BY-LAW.

By-law 2 of Chapter XXV. of the by-laws of the Municipal Council of Colombo, as amended by the by-law published in the *Gazette* of September 16, 1910, is hereby repealed and the following is substituted therefor:—

2. Any person who commits a breach of any by-law of this Council or disregards any requirement lawfully made under the by-laws by the Chairman or Municipal Magistrate shall be liable to prosecution and if he is convicted shall be liable, in the case of a first offence to a fine not exceeding Rs. 100, and in the case of a second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding Rs. 200 and when he commits a continuing offence he Rs. 200, and when he commits a continuing offence he shall be liable to an additional fine not exceeding Rs. 25, for every day during which the offence is continued after conviction or after written notice from the Chairman of such breach or disregard.



(2) Does not the Chairman think that the grant given for this purpose by the Council to the Municipal Education

District Committee should be considerably increased?

The Chairman replied as follows:

(1) I am informed by the Chairman of the Galle Municipal Education District Committee that 104 school children will be provided with a free mid-day meal during 180 school days with the grant of Rs. 1,500 which has been allowed by

the Council for 1936, and that 358 deserving children will be left out owing to want of sufficient funds.

(2) I am aware that the grant of Rs. 1,500 is insufficient for this purpose, but in view of the present state of the Council's finances I do not see how it can be increased. I am sure this fact was also realized by the members when the question was discussed last year at the Budget Meeting of the Four Standing Committees.

4. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. Kahaduwa asked the following questions:—
(1) Is the Chairman aware that there are very frequent light failures in many parts of the town and particularly along Wakwella road?

(2) What are the causes of these frequent light failures?

(3) Will the Chairman be pleased to order such steps to be taken as will minimize this evil?

The Chairman replied as follows:-

(1) I understand that interruptions are fairly frequent along Wakwella road, Elliott road, and in the Talapitiya

(2) The main cause of these interuptions is the falling of branches on the transmission lines.

(3) Steps are being taken to minimize the nuisance by cutting down overhanging branches and numbering trees for cutting.

5. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) That this Council do maintain in the Victoria Park a Zoological section confined to birds only, on lines similar to what is found in the garden of the Colombo Museum. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded. On the suggestion of the Chairman it was resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration.

(2) This Council invites the attention of the Education authorities to the utter lack of facilities for industrial education in Galle, and urges the early establishment in Galle of an up-to-date Industrial School for boys. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded. Mr. J. E. Perera suggested that the words "Ministry of Education" be substituted for the words "Education authorities." The mover and seconder agreed to the amendment, and the motion, as amended, was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously. then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(3) In view of increasing dangers to life and limb along the trunk road between the Kaluwella junction and the Moragoda-ela bridge, this Council earnestly requests Government to give further consideration to the resolution passed by this Council in 1926, 1929, and 1934, which suggested the widening of this road from the Kaluwella junction up to the

Esplanade and its duplication from the Esplanade up to the Moragoda-ela bridge.

With the leave of Council the mover added the figures "1925" also after the words "passed by this Council in."

Mr. E. M. Karunaratna seconded.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this motion.

Council in Committe-

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that the matter be referred to the Works Committee for full consideration.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted. -Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab moved:—That a Special Committee of this Council be appointed to consider the question of establishing a Municipal Free Library in Galle. Mr. A. Kahaduwa seconded, and Mr. W. Dahanayaka supported the motion which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously. It was also resolved that the Special Committee do consist of the following members:—Messrs. E. M. Karunaratna, F. Magdon Ismail, W. Dahanayaka, and A. I. H. A. Wahab, with Mr. Wahab as convener and two members forming a quorum.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. Kahaduwa moved:—That public latrines be built near the following centres in Ward No. 6:—(a) Pedurugewela junction, (b) Richmond Hill junction, (c) Minuwangeda level crossing. Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded. On the suggestion of the Chairman it was resolved that the matter be referred to the Standing Committee on Sanitation for consideration and report.

To consider the question of obtaining a report on a Town planning scheme for Galle:—Resolved that

consideration be deferred until the next meeting.

9. To consider what action should be taken to accord a fitting reception to His Excellency the Governor on the occasion of his forthcoming visit to Galle on March 23.

The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee-

Council in Committee recommended (1) that an illuminated address enclosed in a suitable casket be presented to His Excellency the Governor at the Pavilion; (2) that a sum of Rs. 500 be voted for the necessary expenses; (3) that a Sub-Committee consisting of the Chairman, Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. D. I. Durham, and Mr. W. Dahanayaka be appointed to draft the address.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

10. To sanction a revote of Rs. 4,545.05 being the unspent balance on the amount provided in 1935, for the purchase of a new Crossley engine:—Sanctioned.

11. The following extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council:—

(a) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of January 25, 1936:—

(2) Considered applications for water service to the following premises:—(a) No. 191, Wakwella road:—Recommended that the application be allowed for one kitchen tap only; (b) No. 40, Queen street (Volunteer Armoury):—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap and that in terms of regulation 32 (5) of the Schedule to the Water Service By-laws a charge of 50 cents per mensem be levied.

