THE following telegram that has been received from the Secretary of State for the Colonies is published for general information:—

27th January, 1936.

I have laid before the King your telegram of 21st January conveying on behalf of the people of Ceylon message of condolence with Royal family on the death of King George. I am commanded by the King to request you to convey to the people of Ceylon an expression of His Majesty's deep gratitude for this loyal and kind message of sympathy.

THE following telegram that was sent to the Secretary of State for the Colonies and the telegram received in reply are published for general information:—

23rd January, 1936.

Following for His Majesty the King begins. We, the Board of Ministers of Ceylon present our humble duty to the King and other members of the Royal Family and with loyal devotion desire respectfully to express our feelings of most heartfelt sympathy in the grievous loss sustained by them and by the whole Empire by the death of our beloved Sovereign King George V.

27th January, 1936.

Your telegram of 23rd January, I have it in command from the King to request you to convey of the Board of Ministers an expression of the deep appreciation of their loyalty and kind message of sympathy to His Majesty and to the Royal family.

BY-LAWS.

1. The use of hand-carts, push-carts, barrows, trolleys, and other similar vehicles for transporting goods in the streets or thoroughfares hereinafter indicated shall be subject to the following provisions :—

- (a) No such vehicle shall be used the wheels of which are fitted with any metal tyres, other than half round metal tyres or flat metal tyres without sharp edges.
- (b) No such vehicle shall be taken abreast of any other vehicle of any kind or at a speed exceeding ordinary walking pace.
- (c) Every such vehicle shall be taken as nearly as possible along the left hand edge of the road.
- (d) No such vehicle shall be halted at or near a public well, tank, or standpipe for a longer time than is necessary for drawing water from such well, tank, or standpipe.
- (e) All such vehicles shall on arrival at any such well, tank, or standpipe be halted in a queue in the order of their arrival and facing the same direction and shall be moved up in due order as vacancies occur in front.
- (f) Whenever any such vehicle is halted, there shall be a person in charge thereof to move it up in accordance with the foregoing provision (e).

2. Part (a) of the foregoing by-law 1 shall apply to all metalled and tarred streets and thoroughfares within the limits of the Badulla Urban District Council area.

Parts (b) to (f) of the said by-law shall be applicable only to the trunk road commonly called the Badulla-Batticaloa road, from the town limit sign board near Judges Hill, passing the Courts, the Badulla Resthouse, the Badulla Prison and through Lower street, up to the town limit sign board at Hindagoda.

3. Every contravention of the foregoing by-laws shall be punishable with a fine not exceeding five rupees.

shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to a fine which may extend to fifty rupees, or when the

damage resulting from his offence amounts to more than twenty-five rupees, to double the amount of such damage.

That any person who—

- (a) Makes any fresh clearing in that forest; or
 - (b) Sets fire to that forest, or in contravention of any regulations made by the Governor kindles any fire or leaves any fire burning in such manner as to endanger the forest or any part thereof;
- or who in that forest—
- (c) Kindles, keeps, or carries any fire except at such seasons and in such manner as a forest officer, specially empowered in this behalf may from time to time notify;
 - (d) Fells, girdles, lops, taps, or burns any tree;
 - (e) Quarries stone, burns lime or charcoal, or collects subjects to any manufacturing process or removes any forest produce;
 - (f) Clears or breaks up any land for cultivation or any other purpose;
 - (g) Damages, alters, or removes any wall, ditch, embankment, fence, hedge, or railing—

shall be guilty of an offence, and be liable on conviction to imprisonment for a term which may extend to six months or to fine which may extend to five hundred rupees, or to both, in addition to such compensation for damage done to the forest as the convicting court may direct to be paid. Such compensation when awarded shall be treated in all respects as a fine, shall be recoverable as such and shall not exceed the amount of fine which such court has power to impose.

CEYLON SOUTH COAST, GALLE HARBOUR FURTHER SHOALS REPORTED.

