**GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.**

THE ORDINANCE RELATING TO PILGRIMAGES,  
No. 13 OF 1896.

REGULATION under section 1 of Ordinance No. 13 of 1896 entitled "An Ordinance relating to Pilgrimages," as amended by Ordinance No. 7 of 1897, made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, in anticipation of the customary pilgrimage to the Dewundera Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale in the Matara District, Southern Province.

PILGRIMAGE TO THE DEWUNDERA SRI VISHNU  
MAHA DEWALE.

*Rules made under Pilgrimages Ordinance, No. 13 of 1896.*

1. The duration of the stay at Dondra of pilgrims to the Dewundera Sri Vishnu Maha Dewale shall be restricted to a period of eleven days, namely, July 31 to August 10, 1936. Pilgrims arriving before the day first named or staying beyond the period herein prescribed shall be guilty of an offence.
2. In the event of any disease of a contagious, infectious, or epidemic nature breaking out at Dondra or in its vicinity before or during the pilgrimage or at any other place in the Southern Province, from which, in the opinion of the Assistant Government Agent, it is likely to be conveyed to Dondra during the pilgrimage, it shall be lawful for the Assistant Government Agent to prohibit the pilgrimage or to declare the pilgrimage at an end, and to direct all visitors to leave Dondra at once, and return to their homes and to prescribe the routes by which they shall travel. Any person disobeying the order of the Assistant Government Agent shall be guilty of an offence.
3. Any person suffering from an infectious or contagious disease, and not forthwith reporting the same to the Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence to the senior officer of Police present at Dondra, and any person abetting or assisting in the concealment of such disease, shall be guilty of an offence.
4. Any person selling meat, fish, or fresh vegetables at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage in any other place than that assigned for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board and any person selling meat, food, or drink of any kind condemned as unwholesome by a Sanitary Inspector or Medical Officer, or in their absence by the Mudaliyar or senior officer of Police present at Dondra, shall be guilty of an offence.
5. All cakes, sweetmeats, and other foodstuffs exposed for sale at Dondra during the continuance of the pilgrimage shall be kept in properly constructed glass cases or other fly-proof receptacles. All such receptacles shall be kept clean.
6. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the erection of proper latrine accommodation on a site and of a type approved by the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman of the Sanitary Board sufficient, to last during the continuance of the pilgrimage, for which purpose he shall

forward plans and specifications for the approval of the Assistant Government Agent or Chairman, Sanitary Board, at least ten days before the pilgrimage commences. He shall further be responsible for the supply of coir dust, or sand, and disinfectants of a quality approved by the Assistant Government Agent, and for the proper conservancy and cleaning of the latrines at least twice a day during the continuance of the pilgrimage. In the event of the proprietor or lessee contravening any of the provisions of this regulation he shall be guilty of an offence.

7. Any person who shall during the pilgrimage use any other place for the offices of nature than that set apart for the purpose by the Assistant Government Agent or Sanitary Board or the proprietor or lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage, or failing to cover the deposit with earth or sand, shall be guilty of an offence.

8. The proprietor or (if leased) the lessee of the grounds used in connection with the pilgrimage shall be responsible for the collection and removal of all straw, rubbish, cattle dung, or any kind of litter at least once every day during the continuance of the pilgrimage, and such rubbish and litter shall be burned or buried at a place approved by the Assistant Government Agent or the Chairman of the Sanitary Board. Any proprietor or lessee failing to carry out or to cause to be carried out the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

9. No booth or other building for the purpose of the pilgrimage shall be erected at Dondra within a space of 12 feet from the side drain of the main road from Matara to Tangalla and of the approach road to the dewale, and no stall-holder, vendor, or betel-seller shall expose any article for sale within such space. Any person contravening this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

10. No booth or other building shall be erected at Dondra on such portion of the ground as may be reserved by the Assistant Government Agent, Matara, for the accommodation of visitors or vehicles. Any person contravening the provisions of this regulation shall be guilty of an offence.

## REGULATION.

The regulations published by Notification in the *Gazette* of February 8, 1935, are hereby amended by the substitution for paragraph (2) of Regulation 4 of the two following new paragraphs:—

“(2) Every grain store to be erected in pursuance of permission granted under this regulation shall be constructed, maintained, and managed in accordance with the following requirements:—

(a) *Site*.—

(i.) The site shall be not less than 2 feet above the highest recorded flood level, clear of all grass, vegetation, and trees; and shall be levelled off and well drained.

(ii.) The grain store shall not be utilized for purposes of human habitation, nor shall a person sleep or remain in it over night.

(iii.) All existing drains or sewers on the site, whether used or disused, which are likely in the opinion of the Chairman to harbour rats shall be removed or altered to the satisfaction of the Chairman

by the owner of the site or of the building. All underground drains or sewers shall be properly trapped. There shall not be any opening from a drain to the interior of the grain store.

