- (1) alter and define the limits of the subdivisions set out in Column 1 of Schedule A hereto in the manner set out in Column 2 of the said schedule, and
- (2) provide in the manner set out in Schedule B hereto for the matters necessary to give effect to the alteration and definition so effected.

SCHEDULE A.

Column 1.

Subdivisions of the Chief Headman's Division of Maritime Pattus in the Mullaitivu District, made by Proclamation of May 17, 1933, in the *Gazette* of May 19, 1933.

1. Karikkaddumulai North subdivision consisting of the villages of Chilavattai, Karaiyamullivaikkal, Vadduvakallu, and Vellamullivaikkal.

2. Puthukkudiyiruppu subdivision consisting of the villages of Ampalavanpokkanai, Palamattalan, Pirappuvedduvan, Puthukkudiyiruppu, Puthumattalan, Valayanmadam, and Maruthampupal.

3. Mulliyavalai subdivision consisting of the villages of Mulliyavalai, Tentukki, Kalikkadu, Vattappalai, Taniyuttu, Kumarapuram, Kanukkerni, Mamulai, and Keppapulavu.

Column 2.

Subdivisions now defined.

1. Puthukkudiyiruppu subdivision consisting of the villages of Ampalavanpokkanai, Palamattalan, Pirappuvedduvan, Puthukkudiyiruppu, Puthumattalan, Valayanmadam, Maruthampupal, Karaiyamullivaikkal, Vadduvakallu, and Vellamullivaikkal.

2. Mulliyavalai subdivision consisting of the villages of Mulliyavalai, Tentukki, Kalikkadu, Vattappalai, Taniyuttu, Kumarapuram, Kanukkerni, Mamulai, Keppapulavu, and Chilavattai.

SCHEDULE B.

1. The inhabitants of each of the redefined subdivisions set out in Column 2 of the foregoing Schedule A shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the corresponding subdivision set out in Column 1 of the said schedule for all purposes of the Ordinance.

2. All the property of the inhabitants of each of the subdivisions set out in Column 1 of the said schedule, and all the rights, powers and duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of such inhabitants, shall be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of the corresponding redefined subdivision set out in Column 2 of the said schedule.

3. All the rules now in force under the provisions of the Ordinance in each of the subdivisions set out in Column 1 of the said schedule, shall be in force in the corresponding redefined subdivision set out in Column 2 of the said schedule as if they had been duly made under the law in force at the date hereof.

4. The Committees now in force in the several subdivision set out in Column 1 of the said schedule shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the redefinition of the subdivisions set out in Column 2 of the said schedule but shall remain in force until June 30, 1936, or until the respective fresh Committees elected for the aforesaid redefined subdivisions come into force.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Kurunegala Urban District Council without the authority of the Governor, in order to obtain which a certificate of good conduct from the Chairman setting out the length of service, age, and ground of retirement must be forwarded, together with the application for pension, gratuity, or retiring allowance, and the computation thereof, through the Commissioner of Local Government to the Controller of Establishments.

2. Subject to the provisions of by-law 1 and the following by-laws, every officer of the Kurunegala Urban District Council on the fixed establishment drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards who shall have had service of ten years or more including any service which may be reckoned under the proviso to by-law 7 may be awarded a pension as follows:—

For the first one hundred and twenty months of such service a pension equal to $120/720$ ths of his annual salary and for each additional completed month of service an additional $1/720$ th of such salary, but no officer shall be entitled to draw more than $480/720$ ths of his final salary as pension.

3. The above-mentioned rates shall only be granted in cases of faithful and meritorious service, but when the testimony as to fidelity, diligence, and merit is in any respect defective, a deduction from such rates may be made. Where there has been obvious negligence, irregularity, or misconduct, the grant of a pension may be altogether withheld.

Where service of peculiar and extraordinary merit has been rendered by an officer distinctly outside the duties in respect of which his salary is paid, a special rate of pension may be recommended for sanction, but in ordinary cases the maximum pension or retiring allowance grantable to an officer under these by-laws, or to an officer entitled to pension also in respect of service not under the Council from all services combined, shall not exceed two-thirds of the highest salary drawn by such officer at any time in the course of his service.

