8. A new-entrant to the public service will before appointment be required to pass a medical examination.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 37 of the Co-operative Societies Ordinance, No. 34 of 1921, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931.

## RULES UNDER SECTION 37.

1. Every application for the registration of a society shall be submitted to the Registrar.

2. With every such application there shall be forwarded two copies of the by-laws which the society proposes to adopt.

3. The Registrar shall issue a certificate of registration under his hand and seal in respect of every society registered by him in the form set out in the schedule to these rules.

4. When the Registrar has approved of the proposed by-laws, he shall register them and shall return one copy duly endorsed and signed to the society.

5. A copy of the Ordinance and a copy of the rules made thereunder in the language in which the books and accounts of the society are to be kept shall be sent free to every new society on registration.

6. In the case of any society of unlimited liability—

(a) a member who is not in debt to the society and is not surety for an unpaid debt may withdraw from the society after giving one month's notice to the Secretary;

(b) a member who ceases to be qualified under the by-laws shall be removed by the Committee;

(c) a member may be removed or expelled from the society in such way and for such cause only as may be prescribed in the by-laws;

(d) a member withdrawing, removed or expelled from the society shall be entitled to repayment without interest of any money paid by him or his predecessor in interest towards the purchase of shares, after the period prescribed in the by-laws.

7. In the case of any society of limited liability holding deposits or loans from non-members, no member withdrawing, removed or expelled shall be entitled to a repayment of any money paid by him towards the purchase of shares.

8. No primary society shall fix any limit to the number of its members.

9. (1) Every appointment of a nominee by any member of a registered society for the purposes of section 21 of the Ordinance shall be made in writing signed by the member in the presence of two attesting witnesses.

(2) No member of a society with share capital shall be entitled to appoint more than one nominee unless that member holds more than one share.

(3) In every case where more than one nominee is appointed by any member, the number of shares to be transferred to the exact

proportion of the amount available that is to be transferred to each of those nominees shall be specified at the time of the appointment.

(4) Every appointment of a nominee shall be recorded in the Register of Members.

(5) For the purposes of a transfer to a nominee, the value of any share or interest shall be represented by the sum actually paid for that share or interest by the member holding it, unless the by-laws of the society otherwise provide.

(6) Where any money is paid to a nominee who is a minor, a receipt given either by the minor or by his guardian shall be a sufficient discharge to the society making the payment.

10. No member, other than a registered society, shall hold more than one-fifth of the share capital of a co-operative society whether its liability be limited or unlimited.

11. (i.) In societies with unlimited liability and with shares no dividend shall be paid until the Registrar is satisfied that the Reserve Fund is sufficient to cover the liabilities of the societies.

(ii.) In societies with no share capital no part of the fund shall be divided amongst the members as dividend or otherwise. This rule shall not apply to Thrift Societies.

(iii.) Without the sanction of the Registrar, no part of the funds of a society shall be divided as bonus or dividend or otherwise among the members until the entire expenditure incurred by the society during the year has been debited in the annual profit and loss account before the net profit was calculated.

(iv.) No dividend shall be paid by any society while any claim due from the society to a depositor or lender remains unsatisfied.

(v.) No society shall pay a dividend exceeding nine per cent. on share capital actually paid up.

(vi.) The Registrar may by general or special order direct that a society shall not pay a dividend or shall pay dividends at a reduced rate so long as it receives loans or deposits from non-members other than a central bank.

12. Every primary credit society shall, from time to time, fix in a general meeting the maximum liability it may incur in loans or deposits from non-members.

The maximum so fixed shall be subject to the sanction of the Registrar, who may at any time reduce it. No society may receive any loans or deposit from a non-member which will make its liability to non-members exceed the limit sanctioned by the Registrar.

13. (a) Every society shall from time to time hold General Meetings as provided in the by-laws for the disposal of necessary business including—

(i.) the fixing of a maximum liability as required by rule 12;

(ii.) the fixing of a maximum credit for each member;

(iii.) the election of members of the committee;

(iv.) the consideration of the annual balance sheet; and

(v.) the consideration of the audit note and any inspection note by the Registrar or person authorized by him.

