A PROCLAMATION.

R. E. STUBBS.

WHEREAS by section 28 of the Courts Ordinance, 1889, as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence :

For the Southern Circuit, twice at least at Galle and such other places in such circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such sessions commencing at Galle on April 25 and September 15 in every year :

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Tangalla, a place included within the said Southern Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Tangalla in the said Southern Circuit on or about Wednesday, June 24, 1936.

MUNICIPAL COUNCIL NOTICES.

GALLE MUNICIPAL COUNCIL

Minutes of Proceedings of a General Meeting of the Municipal Council of Galle, held at the Municipal Office on Saturday, April 25, 1936, at 9 a.m., pursuant to notice dated April 20, 1936.

Present : Mr. C. Harrison-Jones (Chairman), Mr. J. E. Perera, Mr. D. I. Durham, Dr. H. E. Ekanayaka, Mr. F. Magdon Ismail, Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya, Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, Mr. C. H. Bradley, Mr. A. C. Mohammedo, Mr. R. L. Ephraums, Mr. W. Dahanayaka, Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab, and Mr. A. Kahaduwa.

2. Two petitions were presented by Mr. W. Dahanayaka, one by Mr. E. M. Karunaratna, and one by Mr. A. Kahaduwa. These were tabled, and the Chairman said that they would receive consideration.

3. Pursuant to notice, Mr. W. Dahanayaka asked the following questions:—(1) Will the Chairman please offer an explanation on the following points in connection with the civic reception accorded to His Excellency the Governor and Lady Stubbs? (a) The lack of sitting accommodation for the Buddhist Monks who were invited to the reception and who were thus compelled to remain standing while the Governor and Lady Stubbs were seated? (b) The lack of facilities for the representatives of the Press, over which adverse criticisms have appeared in the "Ceylon Daily News", "Ceylon Observer", and "Dinamina". (c) The alleged incivility to certain prominent residents of Galle, over which a Clergyman has addressed a letter of protest to the Chairman. (2) (a) Has the attention of the Chairman been drawn to the discerning criticism of Lady Stubbs to the effect that two Municipal Midwives are not sufficient for a big town like Galle? (b) What steps does the Chairman propose to take over this matter? (3) (a) For how long has the Galle Library paid rates to the Council? (b) As section 115 (1) of the Ordinance clearly lays down that "all public libraries shall be exempted from rates" will the Chairman please see that rates are no longer charged from the Galle Library? (c) What is the legal position with regard to the rates that have already been levied from the Galle Library? (4) (a) Is it true that some of the workmen received their March wages so late as on April 8? (b) Is there no fixed date on which the workmen are paid month by month? (c) Will the Chairman please fix some definite day of the month for this purpose? (5) (a) Was a petition forwarded by me to the Chairman on April 6 from a conservancy labourer named Mada Samy, in which allegations of bribery were made against an employee of the Council? (b) Was there a request from me that I should be permitted to be present at the inquiry? (c) On what grounds did the Chairman disapprove of a member of the Council being present at such an inquiry even as a silent spectator? (d) What was the outcome of this inquiry? (6) With reference to the Chairman's answer to my questions 4 to 13 at the last General Meeting, does the Chairman maintain that section 59 (2) vests in him the right to determine without consulting the Council, the conditions of service of an employee whose salary does not exceed Rs. 100 per mensem?

