THE MOTOR CAR (CONVENTION) ORDINANCE,
No. 25 OF 1932.

REGULATIONS under the amended section 2 (1) of the Motor Car (Convention) Ordinance, No. 25 of 1932, made by the Executive Committee of Local Administration, approved by the State Council, and ratified by the Officer Administering the Government of Ceylon.

Regulations.

I.—PRELIMINARY.

1. These regulations may be cited as the International Circulation of Motor Vehicles Regulations, 1935.

2. In these regulations unless the context otherwise requires—

“the 1926 Convention” means the International Convention relative to Motor Traffic signed at Paris on April 24, 1926;

“the 1931 Convention” means the International Convention regarding the Taxation of Foreign Motor Vehicles signed at Geneva on March 30, 1931.

3. (1) The prescribed officer, for the purpose of granting and authenticating driving passes, certificates, fiscal permits or authorities which may be issued under the Ordinance, shall be the Registrar of Motor Cars appointed under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927 (hereinafter called “the Registrar”).

(2) The prescribed association for the aforesaid purpose shall be the Automobile Association of Ceylon or any other association that may from time to time be nominated by the Executive Committee of Local Administration by Notification in the *Gazette*.

II.—ISSUE OF INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATES FOR
MOTOR VEHICLES AND FISCAL PERMITS IN
CEYLON.

1. Any person ordinarily resident in Ceylon may obtain in the manner hereinafter prescribed, international authorization to take abroad, for the purposes of travel, any motor vehicle of which he is the owner or of which he is otherwise in lawful possession.

2. An application for such authorization shall be forwarded to the Registrar or to the prescribed association, in the Form 1 set out in Schedule I. to these regulations, together with the Certificate of the registration of the vehicle, and proof of the payment of the licence duty due on the vehicle for the year in which such application is made.

3. Every vehicle in respect of which such application is made, shall be examined by a special examiner, appointed for the purpose by the Registrar, or nominated by the prescribed association with the written approval of the Registrar.

4. Before the vehicle is examined, an examination fee of Rs. 5 for a car or Rs. 2.50 for a motor cycle, shall be paid to the examiner by the applicant.

5. If the vehicle is approved by the examiner and certified by him to be in conformity with Article 3 of the 1926 Convention, the applicant shall forward to the Registrar or to the prescribed association a fee of Rs. 2.50 in Ceylon revenue stamps.

6. (1) The applicant shall further cause a distinguishing mark, consisting of the letters CL of the size and description, set out in the extract from Annex C to the 1926 Convention reproduced in Schedule II. hereto, to be affixed to the rear of the vehicle, either on a special plate according to the specifications in Annex C or on the vehicle itself.

(2) Such mark shall remain so affixed throughout the period during which the vehicle is abroad.

7. An International Certificate for the vehicle so approved and marked shall thereupon be issued in the Form set out in Annex B to the 1926 Convention under the hand and seal of the Registrar, or where the Certificate is issued by the prescribed association, authenticated with the seal and signature of the Registrar; and such certificate shall, if the conditions laid down in the 1926 Convention continue in all respects to be fulfilled and observed, be valid for one year from the date thereof.

8. Together with the International Certificate there shall also be issued for each such vehicle a Fiscal Permit in the form set out in the Annex to the 1931 Convention and signed and sealed or authenticated in like manner as the International Certificate: Provided, however, that no Fiscal Permit shall be issued for any vehicle which is to be used abroad as a public vehicle for the carriage of passengers for hire or reward or for the conveyance of goods.

9. During the period of one year calculated from the date of issue, for which a Fiscal Permit will be valid under Article 5 of the 1931 Convention—

(a) all alterations or amendments rendered necessary in that Permit by any change of ownership or possession or of the registration number of the vehicle, shall be made and authenticated by the Registrar or the prescribed association;

(b) no duplicate of that Permit shall for any reason be issued; and

(c) no new Permit shall be issued for the vehicle for which the first mentioned Permit was issued: Provided, however, that nothing in this regulation shall be deemed to prohibit the issue of a new Fiscal Permit for any vehicle which is registered in Ceylon at any time during the period of validity of a Permit issued for that vehicle in any other country which is a party to the Convention.

III.—ISSUE OF INTERNATIONAL DRIVING PERMITS IN CEYLON.