(b) Questions before the General Meeting shall be decided, unless otherwise specifically provided, by a majority of members present. Each member present shall have one vote and no more, irrespective of the number of shares held. In primary societies no proxies shall be allowed.

(c) The Registrar or any person authorized by him may at any time summon a special General Meeting of the society in such manner and at such time and place as he may direct. He may also direct what matters shall be discussed at the Meeting. Such Meeting shall have all the powers and be subject to the same rules as a Meeting called according to the by-laws of the society.

14. Members of the Committee shall be appointed and may be removed or suspended in General Meeting by a majority of the members present.

15. No member shall be qualified for election to the committee if—

(i.) he is under 21 years of age; or

(ii.) he holds any office of profit under the society or receives any honorarium; or

(iii.) in the case of a credit society, he lends money on his own account.

16. A member of the Committee shall cease to hold office if—

(i.) he ceases to be a shareholder; or

(ii.) he is declared insolvent; or

(iii.) he becomes of unsound mind; or

(iv.) he is convicted of any offence involving dishonesty or is imprisoned for three months; or

(v.) he accepts any office of profit under the society or receives any honorarium; or

(vi.) in the case of a credit society, he lends money on his own account.

17. The Committee shall exercise all the powers of the society except those reserved for the General Meeting, and subject to any regulations or restrictions duly laid down by the society in General Meeting or in the by-laws.

18. The duties of the Committee shall include the following:—

(i.) to comply with the Ordinance and with the rules made thereunder, and the by-laws of the society,

(ii.) to maintain true and accurate accounts,

(iii.) to keep a true account of the assets and liabilities,

(iv.) to keep a correct register of members,

(v.) to lay before the Annual General Meeting a profit and loss account and a Balance Sheet, and

(vi.) to assist the inspection of books by any person authorized to see them, and

(vii.) in the case of a credit society, to watch that loans are applied to the approved purpose for which they were advanced.

19. A society shall make by-laws in respect of the following matters:—

(i.) Name,

(ii.) registered address,

(iii.) objects for which the society was established,

(iv.) purposes to which the funds may be applied,

(v.) qualifications for membership, the terms of admission of members, and the mode of election,

(vi.) nature and extent of the liability of members,

(vii.) withdrawal and expulsion of members, and the payments, if any, to be made to such members,

(viii.) transfer of the share or interest of members,

(ix.) manner of raising funds, including the maximum rate of interest on deposits,

(x.) General Meetings and the procedure and powers of such meetings,

(xi.) appointment, suspension, and removal of members of the Committee and officers, and the powers and duties of the Committee and officers.

If the objects of the society include the creation of funds to be lent to the members, additional by-laws shall be made on the following matters:—

(xii.) the occupation or residence of the members,

(xiii.) the conditions on which loans may be made to members, including—

(a) the rate of interest,

(b) the maximum amount which may be lent to a member,

(c) extension of the term and renewal of loans,

(d) the purpose of loans,

(e) security for repayment.

Maximum holding.

Division of profits.

Maximum liability.

Compulsory by-laws.

General Meetings.

The Committee.

- (xiv.) the consequences, if any, of default in payment of any sum due on account of shares or loans, disposal of the profits, and
- (xv.) the authorization of an officer to sign documents on behalf of the society.

20. (i.) Subject to the provisions of section 9 of the Ordinance and to rule 19 of these rules a society may from time to time make new by-laws for the conduct of its business, or may amend or cancel any by-law already made.

(ii.) Such additions, amendments or cancellations shall only be made by resolution at a General Meeting of the society; in the case of societies with unlimited liability, the resolution must receive the assent of three-fourths of the members present in a meeting attended by not less than one-half of the members; in the case of societies of limited liability the resolution must receive the votes (which may be in writing) of a clear majority of the total number of members of the society. If written votes are used, voting papers must be sent to all members and the written votes must be examined and counted at a General Meeting at which there is present a quorum in terms of the by-laws of the society.

(iii.) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraphs (i.) and (ii.) of this rule any by-laws and any amendments which have received the previous approval of the Registrar may be adopted by a majority of two-thirds of the members present at a General Meeting of which due notice of the intention to discuss such model by-laws or amendments has been given.

