- (i.) By the substitution of "8" for "6" C. E. Motor Cycles in line 6 of Regulation 10 on page 2.

"76. An officer on retirement may be granted permission to retain his rank and wear the uniform of his Corps on special occasions, subject to the following conditions:—

- (i.) He must have completed a minimum of 10 years' commissioned service, or 3 years' commissioned service and 14 years' service in the ranks, either in the Ceylon Defence Force or in other Authorized Auxiliary Forces of the Empire.

77. When recommending that an officer on retirement should be granted the privilege laid down in Regulation 76, Commanding Officers will render a certificate in terms of the conditions set out in that Regulation. The certificate will be signed by the Commanding Officer under whom the officer last served, or if that is impracticable by a senior officer of the Corps fully cognizant of his service. In the case of a Commanding Officer the certificate will be signed by the Commandant."

FUGITIVE CRIMINAL.

THE AUSTRIA (EXTRADITION) ORDER IN COUNCIL 1935.

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 6th day of June, 1935.

Present.

THE KING'S MOST EXCELLENT MAJESTY IN COUNCIL.

WHEREAS by the Extradition Acts, 1870 to 1932 (a) it was, amongst other things, enacted that, where an arrangement has been made with any foreign State with respect to the surrender to such State of any fugitive criminals, His Majesty may, by Order in Council, direct that the said Acts shall apply in the case of such foreign State; and that His Majesty may, by the same or any subsequent Order, limit the operation of the Order, and restrict the same to fugitive criminals who are in or suspected of being in the part of His Majesty's dominions specified in the Order, and render the operation thereof subject to such conditions, exceptions and qualifications as may be deemed expedient:

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 3rd day of December, 1873, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and His late Majesty the Emperor of Austria and King of Hungary for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals which Treaty was amended by a Declaration signed on the 26th day of June, 1901:

And whereas the said Treaty and Declaration were duly ratified: (b)

And whereas a further Convention was signed on the 29th day of October, 1934, between His Majesty and the Federal President of Austria, which Convention is in the terms following :—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India, and the Federal President of Austria.

Desiring to make further provision for the reciprocal extradition of fugitive criminals, have resolved to conclude a Supplementary Convention to this end and for this purpose have appointed as their plenipotentiaries :—

His Majesty The King of Great Britain, Ireland and the British Dominions beyond the Seas, Emperor of India.

For Great Britain and Northern Ireland :—

Sir Walford Selby, K.C.M.G., C.B., C.V.O., His Envoy Extraordinary and Minister Plenipotentiary at Vienna ;

The Federal President of Austria.

M. Egon Berger-Waldeneegg, Minister for Foreign Affairs ; who, having communicated to each other their full powers, found in good and due form, have agreed as follows :—

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 2 of the Extradition Treaty, signed at Vienna on the 3rd December, 1873, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause :—

“ Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made.”

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty The King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other Member of the British Commonwealth of

Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Vienna. From the date that such notice comes into force the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Austria on the one hand and, on the other, the territory of the Member of the Commonwealth concerned.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any Member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the Member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873.

In faith whereof the above-named plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

Done in duplicate in English and German at Vienna, the 29th of October, 1934.

Now, therefore, His Majesty, by and with the advice of His Privy Council, and in virtue of the authority committed to Him by the said recited Acts, doth order, and it is hereby ordered, that from and after the 30th day of July, 1935, the said Acts shall apply in respect of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, and British Colonies in the case of Austria under and in accordance with the said Treaty of the 3rd December, 1873, as modified by the Declaration of the 26th June, 1901, and by the Convention of the 29th October, 1934.

This Order may be cited as the Austria (Extradition) Order in Council, 1935.

And whereas a Treaty was signed on the 26th day of November, 1880, between Her late Majesty Queen Victoria and the Swiss Federal Council for the mutual extradition of fugitive criminals, which Treaty was amended by a Convention signed on the 29th day of June, 1904 :

who, having communicated to each other their full powers found in good and due form have agreed as follows :

ARTICLE 1.

From the date of the coming into force of the present Convention Article 2. of the Extradition Treaty signed at Berne on the 26th November, 1880, shall be amended by the addition of the following clause :

“ Extradition may also be granted at the discretion of the High Contracting Party applied to in respect of any other crime or offence for which, according to the laws of both of the High Contracting Parties for the time being in force, the grant may be made.”

ARTICLE 2.

The foregoing amendment shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand and, on the other hand, the following territories of His Majesty, that is to say, the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland, the Channel Islands, the Isle of Man, Newfoundland, British Colonies, British Protectorates to which the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880, applies, and mandated territories to which the said Treaty has been or may be extended, and in respect of which the mandate is exercised by His Majesty's Government in the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Northern Ireland.

