 6 in. diameter pipes required for the minor (River) Pumping Scheme.

Resolved that the quotations submitted by Messrs. Walker Sons and Co. Ltd., for Rs. 9,958·59 for 8 in. pipes and Rs. 5,695·82 for 6 in. pipes be accepted.