4. In the case of officers on the fixed establishment of the Council drawing a salary of Rs. 360 per annum and upwards retiring on account of illness or age before completing one hundred and twenty months' gross service a gratuity may be granted calculated at the rate of one-twelfth of a month's pay of the permanent office or offices held at the time of retirement, for each completed month of service.

5. Officers of the Kurunegala Urban District Council shall have no absolute right to any pension, gratuity, or long service allowance under these by-laws, and the Kurunegala Urban District Council retains power and authority to dismiss any such officer without any compensation.

6. No pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be granted to any officer of the Kurunegala Urban District Council who shall be under fifty-five years of age except upon a certificate from the Chairman and two medical practitioners that he is incapable from infirmity of mind or body of discharging the duties of his office, nor unless he shall have discharged such duties theretofore with diligence and fidelity to the satisfaction of the Council.

7. The claim of an officer of the Kurunegala Urban District Council to pension, gratuity, or long service allowance shall be considered to have commenced from the date of his first permanent appointment to the fixed establishment of the Council after January 1, 1933, or its predecessor the Kurunegala Local Board.

Provided that an officer transferred from the provisional and temporary establishment to the fixed establishment may be allowed to count his provisional and temporary service when it has been continuous with his subsequent permanent service.

Service under sixteen years of age however will not count for pension.

8. The service in respect of which pensions, gratuities, or long service allowances are granted under these by-laws must in all cases be continuous, unless interrupted by abolition of office or other temporary suspension of employment not arising from misconduct or voluntary resignation of the officer.

9. The pension or gratuity shall be computed upon the salary of the permanent office held by the officer of the Council at the time of his retirement provided he shall have held such appointment for at least three years; otherwise the pension shall be calculated upon the average of salaries attached to the permanent office held by such person during the three years next preceding the commencement of such pension.

10. In case of abolition of office, if the officer has completed 120 months' gross service, he may be granted a pension of 1/720th of his salary for each month of his service counting for pension with an addition to such service of one month for each completed period of two months' service, the addition in no case exceeding 60 months.

If the officer has not completed 120 months' gross service he may be granted a gratuity of 1/12th of a month's salary for each month of service counting for pension, plus an addition of 50 per cent. thereon. In no case shall the number of months to be added to the actual service exceed that which, if added to the age of the retiring officer, would make that age up to sixty.

11. If any person being in receipt of any pension or long service allowance from the Kurunegala Urban District Council shall be convicted of any offence in any Court of Justice in the Island for which he shall be sentenced to death or to any terms of imprisonment with hard labour exceeding six months such pension or long service allowance shall forthwith determine and cease to be payable, unless such person shall, within three months after his conviction, receive free pardon or unless the Council shall otherwise order.

12. Officers on the fixed establishment of the Kurunegala Urban District Council may be required to retire on or after attaining the age of fifty-five, upon the receipt of twelve months' notice to that effect, but they may continue in office till sixty years of age with the consent of the Council.

13. (1) Every officer who is transferred to or from the service of the Council from or to any other public service and whose aggregate service would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, shall on his ultimate retirement from service if he has served for a period of at least 12 months under the Council, be entitled to a pension which shall bear the same proportion to that to which he would have been entitled had the whole of his service been under the Council as the aggregate amount of the salary which he has drawn from the Council bears to the total sum made up of such aggregate amount and the aggregate of the amounts received by him in the course of his public service elsewhere than under the Council.

Provided however, that in the case of an officer who is transferred to the service of the Council after other public service in which the rules regulating pensions do not offer the same privileges to an officer transferred from the Council to such public service as are accorded under these rules to an officer transferred from such public service to the Council and whose aggregate public service under the Council and elsewhere would have entitled him, had it been wholly under the Council, to a pension under these rules, such officer may with the sanction of the Council on his ultimate retirement from public service (provided such retirement takes place from the Council and that he has served for a period of at least five years under the Council) be entitled to receive from the Council, in lieu of a pension calculated in the manner prescribed in the preceding paragraph, a pension representing the difference between the pension or pensions earned by such officer in respect of his public service elsewhere and a pension calculated as if his public service had been wholly under the Council.