ARTICLE 3.

The High Contracting Parties agree that His Majesty the King may accede to the present Convention in respect of any other members of the British Commonwealth of Nations, whose Government may desire that such accession be effected, by a notice given to that effect by the appropriate diplomatic representative of His Majesty at Berne. From the date that such notice comes into effect the amendment set forth in Article 1 shall apply to extradition proceedings between Switzerland on the one hand, and the territory of the member of the Commonwealth concerned on the other hand.

Any notice given under the first paragraph of this Article in respect of any member of the British Commonwealth of Nations may include any territory in respect of which a mandate on behalf of the League of Nations has been accepted by His Majesty and is exercised by the Government of the member concerned.

ARTICLE 4.

The present Convention shall be ratified. The ratifications shall be exchanged in London as soon as possible.

ARTICLE 5.

The present Convention shall enter into force three months after the exchange of ratifications and shall have the same duration as the Extradition Treaty of the 26th November, 1880.

In faith whereof the above-named Plenipotentiaries have signed the present Convention and have affixed thereto their seals.

RULES OF THE HORTON PLAINS RESTHOUSE, NUWARA ELIYA DISTRICT, CENTRAL PROVINCE.

1. The term "resthouse" for the purpose of these rules shall include the resthouse situated at Horton Plains *alias* Maha Eliya village, Nuwara Eliya District, in the Central Province, together with the land attached thereto and all the buildings thereon.

2. A fee at the rate set out in the schedule hereto shall be paid by every person using or occupying any part of the resthouse: provided that children under twelve years of age shall be charged only half the aforesaid rates, and that no fee shall be charged in respect of the following:—

- (a) an infant in arms;
- (b) a servant who is in attendance on a visitor at the resthouse and sleeps within the resthouse.

3. (1) The correct name and address of every visitor shall be signed and entered in the resthouse collection book on admission to the resthouse, and until this is done a visitor shall not be entitled to use the resthouse and shall not be supplied with refreshments. The date of departure and other particulars required shall be entered in the collection book by every visitor before leaving the resthouse.

(2) If the name or the address so signed or entered by any visitor is subsequently found to be fictitious or incorrect in any material particulars, he shall be guilty of an offence punishable on summary conviction with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

4. No visitor shall occupy any part of the resthouse for a period longer than fourteen consecutive days, if accommodation is required by another visitor.

5. The resthouse shall not be open for the sale or disposal of any wines, spirits, or malt liquors of brands or make other than such as shall have been previously approved by the Provincial Road Committee, Central Province.

6. The resthouse is licensed for the sale for consumption on the premises of foreign liquor (including locally made beer) to persons lodging at the resthouse for at least a night and to *bona fide* travellers who have come to the resthouse from a distance of over three miles. Between the hours of 11 P.M. and 8 A.M. liquor will not be sold except to *bona fide* travellers who have come to the resthouse from a distance of over three miles and who actually arrive at the resthouse between those hours. In such cases, the sale will be restricted to a period of half an hour subsequent to their arrival.

7. Officers of the Excise Department in uniform who visit the resthouse in their official capacity shall not be liable to pay occupation fees provided that—

- (a) they make no use of the bedrooms, stables, or kennels;

- (b) the duration of their stay does not exceed one hour;
- (c) they sign the Inspecting Officer's book giving all the information therein required;
- (d) they do not take any meal, drink, or other refreshment in the resthouse.

8. Resthouse fees and charges shall be paid in cash on demand and in default of such payment the resthouse-keeper or lessee shall be entitled to refuse further supplies.

9. The resthouse-keeper or lessee shall not be bound to comply with any telegram requesting meals to be prepared unless the name and address of the sender are set out in the telegram.

10. No bed, sofa, or couch in the resthouse shall be used for the purpose of sleeping unless a sheet is spread thereon.

11. The value of all articles damaged or broken by any visitor or his servant shall be paid by that visitor in accordance with the scale of charges appearing on the resthouse notice board.

12. (1) The resthouse-keeper or lessee shall keep a complaint book in which visitors shall enter any complaint or remarks about the resthouse or its management.

(2) It shall be the duty of the resthouse-keeper or lessee to produce the complaint book when called upon so to do.

(3) No remarks or complaints shall be written in the collection book.

13. Persons actually occupying the resthouse shall have a prior claim to the use of any stable or kennel attached to the resthouse, over persons not actually occupying the resthouse.

14. The owner or hirer of a horse, dog, or any other animal stabled or kennelled, whether he occupies the resthouse or not, shall pay the personal occupation fee for the period during which such animal is stabled or kennelled, in addition to the fee for the use of the stable or kennel.

15. (1) Any visitor who desires to book any accommodation in advance may do so on giving at least seven clear days' notice.