1. Any person ordinarily resident in Ceylon may obtain, in the manner hereinafter prescribed, an International Driving Pass, in these regulations to be called a Driving Permit, authorizing him to drive a motor vehicle, whilst travelling abroad in any of the contracting states or the states or territories that have acceded to the 1926 Convention.

2. An application for such Driving Permit shall be in the Form 2 in Schedule I., and may be forwarded either to the Registrar or to the prescribed association.

3. Every applicant shall be examined by a special examiner, appointed for the purpose by the Registrar, or nominated by the prescribed association with the written approval of the Registrar.

4. The applicant shall pay such examiner an examination fee of Rs. 5.

5. If the applicant is found after such examination to fulfil the conditions of Article 6 of the 1926 Convention, he shall forward to the Registrar or to the prescribed association a fee of Rs. 2.50 in Ceylon revenue stamps.

6. An International Driving Permit, in the Form set out in Annex E to the 1926 Convention, shall thereupon be issued to him under the hand and seal of the Registrar, or where the Driving Permit is issued by the prescribed association, authenticated with the seal and signature of the Registrar.

7. Every such Driving Permit shall specify the class or classes of vehicles that the holder thereof is authorized to drive; and for the purposes of these regulations, the following shall be substituted for the classification of motor cars set out in section 37 (9) of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927:—

Class I.—Motor Vehicle of which the total weight when loaded with the maximum load which it is officially declared to be capable of carrying does not exceed 7,700 lb.

Class II.—Motor Vehicle of which the total weight made up as above exceeds 7,700 lb.

Class III.—Motor cycle with or without a side car.

IV.—RECOGNITION OF INTERNATIONAL CERTIFICATES, FISCAL PERMITS AND INTERNATIONAL DRIVING PERMITS IN CEYLON.

1. (1) In lieu of the provisions of Chapter V of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, relating to the licensing of motor cars and the licence duty payable therefor, the provisions of this regulation shall apply to every motor vehicle in respect of which a valid International Certificate and Fiscal Permit issued in any country which is a party to the 1926 and the 1931 Conventions, are produced at the time the vehicle is brought into Ceylon.

(2) Every such vehicle may be landed and used in Ceylon free of Customs duty and of the licence duty payable under the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, for one or more periods not exceeding 90 days in the aggregate during the year commencing on the date of issue of the Fiscal Permit, if—

- (a) the Permit has been duly endorsed by the proper officer at the Customs office at the port of embarkation in the last country visited and at the port of arrival in Ceylon;
- (b) the Certificate has been produced before the Registrar and duly endorsed by him for use in Ceylon;
- (c) the holder of the Permit and the Certificate is proved to the satisfaction of the Registrar to be a *bona fide* visitor to Ceylon; and
- (d) the vehicle is proved to be the vehicle for which the Permit and the Certificate were issued.

(3) For the purpose of computing the period of 90 days specified in paragraph (1) of this regulation—

- (a) each day shall be reckoned from midnight to midnight;

(b) every fraction of a day shall be counted as a whole day; and

(c) the day of departure shall be excluded, except in a case where the day of arrival and the day of departure are separated by an interval not exceeding one day.

(4) Where any motor vehicle to which paragraph (1) of this regulation applies, is used in Ceylon for any period or an aggregate of periods exceeding 90 days in any year for which a Fiscal Permit is valid, licence duty for the excess period shall be paid to the Registrar in Ceylon Revenue Stamps at the following rates:—

Licence duty for each complete month of 30 days comprised in the excess period, any fraction of a month being counted as a whole month.

2. The provisions of sections 18, 20, 21 and 24 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, relating to the registration and cancellation of the registration of motor vehicles shall not apply to any motor vehicle in respect of which an International Certificate valid within the meaning of Article 4 of the 1926 Convention is produced before the Registrar for endorsement at the time the vehicle is brought into Ceylon.

3. (1) In lieu of the provisions of section 38 of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, the provisions of this regulation shall apply to any International Driving Permit issued to any person who is a *bona fide* visitor to Ceylon by any of the contracting states or the states or territories that have acceded to the 1926 Convention.