WITH reference to Ceylon Notice to Mariners No. 6 of 1935, the following further patches of rock have been discovered by sweeping operations :—

- (a) A rock with 26 feet over it at L.W.M.S., situated 2,100 feet 101° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion and 4,350 feet 182° from the centre of the conspicuous White Wall. Scattered patches of rock with depths of 28 to 30 feet exist for a distance of 300 feet 300° from this position, the whole area being 150 feet wide.
- (b) A rock with 29 feet over it at L.W.M.S., situated 1,900 feet 079° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion and 3,620 feet 185½° from the centre of the White Wall. This patch consists of a number of rocky heads extending for 100 feet round the above position and is the one referred to in Ceylon Notice to Mariners No. 6 of 1935.
- (c) A rock with 22 feet over it at L.W.M.S., situated 1,200 feet 075° from the extremity of Aurora Bastion and 3,850 feet 196° from the centre of the White Wall. Scattered patches of rock with 24 to 26 feet over them exist for a distance of 350 feet 180° from this position the area being 100 feet wide.
- (d) A rock with 27 feet over it at L.W.M.S., situated 600 feet 198° from Katta Gala rock. Katta Buoy has been moved to a position 620 feet 202° from Katta Gala rock.

1. The Minutes of the General Meeting of November 6, 1935, having been previously printed and copies thereof having been sent to each Member of Council, were taken as read and confirmed.

1A. With the permission of Council, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha presented a petition from Mrs. C. M. Lucas of Villa Fortune, Alwis place, Colpetty, late Public Health Nurse of the Public Health Department, praying that her case be reconsidered and that she be re-employed by the Council, and requested that the petition be submitted to the appropriate Committee for consideration.

2. Pursuant to notice, the Chairman moved :—That the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the following extracts from the proceedings of the Committees annexed to the Agenda.—Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee.—

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee regarding the Public Library of November 9, 1935, were considered.

(2) To consider the nomination of Mr. E. F. C. Ludowyke, Professor of English, Ceylon University College, to fill the vacancy on the Library Committee caused by the resignation of Professor D. M. Hussey. Registered No. 05,521.—Recommended that Mr. E. F. C. Ludowyke be appointed to fill the vacancy on the Committee caused by the resignation of Mr. D. M. Hussey.

(3) To consider the list of periodicals to be ordered for the Public Library for 1936. Registered No. 2,177.—Recommended that the annexed list "A" be approved.

(4) To consider :—(a) The report of the Librarian, Public Library, on the verification of the stock of books in the Library. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Treasurer stating that sanction of the Committee is necessary to strike off the deficiencies reported and take on charge 4 books previously reported as missing but now traced. Registered No. 2,166.—Recommended that the deficiencies in the annexed list "B" be written off and that the four books mentioned therein as previously reported missing but now traced be taken on charge.

(5) To consider the lists of new books recommended by the respective Sub-Committees for addition to the following classes :—Philosophy and Religion, Sociology, Natural Science, Literature, and History. Registered No. 2,354.—Recommended that the lists be approved with the addition of :—(1) Lecky's History of England 7 V. 35, (2) Herbert Paul's History of England 5 V. 42/6.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Law and General Subjects of November 16, 1935, were considered.

(3) To consider :—(a) The question of the assessment of buildings for which certificates of conformity have not yet been issued by the Municipal Engineer, but which are nevertheless in occupation. (b) Reports thereon of the Municipal Assessor stating that such buildings cannot be assessed without prejudice to any legal action which the Council may be compelled to take in connection with illegal occupation. (c) Reports thereon of the Municipal Engineer and the Municipal Treasurer. Registered No. 1,788.—Recommended that all buildings should be assessed irrespective of any legal disability attaching to them if they are capable of being beneficially occupied.

The following item which was recommended by the Works and Finance Committees of November 20, 1935, having been approved of in circulation by the Members of the Law Committee is submitted for sanction of Council :—

(4) To consider :—(a) Letter No. C 5844 of July 1, 1935, from the Superintendent of Police, Colombo, recommending that Alexandra place be declared a main road at its intersection with Ward place. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Engineer stating that he has discussed the matter with the Superintendent of Police and has agreed that Ward place should be declared the main road and recommending that the following regulation be sanctioned and published as required by Ordinance No. 20 of 1927 :—

"At the intersection of the two highways at Ward place and Alexandra place in Colombo, Ward place shall be considered the main road." Registered No. 1,449.

