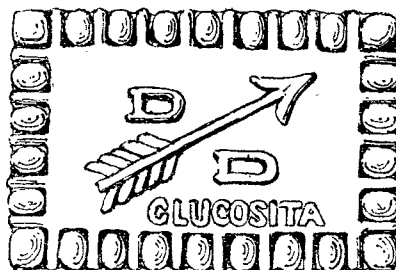

Annamalay Chettiar addressed to Mr. de Silva asking him to recommend to Council the re-sale to the Chettiar of a piece of a land behind premises No. 322, Peradeniya road, which the Council had acquired from his predecessors-in-title but not put into use.

(4) Letter from Bus owners addressed to Mr. de Silva asking that a permit be obtained from the Chairman to enable Mr. Mohamed Ali of No. 15, Cemetery road who is keeping a tea cart at the Bus stand to continue his trade.

Mr. Marikar presented—(5) Petition from Mr. D. M. Abeygoonesekera objecting to the site of the new latrine now in course of construction at premises No. 155, Trincomalee street.

Mr. Wijayatilake presented—(6) Petition dated February 13, 1936, from occupants of the Katukelle Model Tenements asking that the footpath leading towards the Railway, Post Office, &c., and which was closed sometime ago be reopened.

(7) Petition dated January 27, 1936, from Mr. J. Abdul Wahab asking that the public drain adjoining premises No. 330A, Peradeniya road be built at Council's expense.

(8) Petition dated February 5, 1936, from Bus owners asking that Mr. Mohamed Ali of No. 15, Cemetery road be allowed to keep his tea cart and carry on trade in the Bus stand.

The Chairman agreed to look into the matters referred to in the petitions.