(iv.) When any by-law is amended, along with any copy thereof the society shall send to the Registrar a statement signed by the officers of the society that the provisions of paragraphs (ii.) or (iii.) above have been complied with.

21. Every credit society shall maintain—

(i.) a cash book;

(ii.) a ledger account for each member;

(iii.) a loan ledger;

(iv.) a register of deposits;

(v.) a minute book; and

(vi.) such other books as may be prescribed by the Registrar.

22. Every Central Bank shall exhibit its annual Balance Sheet to any person desiring to see it during office hours. Every primary society shall permit inspection of its annual Balance Sheet by any person interested in its funds as member, depositor or creditor.

23. The Committee of every society, or some officers of the society appointed for this purpose by the Committee shall prepare yearly in such form as may be prescribed by the Registrar—

- (i.) an account showing the income and expenditure for the year,
- (ii.) a profit and loss account, and
- (iii.) a Balance Sheet.

The account shall be made up to the 30th April for primary societies and to the 31st May for secondary societies, and a copy shall be sent to the Registrar within such time as he may direct.

24. (i.) Every registered society shall, when called upon to do so, make annually a contribution to a fund for audit.

(ii.) Until such time as a co-operative union has been constituted and registered for this purpose, such contributions shall be held by the Registrar and administered by him on behalf of the contributing societies.

(iii.) So long as the Registrar administers the fund on behalf of the contributing societies he shall report every year to Government the income derived from contributions, the expenditure he has sanctioned from the fund and the balance in his hands.

(iv.) As soon as a co-operative union is constituted and registered for the purpose this fund shall be credited to the union to be utilized in accordance with its stated objects and with its constitution.

(v.) Until a co-operative union is constituted for the purpose, the annual contribution shall be fixed by the Registrar, subject to a maximum of either ten per cent. on the annual profits or one per cent. of the working capital as disclosed in the Balance Sheet and subject also to a minimum of five rupees.

25. For the purposes of section 25 of the Ordinance, a copy of an entry in the book of a society may be certified by a certificate written at the foot of such copy, declaring that it is a true copy of such entry and that the book containing the entry is still in the custody of the society, such certificate being dated and signed by the Secretary of the society and one member of the Committee.

26. Every society shall maintain a register of members showing—

- (i.) the name, address, and occupation of each member and a statement of the shares, if any held by him;
- (ii.) the date on which each member's name was entered in the register;
- (iii.) the date on which any member ceased to be a member;
- (iv.) the nominee, if any, appointed in accordance with rule 9.

27. The reserve fund of a society may, unless the Registrar by special order direct it to be invested as provided in section 30 be utilized in the business of the society.

28. The reserve fund shall be indivisible and no member shall be entitled to claim any specified share in it.

29. (a) Any dispute concerning the business of a co-operative society between members or past members of the society or persons claiming through them, or between a member or past member or persons so claiming and the Committee or any officer shall be referred to the Registrar. Reference may be made by the Committee or by the society by resolution in General Meeting or by any party to the dispute, or if the dispute concerns a sum due from a member of the Committee to the society by any member of the society.

(b) The Registrar may either decide the dispute himself, or appoint an arbitrator, or refer the dispute to three arbitrators, of whom one shall be nominated by each of the parties and the third shall be nominated by the Registrar and shall act as Chairman.

(c) When a dispute is referred to three arbitrators, if any party to the dispute fails to nominate an arbitrator within 15 days, the Registrar may make the nomination instead. If an arbitrator nominated by one of the parties dies, or refuses or neglects to act, or by absence or otherwise, becomes incapable of acting, the Registrar shall call upon the party concerned to nominate a fresh arbitrator within 15 days, and if no arbitrator is nominated accordingly, he may nominate one himself; and if the arbitrator who is incapacitated was nominated by the Registrar a fresh arbitrator shall be nominated in his place by the Registrar.

(d) No legal practitioner may be nominated as arbitrator by any party to a dispute.