* The term "aggregate" salary is to be interpreted as the amount of the aggregate salary of the substantive post held by an officer in the course of his career, disregarding extra emoluments such as duty allowances, and regarding leave on half pay or without pay as leave on full salary.

(2) For the purposes of this section, the expression "public service" includes employment under the Crown or any Local Government public body or bodies.

14. Should an officer who retires on pension find after such retirement an employment under the Council or under the Government or under another semi-official body on a salary equal to or higher than that which he drew from the Council at the time of his retirement, his pension shall be suspended so long as such employment continues. If he draws a less salary he shall be entitled to only so much of his pension as when added to the salary of the new appointment will make his total emoluments equal to the salary last drawn by him previous to his retirement.

15. Employees on the fixed establishment of the Kurunegala Urban District Council drawing salaries of less than Rs. 360 per annum and retiring on account of age or infirmity after serving continuously for a period of fifteen years and upwards may, if the Council be satisfied that they are unfit, owing to age or infirmity of body or mind, further to discharge efficiently the duties of their offices, be granted such long service allowances not exceeding Rs. 7.50 per mensem in each case as the Council may award. Persons in receipt of daily pay, who have completed a period of fifteen years of continuous service, retiring under similar circumstances may be awarded gratuities calculated at the rate of one-eighteenth of a month's pay drawn at the time of retirement for each completed month's service.

16. If any case not covered by these by-laws shall arise which in the opinion of the Council merits the award of a pension, retiring allowance or gratuity, the circumstances of such case should be reported together with the recommendation of the Council to the Commissioner of Local Government for transmission to the General Treasury (Establishments Division) for submission to the Governor, who will decide whether any and, if so, what award shall be granted.

General Meeting.

The Council met this day at 3 p.m., pursuant to notice, dated October 30, 1935.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of October 2, 1935, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of October 14, 1935, were considered.

2. To consider :—(a) Letter No. P9/11 of September 19, 1935, from the Acting Controller of Labour, inquiring whether the Municipal Council would contribute Rs. 500 being 3rd share of the cost of Unemployment Relief Works still available at the Government Dairy, Narahenpitiya. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 2,001.—Recommended. The Chairman was authorized to take immediate steps pending sanction of Council.

3. To consider :—(a) Letter No. P9/2, dated September 26, 1935, from the Acting Controller of Labour regarding the employment of Colombo unemployed labourers on the Colombo South Drainage Scheme suggesting that the Municipal Council should contribute half the cost of labour in respect of such unemployed with work tickets as are utilized in the Scheme. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Treasurer and the Municipal Engineer. (c) A memorandum thereon of the Chairman. Registered No. 2,067.—Recommended that the Controller of Labour be informed that the Council is prepared to accept his suggestion subject to the proviso that this arrangement is approved merely as a stop gap pending Government's decision on the memorandum of the Chairman, Municipal Council on the proposal to introduce Statutory provision for Poor Relief in Ceylon and on condition (1) that the details of the Scheme be submitted to and receive the approval of the Council, (2) that the Council's liability be restricted to meeting half the cost of labour in respect of such of the Registered Colombo Unemployed Labourers as are employed on the work.

The Chairman was authorized to take immediate action pending sanction of Council.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha drew the attention of the meeting to the attitude of callousness displayed by Government in not providing work for 200 men.

The Chairman explained the present position.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Relief of Distress Committee be adopted.

4. To consider the details regarding the working of the City Refuge. Registered No. 1,984.—Recommended that the Institute be started with 50 inmates and that the proposals relating to Staff, Furniture, and Equipment, Uniforms, and Clothing, as per annexure "A" be approved. Recommended (a) that the installation of a wall telephone be approved, (b) that the cost be met from Vote D 21, "Telephones", and (c) that supplemental provision of Rs. 130 under Vote D 21 be sanctioned.

