KNOW Ye that We, the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon, do hereby proclaim the by-law set out hereunder, made by the Municipal Council of Colombo, under sections 109 and 110 (1) (a) of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, 1910, and confirmed by Us by virtue of the powers vested in the Governor by the said section 109 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

BY-LAW.

The Municipal Leave By-laws, published by proclamation dated October 26, 1914, in the *Gazette* of November 20, 1914, as last amended by proclamation in the *Gazette* of November 16, 1934, are hereby further amended by the addition of the following new by-laws at the end thereof:—

Leave By-laws applicable to Ceylonese Officers and Servants appointed to the Municipal Service on or after January 1, 1935.

1. These by-laws shall apply to all officers and servants of this Council, other than the Chairman, the Assistant Chairman, if any, appointed under the provisions of section 50, and the Municipal Magistrate.

2. *Leave may be recalled.*—All leave is granted or withheld subject to the necessities of the Municipal Service, and leave once granted may be recalled at any time, if such a step be deemed necessary for the Municipal Service, by the Chairman: Provided that no leave granted by the Chairman with the sanction of the Council shall be recalled by the Chairman, except with the like sanction.

3. *Absence from Colombo.*—An officer may not absent himself from his station without leave from the Chairman.

4. *Leave to be obtained formally.*—Formal application for such leave must be made in all instances to the Chairman in writing even though permission may have been obtained verbally or demi-officially and although the days for which leave of absence is desired are Government holidays.

5. *Absence without leave.*—In the event of an officer absenting himself from his station or his duties without leave, or violating in any respect these by-laws, the Head of the Department in which the officer is employed will at once report the case to the Chairman, and the pay of that officer will be stopped until the order of the Chairman upon the case is made known.

6. *Periods of Leave to be granted by Chairman and Council.*—It shall be lawful for the Chairman to grant leave to all officers and servants of the Council: Provided that no leave for a period exceeding one month on full pay or half pay or both shall be granted by the Chairman without the sanction of the Council.

7. *Leave on account of Illness.*—When an application for leave or for an extension of leave is based on the ground of ill-health, or when an officer cannot attend office on account of illness, a medical certificate substantially in Form A in the schedule must in every case be forwarded to the Chairman.

8. *Forms for Leave Applications.*—Heads of Departments must forward applications for leave, either on their own account or on that of officers of their departments, on the proper form, viz.:—

(a) Leave in the Colony on Form B in the schedule.

(b) Leave out of the Colony on Form C in the schedule.

Applications which are not made on the proper form will be returned.

A register of all leave granted must be kept.

9. *Annual Full-pay Leave.*—Vacation leave on full pay may be granted for periods not exceeding one month in respect of any year.

10. *Accumulation.*—(i.) Vacation leave may be accumulated for two years only, and subject to the requirements of the service, an officer will be allowed accumulated

vacation leave for not more than two months in respect of the leave due to him for the year preceding and the year in which he takes the leave.

Vacation leave may be accumulated for three years for purposes of leave out of the Island, other than leave preparatory to retirement.

(ii.) An officer who has taken his accumulated vacation leave of two months in any year may nevertheless, subject to by-law 11 be granted one month's vacation leave in the following year.

(iii.) If any officer requires leave, in any year on account of illness or on other reasonable grounds beyond the period of vacation and accumulated vacation leave for which he is eligible, he may at the discretion of the Council be granted further leave for a period equal to any lapsed vacation leave available in respect of his past service provided such lapsed leave does not exceed two months in all.

(iv.) Lapsed leave is not intended to be granted to officers who do not return thereafter for a reasonably long period of further service under the Council. If an officer to whom lapsed leave has been granted retires, or is for any reason compulsorily retired, without returning to duty, or after returning to duty for a period less than the period of the lapsed vacation leave granted, the grant of lapsed leave shall become subject to revision and may be converted into a grant of half-pay leave, or, if no period of duty intervenes between the lapsed leave and the officer's retirement, the Council may order that the officer's retirement shall be retrospective with effect from the date on which the period of lapsed leave commenced.

When lapsed leave is converted into half-pay leave under this paragraph the half salary to be refunded may be deducted from any pension or retiring allowance for which the officer retiring may be eligible, by such instalments as the Council may direct.

11. *"Continuous Duty" Rule.*—As a general rule, officers will be required to perform nine and eighteen months' continuous duty before vacation leave on full pay for one month and two months respectively can be granted to them.

12. *Appointment and Salary of Substitutes.*—(1) Where it is necessary to appoint a substitute to perform the duties of an officer or servant on leave—

(a) if the salary of the officer or servant is over Rs. 1,200 a year the substitute shall be appointed and his salary fixed by the Council.

