BY-LAWS REGULATING THE SUPPLY OF ELECTRICITY.

Application for supply of electrical energy.

Any person desirous of obtaining the use of electrical energy from the Council shall apply in writing in the form set out in Schedule A hereto.

Scale of charges for electrical energy.

- 2. Every consumer of electrical energy shall pay-
 - (a) the charges for consumption,

(b) meter rent, and

(c) other connected charges at the rates set out in Schedule B hereto.

Council's apparatus

- 3. (1) That portion of the service cable on the consumer's premises, the transformers, the main fuses, the meter, and the board remain the property of the Council and on no account shall they be moved or handled by any one except the Council's employees.
- (2) Any installation is liable to be disconnectedfrom the Council's main on that the Council's seals on the discovery meter or the fuses have been broken or that any part of the Council's apparatus or wires has been tampered with.
- (3) Any consumer who breaks or tampers with or permits any person other than an employee of the Council to break or tamper with any seal or any part of the Council's apparatus or wires shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 100.

Extension of installation.

- (1) Every consumer wishing at any time after his installation has been connected to use lamps, fans, or motors of greater size, or to instal additional lamps or other consuming apparatus, either temporarily or permanently, or in any way to alter or extend the wiring on his premises, shall notify his wish to the Council in writing, and if he desires that an electrical contractor should do the work, he shall at the same time notify the name and address of the said contractor.
- (2) Failure on the consumer's part to give such notice shall render the whole installation liable to disconnection from the Council's mains without further notice.
- (3) No extension whatsoever shall be connected to the main installation until the extension has been inspected and tested by the Council's Electrical Engineer.
- 5. Every consumer shall permit the Council's Inspectors and employees at all reasonable times to enter premises to which energy is supplied, for the purpose of reading the meter or inspecting any apparatus or of disconnecting, or reconnecting the supply to such premises, or of removing or replacing any apparatus belonging to the Council.

Replacement of fuses.

Access to Council's apparatus.

- 6. (1) In the event of the melting of the main fuse in any premises notice shall be sent to the Council's Electrical Engineer.
- (2) No such fuse shall be replaced by any person other than one of the Council's authorized Inspectors or workmen.

Interruption of supply.

Re. 1 will be made for replacing the fuse. 7. (1) The Council does not hold itself liable to the consumer, for any loss or damage occasioned directly or indirectly by the total or partial interruption of

supply.

(2) In the case of electrical energy being used or dealt with by any consumer in such a manner as unduly or improperly to interfere with the efficient supply of energy to any other consumer, the Council reserves to itself the right to disconnect the delin-

have been caused by a defect in the con-

sumer's wiring or apparatus, a charge of

quent's supply of energy without notice.

(3) In any such case if the installation be thereafter reconnected, a fee of Rs. 10 for testing and reconnecting will be charged. testing and reconnecting will be charged and must be paid in advance by the delin-

8. (1) All charges shall be deemed to be due on the date on which an account is presented.

(2) If such account is not paid within seven days of presentation, the Council may, after giving seven days' notice, in writing to the consumer, disconnect such defaulting consumer's installation without prejudice to the right of the Council to recover all arrears.

(3) An installation so disconnected shall not be reconnected until the amount of arrears due is paid together with a reconnection fee of Rs. 10.

9. The Council reserves to itself the right to demand a deposit as security

against the supply of energy in any case.

In particular, the Council reserves to itself the right to demand as a condition of the supply of energy the deposit in cash of the equivalent of two months' probable consumption as estimated by the Council, but the deposit of such security shall not prejudice the right of the Council to disconnect an installation for non-payment of accounts rendered as provided by by-law 8.

10. Complaints against the accuracy of an account shall be made to the office 10. Complaints of the Council within a week after the presentation of the account.

11. (1) Consumers about to vacate their premises shall give in writing three clear days' notice of their intention to do so, but shall be responsible to the Council for all energy consumed on such premises until the expiration of twenty-four hours after receipt of such notice by the Council.