5. To consider a plan and detailed estimate for Rs. 12,100 from the Municipal Engineer (supported by the Municipal Treasurer) for alterations and additions to the proposed City Refuge. *Note*.—Sanction of Council is necessary for (a) Supplemental Provision of Rs. 12,100, (b) detailed Estimates. Funds are available. Registered No. 2,174.—Recommended (a) and (b).

The following Item together with the Recommendation of the Finance Committee of October 23, 1935, having been approved of in circulation by the Members of the Relief of Distress Committee is submitted for sanction of Council.

6. To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated October 9, 1935, stating that a sum of Rs. 100.35 has been paid by the Chairman, Port Commission to un-employed labourers absenting themselves from duty on production of Medical Certificates in certain cases of accidents for which accident reports had been furnished, and has quoted in authority Financial Regulation No. 1,030, and in the circumstances requesting a decision as to whether Unemployed Labourers in cases of illness due to accidents arising out of their employment and not due to their own culpable carelessness, may be granted full-pay leave, or half-pay leave up to a maximum of thirty days in such cases with the Chairman's sanction, and if it is considered desirable that such leave should be extended beyond one month with the sanction of the Council. *Note*.—The Council may sanction payment of leave for 47 days to P. W. Andris Appu, Ticket No. 942, at half-pay or full-pay, whose case is now under consideration. Registered No. 2,163.—Recommendation.—Recommended that half-pay leave be allowed up to a maximum of thirty days in such cases with the Chairman's sanction and if it is considered desirable that such leave should be extended beyond one month, this may be allowed with the sanction of Council. Recommended that leave to P. W. Andris Appu (Ticket No. 942) be granted in accordance with the preceding recommendation.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of October 19, 1935, were considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

Thassim, Clerk, Division II., Waterworks Department, for an advance of Rs. 125 to enable him to purchase a bicycle. Registered No. 2,211. (17) Simon Singho, Process Server, Municipal Court, for an advance of Rs. 100 to enable him to purchase a bicycle. Registered No. 2,231. (18) N. H. D. Piyasena, Compositor, Printing Department, for an advance of Rs. 150 to enable him to purchase a bicycle. Registered No. 2,257. (19) Mr. O. P. Gunawardene, Superintendent of Mains, Waterworks Department, for an advance of Rs. 1,350 to purchase a motor car for official duties. Registered No. 2,260. (20) Mr. A. L. W. Goonasekera, Clerk Division II., Waterworks Department for an advance of Rs. 125 to enable him to purchase a bicycle. Registered No. 2,259. (21) Mr. W. G. Jayakody, Division II., Clerk, Public Health Department, for an advance of Rs. 150 to enable him to purchase a bicycle. Registered No. 2,258. (b) The recommendations of the Municipal Treasurer that the advances be granted on the usual terms, viz., that the amount be repaid in 18 monthly instalments and that 5 per cent. per annum be charged as interest on the balances outstanding from time to time. *Note.*—In the cases of Messrs. H. B. Ekanaike and O. P. Pensions and Gratuities.

(87) To recommend, under Rule 2B (1) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 2,460 (being the amount of his annual salary at the time of his death) to Mrs. Mary Agnes Mendis, widow of the late Mr. J. Victor Mendis, Accounts Clerk, Public Health Department, who died on September 2, 1935. Registered No. 2,059.—Recommended.

(88) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 365.13 to the mother of late M. Naris Singho, B. T. 1,718 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who died on May 11, 1935. The gratuity is based on his service of 120 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 54.77. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks. But they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous". Registered No. 2,144.—Recommended.

(89) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 833.75 to the next-of-kin of the late Poochi, B. T. 1,699 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who died on April 27, 1935. The gratuity is based on his service of 267 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 60.03. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks. But they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—

"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous."

The Municipal Treasurer, in his report of October 11, 1935, states that there are two claims from two women who are alleged to have been married to the deceased, viz., Kaliaamma married to the deceased on September 8, 1926, in India and Karuppen Thevar Suppamma who also states to have married him on January 26, 1933, in Ceylon. The Municipal Treasurer, therefore recommends that both cases be considered. Registered No. 2,186.—Recommended that the gratuity of Rs. 833.75 be paid to the two claimants in equal shares.