(e) In all arbitration proceedings under this rule the Registrar or arbitrators shall have power to administer oaths, to require the attendance of the parties and witnesses and to require the production of all necessary books and documents by a summons delivered orally or sent by hand or by registered post, or through the nearest civil court having jurisdiction in the area in which the society operates, and shall further have power to order the expenses incurred in determining the dispute to be paid either out of the funds of the society or by such party or parties to the dispute as he or they may think fit.

(f) The Registrar or arbitrator shall hear the evidence of the parties and witnesses who attend, and upon that evidence and after consideration of any documentary evidence produced by either side a decision or award shall be given in accordance with justice, equity and good conscience and shall be

reduced to writing, announced to the parties and filed in the office of the Registrar or in such subordinate office as he may direct.

(g) In the absence of any party duly summoned to attend, the dispute may be decided *ex parte*.

(h) When three arbitrators are appointed, the opinion of the majority shall prevail.

(i) Any party aggrieved by an award of an arbitrator may appeal to the Registrar in person or by agent within one month of the date of the award.

(j) Any decision or award of the Registrar shall in every case be final. No decision of an arbitrator shall be set aside by a court except on the ground of corruption or misconduct on the part of the arbitrator.

(k) A decision or award shall on application to any civil court having jurisdiction in the area in which the society operates be enforced in the same manner as a decree of such court.

(l) In proceedings before the Registrar or an arbitrator no party shall be represented by a legal practitioner.

Appeals.

30. An appeal under section 33 (2) of the Ordinance against an order of the Registrar directing that the registration of a society shall be cancelled shall lie to the Governor whose order shall be final.

31. Any person aggrieved by an order of a liquidator in the exercise of his powers under section 36 of the Ordinance may appeal to the Registrar whose order shall be final.

Unfit officers.

32. If in any society, in the opinion of the Registrar, any member of the Committee or other officer is unfit for the discharge of his duties, the society shall on the requirement of the Registrar dismiss him.

Non-members.

33. The Registrar shall have power to prohibit or restrict transactions of any society with non-members when it is proved to his satisfaction that such transactions are opposed to co-operative principles or involve an abuse of any of the privileges accorded to societies or involve an evasion of income tax or a breach of any rules or orders of Government.

1. The Minutes of the Meeting held on September 13, 1935, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Three petitions were presented, one by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya and two by Mr. E. A. Paulas. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Assessment rates for 1936 :—The Chairman moved—(1) To make and assess for the calendar year 1936 :—(a) A rate of 17½ per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever within the Police limits of Galle. (b) A rate of 11½ per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police limits and situated within an area bounded as follows :—North by an imaginary line eastwards 3 chains north of Kumbalwella road up to its junction with Hirimbura road, thence along an imaginary line 3 chains north of Hirimbura Cross road up to its junction with Hirimbura road, and thence along Hirimbura road up to its junction with Morris road ; east from the last mentioned point southwards for a distance of 3 chains, thence westwards along an imaginary line 3 chains south of Hirimbura road and Hirimbura Cross road up to the junction of Hirimbura Cross road with Hirimbura road, and thence southwards along an imaginary line 3 chains to the east of Hirimbura road up to its junction with Circular road ; south by an imaginary line westwards 3 chains north of Cripps road from its junction with Hirimbura road up to its junction with Elliott road ; and west by an imaginary line northwards 3 chains north of Elliott road from its junction with Cripps road to its junction with Kumbalwella road, the said rate of 11½ per cent. to be levied with effect from the 3rd quarter only ; and (c) A rate of 7 per cent. of the annual value of all houses and buildings of every description and of all lands and tenements whatsoever outside the Police but within the Municipal limits of Galle, except as specified above in (b), as required by section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, payable by four instalments on or before the following dates :—

Karunaratna moved as an amendment that in the opinion of this Council it is highly desirable that the services of a qualified Town Planner be obtained to report to the Council on a Town Planning Scheme for Galle, Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. The mover and seconder agree to the amendment which was then put to the meeting and carried.

(b) That public latrines be erected without delay in Ward No. 5 :—On the Chairman explaining that the matter was receiving consideration this motion was, with the permission of Council, withdrawn by the mover.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. J. E. Perera moved :—That compensation be paid by the Council up to half the value of trees cut in connection with the extension of electric lights within the Municipality. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded. With the permission of Council this motion was, on the suggestion of the Chairman, deferred till the next meeting pending further investigations into the matter.