(b) in all other cases, the substitute shall be appointed and his salary fixed by the Chairman with the approval of the Standing Committee on Finance.

(2) In no case shall the salary of the substitute exceed the initial salary of the officer or servant.

13. *Casual Leave.*—Short periods of leave, not exceeding seven days in any year, may be granted to an officer by the Chairman, if that officer can be conveniently spared from his duties. Such leave is not accumulative, and in no case can it be granted to prolong the period for which the ordinary leave is granted. Such leave will not be counted in calculating the amount of vacation leave on full pay for which an officer is eligible when he is proceeding on long leave.

14. *Calculation of Casual and Vacation Leave.*—In calculating casual or vacation leave to be spent in the Island or in South India, Sundays and holidays shall not be included and the leave should be reckoned as 24 and 48 working days respectively except in the case of officers of departments who are required to work seven days in the week when one month's and two months' leave should be reckoned as 28 days and 56 days respectively. In calculating vacation leave to be spent out of the Island (except South India) Sundays and holidays shall be included, the equivalent of 3 months' leave being reckoned as 91 days.

15 (i.) *Leave to Minor Employees.*—Minor employees classed in scales 15 to 19 (inclusive) of the Salaries Scheme sanctioned on November 7, 1934 (excluding fireman and motormen of the Fire Brigade and Ambulance Department), may be granted short periods of casual leave on full pay not exceeding seven days in any calendar year:

Provided that in the case of illness the leave may be allowed up to the maximum of seven days.

(ii.) Such employees who have been continuously employed for two years and upwards may, in addition to leave under paragraph (i.) of this by-law, be granted leave on full pay not exceeding fourteen days in any one calendar year, if such leave is necessitated by illness and in proof of such illness a certificate from a qualified medical practitioner is produced in any case where the Chairman calls for it.

(iii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, such employees irrespective of length of service may, with the sanction of the Chairman, be granted half-pay leave up to a maximum of one month in a calendar year. If it is

considered desirable that such half-pay leave should be extended beyond one month, the sanction of the Council must be obtained. In the case of an employee who has been employed for two years and upwards, he may be allowed to take any full-pay leave for which he is still eligible under paragraph (ii.) of this by-law in lieu of a corresponding period of half-pay leave.

16. (i.) *Leave to Daily-paid Employees.*—Any daily-paid overseer or sub-overseer who has served the Council satisfactorily for two years and upwards may, upon the recommendation of the Head of the Department in which he is employed for the time being, be granted leave on full pay not exceeding seven days in any one calendar year.

(ii.) In case of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, daily-paid employees irrespective of service may be granted half-pay leave, with the sanction of the Chairman, up to a maximum of thirty days in a calendar year. If it is considered desirable that such half-pay leave should be extended beyond one month, the sanction of the Council must be obtained. In the case of a daily-paid overseer or sub-overseer who has been employed for two years and upwards, he may be allowed to take any full-pay leave for which he is still eligible under paragraph (i.) of this by-law in lieu of a corresponding period of half-pay leave.

(iii.) A daily-paid employee who has been continuously employed for a period of two years and upwards may be allowed sick leave on full-pay up to a maximum of 14 days in the third or any succeeding year of his employment,—

either (a) on the production of a certificate recommending such leave from a qualified medical practitioner ;
or (b) on his satisfying the Head of his Department that he is actually in need of such leave.

17. *Leave to Daily-paid Indian Immigrant Employees.*—(i.) Daily-paid Indian immigrant employees who have served the Council satisfactorily for 2 years or upwards may be allowed leave without pay as follows :—

Two years' and under three years' service ..	6 weeks' leave
Three years' and under four years' service ..	3 months' leave
Four years' and under five years' service ..	4 do.
Five years' and under 6 years' service ..	5 do.
Six years' service and upwards ..	6 do.

(ii.) Such employees on their return will receive pay at a rate not less than the rate at which they were paid when they proceeded on leave, if their efficiency is not impaired.

(iii.) A minimum of two years' continuous service must be performed between any two periods of leave.

(iv.) In computing service for the purposes of any leave to be granted under paragraph (i.) of this by-law no earlier leave shall be included as service.

(v.) Such employees irrespective of length of service will, as regards illness due to accidents arising out of their employment, come under the provisions of by-law 16 (ii.).

(vi.) When an employee does not return on the expiration of any leave granted under the above rules he shall be deemed to have left the service of the Council.