(90) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 335.18 to the widow of the late Madan VI. labourer, Public Health Department, who died on June 9, 1935. The gratuity is based on his service of 182 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 33.15. *Note.*—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks, but they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules which runs as follows:—

"It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous." Registered No. 2,210.

Recommended.

The Following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of October 30, 1935, were considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(2) To consider at the request of Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, M.S.C., M.M.C., the correspondence between Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader, M.M.C., and the Municipal Treasurer regarding a claim for the surplus of sale, &c., of premises No. 287 and 289, 2nd Division, Maradana, for arrears of rates. Registered No. 1,362.—Recommended that in view of the circumstances under which a refund of the sum of Rs. 63.75 was not obtained, the plea of prescription be waived and a refund be made.

(3) To consider:—(a) An application from Mr. T. Nalliah, Division I Clerk, Municipal Treasurer's Department, requesting that he be appointed under the 1924 Salary Scheme as he was holding a temporary appointment in the Council's service from October, 1933, and therefore his case is similar to that of the Division II officers who were on the waiting list holding temporary appointments and to whom the Council gave the concession of being appointed under the 1924 Salary Scheme in spite of the fact that their appointments took effect in 1935. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Treasurer and the acting Secretary, Municipal Council. Registered No. 2,176.—Recommended that Mr. T. Nalliah be treated as having entered the service of the Council under the 1924 Salaries Scheme.

(4) To consider:—(a) The petition presented by Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.M.C., in Council, on September 4, 1935, from certain land owners of Nagalagam street, Grandpass, praying that in view of the fact that their fairs and private markets have been in use long before the Municipal Market at Grandpass came into existence they be excluded from the operation of the proposed by-law prohibiting the sale of fruits and vegetables within a certain radius of public markets and requested that it be placed before the appropriate Committee for consideration. (b) A memorandum of the Chairman, dated September 9, 1935, stating that his own view is that until we have established a modern market at or in close proximity to this site it would be undesirable to suppress the Nagalagam street fair. Registered No. 1,897.—Recommended that until a modern market has been erected in proximity to this site it would be undesirable to suppress the Nagalagam street fair.

(5) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer, dated October 7, 1935, regarding the Workmen's Compensation Ordinance, No. 19 of 1934 recommending that the Council do maintain its own Workmen's Compensation Fund by charging an annual percentage which will approximately represent the premium which would have to be paid to an Insurance Co., based on the total wages of the preceding year of all its daily-paid staff together with interest at fixed deposit rates, and it is also proposed that the Council's Pension Rules be amended on the same lines as those of the Government so as to provide that one award only shall be payable and that such award shall be the one which is the more favourable to the workman or dependant. Registered No. 2,189. Recommended.

(7) To consider a letter, dated October 16, 1935, from the Chairman, Committee of Management, Workmen's Resort, Slave Island, stating that the annual grant of Rs. 2,400 to the Workmen's Resort from Government has been reduced to Rs. 1,200 and that they have been directed to seek assistance from the Colombo Municipality in future, and therefore requesting in view of the real service rendered by the Resort a contribution of at least Rs. 1,200 to compensate the reduction in the Government Grant. Registered No. 2,252.—Recommended that a contribution of Rs. 1,200 a year be made and that on the understanding that this amount be not increased on any subsequent application.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(8) To consider the question of acquisition of land for proposed lavatory at Joseph lane, Bambalapitiya. Registered No. 703.—Recommended that the site of the north of the Market be acquired, and the proposal to build the lavatory on the Joseph lane site be dropped.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(12) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated October 23, 1935, regarding the post of Medical Officer, Maternity and Child Welfare. Registered No. 1,801.—Recommended that applications be called for locally for the post of Medical Officer in charge of Maternity and Child Welfare from candidates of either sex, without specifying any age limit, on a salary Rs. 4,800 by annual increments of Rs. 300 to a maximum of Rs. 8,400 a year with a car allowance of Rs. 1,200 a year. Candidates should be qualified in General Medicine and possess qualifications recognized by the General Medical Council, and registrable in Ceylon. Preference will be given to candidates who possess the following qualifications, viz., a Diploma in Public Health, a Diploma in Midwifery and a good practical knowledge of Obstetrics, Gynaecology, Pediatrics and Child Welfare work. The selected candidate should be able to speak colloquial Tamil and Sinhalese and will be debarred from private practice. The selected candidate should also be required to enter into an agreement to serve the Council for a period of one year from the date of assuming duties, at the end of which period the question of the permanency of the appointment with leave and pension rights, according to the Council's regulations, will be considered.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(13) To consider:—(a) The applications received for the post of Assistant Engineer, Waterworks Department. (b) A report thereon of the Waterworks Engineer. Registered No. 1,689.—Recommended that the recommendation of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together), item No. 7 of September 25, 1935, be adhered to:—That Mr. R. Kumaranayagam, B.Sc. (Lond.) A.M.I.C.E., A.M.I. Struct. E. be appointed to the post of Assistant Engineer, Waterworks Department, on the advertised scale of salary of Rs. 6,840 per annum with annual increments of Rs. 384 to Rs. 9,144 per annum, plus a car allowance of Rs. 1,200 per annum.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Mr. M. L. M. Reyal and Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, dissented.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