- (iv.) No other building or wall or tree shall be allowed to stand within 15 feet of the grain store, nor shall a human habitation be built within an enclosure wherein the grain store stands.
- (b) *Type of Building.*—The grain store shall be of one storey only, the height of the walls at the eaves, being not more than 16 feet above floor level. Grain shall not be stacked to a greater height than the level of the top of walls of the store. A verandah in front, not more than 10 feet wide and with a concrete floor sloping outwards, is permissible. The store shall consist of one or more rooms or units, each room or unit not having a greater floor area than 375 square feet. This area will admit of a unit being 25 feet long and 15 feet wide. Roof trusses in this width can be dispensed with. Units may be placed side by side or, if a greater number are required, back to back.
- (c) *Materials.*—The cement used in the construction of the grain store shall be up to British standard specification. Sand shall be clean river sand, the bricks shall be hard and well burnt, and the roof tiles shall be Calicut or Mangalore pattern and not half round. The timber shall be well seasoned and resistant to the attacks of white ants. The concrete in the surface water drains, paving, and floors shall not be less than 4 inches thick, and in damp course not less than 3 inches thick, and in the door sill not less than 6 inches thick, and shall be composed of one part of cement, two parts of sand, and four parts of stone broken to pass through a 1-inch diameter ring. The concrete in foundations and walls shall be composed of one part of cement, three parts of sand, and six parts of stone broken to pass a 2-inch diameter ring. The cement mortar for jointing and plastering on walls shall be composed of one part of cement to five parts of sand, rendering to  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch damp course on tops of floors and to the door sill to be one part of cement to two parts of sand. Lime plastering shall be composed of one part of lime to two parts of sand. Wherever wire screens are specified the wire shall be not less than No. 12 B.W.G. and not greater than  $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch mesh.
- (d) *Paving.*—The open space in front of the door of the store shall be paved for an extent of 8 feet by 8 feet with concrete, or other impervious material, preferably jointless, placed above the surrounding ground and laid to fall away from the entrance door or verandah. A guard rail shall be fixed so as to prevent carts backing close against doors or verandahs.
- (e) *Surface Water Drains.*—Surface water drains of cement concrete shall be constructed around the store, and be placed so as to catch rain water from the roof. The drain shall be laid to ample falls, and shall discharge clear of the site.
- (f) *Foundations.*—Foundations suitable for the support of the building shall be carried down at least 2 feet below ground, and consist of concrete, brick, or stone built into solid ground.
- (g) *Walls.*—Walls shall be constructed of concrete, brick, or stone, at least 9 inches thick laid in cement mortar. No other material will be permitted, and no hollow, recess, or projection shall be constructed on any part of the wall.
- (h) *Damp Course.*—A damp course shall be provided, and shall be of cement mortar  $\frac{3}{4}$  inch thick, or of concrete laid as a continuous slab at floor level.
- (i) *Floors.*—Floors shall be of concrete and securely connected to walls laid at least 6 inches above the surrounding ground on a layer of hard dry rubble or filling and laid to fall towards floor ventilators. Its upper surface shall be rendered smooth in cement mortar at least  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch thick.
- (j) *Plastering to Walls.*—All walls shall be plastered perfectly smooth in cement mortar  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch thick internally, and externally to a height of at least 6 feet from the floor. Above the height so plastered, the walls shall be plastered in lime plaster and limewashed. All angles between floors and walls and all other internal and external angles of plastering shall be rounded off. The wall plastering shall be laid continuously with the concrete flooring without any joint between the plastering and the surface of the floors.
- (k) *Roof.*—The roof shall be of simple design free from valleys and shall be of timber or iron framing covered with flat tiles, iron or other approved flat waterproof material. No enclosed spaces of any kind will be permitted in the roof. The walls shall be carried up tight to the underside of the tiles, and the tiles shall be bedded on to the top of the walls in cement mortar. No eaves, guttering, or downpipes will be permitted. Eaves shall project at least 2 feet and sufficiently far for rain water to drip into the surface water drain. All woodwork in the roof shall be once dipped in, and once painted with, liquid fuel or solignum.
- (l) *Glass Windows.*—Glass windows are not advised, but where provided shall have their sills sloped off sharply, on the outside as well as on the inside, and placed not less than 6 feet above the floor. Windows shall be protected on the inside by a fixed wire or metal screen having apertures not larger than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch either way. As an alternative or in addition to windows, glass tiles in the roof will be allowed, but the supply of light must be ample and to the satisfaction of the Chairman.
- (m) *Doors.*—There shall be one doorway only to each unit. The door shall be of iron or of wood with framing at least 2 inches thick hung in two leaves, opening outwards and when shut, fitting closely into rebates. Each leaf shall be bound at the edges with metal sheeting hung to an angle iron frame or wood frame built into recesses in the wall and dowelled at ends into concrete sill. The door shall be fixed so that it will be impossible for a rat to enter when the door is closed. The woodwork of door and frame shall be once dipped in, and once painted with, liquid fuel or solignum. An iron cross bar shall be fixed across door 4 feet 4 inches above the sill to obstruct the passage of laden labourers.
- (n) *Rat-proof Barrier.*—A rat-proof barrier shall be provided, and shall consist of a dwarf brickwork wall, 3 feet high and 9 inches thick, built across the doorway and on the centre line of the walling, and plastered on both sides in cement. On the top of the dwarf wall shall be built a slab of reinforced cement concrete, 6 inches thick, projecting 9 inches on each side, and, at the ends of the dwarf wall, weathered, throated, and rendered smooth in cement, but with a rebate for a door to close against it. The height of the sill from the floor shall be 3 feet to the underside and the width of the sill 27 inches overall.
- (o) *Ventilators.*—Ventilating openings shall be provided in the upper part or roof of the store and at floor level, protected by wire screens or metal plates or bars having apertures not larger than  $\frac{1}{2}$  inch either way. A double roof ventilator shall be formed at the ridge, but carefully protected by woven wire mesh or perforated zinc sheeting.
- (p) *Steps.*—No steps or planks or similar means of facilitating access to any door will be allowed. The space near and around every door shall be kept clear of obstructions both on the inside and on the outside.
- (q) *Ceilings.*—No ceilings or doubled roofs or enclosed spaces will be permitted. No internal ledges whatever shall be formed.
- (r) *Water.*—In no circumstances shall water be permitted to remain in or near the store. No food, green vegetables, or plants shall be allowed to be inside the store.
- (s) Verandahs shall not be used for storage purposes. If, in the opinion of the Chairman, a boundary wall is necessary he may order the same to be erected.
- (t) The grain store shall be closed between sunset and sunrise.
- (3) Any application under this regulation for permission to erect a building may be refused by the Chairman, if, in his opinion, the site of the proposed building is in a crowded or unhealthy locality or in an area which is primarily residential."