The following item having been approved of in circulation by the members of the Law Committee is submitted for sanction of Council :—

(5) To consider :—(a) Letter No. B 156/35 of November 20, 1935, from the Legal Draftsman stating that the Hon. the Attorney-General has ruled that a regulation for the compulsory vaccination of stray dogs seized and detained by local authorities cannot be made under section 9 (c) of the Rabies Ordinance, 1893. (b) A report thereon of the Municipal Veterinary Surgeon suggesting that the principal Ordinance No. 7 of 1893, be recommended to be amended by an amending Ordinance to include the following proviso :—

Section 9 "(e) For establishing and maintaining inoculation stations for dogs and other animals, for regulating the management of same, and to compel the preventive inoculation of dogs and animals or inoculation for the purpose of diagnosing the nature of any disease." Registered No. 2,532.

The following Extract from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Sanitation and Markets of October 21, 1935, was considered.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(6) To consider :—(a) A memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health dated October 12, 1935, stating that Mr. R. C. Mackellar, Sanitary Inspector, Public Health Department, has passed the examination as per Council's resolution of May 11, 1927, promoting him to the post of Sanitary Inspector on condition that he passes the examination referred to above, and therefore recommending that he be now permitted to draw his increments as they were stopped by Council on November 6, 1929, owing to his failure to pass the examination within the prescribed time. Fernando, Clerk in Division II. of the Municipal Engineer's Department, has taken 53 days vacation leave during the current year up to October 7, 1935, and therefore requesting sanction of Council to set off this leave against the lapsed leave available out of 1930, 1931, and 1932, as he has not completed 9 months service to be entitled to vacation leave since taking accumulated vacation leave last year as required by Municipal Council Leave Rule 10 (ii). Registered No. 2,389.—Recommended.

(54) To recommend that, under section 6 of the Municipal Council Leave By-laws, the excess leave of 7 days over 42 days granted to Mr. K. C. Perera, Clerk in Division II. of the Municipal Treasurer's Department, be sanctioned. Registered No. 2,312.—Recommended.

Pensions and Gratuities.

(55) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 712·03 to Anthony No. 2, labourer, Municipal Veterinary Surgeon's Department, who was condemned by a Medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 301 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 42·58. Registered No. 2,379.—Recommended.

(56) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 944·48 to Johonis, B. T. No. 7, labourer, Public Health Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 325 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 52·31. Registered No. 2,435.—Recommended.

(57) To recommend, under rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 945·95 to Kunjetty, B. T. No. 1891, Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 272 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 62·60. Registered No. 2,489.—Recommended.

(58) To recommend, under rules 18 (1) and 2A (1) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of £634. 10s. 2d. and a reduced pension of £190. 7s. per annum from May 19, 1935, calculated as follows: to Mr. C. L. Cox, who was transferred from Council's service on June 8, 1921, after a service of 14 years and 9 months, to the service of the Nigerian Government with the sanction of the Council:—

The gratuity is based on his service of 175 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 30·77. Registered No. 2,530.—Recommended.

(60) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 585·69 to Sollamuthu, B. T. 1206 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 250 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 42·17. Registered No. 2,528.—Recommended.

(61) To recommend, under Rules 12, 2, and 2A (i.) of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of gratuity of Rs. 536·25 and a reduced pension of Rs. 160·87 per annum from September 14, 1935, to M. K. Velu, Turncock, Waterworks Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. Registered No. 2,529.—Recommended.

(62) To recommend, under Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, the grant of a gratuity of Rs. 306·41 to Odayan, B. T. 1520 of the Municipal Engineer's Department, who was condemned by a medical board as unfit for further service. The gratuity is based on his service of 218 months and his average monthly pay of Rs. 25·30. *Note.—This labourer's service had been interrupted by breaks. But they can be condoned under second proviso to Rule 21 of the Municipal Council Pension Rules, which runs as follows:—“It shall, however, be competent for the Council, with the consent of His Excellency the Governor, to award such gratuities in cases in which the service has not been continuous.”* Registered No. 2,556.—Recommended.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) of November 27, 1935, were considered.

MUNICIPAL TREASURER'S DEPARTMENT.