The Chairman informed the meeting that the Municipal Engineer reports that Mr. R. Kumaranayagam would be unwilling to accept the appointment under the 1934 Salaries Scheme for new entrants, as it would deprive him of certain privileges enjoyed by those appointed under the 1924 Scheme.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that Mr. Kumaranayagam's appointment be treated as a promotion based on the 1924 Salaries Scheme. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The Chairman explained facts and suggested that the matter be referred back to the Four Standing Committees. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha accepted the suggestion of the Chairman.

The Chairman's suggestion was put to the meeting and carried.

(14) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman, dated October 15, 1935, regarding the extension of the new 30-inch main towards Labugama. Registered No. 2,216. Recommended that the suggestions contained in Chairman's memorandum of October 15, 1935, be adopted.

At this stage of the meeting Dr. S. Muttiah moved that the tax on bicycles for the year 1936 be reduced from Rs. 3 to Rs. 2. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha seconded.

The Chairman explained the present position and suggested that the amount be retained.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke in support of Dr. Muttiah's motion.

The Chairman moved, as an amendment, that the tax do remain as at present.

The amendment was put to the meeting and carried.

The amendment was thereupon put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

3. The Chairman moved in Committee:—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

4. The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendation of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

5. The Chairman moved that the Hon. Mr. F. J. Soertsz, K.C., who has been absent from the two previous General Meetings and thereby ceased to be a Member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings, be restored to office, under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—*Carried.*

With the permission of Council, Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader moved:—"That the Council do record its cordial appreciation of the great services rendered to the Council and to the Ratepayers of Colombo by Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, during the period he acted as Chairman of this Council." Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

Mr. F. Dadabhoy supported.

The motion was carried with acclamation.

The Chairman thanked Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader and the Council for their appreciation of his work.

ANNEXURE " B ".

Interim Report of the Departmental Committee regarding the Municipal Press.

1. This Committee was appointed by the Chairman (Mr. W. L. Murphy) by his minute, dated December 13, 1934, pursuant to a recommendation contained in the report, dated June 14, 1933, on the working of the Colombo Municipal Press by Mr. C. Thomas of the Government Press. The Special Committee on Relief to Ratepayers and on Economy in Municipal Departments considered the report of Mr. Thomas *vide* paragraph 23 of the Report of the Special Committee which was adopted by Council at its meeting held on October 3, 1934.

2. The Committee consists of the Municipal Treasurer (Mr. G. H. N. Saunders), Chairman; the Medical Officer of Health (Dr. C. V. Aserappa); and the Secretary (Mudaliyar D. J. G. Caldera). On the retirement of Mudaliyar Caldera his place on the Committee was taken by the Acting Secretary (Mr. W. J. Fernando).

3. The Municipal Printer, Mr. J. W. Eagar, was present at all the meetings of the Committee. Mr. C. Stewart Orr, Municipal Assessor, and Mr. J. W. Hesse of the Secretariat, were present by invitation at the meeting held on September 26, 1935, when certain forms were considered. To all of them the Committee desires to express its thanks.