(2) Failing such notice, a consumer shall be held responsible for all energy consumed on such premises until the lapse of twenty-four hours from the date on which notice in writing, of the fact that he has vacated the premises is actually received at the

Council's office.

12. (1) If the consumer or the Council shall at any time consider that any meter is not in proper working order, the Electrical Engineer may on his own motion or initiative or on receipt of a notice to that effect from the consumer take the necessary steps to have the meter tested.

(2) If it is found as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer that the supply registered by the meter is not more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. fast or $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. slow the consumer shall pay on demand the testing fee of Rs. 5.

(3) If it is found as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer that the supply registered by the meter is more than $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. fast, no testing fee shall be charged and the Council shall refund to the consumer any amount paid by him in excess of the value of the quantity actually consumed by him during the previous three months.

(4) If as a result of any test made at the request of a consumer, it is found that the supply registered by the meter is more than

Complaints regarding accounts.

 $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. slow, no testing fee shall be charged but the consumer shall pay on demand the charges for the difference between the quantity registered by the meter and the quantity actually consumed during the three previous months.

(5) For any period during which the meter is found to have been out of order or to have registered incorrectly the consumer shall not be liable to pay meter rent.

- (6) No testing fee shall in any case be recovered where the test is made on the initiative of the Council or its Electrical Engineer.
- Whoever being a registered consumer Penalty. wilfully or negligently causes electrical energy to be diverted or wasted or mali-ciously injures any meter or wilfully alters the index of any meter fixed to his premises or prevents any such meter from duly registering, shall be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine, which may extend to Rs. 100.
- 14. (1) No person who does not hold a certificate of competency as an Electrical Contractor from the Council shall-
 - (a) undertake or carry out the work of installation of electrical fittings, fixtures, or wires in any premises on a service which is intended to be connected to the Council's mains, or
 - (b) after an installation in any premises has been connected to the Council's mains, carry out or perform, in connection with such installation, any electrical work-
 - (i.) which consists of or is in the nature of, alterations, adjustments, additions, or repairs to such installation,
 - (ii.) which is other than such ordinary replacement of lamps, fans, switches, or other component parts as in no way alters or affects the capacity and nature of such installation.
- (2) Every person who without being the holder of a valid certificate of competency carries out or attempts to carry out any electrical work described in paragraph (1) of this by-law otherwise than as the paid servant of a qualified contractor and every person who causes or procures such work to be carried out or attempted or performed shall be severally guilty tof an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding one hundred rupees.
- 15. No person shall be granted a certificate of competency as electrical contractor unless he has
 - (a) had at least three years d at least three years practical experience in a recognized Electrical Engineering workshop or Firm or Electrical Power Station, and

(b) been regularly engaged for a period of not less than two years in the practice of Electrical Engineering

Provided, however, that the Council may issue a certificate of competency as electrical contractor to any person not so qualified if in opinion of the Council such person is otherwise fully qualified to exercise the powers and to perform the functions of an electrical contractor:

Provided, also, that the Council may in its discretion refuse to grant a certificate of competency to any person as an electrical contractor, whatever his qualification may be without assigning any reason or excuse for such refusal.

16. (1) No electrical contractor shall contractors carry out or perform any electrical work, such as installation work, including additions, alterations, and adjustments to existing installations except after notice of not less

than two days to the Municipal Electrical Engineer to enable him to inspect the proposed work.

- (2) If the Municipal Electrical Engineer approves of the intended work but objects to the manner in which the contractor proposes to carry it out, he may impose terms or conditions to be observed by the contractor in the performance of the work, or may vary, or modify the plan or scheme of the proposed work and may issue a permit only for the variation or modification made by him.
- 17. Every electrical contractor in carrying out any work shall strictly follow any modifications or variations or other directions that may be set out in the permit by the Electrical Engineer. Any deviation from such directions of the Electrical Engineer shall entitle the Council to cause the said work to be removed and taken down at the expense of the contractor and shall further subject the said electrical contractor to a cancellation or suspension of his certificate of competency.