(2) Any such person shall be deemed to possess a Certificate of competence issued under the provisions of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, and to be authorized to drive the class of vehicle specified in the Driving Permit,—

- (a) if the Permit is valid within the meaning of Article 7 of the 1926 Convention; and
- (b) if before he drives any vehicle in Ceylon he produces the Permit for inspection by the Registrar; and
- (c) if he fulfils in all respects the conditions set out in Article 6 of the 1926 Convention.

4. (1) The provisions of section 39 (1) of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, relating to the suspension, cancellation, and endorsement, by the court, of the Certificate of competence held by any person convicted of an offence against the said Ordinance, shall not apply to any *bona fide* visitor to Ceylon holding an International Driving Permit.

(2) In the event of any such visitor being convicted of an offence punishable in Ceylon with the suspension or cancellation of the Certificate of competence, the Registrar may in his discretion make an order, in the Form 4 in Annex E to the 1926 Convention, depriving such visitor of the right to drive in Ceylon.

5. The second schedule to the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, is hereby modified by the substitution in the last item thereof, relating to temporary Certificates of competence issued under section 37 (17), for the words "per month or part of a month", of the words "for the entire period of 3 months or for any part thereof".

6. Save as aforesaid, the provisions of Chapters I, II, IV, VI, VII, VIII, and X of the Motor Car Ordinance, 1927, so far as they are not inconsistent with the tenor of these regulations and the purposes of the Conventions, shall apply to every motor vehicle brought to Ceylon on the authority of an International Certificate, and to every person visiting Ceylon with an International Driving Permit.

V.—SUPPLEMENTARY.

1. It shall be the duty of the Principal Collector of Customs in Colombo and of the Sub-Collectors of Customs at Trincomalee and Talaimannar, within one week of any motor vehicle, other than a vehicle imported by a recognized dealer, being passed for delivery to any person in Ceylon, to forward to the Registrar a complete description of such vehicle and the name and address of the person by or for whom it was brought to Ceylon.

2. No motor vehicle shall be permitted by the Customs authority of any port in Ceylon, to be taken out of the Island without a Permit in that behalf issued under the hand of the Registrar.

VI.—REPEAL.

The regulations published by Notification in the *Gazette* of December 23, 1932, are hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE II.

Extract from Annex C to the 1926 Convention.

The distinctive sign laid down in Article 5 is formed of an oval plate 30 cms. wide by 18 cms. high bearing from one to three letters painted in black on a white ground. The letters are formed of capital Latin Characters. They are of a height of at least 10 cms. and their strokes are of a width of at least 15 mms.

In so far as concerns the motor cycles the distinctive sign provided for in Article 5 will measure only 18 cms. horizontally and 12 cms. vertically. The letters will measure 8 cms. in height ; the width of their strokes being 10 mms.

REGULATIONS made by the proper authority in that behalf, to wit, the Weligama Urban District Council, under section 23 of the Butchers' Ordinance, 1893, and approved by the Local Government Board and confirmed by the Officer Administering the Government in pursuance of the powers vested in the Governor by the said section 23 and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

The regulations dated September 11, 1935, published in the *Gazette* of September 20, 1935, are hereby cancelled.

REGULATIONS REFERRED TO.

1. The cattle-pound at Perumatotam shall be the spot in which the licensed butchers of the urban area of Weligama shall, as required by section 12 (1) of the Ordinance, expose for public view cattle, sheep, goats, or pigs intended for slaughter for a period of not less than 24 hours immediately preceding the time of slaughter.

2. The public slaughter-house proclaimed under section 22 of the Ordinance shall be in charge of the Sanitary Inspector of the Weligama Urban District Council, who shall be responsible for its discipline and sanitary condition.

3. No animal shall be slaughtered at the slaughter-house except between 7 A.M. and 9 A.M., nor until after it has been inspected and approved by the officer appointed for the purpose by the Council as fit to be slaughtered for human food.

4. Any animal rejected as unfit for slaughter shall be immediately removed.

5. The Medical Officer, Weligama, or the officer appointed by the Council may prohibit the slaughter of any animal if after it has been approved as aforesaid, and before slaughter it is found to be diseased or unfit to be slaughtered for human food.

6. If after the slaughter of any animal which has been approved as aforesaid, the carcass shall appear diseased or unfit for human food, the Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, shall cause the meat to be immediately destroyed or so disposed of as to prevent it being exposed for sale or used for human food.