4. At a preliminary meeting of the Committee held on January 9, 1935, it was agreed that the Secretary should note to make separate provision for the Printing Department in the 1936 Budget on the lines suggested by Mr. Thomas. It may be mentioned that draft estimates for 1936 have been framed in accordance with this decision.

It was also decided at this meeting:—(1) That all Heads of Departments be requested to send a sample page of all printed forms used in their respective Departments separating the loose forms from those which are bound. (2) That the Municipal Printer do submit a report on the standardization of forms, indicating wastage that can be avoided and what economies he suggests.

5. Since then the Committee met on 5 occasions, and considered the printed forms received from the various departments and the report of the Municipal Printer.

6. The ten draft regulations (*vide* annexure " C ") which are based on the regulations in force at the Government Press are recommended for approval and to be printed as Standing Orders.

7. *Standardization of Forms.*—The Committee having carefully scrutinized all printed forms at present used by the various Departments recommends the standardization of the following forms and that each form be given a fresh printing Departmental number:—

Office memo forms should be of the size of $\frac{1}{2}$ of foolscap, white with crest only.

Office minute forms should be of the size of $\frac{1}{4}$ and $\frac{1}{2}$ foolscap with departmental reference number, and subject only.

Labels should be those used by the Secretariat.

Salary Abstracts.—It was considered that owing to there being over 23 columns and the possibility of a few more columns being required the form now used should stand subject to minor amendments.

Letter forms.—The letter forms at present used by the Municipal Treasurer's Department were approved with amendments to be used by the Departments at the Town Hall. The Municipal Treasurer's footnote to stand only in forms to be supplied to him. The size of the form to be the same for all Departments.

Attendance Register Form.—A new form was approved.

Check Roll Form.—This was approved with amendments in two sizes, *i.e.*, full sheet and half sheet.

Issue Receipts, Works Notes, Order (two) Payment Orders, Issue Notes, Payment Order for the Library, Stock Receipts, Depot Stock Receipts, Fine Statement, Verification Form, the Delivery Book of Papers and the Letter Register Forms, were approved with amendments.

The Committee recommends that the printed file covers be abolished and that in their place brown paper covers with ordinary labels be adopted.

8. The Committee hopes that with the co-operation of the Heads of Departments and the Municipal staff, substantial economies could be effected in the Council's printing bill in the future by adopting the foregoing recommendations.

ANNEXURE " C ".

Draft Regulations.

(1) For the purpose of these regulations the term " printed form " means a form of any kind which requires entries to be made on it. Forms are divided into " General " and " Departmental ". The former designed for use of all departments and the latter designed primarily for the use of one department, although possibly used by several.

(2) The authorized forms have been divided into groups, and all departments are required to order simultaneously on a set date for one year's supply of the forms in each group, as it is desirable that each form should be printed once only during a financial year.

(3) All orders for forms should be carefully checked before being forwarded, as errors and alterations involve special printing and additional expense.

(4) Supplementary orders for printed forms will only be accepted on account of application to unforeseen circumstances or some reasonable ground being stated.

(5) In every department an officer should be placed in charge of, and be made responsible for the receipt and issue of forms.

(6) Applications for new general forms or for the amendment of existing forms must be made to the Printing Committee through the Municipal Printer. If the new form is considered suitable for other departments as well, then the department making such application should, in the first instance, circulate it among the Heads of other departments and have their comments attached to the application.

(7) Heads of departments should cause all obsolete forms to be returned to the Municipal Printer, who will use such forms, where possible, for printing proofs, &c.

(8) Orders for work other than printed forms may be sent at any time. Departments should see that ample time is allowed for the execution of these orders.

The contents of packages received from the Municipal Printer must be carefully checked with the advice note forwarded by him.

(9) Work of an urgent nature that cannot be executed by the Municipal Printer owing to pressure of work may be entrusted to any local printing establishment. Applications for all such work should be made to the Printing Committee through the Municipal Printer. The latter officer should call for quotations and make arrangements for the proper and early execution of such work.

