WHEREAS by section 4 of "The Village Communities' Ordinance, 1889," it is enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, by Proclamation to be by him for that purpose issued, to declare from time to time, as he may think desirable, that any chief headman's division or part thereof shall be brought, from a time to be named therein, within the operation of the said Ordinance:

And whereas it is expedient to bring so much of the four gravets subdivision of the chief headman's division as lies within the four gravets of Galle, but outside the Municipal limits, and the Akmimana subdivision of Galle, in the Galle District, Southern Province, within the operation of the said Ordinance:

Now know Ye that We, the Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council do by this Our Proclamation declare that so much of the four gravets subdivision of the chief headman's division as lies within the four gravets of Galle, but outside the Municipal limits, and the Akmimana subdivision of Galle, in the Galle District, Southern Province, shall, as and from and after

the First day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five, be brought within the operation of the said Ordinance.

Given at Colombo, in the said Island of Ceylon, this Tenth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

Now know Ye that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby subdivide so much of the four gravets subdivision as lies within the four gravets of Galle, but outside the Municipal limits, and the Akmimana subdivision of Galle, in the Galle District, Southern Province, and appoint that so much of the said four gravets subdivision as lies within the four gravets of Galle, but outside the Municipal limits, and the Akmimana subdivision of Galle, in the Galle District, Southern Province, shall, as and from and after the First day of December, One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five, consist of the villages or groups of villages specified in the schedule A hereto.