**Survey Clerical Examination, August, 1936.****Date of Examination.**

1. A competitive examination for candidates wishing to enter Classes II. and III. of the Clerks' and Draughtsmen's Scheme will be held in Colombo on August 28 and 29, 1936.

**Places for Competition.**

2. The number of places in Class II. assigned for general competition will be 3. Appointments in Class III. will be offered to the first 8 of those who are not selected for appointment to Class II. The names of successful candidates will be published in the *Government Gazette*.

**Applications.**

3. Applications for admission to the examination must be addressed to the Surveyor-General on forms which may be obtained from his office up to July 10, 1936.

4. Applications must reach the Surveyor-General not later than 2 P.M. on July 15, 1936. Any applications received after that hour will be rejected.

5. The Surveyor-General will return those applications which are approved to the candidates concerned. Such applications will constitute the candidates' tickets of admission to the examination. Candidates presenting themselves for examination must produce to the officer appointed to supervise the examination their forms of application approved by the Surveyor-General. A candidate not producing such form will be refused admittance to the examination.

**Eligibility.**

6. The examination will be confined to British subjects whose families are permanently resident in Ceylon.

7. Candidates other than those eligible under regulation 9 must furnish proof when forwarding their application that they have previously passed at least—

- The Cambridge Senior or the London Matriculation or the Senior School Certificate (English) Examination; or
- The Final Examination for the Commercial Certificate of the Ceylon Technical College; or
- The Cambridge Junior or the Junior School Certificate Examination (English), and either examination of either (i.) the Higher Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of Commerce, or (ii.) the Commercial Certificate Examination of the London Chamber of Commerce.

Their applications must also bear a duly cancelled stamp of Rs. 10.

8. (i.) A certificate of the registration of the candidate's birth showing him to be not less than 18 nor more than 22 years of age on August 1, 1936, and a certificate of good character signed by a responsible person, to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General, must be attached to the form of application.

(ii.) Certificates of birth issued for the purposes of the Code for Assisted Schools will not be accepted for this examination.

(iii.) Affidavits will in no circumstances be accepted as substitutes for birth certificates.

(iv.) In the case of candidates who submit certificates of registration in the register of past births, the certificates will only be accepted after consideration of the evidence by which the dates of birth were established. If the name appearing in the birth register differs, either by alteration or addition, from the name by which a candidate is known, (a) the parent or guardian, in the case of a candidate under the age of 21 years, should, before obtaining a certificate, apply to the Registrar-General or his Assistant for such alteration in the manner set forth in section 21 of Ordinance No. 1 of 1895, and (b) in the case of a candidate over the age of 21 years, he should produce evidence to the satisfaction of the Surveyor-General that the certificate of birth forwarded applies to him.