The Chairman replied as follows:—(1) (a) No seats were provided for any member of the public at the reception except a few seats for ladies in a corner of the enclosure. (b) The Press appeared to have quite as good facilities as it was possible to provide in a building and enclosure of the nature of the Esplanade Pavilion. (c) I am not aware of any incivility. (2) (a) I am not aware of any such criticism having been made. (b) I understand from the Medical Officer of Health that there are in Galle several unqualified midwives whose services appear to be greatly in demand, and that as a result even the present two Municipal Midwives find it difficult to get a sufficient number of cases in their areas. I propose, therefore, to take the necessary steps to get the provisions of section 57 of Ordinance No. 26 of 1927 made applicable to Galle so that action can be taken to put a stop to the dangerous practices of these unqualified persons. Thereafter the question of appointing additional Municipal Midwives might well be considered. (3) (a) Since its inception. (b) The Galle Library does not fall into the category of "public libraries" and section 115 (1) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910 does not therefore apply. (c) This question does not arise. (4) (a) Yes, but I do not think this date can be said to be too late. (b) No. (c) No, it is not possible to do this, but I can give an assurance that the wages of all daily-paid workmen will be paid as early as possible after receipt of the check rolls from the various departments. (5) (a) Yes. (b) Yes. (c) As this was purely a departmental inquiry held by the Medical Officer of Health I was unable to approve of any member of the Council being present. (d) The petitioner failed to prove the allegations made by him against the Council's employee. (6) The answer to this question is in the affirmative.

With reference to the reply to question (1) (a) Mr. Dahanayaka asked as a supplementary question why the Buddhist Monks were invited to the reception at all if they could not have been treated in the time-honoured manner to which they are accustomed. The Chairman replied that he was not prepared to answer that question.

With the permission of the Council the following two items on the agenda were next taken up for consideration.

4. To consider the question of obtaining a report on a Town Planning Scheme for Galle. The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee :—

After discussion, Council in Committee recommended by 10 votes to 2 that a decision on the matter be deferred until the August Meeting of the Council.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendation of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

5. To consider the following extract from the minutes of the Standing Committees on Finance and Assessment and Law and General Subjects on March 7, 1936:—"Considered the present rates levied in the town under section 115 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910, with a view to deciding on a correct method of rating from 1937.—Recommended (1) that with effect from the beginning of 1937 a uniform rate of 11½ per cent. be levied throughout the town; (2) that an additional rate of 6 per cent. be levied within the water served area, (3) that suitable street lights be provided in those areas which were at present not lit with electricity". The Chairman moved Council into Committee to consider this item.

Council in Committee :—

Council in Committee recommended, after discussion, that the recommendations of the Standing Committees be referred to the Four Standing Committees for further consideration.

Council in Committee recommended, further, that, in view of the fact that the sanction of the Governor has not been obtained for the levy of the increased rate of 11½ per cent. in the newly extended lighting area, the old rate of 7 per cent. be reverted to in respect of the third and fourth quarters of the current year.

Council resumed, and the Chairman moved that the above recommendations of the Council in Committee be adopted.—Carried.

6. Pursuant to notice Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved:—(1) This Council invites the attention of the Ministry for Local Administration to the unrivalled resources in fisheries, both marine and inland, found in and around Galle, and suggests that Galle be made the headquarters of the proposed research and experimental work on fisheries. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded and Mr. E. M. Karunaratna supported the motion which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(2) This Council invites the Commissioner for the Development of Agricultural Marketing to open a branch establishment of his activities in Galle. Mr. A. I. H. A. Wahab seconded and Mr. E. M. Karunaratna supported the motion which was then put to the meeting and carried unanimously.

(3) That the charge made for the temporary lighting from non-consumers of electricity be reduced from Re. 1.00 to 75 cents per unit. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. (a) Carried, (b) resolved that the reduced charge do take effect from May 1, 1936.

(4) That in cases of temporary lighting the Council's workmen shall be in attendance only if a request to that effect is made along with the application for temporary lighting. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded. (a) Carried, (b) resolved that the change do take effect from May 1, 1936.

7. Pursuant to notice Mr. A. Kahaduwa moved:—(1) In view of the fact that the Parana-ela (which begins near Bekke Reservoir and falls into the sea at Mahamodera and near the Park) is a menace to the health of the people the Municipal Engineer be asked to submit an early report on ways and means of improving it. With the permission of Council the mover substituted the word "detrimental" for the words "a menace". Mr. W. Dahanayaka seconded.—Carried.