(4) To consider a report of the Municipal Treasurer dated November 21, 1935, stating that Government has changed its office hours on Saturdays from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. to take effect from December 1, 1935, and therefore suggesting that Council's office hours be altered accordingly. Sanction of Council is necessary. Registered No. 2,544.—Recommended that the office hours be changed from 9 A.M. to 1 P.M. on Saturdays.

Resolution of Council in Committee.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha desired that officers be still allowed the usual time off for breakfast in office.

The Chairman stated that that was the intention.

Resolved that the recommendation of the Standing Committees be adopted.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(7) To consider:—(a) A memorandum of the Medical Officer of Health dated October 29, 1935, regarding the Health Station at Prince of Wales' avenue. (b) The comments thereon of the Municipal Treasurer requesting sanction of Council to retain the Health Station as a permanent establishment and to appoint a permanent Cycle Orderly. Registered No. 2,455.—Recommended.

(8) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer dated May 29, 1935, forwarding a list of cases recommended by the Medical Officer of Health, for payment of compensation for destroying infected articles. Registered No. 1,472.—Recommended that payment be made of Rs. 20 as recommended in the Chairman's Memorandum, dated

October 30, 1935 (in lieu of the item for Rs. 9.29) and that payments as per cases recommended by the Medical Officer of Health in regard to the other 7 items aggregating Rs. 776.06 be made. *Note.*—The total amount of compensation will therefore be Rs. 796.06.

(9) To consider the applications received for the post of City Microbiologist. Registered No. 2,478.—Recommended that in view of the fact that Professor E. K. Wolff's qualifications and experience are equivalent to those laid down in the advertisement, he be appointed to the post.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha dissented from the appointment of a non-Ceylonese.

Resolution of Council in Committee:—

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that the matter be referred back to the Four Standing Committees (meeting together) for reconsideration. Mr. Aelian W. Pereira seconded. Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando supported.

Dr. S. Muttiah inquired from the Chairman whether the recommendation of the Standing Committees was *ultra vires* as some of the Members were of that opinion.

The Chairman gave his ruling that the recommendation was in order and moved, as an amendment, that it be adopted. Dr. S. Muttiah seconded.

(At this stage Mr. A. R. A. Razik left the Meeting.)

Dr. E. A. Coorey and Dr. S. T. Gunasekera supported the amendment.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha and Mr. Aelian W. Pereira replied.

Dr. E. A. Coorey spoke again.

Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford spoke to the amendment.

The amendment was put to the meeting and declared carried.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha called for a division and the Council divided as follows:—

Noes.—(1) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, (2) Mr. M. I. M. Reyal, (3) Mr. T. C. Dyball, (4) Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, (5) Mr. Aelian W. Pereira, (6) Mr. F. A. Bond, (7) Mr. C. F. Whitaker, (8) Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford, O.B.E.

The amendment was thereupon put to the meeting as the substantive motion and carried.

WATERWORKS DEPARTMENT.

(11) To consider:—(a) The applications received for the post of Assistant Engineer, Waterworks Department. (b) A report thereon of the Waterworks Engineer. Registered No. 1,689.

Mr. A. E. Goonesinha moved that Mr. R. Kumaranayagam be appointed and that his case be treated as a normal promotion. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.

The motion was put to the meeting and lost. 3 voting for and 5 against.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam, Mr. A. E. Goonesinha, and Mr. A. R. A. Razik desired their dissent to be recorded.

Recommended that applications be invited both in the United Kingdom and in Ceylon for the post of Assistant Engineer, Waterworks Department, on a salary of Rs. 9,528 rising to Rs. 11,520 per annum by annual increments of three of Rs. 384 and two of Rs. 420 plus a travelling allowance of Rs. 1,200. Applicants should not exceed 40 years of age and must be Chartered Civil Engineers with 10 years general Civil Engineering experience including at least 3 years in Waterworks design, construction, and maintenance. The appointment to be on probation for 3 years, in the first instance.