78. Any electrical contractor who commences or carries out any work connected with or affecting any installation or any extension thereof without notice to the Electrical Engineer of the Council previously given and permission of the said Electrical Engineer being obtained shall be liable in addition to the cancellation of his certificate of competency to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100.

19. Any electrical contractor who in carrying out any electrical work acts in contravention of the directions set out in the M. E. E. contravention of the directions set out in the permit issued to him by the Electrical Engineer of the Council shall in addition to being liable to have his certificate of competency cancelled, be guilty of an offence punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 100.

Provided that if the same shop or boutique is licensed for the sale of both Dry Fish and Nettelie only one licence fee shall be payable.

131D. (1) A Wholesale Dry Fish or Nettelie Licence shall not be issued unless the following conditions are complied with:

- (i.) The building in which the trade is to be carried on shall have— $\,$
 - (a) the floor of all the rooms including the kitchen and outhouses, and the yard upon which it stands,
 - paved and cement-rendered; (b) the inner surface of all the walls of all the rooms including the kitchen and outhouses, plastered with cement not less than half an inch in thickness to a height of three feet from the floor;
 - (c) no ceiling or loft capable of harbouring rats.
- (ii.) All bags shall be kept on platforms 18 inches in height and 18 inches away from the internal walls of the rooms.
- (iii.) The premises shall be cleaned and limewashed internally and externally twice annually.

 (2) A Retail Dry Fish Licence or a Retail Nettelie
- Licence shall not be issued unless the following conditions are complied with :-

 - (i.) The room in which dry fish is kept for sale or stored shall have a proper cement floor;
 (ii.) the inner surface of all the walls of the room shall be plastered with cement not less than half an inch in thickness to a height of 3 feet from the floor: (iii.) the premises shall be cleaned and limewashed
 - internally and externally at the beginning of each year before the licence or a renewal thereof is applied for.
- (3) (i.) The issue of Wholesale Dry Fish Licences or Wholesale Nettelie Licences is prohibited within the Municipal limits except in the following defined areas:—

 - (e) That section of Malabar street from Lady Mac Carthy's road to Municipal limits.
 - (f) That section of Ampitiya road from No. 11/10 to Municipal limits.

 - (2) In determining for the purposes of this rule the pension for which an officer would have been eligible if his service had been wholly under the Council,
 - (a) the final pensionable emoluments taken shall be those of his last period of service calculated in accordance with the rules applicable thereto;
 - (b) no regard shall be had to rules 5 and 22;
 - (c) regard shall be had to the condition that pension may not exceed two-thirds of the final pensionable emoluments;
 - (d) no period of other public service under any Government, local government public body or other employing authority which does not grant a pension or gratuity to the officer shall be taken into account.
 - (3) For the purposes of this rule-

- (4) Where an officer who has been transferred from other public service and whose aggregate service would have qualified him, had it been wholly under the Council to retire on pension under these rules, is compulsorily retired from the service of the Council on abolition of office, he may, be granted from the funds of the Council in addition to the pension granted to him under this rule an addition to pension equal to 1-720th of his final pensionable emoluments for each complete period of four months' service included in the calculation of the pension for which he would have been eligible had the whole of his service been under the Council.

Provided that the number of 720ths of final pensionable emoluments grantable as addition to pension under the first part of this sub-section shall not exceed the number of months by which the officer's age at retirement falls short of 55 years or 60-720ths, whichever is less.

Provided further that the officer who is thus retired shall be liable to be recalled to the service of the Council for re-employment.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated September 25, 1935.

- 1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of September 4, 1935, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.
- 2. To submit, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the financial year, 1934.