18. *Temporary Officers not entitled to Leave.*—Temporary officers are not entitled to leave except as provided in their agreements. The Chairman may, however, grant such officers full or half-pay leave : Provided that no leave for a period exceeding one month shall be granted by the Chairman without the sanction of the Council, and the Council may in case of illness grant further leave, if it thinks fit.

19. *Half-pay Leave out of the Colony.*—Subject to the necessities of the service, leave of absence on half-pay may be granted without any special grounds after four years' resident service from first appointment in the Municipal Service, or in the case of seconded or transferred officers a period of four years' total service with the Government and the Council. It may be given after any shorter period of service in cases of serious illness or of urgent private affairs, if the Council is satisfied that the indulgence is indispensable. In cases of serious illness the state of the officer's health must be certified by his medical attendant, or if required by the Council by a Medical Board. In cases of urgent private affairs the nature of such private affairs must be stated confidentially to the Chairman.

20. *Calculation of Half-pay Leave.*—In the absence of special grounds, half-pay leave must not exceed one-sixth of the officer's resident service in the Colony. On special grounds it may exceed that period by six months. Leave for this further period of six months cannot be commuted.

21. *Half-pay Leave not to be spent in the Colony.*—Half-pay leave is primarily intended to enable an officer to recruit his health by change of climate, and it will not be granted if it is to be spent in the Colony, except in special circumstances.

22. *Commutation of Half-pay Leave.*—At the request of any officer who may be entitled to half-pay leave, the Council may commute the whole or any portion of such leave into one-half the period of leave with full salary, if the leave is to be spent outside the Colony and if the total period of commuted and uncommuted leave, together with any period of vacation leave that may be granted, does not exceed ten months at a time. No officer can claim as a right to commute his leave in this manner, the decision whether commutation can or cannot be allowed being wholly within the discretion of the Council.

Note.—Salary during "commuted" leave will be payable only at the current "official" rate of exchange (i.e., 1s. 4d. to the rupee).

23. *No Private Arrangements to benefit Officers allowed.*—When an officer is entitled to half-pay leave, no private arrangements made with the object of securing to him more than half pay will be allowed.

24. *Combined Vacation and Half-pay Leave.*—(i.) Vacation leave may be granted to an officer to be followed immediately by leave on half pay.

(ii.) Where vacation leave on full pay is to be followed by half-pay leave (including commuted half-pay leave), the arrangements for the discharge of the officer's duties will be made by the Council.

(iii.) No officer shall proceed on vacation leave until he has handed over to the officer or officers appointed to act for him during his absence.

25. (1) In the event of an office being vacated by the death, removal, or absence on long leave of the holder, the person appointed to act in that office shall be remunerated as follows :—

(i.) If he is not in the Municipal Service he shall be remunerated at such rate as may be determined in terms of the foregoing by-law 12.

(ii.) If he is the holder of another office, but is not performing the duties of it—

(a) in any case where his salary in his substantive office is not less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, he shall continue to draw the former, and

(b) in any case where his salary in his substantive office is less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, he may, while so acting, receive half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, half the initial salary of his substantive office and all the increments he has earned in his substantive office : Provided that he shall not receive in all more than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting, or more than his substantive salary increased by one-third if this amounts to less than the initial salary of the office in which he is acting.

(iii.) If he is the holder of another office and is required to discharge the duties of that office in addition he may receive—

(a) in any case where the offices are distinct and separate offices in different departments, half the initial salary of the office in which he is acting together with the whole of his salary in his substantive office ; and

(b) in any other case, the salary which he would receive if his case fell under paragraph (2) of this by-law, or a reasonable allowance in lieu of overtime, as the Council may decide on the recommendation of the Head of the Department, having regard to the circumstances of each case.

(iv.) When an officer acts in an office to which a higher commuted allowance than that which he normally draws is attached, he may draw the higher allowance while it is available.

(2) For the purposes of this by-law, absence on long leave shall mean absence on leave for a period amounting to or exceeding sixty days.

(3) An officer appointed to act in an office other than his own cannot draw "acting" or "officiating" pay while he himself is on leave. This rule does not apply to casual leave granted under by-law 13.

26. *Rate of Exchange for Payment of Salary in "Silver Currency" Countries.*—Rates of exchange for payment of salaries in England :—

(i.) Officers of the Municipal Council who are residing in any part of Asia other than Cyprus in any rupee-using country, or in any country the currency of which is based on a silver standard, will draw their salaries in the local currency at the current rate of exchange between the country in question

and Ceylon or England, according as the salary is paid direct by the Municipal Council, or through the Crown Agents by arrangement with Government. The privilege rates of exchange which certain officers on rupee salaries have been allowed to retain will be payable solely in countries other than those above enumerated.