(2) That the Superintendent of the Electricity Department be asked to submit plans and estimates for lighting with electricity suitable parts of the Galle Ramparts. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

8. Pursuant to notice, Mr. F. Magdon Ismail moved that the portion of the small esplanade opposite the Courts be so filled up to prevent it from getting muddy during the rains. Mr. Thomas Amarasuriya seconded. On the suggestion of the Chairman this motion was referred to the Standing Committee on Municipal Works for consideration.

9. The following motion stood in the name of Mr. W. Dahanayaka :—(1) That the licence holders of meat stalls be informed that it is the earnest wish of this Council that meat stalls should remain closed on Wesak Day, May 6, 1936. Mr. J. E. Perera rose to a point of order and stated that the closure of the meat stalls on any day was prohibited by by-law. Mr. Dahanayaka said there was another by-law which provided that any stall in a public market should not be closed for more than two consecutive days. He maintained further that in spite of the by-law referred to by Mr. Perera the Council was yet entitled to express its wish on the matter. After further consideration in Committee the Chairman ruled that the motion was not in order and could not be accepted. (2) In the opinion of this Council the Chairman shall appoint and dismiss only those employees whose initial salary is less than Rs. 400 per annum. The Chairman ruled that this motion also, as worded, was not in order as it was contrary to the provisions of section 59 (2) of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910.

10. To elect, by ballot, a member of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment in place of Mr. D. I. Durham who has resigned from that Committee :—A ballot was taken, and the Chairman declared that Mr. E. M. Karunaratna was elected.

11. The following extracts from the minutes of the Standing Committees were laid before the Council :—

(a) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Municipal Works of April 4, 1936.*

(2) Considered applications for water service to the following premises :—(a) 18, Kaluwella.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap ; (b) 31A, Wakwella road.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap ; (c) 62, Pedlar street.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap, provided the owner agrees to an increase in the assessment of the premises with effect from 1937 ; (d) Buddhist temple at Kandewatta.—Recommended that the application be allowed for one tap only.

(3) Considered Mr. W. Dahanayaka's motion at the meeting of Council on February 8, 1936, viz. :—That this Council do maintain in the Victoria Park a Zoological Section confined to birds only, on lines similar to what is found in the garden of the Colombo Museum.—Recommended, after consideration of the correspondence on the subject with the Director of the Colombo Museum, that the suggestion be deferred for next year and that meanwhile further information be obtained as regards the cost and means of obtaining the birds for the proposed aviary.

(4) Considered an estimate of Rs. 180 for patching the approach road to Closenberga.—Recommended that the estimate be approved and that a supplemental vote be passed for the purpose.

(5) Considered an application from Messrs. Clark, Spence & Co. requesting a reduction of the present fee charged for water supplied for shipping purposes. Recommended that the necessary steps be taken to amend the by-law so as to empower the Council to charge a fee not exceeding Rs. 5 per 1,000 gallons and that as soon as the amendment is gazetted the present fee be reduced from Rs. 5 to Rs. 2.50 per 1,000 gallons.

(6) Considered tenders for the construction of a " Fire Shed " on the portion of the land adjoining the garage of the Superintendent of Police, Galle.—Recommended that the tender of M. H. James for Rs. 656.62 be accepted.

(7) Considered Mr. W. Dahanayaka's motion at the meeting of Council on February 8, 1936, viz. :—In view of increasing dangers to life and limb along the trunk road between the Haluwella Junction and the Moragoda-ela bridge this Council earnestly requests Government to give further consideration to their resolutions passed by this Council in 1925, 1926, 1929, and 1934, which suggested the widening of this road from the Kaluwella Junction up to the Esplanade and its duplication from the Esplanade up to the Moragoda-ela bridge.—Recommended that the attention of the Government be again drawn to the necessity for widening the main Colombo-Matara road from the Kaluwella Junction up to the Esplanade and for its duplication from the Esplanade up to the Moragoda-ela bridge, a scheme for which has already been prepared by Government.

(8) Considered papers relating to the acquisition of land at Kandewatta for a playground.—Resolved that consideration be deferred pending investigations into the suitability of another site suggested by the member for Ward No. 6.