(2) Such notice shall be accompanied by a remittance of Rs. 11, which will be credited to the visitor's account if the accommodation is taken as arranged.

(3) The remittance will usually be forfeited if the accommodation is not taken as arranged: provided that such remittance may be refunded (less Money Order commission) if sufficient notice of cancellation of the booking has been given; but in no case shall any refund be made if the resthouse-keeper or lessee was deprived of revenue which would otherwise have accrued to him but for the fact that that accommodation had been previously booked.

(4) A notice accompanied by a remittance under paragraphs (1) and (2) will entitle the sender to the use of the accommodation booked in preference to any visitor who has not similarly booked accommodation in advance.

16. A breach of any of the above rules, or others that may hereafter be made by the Provincial Road Committee with the approval of His Excellency the Governor, shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding Rs. 50.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.**Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, January 11, 1936, pursuant to notice dated January 6, 1936.**

Present:—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman; Mr. J. E. Perera; Mr. D. I. Durham; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna; Mr. R. L. Ephraums; Mr. A. C. Mohammedo; Mr. C. H. Bradley; Mr. W. Dahanayaka; Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab; and Mr. Alfred Kahaduwa.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting and of the Special Meeting held on December 14, 1935, copies thereof having been furnished to each member, were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, one by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, and three by Mr. W. Dahanayaka. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. To consider the question of obtaining a report on a town planning scheme for Galle.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee.

Council in Committee interviewed Mr. O. Weerasinghè, A.R.I.B.A. who explained the various points which would be dealt with by him in a town planning report for Galle. He also undertook to forward for the information of the members copies of reports prepared by him for the Urban District Councils of Nawalapitiya and Kolonnawa.

Council in Committee then recommended, after discussion, that consideration of the matter be deferred until the next meeting of the Council.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions :—(1) When was the assessment of properties last made by a competent person and by whom ? (2) What was the entire cost to Council of such assessment ? (3) Who has assessed the buildings that have come up subsequent to that date ? (4) What is the basis on which the annual values of the following are determined ? (a) Dwelling houses occupied by owners, (b) Dwelling houses let out on rent ; (c) Business centres such as shops and boutiques ; (d) Hotels and boarding-houses ; (e) Petrol Stations ; (f) Buildings used as offices ; (g) Lands. (5) Is there any person in the service of the Council who has any kind of qualifications for assessing properties ? If so, who is he and what are his qualifications ? (6) Will the Chairman be pleased to make a statement on the recent detection of bad rice in the Galle Bazaar ? (7) Is it a fact that the owners of the rice stores concerned have been severely warned by the Chairman ? (8) In view of the gravity of this matter and the widespread alarm caused by this detection, will the Chairman be pleased to order the prosecution of the said owners of rice stores, as provided in section 204 of the Municipal Councils Ordinance ?

The Chairman replied as follows :—(1) In 1923 all Government buildings in the town were assessed by Captain E. G. Eastman, Municipal Assessor, Colombo, and later Government Assessor. In 1924 private properties were assessed by the same officer, the work being done ward by ward as funds permitted. The assessment of all the wards was finally completed in 1925. (2) Rs. 5,984·06. (3) The Secretary of the Council. (4) In each of the cases mentioned the annual value is determined on the basis of the annual rental which a tenant or lessee might reasonably be expected to pay for the building or land in question, taking into consideration the circumstances of each particular case, e.g., in the case of a building, the locality, the nature, and condition of the building, and the purpose for which it is used ; in the case of a land, the extent of the land and the nature, condition, and extent of the produce growing thereon. (5) If experience in this work cannot be considered a qualification, the answer to this question must be in the negative. (6) A statement on the subject is tabled. (7) No. (8) No. I do not think a prosecution is necessary or that any offence punishable under section 204 can be proved.

5. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved :—(1) That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to submit a report, as early as possible, on a revised constitution for the Galle Municipal Council. Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded, and Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya supported the motion.

Messrs. A. C. Mohammedo and A. I. H. A. Wahab opposed the motion. Mr. J. E. Perera also spoke.

The mover replied. The motion was then put to the meeting and declared lost, 6 voting for and 7 against.

(2) That this Council invites the attention of Government to the wide prevalence of tuberculosis in Galle, and suggests the early establishment of an anti-tuberculosis sanatorium in the Southern Province. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded the motion which was supported also by Messrs. A. C. Mohammedo, A. I. H. A. Wahab, and Thomas Amarasuriya.

The motion was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

6. The following motion which stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka was, with the permission of Council, withdrawn by the mover on the Chairman pointing out that it was not in order :—“ This Council requests the Chairman to hold an inquiry into the circumstances under which over 50 bags of rice that were unfit for human consumption happened to be transported from the Customs at Galle to two rice stores in the Bazaar between December 28 and January 3.”