The Chairman moved that, in terms of section 102 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, the Chairman's Administration Report for the figure 1934, be submitted to His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

- 2A. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. R. A. Razik, presented a petition from the stall-holders of Quarry road market praying that in view of the fact that 3 months' rent have been deposited by them the 10 per cent. warrant cost chargeable in the event of their failure to pay the monthly rent on the 10th of each month be waived, and requested that the petition be submitted to the appropriate Committee for consideration and report.
- 28. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. R. A. Razik, presented a petition from the Registered Gala-keepers within the Municipality of plombo, praying that they be exempted from the payment of water rate and requested that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration.
- 3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando moved:—"In view of the fact that the sale of Petrol, Kerosene Oil and Methylated Spirits is allowed in any area of the city subject to necessary precautions, while on the other hand, the sale of coconut oil is restricted to Wolfendhal and the Offensive and Dangerous Trades areas alone, this Council with a view to encouraging the coconut industry and also to make coconut oil available to all classes in the city directs the Housing and Town Improvement Committee to consider the question of permitting the sale of coconut oil, over 50 gallons, in other parts of the city subject to necessary safeguards." Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Chairman stated that he had no objection to the motion being referred to the Housing and Town Improvement Committee.

The motion was put to the meeting and carried.

4. Pursuant to notice, Mr. A. E. 16.—Remission, Reduction, or Waiver of Annual Payments.

(8) Where the price exceeds Rs. 100, the balance amount of the purchase money shall be paid by the purchaser on or before the thirtieth day after the sale of the holding, or if the thirtieth day be a Sunday or a public holiday, then on the first working day after the thirtieth day. Provided that the Government Agent may at his discretion grant further time for payment.
(9) In default of payment within the period mentioned in the last preceding regulation, the deposit shall be declared forfeited and the holding shall be re-advertised. The forfeited deposit shall be applied to defraying the costs of the sale and any balance remaining to reduction of the amount due to the Crown in respect of the holding. The defaulting purchaser shall have no claim to the holding or to any part of the sum for which it may subsequently be re-sold.
(10) The Government Agent or the officer conducting a sale may in his discretion refuse to accept any bid, and may continue the sale as if no such bid had been made. (11) No officer having any duty to perform in connection with any sale shall either himself or through any other person bid for, acquire, or attempt to acquire any interest in any holding at such sale. (12) In all cases, the sale shall be conducted on the spot unless the Government Agent
otherwise directs.
23.—Form of Certificate of Sale (where some person other than the Crown is the purchaser.)

24.—Form of Certificate of Sale (when the Crown is the purchaser.)

The selection of persons to receive permits shall ordinarily be made at a Land Kachcheri. Provided that the Government Agent may make such a selection otherwise than at a Land Kachcheri in the following cases:—

- (a) Where the Government Agent is satisfied that the interests of the owner or permitholder of any adjacent land require the immediate allotment or reallotment of any piece of Crown land.
- (b) Where a permit-holder desires that his land should be transferred to another person and the Government Agent approves of the cancellation of his permit and the reallotment of the land to that other person.
- (c) In any other case not specially provided for in which the Government Agent is satisfied that immediate allotment is desirable in the interests of the applicants and that there are no other interests in the land in question which are likely to be prejudiced.

28.—Survey Fees and Other Deposits.

- 1. The Government Agent may in a notice under section 21 require any applicant for land to deposit in the Kachcheri with his application a sum not exceeding Rs. 3 per acre or part of an acre of the extent of the land applied for. This money shall be kept to the credit of the applicant and if he is selected to receive a permit or a grant, utilized after the lapse of one year to defray the whole or part of any annual or other payments due from him to the Crown. If owing to any action or omission of the applicant Government is put to the expense of an unnecessary survey the deposit shall be forfeited and credited to the revenue. In any case of dispute the Land Commissioner's decision as to whether any particular deposit shall or shall not be forfeited shall be final. If the applicant is not selected to receive a permit or a grant and if his deposit is not forfeited it shall be refunded to him.
- 2. If the Government Agent has reason to believe that any person selected to receive a permit for Crown land is likely to abandon that land after taking one or more crops or removing timber or firewood therefrom, the Government Agent may require that person before he is put in possession of the land to deposit as a guarantee of good faith such sum as the Government Agent may specify not exceeding a total calculated at the rate of Rs. 15 per acre of the extent of that land. The money so deposited shall be utilized to defray annual payments as they fall due. If, however, the permit is finally cancelled owing to that person's abandoning the land or owing to any fault of that person the balance of the deposit shall be credited to revenue.