(10) No work other than that of the Municipal Council of Colombo will be undertaken by the Municipal Printing Office.

RULES made by the Trincomalee Urban District Council, under section 60 of Ordinance No. 11 of 1920, and approved by the Local Government Board, are published for general information.

RULES REFERRED TO.

1. The resthouse is intended primarily for the use of travellers. Every person using any part of it as an office or place of business during his occupation of the resthouse shall pay a special charge of 50 cents for each hour or part thereof for each such use of any part of the resthouse. Every person so using the resthouse shall desist from doing so upon being requested by the resthouse-keeper, whose duty it is to consult the comfort and convenience of the occupants of the resthouse. Resthouse fees at the rates specified in the tariff appended hereto are payable by all persons using the resthouse and garage.

2. Every person, other than infants, using the resthouse or garage is separately chargeable for occupation, provided that—

(a) The servant of a traveller who occupies the resthouse may be allowed to sleep within the resthouse without the payment of any occupation fees.

(b) A chauffeur, whose car or whose master's car is garaged in the resthouse premises, may be permitted to sleep in the car or in the garage without the payment of the said fees.

3. Each visitor must sign his or her name in the resthouse book on entering the resthouse, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse or to be supplied with refreshments.

4. No person shall occupy any part of the resthouse for more than three consecutive days, without the special authority in writing of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

5. Travellers shall note in the resthouse book only those resthouse charges which are payable to the Urban District Council.

6. The resthouse fees and charges shall be in accordance with the tariff appended hereto, and shall be paid in cash on demand. In default further supplies will be refused. The attention of visitors is invited to Ordinance No. 33 of 1908, a copy of which shall be exhibited, together with these rules in some conspicuous place in the resthouse.

7. No room shall be reserved unless engaged at least one day in advance, but when so engaged shall be paid for whether occupied or not, provided that until the arrival of the person or persons engaging accommodation, the accommodation shall be at the disposal of any other person requiring it.

8. The resthouse-keeper is authorized to take no notice of telegrams asking him to prepare m. als, when the name and address of the sender are not given.

9. Beds, sofas or couches in the resthouse shall not be used for the purpose of sleeping without sheets. A breach of this rule will involve a charge of Rs. 5.

10. The value of all articles damaged or broken by visitors is to be paid in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

11. Visitors shall be entitled to call upon the resthouse-keeper to attend on them personally. The resthouse-keeper is a paid servant of the Council and is expected to wear a white coat and to be neatly dressed when attending on visitors.

12. Any complaint which a traveller may have to make about the resthouse or the resthouse-keeper, should be noted in the complaint book, which the resthouse-keeper is bound to produce when asked for, or should be communicated to the Chairman, Urban District Council, Trincomalee.

13. The resthouse-keeper will exercise ordinary care for the safety of luggage brought to the resthouse by visitors, but the Council accepts no liability for any loss of such luggage or other property so brought in by them.

14. Visitors are not permitted to bring dogs into the resthouse.

15. A breach of any of the above rules will render the offender liable to a penalty not exceeding Rs. 50, unless a lesser penalty is provided by the particular rule, and such penalty shall be recoverable as a fine as provided by section 11 (1) (b) of Ordinance No. 21 of 1901.

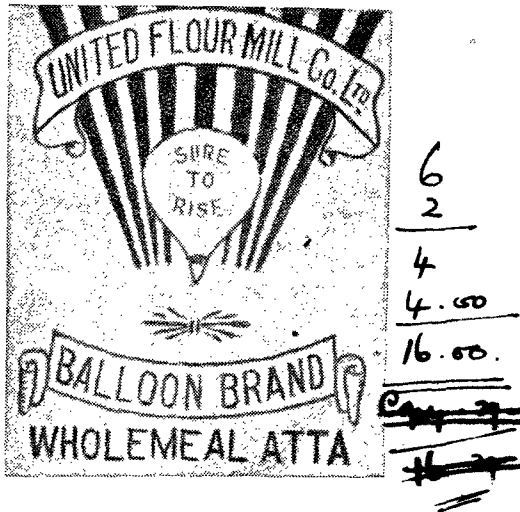