(12) With reference to the resolution of the Four Standing Committees of June 26, 1935, that Dr. L. F. Hirst be requested to report on the question of the area necessary to be acquired for the Augmentation Scheme of the Colombo Water Supply to consider:—(a) The report of Dr. Hirst, dated September 17, 1935. (b) A memorandum thereon of Mr. H. P. Kaufmann, dated November 12, 1935. Registered No. 2,096.—Recommended that the recommendations of Dr. L. F. Hirst be accepted, *i.e.*, (1) The acquisition of approximately 600 acres comprising the site of the proposed storage, reservoir, and the surrounding margin. (2) The acquisition of all habitations in close proximity to the above area or to the banks of the main feeder streams. (3) The acquisition of any habitations on the outlying parts of the catchment area found to be incapable of effective sanitary control. (4) Provision of means of access for the Waterworks Staff to all feeder streams. (5) Adequate powers of control over the entire catchment area for the prevention of pollution of human origin.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Special Committee Regarding Housing and Town Improvement of November 29, 1935, were considered.

MUNICIPAL ENGINEER'S DEPARTMENT.

(4) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer dated November 11, 1935, regarding Street lines—Premises No. 16A, Cattlemart lane, and requesting that the following resolution be adopted:—“To sanction the laying down of street lines under section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, at No. 16A, Cattle mart lane, marked A-B on plan No. 1,857 of September 2, 1935, signed by Mr. O. T. F. Senaratne, Engineer, Buildings.” Registered No. 2,481.—Recommended.

(5) To consider a report of the Municipal Engineer dated November 7, 1935, regarding the proposed street lines in Darley road—McCallum road to Maradana road, submitting for consideration and sanction of Council, in terms of section 18 (4) of Ordinance No. 19 of 1915, the proposed street lines as depicted on plan No. 2,929 dated August 9, 1935, and signed by Mr. H. Wijenathan. Registered No. 2,424.—Recommended.

(7) To consider:—(a) A letter dated November 22, 1935, from Mr. J. L. D. Peiris for permission to name the road reservation for the two new buildings erected at his premises Nos. 2 and 24, Thimbirigasyaya road, as “Spathodea avenue.” (b) The memorandum thereon of the Municipal Assessor stating that he has no objection. Registered No. 2,605.—Recommended.

PUBLIC HEALTH DEPARTMENT.

(8) To consider the following motion of Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, M.M.C., in Council on October 2, 1935:—“In view of the fact that the sale of petrol, kerosene oil, and methylated spirits is allowed in any area of the City subject to necessary precautions, while on the other hand, the sale of coconut oil is restricted to Wolfendhal and the Offensive and Dangerous Trades areas alone, this Council with a view to encouraging the Coconut Industry and also to make coconut oil available to all classes in the City directs the Housing and Town Improvement Committee, to consider the question of permitting the sale of coconut oil over 50 gallons, in other parts of the City subject to necessary safeguards.” Registered No. 2,073.—Recommended that storing of coconut oil in excess of 50 gallons be deleted from the list of Dangerous Trades and that licences be issued subject to such conditions as the Chairman may impose in each case acting under section 212 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

The following Extracts from the Minutes of the Relief of Distress Committee of November 29, 1935, were considered.

(2) To consider a memorandum of the Municipal Treasurer dated November 7, 1935, stating that Council on July 5, 1933, agreed to contribute a maximum contribution of Rs. 200,000, half the total cost of the Government's Scheme for raising the flood embankment if undertaken as an Unemployment Relief Work, &c., but a sum of Rs. 30,000 was transferred from the above contribution as Council's share of cost of the Relief Schemes, *viz.*, Extension to Peter's lane, Rs. 15,000; construction of a road to Wanatamulla, Rs. 15,000; thereby leaving a balance of Rs. 170,000 for the Flood Scheme. Up to end of May, 1935, the amount paid to Government for the Flood Scheme was Rs. 187,186.60 and the Municipal Treasurer, therefore, requests supplemental provision of Rs. 17,186.80 for the excess amount paid to Government. Sanction of Council is necessary. Registered No. 1,847.—Recommended.

(3) To consider a memorandum of the Chairman dated November 14, 1935, regarding Unemployment Relief stating that at a Conference held on November 12, 1935, with the Hon. the Minister for Agriculture and Lands as Chairman, it was decided—subject to the approval of Council—to continue filling up of Buller's road swamp with 900 persons for 2 months at an estimated cost of Rs. 36,000 in order to give time to the Irrigation Department for land acquisition, &c., for the Colombo South Drainage Scheme. Sanction of Council is therefore, necessary for the following:—(1) Rs. 12,000

to be allocated as Council's share of cost on account of the continuation of the Buller's Road Swamp Scheme. (2) For a supplemental vote of Rs. 24,000 being the Government's share on account of the above scheme. Registered No. 2,476.—Recommended (1) and (2).