7. To elect, by ballot, members to form the Four Standing Committees for the year 1936 :—A ballot was taken and the Chairman declared that the following members had been elected :—

- (1) *Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment.*—Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. D. I. Durham, and Mr. W. Dahanayaka.
- (2) *Standing Committee on Municipal Works.*—Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. C. H. Bradley, and Mr. A. Kahaduwa.
- (3) *Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects.*—Mr. F. Magdon Ismail, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, and Mr. A. C. Mohammedo.
- (4) *Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation.*—Mr. H. E. Ekanayaka, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, and Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab.

8. To reappoint the following Special Committees :—(a) Special Committee appointed on October 14, 1935, to inquire and report to the Council whether the staff of the Council could be reduced.—Resolved that this Committee be not reappointed.

(b) Special Committee appointed on January 18, 1934, to report on the future development of the Esplanade.—Resolved that this Committee be re-appointed with the following personnel :—Mr. E. M. Karunaratna (Convener), Mr. J. E. Perera, and Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, two members forming a quorum.

(c) Special Committee appointed on November 24, 1934, to report what steps should be taken to improve the housing and general conditions of the town.—Resolved that this Committee be reappointed with the following personnel :—The Chairman, and all the elected members, with Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya as convener and three members forming a quorum.

(d) Select Committee appointed on September 13, 1935, to consider and report upon the question of leasing the Esplanade pavilion to the Galle Cricket club at a nominal rent.—Resolved that this Committee be reappointed with the following personnel, Mr. E. M. Karunaratne (convener), Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, and Mr. A. Kahaduwa, two members forming a quorum.

(e) Special Committee appointed on November 22, 1935, to report on the establishment of a Municipal Play Centre at the Galle Esplanade for the children of the crowded localities round about, who are at present deprived of organized recreation.—Resolved that this Committee be reappointed with the following personnel :—Mr. W. Dahanayaka (convener), Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, and Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab, three members forming a quorum.

9. To sanction the following revotes for 1936 :—(a) Rs. 1,000 for improvements to public latrines.—Sanctioned. (b) Rs. 1,633·50 being unspent balance on the vote of Rs. 2,147·50 for improvements to the Esplanade.—Sanctioned. (c) Rs. 139·50 being unspent balance on the vote of Rs. 400 for constructing a traffic control box at Dicksons road junction.—Sanctioned. (d) Rs. 761·03 being unspent balance on the vote of Rs. 1,900 for extending the water service from Dewata Junction to Waggalmodera Bridge.—Sanctioned.

10. To approve under Rule 18A of the Municipal Pension Minute of the transfer to Government Service of Mr. L. P. Juriansz, Clerk, Health Department, with effect from January 3, 1936.—Resolved that the transfer be approved.

11. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, February 8, 1936, at 9.30 A.M.

12. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting the Chairman moved that the Council do place on record its sincere appreciation of the work done by Mr. A. M. Saheed during his term of office as a nominated member of the Council. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

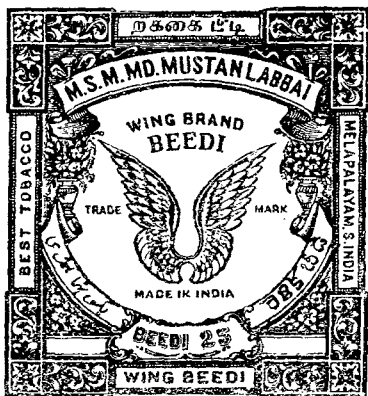

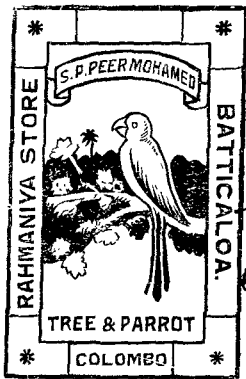

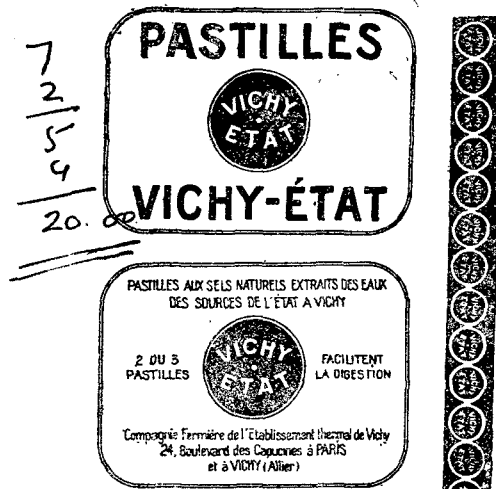