- (ii.) *Rate of Exchange for Payment of Salary in England.*—The following are the rates of exchange for payment of salaries in England :—

27. *Date up to which Salary is payable in Sterling.*—All officers will draw salary at the sterling rate of exchange fixed in their leave certificates up to and including the day preceding that of their departure from England, but any officer spending one full week or more on the Continent before embarking for Ceylon from Marseilles, Brindisi, Genoa, Naples, or Trieste is permitted to draw pay at the sterling rate up to and including the day before his ship leaves such port.

28. *Date of Resumption of Full Salary.*—An officer returning from leave will be entitled to draw full salary only from the day on which he assumes the duties of his fixed office, or of the office the duties of which he may be ordered temporarily to discharge.

29. *Pay of Officers on Leave.*—Arrangements will be made with Government for the payment by the Crown Agents for the Colonies of the full salary or the half pay due to officers on leave in England.

30. The Council may grant study leave to any officer who holds a pensionable appointment in the Municipal Service for the purpose of enabling him to obtain technical training or professional qualifications in his particular branch of work, subject to the following conditions :—

- (a) He shall have had at least 5 years' continuous service under the Council.
- (b) The Council shall be satisfied that his work in the Municipal Service has been exceptionally satisfactory and that he possesses the qualifications necessary to enable him to take full advantage of the concession granted.
- (c) The study leave may include any vacation, half-pay, or commuted half-pay leave and special half-pay leave to which the officer may under these by-laws be entitled, with such additional leave on no pay as the Council may decide to allow : Provided that the total period of leave allowed shall not exceed three years in the aggregate except in cases where the Council is satisfied that there are special grounds for a further extension.
- (d) He shall on his return to the Municipal Service revert to his appointment and, subject to the special sanction of the Council, his rate of salary shall be augmented by such ordinary or extraordinary increments as would have accrued during the period of his absence. Without such special sanction he will receive the salary of his appointment at the date of the expiration of his vacation, half-pay or commuted half-pay or special half-pay leave under by-law 20. If the officer does not obtain the qualifications for obtaining which the leave was granted, his salary on reversion to his post shall be that which he drew when he went on leave.
- (e) When the 6 months' special half-pay leave under by-law 20 is granted, the officer shall, prior to the commencement of such leave, sign an undertaking to repay the salary drawn by him during the period of special half-pay leave should he, through any cause within his control, fail to serve the Council for at least three years on his return to Ceylon.

31. *Leave in lieu of Statutory Holidays.*—If, in the opinion of the Chairman, it is necessary that any officer shall continue to perform his duties during the statutory holidays

which occur at Christmas, the New Year, or Easter, he may at his discretion grant leave of absence to such officer in lieu of, and not exceeding the term of, such statutory holidays.

32. *Leave Preparatory to Retirement.*—Immediately before retirement from the service of the Council an officer may be granted the vacation leave to which he is entitled.

MERCHANT SHIPPING.

THE MERCHANT SHIPPING (HELM ORDERS)
ORDER, 1935.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 13th day of
August, 1935.

Present,

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

Whereas by subsection (1) of Section 136 of the Merchant Shipping (Safety and Load Line Conventions) Act, 1932^(a) (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") it is enacted amongst other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that the provisions of Part I of the Act shall extend to the Isle of Man, any of the Channel Islands and any colony:

And whereas by Section 5 of the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890^(b) it is enacted amongst other things that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that all or any of the enactments described in the First Schedule to that Act shall extend to any foreign country in which for the time being His Majesty has jurisdiction:

And whereas by subsection (2) of Section 36 of the Act it is enacted that the Foreign Jurisdiction Act, 1890, shall have effect as if the provisions of Part I of the Act were included amongst such last mentioned enactments:

And whereas by paragraph (a) of subsection (3) of Section 36 of the Act it is enacted that His Majesty may by Order in Council direct that any provision of Part I of the Act which is expressed to apply only to British ships registered in the United Kingdom shall apply to British ships registered in any country or part of His Majesty's dominions to which the provisions of Part I of the Act can be extended by virtue of the foregoing provisions of the said Section:

Now, therefore, His Majesty, in pursuance of the powers vested in Him by the hereinbefore recited Acts and of all other powers enabling Him in that behalf, and by and with the advice of His Privy Council, is pleased to direct, and doth hereby direct, as follows:—

1. The provisions of Section 29 of the Act shall extend to the Isle of Man and the Channel Islands, to the colonies, and to foreign countries in which for the time being His Majesty exercises jurisdiction, and shall apply to British ships registered in any of such territories.

2. This Order may be cited as the Merchant Shipping (Helm Orders) Order, 1935.