3. The Chairman moved in Committee:—That the Council do resume. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded—Carried.

4. The Chairman formally moved in Council that the resolutions of Council in Committee, and the recommendations of the various Committees, subject to any amendments of such recommendations by the Council in Committee, be adopted. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.

5. The Chairman submitted, in terms of section 96 of Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, a Budget containing (a) An estimate of the available Municipal Income; (b) Details of proposed expenditure for 1936.

6. The following documents were also laid on the table:—

(1) Statements of Receipts and Disbursements from January 1 to October 31, 1935, and Progress Report showing expenditure for October, 1935.

(2) Weekly statements of plague.

(3) Attendance return of Committees of the Municipal Council for 1935.

(5) Return of average daily supply and consumption of water for October, 1935.

(6) The Municipal Engineer's Report for November, 1935, on the condition of Tramway routes.

(7) The Municipal Engineer's and the City Analyst's Reports on the calorific value, pressure, and the purity of the gas supplied by the Colombo Gas and Water Co., Ltd., during November, 1935.

Special Budget Meeting.

Wednesday, December 11, 1935, at 3 p.m.

The Council met this day at 3 P.M., pursuant to notice, dated December 4, 1935, to consider finally the Budget for the year 1936, in accordance with the provisions of section 98 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, as amended by Ordinance No. 21 of 1929.

Present.—Mr. W. L. Murphy, B.A., C.C.S., Chairman; Dr. E. V. Ratnam; Dr. E. A. Coorey; Dr. S. Muttiah; Mr. T. C. Dyball; Mr. F. Dadabhoy, J.P.; Mr. A. E. Goonesinha; Mr. A. R. A. Razik, J.P.; Mr. G. K. Thornhill; Mr. H. K. de Kretser; Mr. T. A. Owles; Mr. F. A. Bond; and Mr. C. F. Whitaker.

(Mr. G. H. N. Saunders, Municipal Treasurer, was also present.)

The Chairman moved that the Council do resolve itself into a Committee of the whole Council to consider the Budget for 1936. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

A Budget for 1936, containing—(a) An estimate of the available Municipal Income, (b) Details of proposed Expenditure for 1936—having been circulated among the Councillors and submitted to the Council according to the provisions of section 97 (1) and after compliance with section 96, respectively, of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, as amended by Ordinance No. 21 of 1929, was finally considered by the Council in terms of section 98 of that Ordinance.

THE ESTIMATED REVENUE.

B. *Licences.*—Item No. 8, Motor Vehicles. Mr. A. E. Goonesinha inquired whether the same concession as was granted this year of one month's grace will be allowed next year also. The Chairman replied in the affirmative.

The Chairman moved that the Estimated Revenue amounting to Rs. 5,864,996 be passed. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman pointed out that the item I. 82 Motors for pumps and auxiliaries on page 17 should be deleted as it was proposed to charge this amount of Rs. 15,000 to the depreciation fund. This was agreed to.

The Chairman stated that it was considered undesirable to station disinfecting labourers at the Dean's Road Market and it was reported that a sum of Rs. 650 was necessary to meet the cost of certain alterations to the Ambulance Station for the purpose of having these labourers stationed there.

Resolved, on the motion of the Chairman, that a sum of Rs. 650 be added under the heading "Improvements and additions to Buildings, &c."

The Chairman stated that the net result of these alterations was a decrease in the expenditure of Rs. 8,228.

The details of the Estimated Expenditure were gone through.

The Chairman stated that the Estimated Expenditure, on page 1 of the draft budget, should be altered from Rs. 6,176,045 to Rs. 6,167,817 and that instead of an estimated deficit of Rs. 1,049 there would be an estimated surplus of Rs. 7,179.