7. The officer in charge of the slaughter-house shall not permit the slaughter of any animal which has not been approved as fit to be slaughtered for human food, or the slaughter of which has been prohibited as provided in regulation 5.

8. No person shall remove from the slaughter-house, except under the direction of the Medical Officer or the officer appointed by the Council, any meat which has been declared as unfit for human food.

9. No animal shall be slaughtered in the presence of other animals, or until the carcass of any animal previously slaughtered shall have been removed or screened off and the premises cleansed.

10. The following fees shall be paid in advance to the Council for the use of the slaughter-house :—

These rates shall cover exposure in the proper spot for 24 hours. An additional fee at one half the above rates shall be paid for each further period of 24 hours' exposure or any part thereof.

B—Vehicles which when fully laden exceed 7,700 lb.

C—Motor cycles with or without side cars.

to retain a reasonable number of duplicates, but shall not in any case be permitted to retain any typical or unique specimen.

34. (1) The Director may on application provide facilities for research to any person specially interested in the collections at the Museum.

(2) Any order by the Director on any such application shall be subject to appeal to the Committee of Management.

MUSEUM STAFF.

35. In addition to the Director, the Museum staff shall include (a) the Librarian, who shall also be Secretary of the Museum, (b) Assistants in Systematic Entomology and Ethnology, (c) Taxidermists, and (d) such other officers as may from time to time be found necessary for the administration of the Museum and the custody of the collections.

36. The duties of each member of the Museum staff other than the Director shall be determined by the Managing Committee.

REPEAL.

37. The rules and regulations published in the *Gazette* of February 28, 1913, and March 16, 1923, are hereby rescinded.

Rules.

Rules 1 to 5 of the rules set out in the schedule to the Ordinance are hereby repealed and the following rules substituted therefor.

COMMITTEE.

1. The Committee of Management shall be constituted as follows:—

President: His Excellency the Governor.

Vice-Presidents: The Chief Justice.

The Chief Secretary.

Other Members: The Director of Education.

The Principal, University College.

The Director, Colombo Museum.

The Archæological Commissioner.

The President, Royal Asiatic Society.

Such other members as may from time to time be nominated by the Governor (of whom three at least shall be persons not holding office under the Government). Such nominated members shall be appointed for a period of 3 years at a time.

2. The Committee of Management shall be the managing body of the Museum subject to general control by the Executive Committee of Education and the State Council.

3. (a) The Committee shall meet once a quarter.

(b) Meetings of the Committee other than the quarterly meetings may be summoned at the discretion of the President or on receipt of a written requisition signed by seven members of the Committee.

4. All meetings of the Committee shall be summoned by circular under the hand of the Secretary addressed to the members specifying the hour and place of the meeting and the proposed business of the meeting and 10 days' notice of the meeting shall ordinarily be given.

5. Five members shall constitute a quorum at all meetings of the Committee.

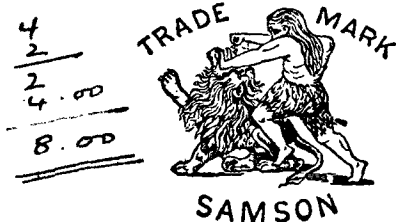

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—

- (a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes and house-service taps inspected during September, 1935.
- (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. (1) Mr. de Silva suggested that the Municipal Electrical Engineer be asked to report whether it was possible to supply electricity for cooking purposes during the day at cheap rates.

Chairman agreed to do so.

(2) Mr. Wijayatilake enquired whether, in view of the rise in the level of the reservoir, the hours of supply of water could be extended and all lorries employed for distribution of water stopped.

Chairman stated that hours of supply had been extended already 4 lorries were stopped on October 18, and the other 2 lorries now employed for supply of water to bungalows in the higher levels would also be stopped as soon as the water in the reservoir rose within 5 feet of spill level. It was 8½ feet that morning.

4. Petitions :—Mr. de Silva presented (1) letter addressed by Mr. G. Marapana to Mr. de Silva dated October 15, 1935, enclosing copies of correspondence between Mr. Marapana and the Municipal Council and the Public Works Department on the subject of the drain passing through Mr. Marapana's property bearing No. 11/10, Ampitiya.

