## SCHEDULE D.

1. The inhabitants of each of the redefined subdivisions set out in column 2 of the foregoing Schedule B and of the new subdivisions set out in column 2 of the foregoing Schedule C shall be the successors of the inhabitants of the original subdivisions set out in the corresponding items in column 1 of those two schedules for all the purposes of the Ordinance.

2. All the property of the inhabitants of the several subdivisions set out in column 1 of the two schedules aforesaid and all the rights, powers, duties, debts, liabilities, and obligations of those inhabitants shall be deemed to be transferred to the inhabitants of the redefined or new subdivisions set out in the corresponding items in column 2 of those schedules.

3. The Committees now in office in the several subdivisions set out in column 1 of the aforesaid schedules shall not be deemed to have been dissolved by reason of the redefinition or amalgamation of the subdivisions set out in the corresponding items in column 2 of those schedules but shall remain in office until June 30, 1936, or until the respective new Committees elected for the aforesaid redefined or amalgamated subdivisions come into office.

The required change shall be made on payment of a fee of 10 cents: Provided, however, that if the order is to be paid in a country other than the original country of payment, the required change shall be made on payment of a commission at the ordinary rate chargeable on a Money Order of that value in respect of the country to which the order is transferred.

12. The remitter of a Money Order which has not been paid may require that the amount be paid to some person other than the payee named in the order. The required change shall be made on payment of a fee of 10 cents. Application for such alteration shall be made to the Postmaster of the office of issue of the order who may call upon any such applicant to furnish proof that he is in fact the remitter of the order and also to produce the receipt granted to him or the order.

13. The remitter of a Money Order which has not been paid may stop payment and require that the money be repaid to himself. This shall be done on payment of a fee of 10 cents. In no case, however, shall the Postmaster-General be liable for inability or failure to stop payment of a Money Order in compliance with a remitter's request.

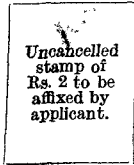

3. The following regulation shall be inserted as regulation 8 in the Fourth Schedule to the Ordinance :—

8. (1) No person shall act as conductor of an omnibus unless he is the holder of a licence in that behalf issued by the registrar.

(2) Every application for a licence shall be in form 28 in the Third Schedule to the Ordinance, and shall be accompanied by two copies of the applicant's most recent photograph, and the prescribed fee.

(3) Every licence shall be substantially in form 29 in the Third Schedule to the Ordinance.

(4) One copy of the photograph of each applicant shall be filed in the registrar's office, and the other copy shall be affixed to the licence, if the registrar decides to issue a licence, and shall be authenticated by the registrar with a facsimile of his signature or with his official seal or stamp.

(5) No licence shall be issued to any person who has not completed eighteen years of age.

(6) Every licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

(7) A licence already issued may (on application made to the registrar by the holder thereof and on payment of the fee of one rupee) be renewed by endorsement on such licence of the renewal thereof by the registrar. Every licence so renewed shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is renewed.

(8) The registrar may, subject to appeal to the Governor, refuse to issue or renew a licence, or at any time suspend or cancel a licence or a renewal of a licence already issued, to any person who is in the opinion of the registrar unfit to be the conductor of an omnibus because he habitually behaves in a riotous or disorderly manner or is habitually drunk or suffers from any disease of an infectious or contagious nature.

(9) Every conductor of an omnibus shall carry his licence on his person or in the omnibus while he is on duty, and shall forthwith produce it for inspection on demand by a police officer or headman.

(10) Every conductor who is prosecuted before any court for any offence shall take his licence with him to the court-house and shall produce the licence when called upon to do so by the court at any stage of the proceedings.

(11) A court which convicts a conductor of any offence under any written law shall call upon the conductor to produce the licence and endorse on it the particulars of the offence and the sentence imposed, and may in addition suspend or cancel the licence by a further endorsement made on the licence and recorded in the proceedings. If the licence is not so produced when demanded, the holder thereof may by an order recorded in the proceedings be disqualified for acting as conductor of any omnibus until the licence is produced in court for such endorsement as may be necessary.