The Chairman moved that the Estimated Expenditure, as shown in the draft budget, amended as stated by him, amounting to Rs. 6,167,817 be passed. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

The Chairman drew attention to a statement showing Capital Works to be carried out by temporary borrowing from Municipal Council Funds which was laid before the Council and which he stated would be printed on the first page of the Budget.

The Chairman moved that the Council do resume. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

Council Resumed—

The Chairman formally moved in Council that the Budget for 1936, as amended, and the resolutions of Council in Committee be adopted. Dr. E. V. Ratnam seconded.—Carried.

With the permission of Council, the Chairman moved that this Council do place on record its appreciation of the services of Dr. E. V. Ratnam and Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando, who have been the Members for St. Paul's Ward and Kotahena Ward respectively during the following periods:—(1) Dr. E. V. Ratnam from January, 1912, to December, 1935. (2) Mr. C. H. Z. Fernando from January, 1921, to December, 1935. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried unanimously.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam thanked the Chairman for the kind references made regarding his services and to the Council for accepting the vote of appreciation.

Dr. E. V. Ratnam moved that the Council do record their appreciation of the good work done by the Municipal Treasurer, and his staff, in framing the Budget. Dr. E. A. Coorey seconded.—Carried.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL.

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on December 14, 1935, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated December 9, 1935.

Present :—Mr. C. Harrison-Jones, Chairman ; Mr. J. E. Perera ; Mr. D. I. Durham ; Mr. A. M. Saheed ; Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka ; Mr. F. Magdon Ismail ; Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya ; Mr. E. A. Paulas ; Mr. E. M. Karunaratna ; Mr. C. H. Bradley ; Mr. A. C. Mohamado ; Mr. R. L. Ephraums ; and Mr. W. Dahanayaka.

1. The Minutes of the meeting held on November 22, 1935, a copy thereof having been furnished to each member were taken as read and confirmed.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, five by Mr. W. Dahanayaka, and one by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna. These were tabled and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Considered the question of constructing a bus stand on the suggested alternative site, viz., that occupied at present by the Galle Public Hall, Clark Spence's Coal Shed and the Municipal Cart shed :—

Mr. E. M. Karunaratna moved Council into Committee to consider this item. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

Council in Committee—

After discussion Mr. J. E. Perera moved that the suggested site, viz., that of the present Public Hall and coal sheds be not approved as it is not found to be good enough to justify the heavy expense necessary to make it suitable, and that more use be made of the bus stand in Havelock place (between Keppu-ela and the Minor esplanade) which may be extended by the inclusion of a small portion of that esplanade. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above resolution of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried unanimously.

4. Considered letter No. D 569 from the Commissioner of Local Government regarding the payment of pensions and gratuities to the widows and children of officers in the employ of all local authorities :—

The Chairman moved that the Commissioner of Local Government be informed—(a) that the Council desires to have a scheme to provide for the grant of pensions and gratuities to the widows and children of officers in the employ of all local authorities, and (b) that the Council considers that the Scheme should be one under which both the employees of the local body and the local body itself should contribute to a centralized fund in Colombo which should be under the direction and control of the Commissioner of Local Government. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried unanimously.

5. Considered papers relating to the licensing by the Council of vehicles and animals from outside Municipal limits :—Resolved that consideration be deferred.

6. Considered the question of obtaining a report on a Town Planning Scheme for Galle :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee—

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion (1) that Mr. O. Weerasinghe, A.R.I.B.A. be requested to be present at the next meeting of the Council in order that he may be interviewed on the subject ; (2) that information be obtained from the Urban District Councils of Negombo and Kolonnawa as regards the fees paid to Mr. Weerasinghe and the nature of the work proposed to be done.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

7. Considered an application from the Chairman of the Galle Municipal Education District Committee, Galle, for the loan of the services of the Municipal Engineer to advise the Committee and otherwise help in the inspection of school buildings constructed by the Committee within the Municipal area :—The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee—

Council in Committee were of opinion that the services of the Municipal Engineer could not be spared for the purpose as he had quite sufficient work in hand at present but recommended nevertheless that the matter be left in the hands of the Chairman for him to decide.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

8. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of December 5, 1935* :—

(2) Considered 5 applications for water service :—Recommended that out of the three taps requested in application No. 58 only one tap be allowed ; out of the 4 taps requested in application No. 60 only 3 taps be allowed ; and that the remaining three applications be returned to the applicants to be duly perfected before being considered.