Mr. Marikar presented (2) Letter addressed by Mr. S. P. Samarasinghe and others to Mr. Marikar suggesting the erection of a lamp post at the turn off to Lady Torrington road.

Mr. de Silva presented (3) Petition from Mr. A. Amirdeen dated October 17, 1935, praying that the usual premium of Rs. 50 be levied for the transfer of half share of beef stall No. 2 in the Public Market in his favour instead of Rs. 200 proposed by the Markets Committee.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented (4) Petition from Mr. N. A. D. Cornelis Appuhamy dated October 18, 1935, applying for Market Stall No. 22 on a rent of Rs. 27.50 per mensem.

(5) Petition from Mr. D. P. Epa dated October 17, 1935, on the subject of the water supply to premises No. 26E, Mulgampola, and

(6) Letter addressed by Mr. W. H. Pate to Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake dated October 13, 1935, suggesting the removal of a dangerous corner in Railway Approach road.

Resolved to refer (1) and (6) to the Municipal Engineer for report, (2) to Municipal Electrical Engineer for report, to consider (3) and (4) with the respective items of the Standing Committee recommendations and to refer (5) to Law Committee for consideration.

5. Correspondence :—(a) Copy of letter No. J 40/34 of September 27, 1935, from the Chief Secretary to the address of Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson stating that His Excellency the Officer Administering the Government has been pleased to appoint him to be Chairman, Municipal Council, Kandy ; Additional Assistant Government Agent, and Local Authority under the Petroleum Ordinance within the limits of the Kandy Municipality from about November 6, 1935. (b) Letter from the Chief Secretary dated October 3, 1935, stating that it will be necessary to invite the Council to provide for the payment of the emoluments of the new Chairman either in whole or in part.—Tabled.

Resolved that the Council approve in principal the proposal to divide the time of the officer appointed to the post of Chairman between the Municipality and the Kachcheri and that in the case of Mr. Rogerson the Council agree to pay—half his salary, Rs. 10,875 ; rent allowance, Rs. 870 ; Pensionary contribution, Rs. 870 ; Travelling allowance, Rs. 1,500. Total, Rs. 14,115, but that the Chairman represent to Government that it should consider the question of making a junior Civil Servant available for the post as soon as possible, seeing that the Municipal Council of Kandy can ill afford to pay half salary of an officer of Mr. Rogerson's status in the Civil Service.

6. Recommendations of the Standing Committees.

(6) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 250 under Head 6, Conservancy of Latrines, petrol for lorries.—Recommended.

(7) To obtain a supplementary vote of Rs. 25 under "Cemetery Sundries Vote" for meeting the cost of the extra equipment necessary up to the end of the year.—Recommended.

(8) Application from Mr. D. J. A. Abeyasinghe for a promotion to the Special Grade with effect from September 1, 1935.—Recommended (1) that an additional post in the Special Grade be created on the salary scale of Rs. 3,180—180—Rs. 4,200 (old scheme) ; and (2) that Mr. Abeyasinghe be promoted to the Special Grade as from September 1, 1935.

(9) Applications from Mr. A. J. K. Marikar and Mr. W. A. de Alwis Senewiratne for promotion to the 1st Grade with effect from January 1, next and August 15 next respectively on completion of their stagnation periods at the top of Grade II.—Recommended.

(10) Application from Mr. B. Chas. de Silva for promotion to Grade II. in the Council's service with effect from January 1, next, on completion of his halt of two years at the top of Grade III. (O 68).—Recommended.

(11) Applications received from—(a) Mr. A. N. P. Widyasekera, Chief Physician; (b) Mr. G. S. Piyasekera, Assistant Physician; (c) Mr. M. N. Themaris, Dispenser; of the Municipal Free Ayurvedic Dispensary asking for increase of pay.—Recommended that Mr. Widyasekera be placed on a salary scale of Rs. 600—Rs. 30—Rs. 900 with his present rent allowance, and that the other two applications be refused.

“Officers admitted to the Municipal Service on or after August 26, 1934, or officers who held temporary appointments on August 26, 1934, and were placed on the salary scales provided in the Salary Scheme of 1934, after that date may be granted vacation leave not exceeding 4 weeks and 8 weeks and casual leave not exceeding 7 days, as against periods of 6 weeks, three months and 14 days respectively.”