4. These regulations shall have force and effect on and after the first day of April, 1936.

### KANDY MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

**The Minutes of Proceedings of a Meeting of the Municipal Council of Kandy, held in the Town Hall, Kandy, on December 21, 1935, at 8.45 a.m., in accordance with the Notice dated December 17, 1935.**

*Present* :—Mr. W. J. L. Rogerson, Chairman; Ratwatte Adigar; Mr. Geo. E. de Silva; Mr. S. A. Wijayatilake; Mr. Haji M. S. Usoof Ismail; Mr. W. A. B. Soysa; Mr. W. Beven; Mr. O. T. Nettelton; Dr. D. T. de Kretser; Mr. M. A. S. Marikar.

Before proceeding with the business of the Meeting the Chairman moved a vote of condolence with Dr. de Kretser in his recent bereavement. The motion was passed all members standing.

1. The Minutes of Proceedings of the Meeting held on November 16, 1935, and of the Special Meeting held on December 14, 1935, having been previously submitted to the Chairman for his approval and a copy thereof furnished to each Member, were taken as read and confirmed by the Chairman.

2. The following documents were submitted :—

(a) Statement of receipts and disbursements from close of 1934 to November 30, 1935, on account of the Municipal Fund.

(b) Progress report of works brought up to October 31, 1935.

(c) Health Officer's report for November, 1935.

(d) Statement of cases instituted by the several Inspectors and work done by the Municipal Magistrate during the month of November, 1935.

(e) The reservoir readings for the week ending December 21, 1935.

Resolved that the statement (a), together with the Minutes of Proceedings of this meeting, as required by section 83 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance, No. 6 of 1910, be forwarded to the Commissioner of Local Government for publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. The following papers were laid on the table :—(a) Reports by the several Inspectors on laundries, bakeries, dairies, standpipes, and house service taps inspected during November, 1935. (b) Report from the Municipal Engineer on the condition of the various drives in Kandy.

3A. Report of the Medical Officer of Health on anti-plague measures carried out in Kandy, was tabled for the information of the Press.

3B. Ratwatte Adigar drew the Chairman's attention to—(1) the large number of beggars frequenting the Market; and (2) the traders established in the market area which is not allowed for such use.

(3) Mr. de Silva suggested that the Car Park opposite the Mahaiyawa cemetery should be properly levelled.

Mr. Nettelton supported the proposal and suggested that relief labour might be employed for the work.

The Chairman agreed to look into these matters.

4. Petitions.—Mr. Wijayatilaka presented :—(1) petition from Mr. P. L. P. Alwis dated December 20, 1935, praying for an extension of time until February 29, 1936, for the renewal of motor licences.

Mr. Soysa presented :—(2) petition from Mrs. B. N. Muthammal dated December 10, 1935, asking that the drain from Dr. Anthonisz' property and passing through her property be diverted. (3) Application from Mr. P. L. Singho Appuhamy dated December 7, 1935, for a private water service to premises No. 938/939, Peradeniya road.

Mr. Beven presented :—(4) petition from Mr. S. M. Abdul Cader dated December 18, 1935, complaining that he has been called upon to pay a high premium for transfer of half share of beef stall No. 86.



Mr. Wijayatilaka presented :—(5) Petition from Mr. P. L. P. Alwis dated December 16, 1935, praying that a Bus halting place be allowed in Temple street. (6) Petition from Mr. W. M. Talakumbura of space No. 68, Public Market dated December 11, 1935, complaining that he has been asked to pay the electric dues due by the previous occupant of the space.

The Chairman undertook to look into the matters referred to in the various petitions.

4A. Pursuant to notice Mr. Ismail asked the following questions to which the Chairman replied :—

Q.—(1) Does the revised estimate for Rs. 199,500 which the Council recently sanctioned in connection with the Minor (River) Pumping Scheme represent the full and final expenditure necessary for the completion of the scheme? If not what further sum is required and for what purpose? A.—The sanctioned revised estimate of Rs. 199,500 for the Minor Augmentation (River) Pumping Scheme is the full amount required for the scheme as enumerated in the Municipal Engineer's report dated February 26, 1934, and March 2, 1934, with the alterations that Council have approved, *i.e.*, the storage tank to be at the higher level and an Infiltration Gallery takes the place of the two wells provided for originally in the scheme.

Q.—(2) When will it be possible to inaugurate the scheme? A.—The inauguration of the scheme can take place as soon as the Pumping and Delivery mains are laid and the storage tank completed. The storage tank will be completed by February 1, 1936. The pipes for the delivery mains have not yet arrived. It is not intended to use this supply except in drought periods.