7. To declare in terms of Rule 2 of the Municipal Pension Minute the post of Park-keeper to be pensionable—Resolved that in terms of Rule 2 of the Municipal Pension Minute the post of Park-keeper be declared to be a pensionable one.

8. To sanction the appointment of a temporary clerk to assist in the Assessment Department for two months on a salary of Re. 1 per working day.—Sanctioned.

9. To elect, by ballot, a member of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works to fill the vacancy caused by the death of Mr. S. H. Dahanayaka :—A ballot was taken and the Chairman declared that Mr. J. E. Perera was elected.

10. To appoint a convener of the Special Committee appointed to report upon as to what steps should be taken to improve the housing and general conditions of the town :—Resolved that Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya be appointed convener of this Committee.

11. To appoint a convener of the select committee appointed to consider and report upon the motion of Mr. E. M. Karunaratna at the meeting of Council on September 13, 1935, regarding the lease of the Esplanade Pavilion to the Galle Cricket Club :—Resolved that Mr. E. M. Karunaratna be appointed convener of this Committee.

12. Considered papers relating to the acquisition of land at Kandewatta for a playground :—Resolved that the Government Agent, Southern Province, be requested to furnish a valuation report of the whole land now proposed to be acquired as depicted on the sketch submitted by the Municipal Engineer.

13. Considered letter No. B 119/35 dated September 24, 1935, from the Legal Draftsman on the question of the draft by-laws on Dairies :—Resolved that the Medical Officer of Health be requested to submit his written comments on the suggestion made by the Legal Draftsman and that thereafter the matter be referred to the Law Committee for consideration.

14. Letter from Mr. M. S. Marikkar, Proctor, on behalf of the widow of the late shroff, Mr. K. S. Mohideen Lebbe, regarding the gratuities in deposit of the three minor sons :—Resolved that Mr. Marikkar be informed that the Council will have no objection to the amount being paid to his client provided she obtains an order from the District Court of Galle authorizing such payment.

15. Considered the results of the sale of Market Stalls, Betel Sheds, and fruit trees for 1936 :—

*Fish Market.*—Resolved that the sales be confirmed and that the nine stalls for which there were no bids be resold by public auction each at an upset price of Rs. 16.

*Offal Market.*—Resolved that the sale of the room and stall No. 6 be confirmed and that no further action be taken for the present with regard to the remaining stalls for which there were no bids.

*Kaluwella Markets.*—Resolved that no further action be taken for the present with regard to the stalls in these markets, for all of which there were no bids.

*Betel Sheds.*—Resolved that the sale of the Betel Shed in the Bazaar be confirmed and that tenders be now invited for the lease of the Betel Shed in the Fort for which there were no bids.

*Fruit Trees.*—Resolved that the sales be confirmed.

16. Considered tenders received for the lease of the Meat Market Stalls for 1936 :—Resolved (1) that the tenders received for stalls Nos. 1 to 6 be accepted ; (2) that no action be taken with regard to stalls 7 and 8 for which there were no offers ; and (3) that stalls Nos. 9 to 14 be offered to the present lessees at this Year's rates.

17. Considered tenders received for the lease of fruit trees at the Segregation Camp and the Infectious Diseases Hospital for 1936 :—Resolved that in view of the fact that the only tender received was from the present lessee for Rs. 160 that he be asked to pay Rs. 240 for the lease of the trees for 1936.

18. To sanction a supplemental vote of Rs. 400 for the purchase of an additional typewriter and stand for the Municipal Office.—Sanctioned.

19. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of October 2, 1935 :—*

(2) Considered 2 applications for water service.—Recommended that the applications be allowed.

(3) Considered an estimate of Rs. 9,000 for sett paving Ward street and a portion of the Dickson road junction.—Recommended that the proposal be dropped as the Committee do not consider it worth while in view of the opinion expressed by the Municipal Engineer, Colombo, that the average life of a sett-paved track can be put down as 10 years.