(3) Considered papers relating to the proposed acquisition of land at Kandewatta (in Ward No. 6) for a playground:—Recommended that consideration be deferred pending negotiations with the owners of the garage and houses Nos. 144, 145,

(4) Considered the question of acquiring two strips of land in connection with the proposed construction of side drains along Halls road at an approximate cost of Rs. 377:—Recommended the acquisition of the two strips in question at an approximate cost of Rs. 377.

(6) Considered an estimate of Rs. 575 for improvements to the public latrines at Mahamodera, Customs road, Sea-

beach, Pettigalawatta, Jakotuwa, Wellaboda, and Dewatta: - Recommended that the estimate be passed.

- (7) Considered the question of amending the rules on which the agreements entered into with consumers of electric current are based :--Recommended that the rules be amended by the addition of the following as rules 6 (h) and 9 $_{\mathbf{r}}$ espectively:-
 - Rule 6 (h): In the case of new installations a connection fee of Rs. 5 shall be paid in all cases before the supply is given.
 - Rule 9: An installation which has been disconnected by reason of the fact that the premises to which the supply is given has become temporarily vacant will not be connected except on payment of a reconnection fee of Rs. 5.
- (8) Considered tenders for:—(a) Constructing a 60-ft. span bridge over the Moragoda-ela by the Gangarama temple:—Recommended that the lowest tender, viz., Rs. 3,642 by D. S. Fernando be accepted. Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(b) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of January 25, 1936:—

(2) To consider an application from N. T. Missinona, widow of the late P. V. Richard, Patrol, Waterworks Department, for the payment of a gratuity:—Recommended, under rule 24 of the Municipal Pension Minute, the grant of a

gratuity of Rs. 132 being three months' pay of the office to the widow and one month's pay for her minor child.

(3) Considered an application from B. G. Appuwa, Conservancy Labourer, for permission to retire from service on the ground of ill-health:—Recommended, in view of the certificate of the Medical Board that he be allowed to retire from service and that under rule 21 of the Municipal Pension Minute he be awarded a gratuity of Rs. 187 for his 22 years' service under the Council.

(4) Considered two petitions from the scavenging labourers asking for an increase of wages:—Recommended that with effect from March I, 1936, scavenging labourers with five years' service be paid at the rate of 60 cents per diem and that the necessary supplemental expenditure be sanctioned. Recommended, further, that all scavenging labourers who are at present paid on a monthly basis be placed on a daily wage.

(5) Considered a memorial from the members of the Municipal staff asking for the privileges of commuted pension and the grant of house allowances:—Recommended, in view of the present state of the Council's finances, that the application be refused. (4) Considered two petitions from the scavenging labourers asking for an increase of wages:--Recommended that

(6) Considered an application from Inspector Seedin for a loan of Rs. 100 for the purchase of a bicycle:—Recommended the grant of a loan of Rs. 100 to be repayable in ten equal monthly instalments and with interest at $2\frac{1}{2}$ per cent. per annum on the balance oustanding.

(7) Purchase of a new conservancy lorry to replace the old Ford lorry No. N 388 which is no longer serviceable:—Recommended the acceptance of the quotation of Messrs. Walkers & Clark Spence, Ltd., viz., Rs. 3,073.75 for supplying a 1½-ton Morris Chassis for fitting the existing Ford body thereto, and taking over the old Ford Chassis.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

- (c) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of January 25, 1936:—
- (a) Considered the question of extending the conservancy system so as to include the area lying between Bope road and the Colombo-Galle road as far as the junction of these two roads with Bope Cross road :—Recommended that the conservancy system be extended so as to include the area mentioned.

Resolution.

Resolved by 11 votes to 2 that the above recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

- (d) Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Luw and General Subjects of January 25, 1936:—
- (2) Considered an application from Mr. G. Ranasooriya, Proctor for the 4th plaintiff in D. C., Galle, case No. 33,082, to transfer to his client the rights of the Council in property No. 11, Dangedera purchased by Council for non-payment of rates:—Recommended that the rights of the Council in property No. 11, Dangedera, be transferred to the 4th plaintiff in D. C., Galle, case No. 33,082, on the following conditions:—(1) that the transfer be prepared and executed at the expense of the purchaser; (2) that the Council does not warrant and defend title except as regards acts done by the Council; (3) that the consideration be a sum of Rs. 175 which amount includes all expenses incurred by the Council and all arrears of rates due on the property up till first quarter, 1936; (4) that the 4th plaintiff undertakes to continue to pay the rates on the property as they fall due so long as the partition case is pending and until final decree is entered; and (5) that the 4th plaintiff undertakes to pay all costs that the Council would have to pay in the said case.

Resolution. Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

12. To fix a date for the next General Meeting of the Council:—Agreed that the next General Meeting of the Council be held on Saturday, March 14, 1936, at 9 A.M.