Q.—(3) Will the Municipal Engineer be held solely responsible for the efficient and satisfactory working of the scheme after its completion, or will responsibility be divided between the Municipal Electrical Engineer and the Municipal Engineer? A.—The Municipal Engineer will be responsible for the maintenance of the plant and wells and its control, except the Electrical Supply sub-station and its connections, which will be under the Municipal Electrical Engineer.

#### 5. Recommendations of Standing Committees :—

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects held on November 16, 1935.*

(1) Letter No. M 225/35 of October 17, 1935, from the Superintendent of Police, Central Province, suggesting the desirability of putting up "intersecting highways notices" declaring one street, the main road at Trincomalee street and Brownrigg street, in accordance with section 44 (8) of the Motor Car Ordinance. (B 75).—Recommended.

(2) Application from Mr. Abdul Kany and Mr. A. Amirdeen, joint licensees of stall No. 56A, Public Market, to transfer the stall in favour of Mr. K. Ayu Lebbe Marikar.—Recommended on the usual premium.

(3) To consider the question of allowing other trades than vegetables approved by the Medical Officer of Health in the 15 vacant spaces in the Small Market.—Recommended.

*Extracts from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment held on November 16, 1935.*

(4) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 1,750 for installing a radiogram at the Victoria Esplanade. (F 306).—Not recommended.

(5) To obtain supplementary votes in the amounts mentioned against each, under the following heads in the Budget, to meet the expenditure up to the end of the year :—(a) Legal expenses, Rs. 100; (b) salaries of market labourers Rs. 125; (c) removal of sick and burial of dead paupers, Rs. 450; (d) lighting of town streets, Rs. 1,700; (e) lighting of Town Hall, Rs. 160; (f) Municipal Free Library, wages of substitute peon, Rs. 35.—Recommended except the item of Rs. 1,700 reserved for further investigation.

(6) To obtain sanction for transferring a sum of Rs. 500 from the unexpended sum in the stationery vote to supplement the printing vote by Rs. 300 and the Collectors' commission vote by Rs. 200.—Recommended.

(7) To obtain sanction for paying a commuted pension of Rs. 405.40 and a reduced annual pension of Rs. 121.62 to Mr. U. B. Wijesinghe, Process Server, who has been retired from the Council's service as from February 6, 1935. (0550).—Recommended.

(8) To obtain sanction for writing off a sum of Rs. 619.84 due from Nanduwa Duraya in respect of the Halloluwa Ferry Toll rent for 1931, in view of the grant of an insolvent's certificate to him. (D 38).—Recommended.

(9) To obtain sanction for the waiver of Rs. 14 due as rates on certain paddy fields in view of the inability of the owners thereof to pay the rates owing to poverty. (A 60).—Recommended.

(10) Applications from :—(a) Mr. D. Senewiratne, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, for a loan of Rs. 1,500; and (b) Mr. E. R. Abeyagoonsekera, Sanitary Inspector, for a loan of Rs. 750 to enable them to purchase motor cars for use on official duties.—Not recommended.

(11) To obtain a vote for Rs. 60 to meet part cost of rental of telephone installed at the Chairman's bungalow. (0313).—Recommended.

*Extract from the Minutes of the Meeting of the Electricity Committee held on November 16, 1935.*

(12) Estimate from the Municipal Electrical Engineer for Rs. 4,230 for extending electric lights along Heerasagala road on low tension A. C. system.—Recommended vote of Rs. 5,200 to extend on the high tension A. C. system.

Resolution of Council on the recommendations of Standing Committees under items 1 to 9 and 11 and 12.

Resolved that the recommendations be adopted, the proposal under item (3) to be regarded as a temporary measure.

Resolution of Council on item (10).—Resolved that the loan applied for by Mr. D. Senewiratne, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon, be allowed on the usual terms, subject to repayment in 12 monthly instalments.

6. At this stage Mr. Nettelton brought to the notice of the Chairman the unnecessary sounding of horns by motor bus drivers in the vicinity of the Queen's Hotel, and the Chairman agreed to refer the complaint to the Superintendent of Police, Central Province.

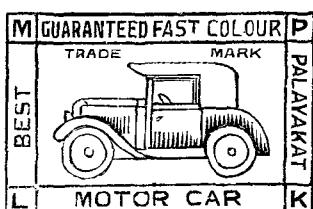