(4) Considered Factory Estimate No. 1259 for Rs. 1,856 for supplying one Factory Type Tar Sprayer.—Recommended that the estimate be approved and that a supplemental vote for Rs. 2,000 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(5) Considered the question of extending the water service along the Galle-Matara road from the Dewata Junction to the Waggalmodera Bridge.—Recommended (1) that the water service be extended from the Dewata Junction to the Waggalmodera Bridge ; (2) that the Municipal Engineer's estimate of Rs. 1,900 for supplying a 2 in. C. I. Main and fixing two stand posts be passed ; (3) that the work be carried out departmentally, but that quotations for the materials required be obtained from Colombo firms ; and (4) that a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,900 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(6) Considered tenders for :—(a) Clearing the trace of the proposed approach road to Heependola.—Recommended that the tender of K. D. C. Yapa for Rs. 189/75 be accepted. (b) Constructing side drains along the Galle-Matara road at the Dewatta Bazaar.—Recommended that the tender of D. S. Fernando for Rs. 1,425·05 be accepted.

(7) Considered tenders for the following services for the year 1936 :—

*Supply of Metal and Random Rubble.*—Recommended that the tender of W. Goonewardena be accepted at the following rates :—

Metal : 2 in. Rs. 6·45 per cube ; 1½ in. Rs. 8·90 ; 1 in. Rs. 10·40 ; and ¾ in. Rs. 11·45.

Random Rubble : Rs. 9·85 per cube.

*Supply of Gravel.*—Recommended that no contract be entered into for 1936.

*Supply of Coir Dust.*—Recommended that the tender of E. D. P. de Silva at Rs. 20 per 100 bags of 2½ bushel each be accepted.

*Supply of Grass.*—Recommended that the tender of W. L. K. Handy be accepted at the following rates :—20 cents per bundle of 20 lb. and 8 cents per bundle of 8 lb.

*White Washing and/Or Colour Washing Municipal Buildings.*—Recommended that the tender of C. L. M. Haniffa at Rs. 55 per quarter be accepted.

*Purchase of Street Sweepings and House Rubbish.*—Recommended that the tender of W. L. K. Handy for Rs. 150 be accepted.

*Supply of Ekels, Baskets, Coir Yarn, Coconut Oil, and Coconuts.*—Recommended that the tender of W. V. Ginaseena be accepted at the following rates :—Ekels, Rs. 2·25 per 100 bundles of 50 ekels each ; baskets, large size (with lugs) Rs. 3·60 per dozen, small size (without lugs) Rs. 2·52 per dozen ; coir yarn, 11 cents per lb. ; coconut oil, 30 cents per bottle ; coconuts, Rs. 5·50 per 100.

(8) Considered an estimate of Rs. 325 for constructing two flights of steps to the sunken garden at Victoria Park.—Recommended that the estimate be passed (with the variations suggested by Mr. J. E. Perera) subject to its being approved by the Provincial Engineer.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item (8) it was resolved that the estimate be reduced to Rs. 300 in accordance with the suggestions made by the Provincial Engineer and that the work be carried out departmentally.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted, Mr. E. A. Paulas dissenting from the recommendation in connection with item No. 4.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of October 2, 1935 :—*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Ward No. 6.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Considered the question of writing off on the ground of poverty of the owners the rates due on the following properties for 1935 :—454, Gintota, and 556, Dadalla.—Recommended that the rates due for 1935 amounting to Rs. 2 be written off on the ground of poverty of the owners.



(4) To confirm the purchase on behalf of the Council of property No. 770, Galupiadda, sold by public auction for non-payment of rates.—Recommended that, as the rates due for 4th quarter, 1934, and 1st quarter, 1935, has subsequently been paid, the sale be not confirmed, and that the balance rates due for 1935 amounting to Rs. 4.11 be written off on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(5) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 74.55 being arrears of electricity dues outstanding for 1934.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 74.55 be written off as irrecoverable.

(6) To write off as irrecoverable a sum of Rs. 343.50 being arrears of conservancy fees for 1934.—Recommended that the sum of Rs. 343.50 be written off as irrecoverable.