29.—Alienation of Crown Land over 5,000 feet in elevation.

(See Section 156 (3).)

(1) No Crown land of an elevation of over 5,000 feet shall be alienated except in such localities as may be determined by the Executive Committee of Agriculture and Lands and approved by the Governor.

(2) No person shall be given either on permit or grant an allotment of such land exceeding 5 acres in extent.

30.—Collection of Annual Payments.

(See Section 156 (5).)

(1) The Government Agent may appoint officers to collect annual payments or other moneys due to the Crown in respect of holdings or lands given on permit in any locality within his Province.

(2) The Executive Committee may, in consultation with the Financial Secretary, fix the rate of commission, not exceeding 10 per cent. of the moneys collected, to be paid to such officers.

31.—Appeals to Executive Committee.

(See Sections 45, 76(3), 79, and 156(8).)

(1) Every appeal to the Executive Committee under the provisions of the Ordinance shall be preferred by a written statement setting out the grounds of appeal and signed by the appellant.

(2) Every such statement shall bear a stamp of the value of one rupee.

(3) Every statement of appeal shall be delivered or sent by registered post to the Clerk of the Executive Committee within the 14 days next following the date on which the decision appealed against was communicated to the appellant: Provided, however, that the Executive Committee may in its discretion consider any appeal notwithstanding that it is not in time under this regulation.

32.—Assessment of Annual Payments.

(See Section 156 (10).)

(1) Where any person receives a grant of any land previously held and improved by him upon a permit the value of that land for the purpose of fixing the annual payment payable under the grant shall be its value on the date of the permit issued to him.

(2) The annual payment in respect of any land or any class or description of land alienated by grant or permit shall be such percentage of its value as the Land Commissioner may from time to time approve having regard to the locality, the quality of the soil, and the use to which the land may reasonably be expected to be put by the grantee or permitholder.

(3) Any fraction of a rupee forming part of the amount arrived at in computing any annual payment shall be reckoned as the next highest multiple of 25 cents.

33.—Authentication of Permits and Endorsements.

(See Section 156 (11).)

(1) All permits issued under this Ordinance shall be signed by the Government Agent. Provided that the Government Agent may with the express permission of the Land Commissioner authorize in writing his Office Assistant by name to sign permits on his behalf.

(2) An endorsement under any of the sections 143 (2), 149 (1), or 150 (1), may be set out on a separate slip attached to the grant or certificate and signed by the Government Agent.

34.—Proportionate Payment for outstanding Portions of a Year.

(See Section 156 (11).)

(1) In respect of the period intervening between the date when any person selected to receive a grant or permit is put into possession of the land and the date upon which the first annual payment is due under the grant or permit, the Government Agent may require that person to pay a sum of money bearing the same proportion to the amount of the annual payment specified in the grant or permit as the number of months in the aforesaid period beauty to 12 months. Provided that in calculation the number of the period bears to 12 months. Provided that in calculating the number of months in any such period any portion of a month left over shall be taken as one full month. Provided further that any fraction of a rupee forming part of the amount arrived at in computing that sum of money shall be reckoned as the next highest multiple of 25 cents.

(2) When a person who already holds a piece of Crown land on a permit is selected to receive a grant for that land the Government Agent may in respect of any period which is not covered by an annual payment under the permit or under the grant require that rson to pay a sum calculated in the manner prescribed in the last preceding regulation. pe(3) For the purpose of these regulations every annual payment shall be deemed to be a payment in respect of the year which commences on the date when the payment falls due. due.

35.—Additional purposes for which Crown Land may be Mapped-out.

The following purpose for which Crown land may be mapped-out shall be added to the purposes specified in section 8 of the Ordinance, viz.:

* "Mining and Gemming".