(3) Considered the Municipal Engineer's Schedule of rates for 1936 :—Recommended that the Schedule of rates for 1936 be approved subject to the modifications suggested by the Provincial Engineer.

(4) Considered an estimate of Rs. 400 for providing a barbed wire fence round the Municipal Quarry :—Recommended that the estimates be approved.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of December 5, 1935.*

(2) List of demolished buildings in Ward 4, 5, 5a, and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(3) Considered papers relating to the retirement of I. Wickrematillaka, Conservancy Overseer, who has been condemned by a Medical Board as unfit for further service.—Recommended that a further three months leave without pay be granted to I. Wickramatillaka from December 1, 1935, and that the Medical Officer of Health be requested to examine him and report on the question of his fitness to resume duties at the end of that period.

(4) Considered an application from the Inspectors requesting that they be supplied with leather belts to be worn with the new type of uniform.—Recommended that one leather belt be also issued to each Inspector, the Manager, Conservancy Department, and the Supervisor, Anti-plague Campaign.

(5) Considered Audit query No. 79 of November 23, 1935.—Recommended that the expenditure of a sum of Rs. 1,366·20 on laying a subsequent coat of Texaco on the Fort roads, Bope Cross road, and Bope road be sanctioned.

(6) Considered the question as to whether any payment should be made as an act of grace to the widow of the late P. Kadiraval, who was accidentally electrocuted on October 17, 1935.—Recommended that under section 45 (1) (j) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, a payment of Rs. 50 be made as an act of grace to the widow, Meepagamage Punchinona alias Jane, who is very poor.

(7) To recommend a supplemental vote of Rs. 100 under Head 69—Legal Expenses.—Recommended.

(8) Considered an application from Dr. G. H. Arndt, Medical Officer of Health, for a loan of Rs. 2,000 for the purchase of a new car.—Recommended that a loan of Rs. 2,000 be granted on the following conditions—(1) repayment to be made in 18 equal monthly instalments; and (2) interest at 2½ per cent. to be charged on the amount outstanding.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

9. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council.—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, January 11, 1936, at 9.30 A.M.

10. In connection with the item on the agenda relating to the tabling of documents Mr. W. Dahanayaka, with the permission of Council, moved that the Superintendent of the Electricity Department be requested to submit, with effect from January 1, 1936, monthly reports of the work done by this Department. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

11. At this stage, at the request of Mr. W. Dahanayaka, the Chairman made a statement regarding the accident which occurred at Milidduwa on the 7th instant in which a pedestrian was killed by being dragged along by a passing motor car in a coil of electric wire which had been disconnected by the workmen of the Electricity Department for the purpose of felling a tree. He also stated that all the papers relating to the matter would be tabled at the next meeting for the information of the members.

With the permission of Council the following item which did not appear on the agenda was next taken up for consideration:—

12. To sanction the following supplemental votes:—(a) Rs. 200 under Head 30, Disinfectants and coir dust; (b) Rs. 400 under Head 71, Electric lighting of markets (cost of current and maintenance); (c) Rs. 400 under Head 86, Destruction of stray dogs; and (d) Rs. 300 under Electricity Head 8, Maintenance and repairs of street lamps.—Sanctioned.

13. At the conclusion of the business of the meeting the Chairman said that as that was the last occasion on which the Council would meet for the year he wished to convey to the two retiring members, Messrs. E. A. Paulas and A. C. Mohammedo, the thanks of the Council for the valuable services they had rendered to it during their tenure of office. Mr. J. E. Perera also spoke and associated himself with the remarks made by the Chairman. Messrs. E. A. Paulas and A. C. Mohammedo replied.

9. The Chairman moved an increase of Rs. 150 under Head G 13 (Allowances)—in order to provide for the increased travelling allowance of the Electrical Inspector as sanctioned by the Council on November 22, 1935.—Carried.

10. Mr. A. C. Mohammedo moved that the Budget, as amended, be adopted and that the taxes enumerated on page 10 be imposed and enforced. Mr. E. A. Paulas seconded.—Carried.