(7) Issue of uniforms to Sanitary Inspectors and other officers of similar status.—Recommended that with effect from January 1, 1936, the following uniforms and equipment be issued annually to the Sanitary Inspectors, the Supervisor, Anti-Plague Campaign and the Manager, Conservancy Department :—1 English drill uniform suit, 4 pairs khaki shorts, 4 khaki shirts, 2 pairs khaki hose, and 1 pair shoulder cords of maroon instead of black as hitherto.

(8) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 102 under Head 25—New Microscope.—Recommended.

(9) Considered the question of revising the charge for water supplied to eating-houses, tea boutiques, &c., under water service regulation 32 (5).—Recommended that no change be made and that the present charge of Rs. 2 per quarter be continued.

(10) Considered the question of reducing the annual licence fee on carts fitted with pneumatic tyres as suggested by the Commissioner of Local Government.—Recommended that the Commissioner of Local Government be informed that in the case of carts fitted with pneumatic tyres the Council agrees to a licence fee of 75 cents for a double-bullock cart and 50 cents for a single-bullock cart.

(11) Considered the following applications :—(a) Application from Mr. S. G. E. de Alwis, Second Clerk, for the grant of a long service allowance.—Recommended that in view of his long service Mr. Alwis be given a personal allowance of Rs. 180 per annum from July 1, 1936, which is to be reckoned for pension purposes. (b) Application from Mr. M. K. M. Meedin, Assessment Clerk, asking that he be given his next increment as from July 1, 1936.—Recommended that the application be refused as the Committee see no reason to deviate from the approved salaries scheme of the Council. (c) Application from Mr. C. L. V. Perera, Clerk, Electrical Department for an increase of salary.—Recommended that the application be refused as the Committee see no reason to vary the approved scale of salary attached to his post. (d) Application from U. Hendrick Appu, Park Labourer, for an increase of wages.—Recommended that his wages be increased to Rs. 19 per mensem with effect from October 1, 1935.

(12) Travelling allowance of the Medical Officer of Health and the Superintendent of the Electricity Department.—Recommended that the travelling allowance of the Medical Officer of Health and the Superintendent of the Electricity Department be permanently restored to the original amount of Rs. 1,200 per annum in each case with effect from January 1, 1936.

(13) Considered an application from the Collectors of Wards 5 and 5A for the payment of a bonus for work done by them in connection with the preparation of lists of all properties situated within the new lighting area.—Recommended that the Collector of Ward 5 be paid a bonus of Rs. 35 and the Collector of Ward 5A a bonus of Rs. 15 for the work—the expenditure to be met from Vote No. 9.

#### Resolution.

With regard to item 7 it was resolved that with effect from 1936, khaki helmets be also issued to the officers concerned once in three years.

The recommendation of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(c) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of October 2, 1935 :—

(2) Considered an application from the licensed stall holders of the Meat Market asking for a reconsideration of the rates for the sale of mutton fixed by Council on November 18, 1935.—Recommended that the application be refused.

#### Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

20. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Friday, November 22, 1935, at 2 P.M.

21. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting Mr. J. E. Perera said as that was the last General Meeting the Chairman would preside he desired to express on behalf of himself and his colleagues their regret at Mr. Rogerson's impending departure and their sincere appreciation of the good work done by him during his tenure of office as Chairman of the Council. Mr. R. L. Ephraums also spoke.

The Chairman in reply thanked the speakers for their kind remark and expressed his thanks to the members and staff for all the assistance they had given to him.





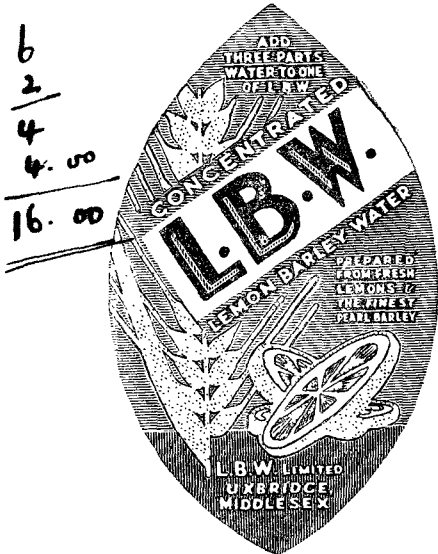