(9) To approve an estimate of Rs. 1,136.66 from Messrs. Brown & Co. for extending the electrical mains along Donald Jansz road.—Recommended that the estimate be approved and that a supplemental vote of Rs. 1,200 be sanctioned for the purpose.

(10) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment the question of appointing another Electrical Inspector.—Recommended the appointment of a second assistant to the Superintendent of the Electricity Department on a salary of Rs. 900 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 60 to Rs. 1,500 per annum.—Recommended, further, that in the notice calling for applications mention be made of the fact that a travelling allowance will be paid if it is considered necessary to employ the officer on outdoor work.

Resolution.

With regard to item (5) Mr. W. Dahanayaka moved as an amendment that the fee be reduced to Rs. 2 per 1,000 gallons. Mr. J. E. Perera seconded.—Carried.

With regard to item (8) Mr. J. E. Perera moved as an amendment that the original resolution of April 26, 1935, be given effect to. Mr. F. Magdon Ismail seconded.—Carried by 6 votes to 5.

With regard to item (10) it was resolved by 8 votes to 3 that the recommendation of the Standing Committee be adopted.

The recommendations of the Standing Committee with regard to the remaining items were adopted.

(b) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Finance and Assessment of April 4, 1936.*

(2) Considered together with the Standing Committee on Municipal Works the question of appointing another Electrical Inspector.—Recommended the appointment of a second assistant to the Superintendent of the Electricity Department on a salary of Rs. 900 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 60 to Rs. 1,500 per annum.—Recommended further, that in the notice calling for applications mention be made of the fact a travelling allowance will be paid if it is considered necessary to employ the officer on outdoor work.

(3) List of demolished buildings in Ward 5A, 6, and 7.—Recommended that the rates be struck off.

(4) Considered the question of writing off rates for 1936 on the ground of poverty of the owners.—Recommended that the rates due for 1936 on 256 properties in the town (as per lists annexed) amounting to Rs. 307.61 be waived on the ground of poverty of the owners.

(5) Considered the question of waiving the rates on property No. 29, Galupiadde.—Recommended that the rates due for 4th quarter, 1935, amounting to Re. 1.82 be waived on the ground of poverty of the owner, but that the rates be recovered for 1936 on a reduced annual value of Rs. 20.

Resolution.

Resolved that the above recommendations of the Standing Committee be adopted.

(c) *Extracts from the Minutes of the Standing Committee on Markets and Sanitation of April 4, 1936.*

(2) Considered Mr. A. Kahaduwa's motion at the meeting of the Council on February 8, 1936, viz., " That public latrines be built near the following centres in Ward No. 6 :—(a) Pedurugewela Junction, (b) Richmond Hill Junction, (c) Minuwangoda Level Crossing.—Recommended (a) that the following order of priority be observed in connection with the erection of public latrines in the Town—

(1) Sea Beach (adjoining the existing public latrine), (2) Mahamodera, (3) Halls road, (4) near Gintota Bridge, (5) Sarenthukade Junction, (6) Weliwatta, (7) Baddegama-Hirimburra Road Junction, (8) Dadalla, (9) Richmond Hill Junction, and (10) Minuwangoda Junction

(b) that Nos. 1 and 2 be erected during the current year ; (c) that sites be acquired for Nos. 3, 4, 5, 7, and 8 ; and (d) that no action be taken for the present with regard to Nos. 9 and 10.

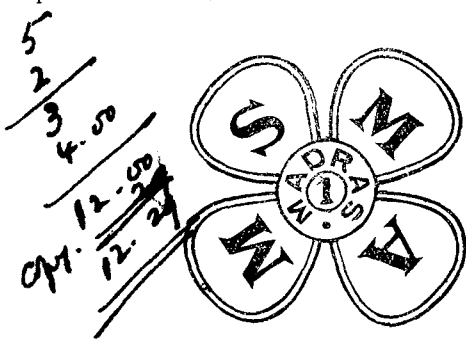