(v.) If the candidate has been educated at a Government or Assisted School, a certificate must be from the Principal of the last Government or Assisted School which he has attended; otherwise it may be from the candidate's teacher or schoolmaster by preference, or a



member of the Public Service, a Justice of the Peace, Minister of Religion, Advocate, Proctor, or Notary, or generally speaking, some person whose name is known and to whom reference can be readily made.

9. (a) Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department, who joined subsequent to 1919 and prior to 1934, and who have completed three years' service and whose service has been throughout satisfactory, are eligible to enter for the examination, irrespective of the age and preliminary educational qualifications, &c., laid down in paragraph 7 and without fee.

(b) They will be allowed to compete amongst themselves for not more than 50 per cent. of the vacancies advertised above for Class II., and will be eligible for promotion if they obtain a minimum of 33 per cent. in each of the subjects laid down in paragraph 13.

(c) Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. appointed subsequent to 1934, on completion of 3 years satisfactory service will be allowed to compete with the above for the same vacancies, but will have to obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. in each of the subjects.

10. All Clerks and Draughtsmen in Class III. of the Survey Department will always be allowed to compete on the same terms as outsiders but without fee if they fulfil all the necessary conditions as regards age, qualifications, &c.

#### Withdrawals and Refunds.

11. (a) If a candidate is rejected owing to his not satisfying the conditions for admission to the examination a refund will be made of  $\frac{3}{5}$  the value of stamps affixed to his entry.

(b) (i.) Except in cases referred to in Regulation 11 (a) no refund will be made, but if notice of a candidate's withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office, Colombo, by July 28, 1936, a voucher will be issued. This voucher will entitle the candidate to enter once more for the same examination, without fee, provided that the examination is held within a year and that the Regulations are complied with in other respects.

(ii.) Candidates who withdraw on account of illness will receive vouchers as in (i.) provided the notice of withdrawal is received in the Surveyor-General's Office Colombo, before the examination commences, and is accompanied by the approved application form and a medical certificate from a qualified Medical Officer.

#### Leave to Government Officers to attend Examination.

12. Heads of Departments are requested to grant to officers of their Departments, whose applications have been returned to them approved by the Surveyor-General, leave to present themselves at the examination.

#### Subjects.

13. The subjects for examination are as follows:—

(1) English Language and Composition.

A one and half hour paper which will include an essay, a precis and questions to test the correct use of the English Language

A two hour paper in three sections as follows:—

- (a) 20 minutes. A test of accuracy with figures including Tots and additions of various kinds ..
- (b) 50 minutes. A test of general intelligence ..

(3) Draughtsmanship or Typewriting, as alternative subjects, *i.e.*, only one is to be taken and candidates must state clearly which of the two they select.

(a) Draughtsmanship—a three hour paper—Each candidate will be required to ink up in Indian Ink the faint outline of the plan supplied. A specimen of the type of plan to be inked up can be examined by prospective candidates at S. G. O. and at the Provincial Survey Offices at Galle, Kandy, Kurunegala, Anuradhapura, Ratnapura, and Badulla (candidates are required to bring Indian Ink and drawing materials)

(b) Typewriting—Candidates will be required to type accurately from a given document. The time taken will be taken into consideration in marking the paper. (Candidates are required to bring their own typewriters) ..

(4) *Viva Voce* Test ..

14. The examination is held in two parts. The written examination under heads (1) to (3) above is first held and on the results of it candidates are selected competitively to attend the *viva voce* under head (4). The number to be called for the *viva voce* examination will be fixed by the Surveyor-General in consultation with the Director of Education. In all written papers marks will be deducted for bad writing and mistakes in spelling. Candidates whose writing is illegible are liable to be disqualified. The *viva voce* examination will be held in Colombo.

#### Medical Examination.

15. The successful candidates will be required to pass a medical examination as to their physical fitness for service in any part of the Island.

#### Salaries, &c.

16. Candidates, on selection, will be required to enter into an agreement and bond to serve on probation for a period of three years in the Department. Each candidate will during such period diligently and efficiently discharge all duties which he may be required to do and shall enter into a bond for the payment of (Rs. 450) Rupees Four hundred and Fifty, in the event of leaving the Department before the expiration of three years. He shall be bound by all rules and regulations applicable for the time being to the Department. The appointments are pensionable; officers do not however acquire pension rights until they are confirmed on the satisfactory completion of their period of probation.

17. Appointments to Class II. will be made on the salary scale of Rs. 720 per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 108, to Rs. 2,448 per annum with Efficiency Bars and two years' halts at Rs. 1,260 and Rs. 1,800 respectively; appointments to Class III. on Rs. 480, per annum rising by annual increments of Rs. 30 to Rs. 1,200 per annum with Efficiency Bars before Rs. 660, 840, and 1,020. Leave and Holiday Warrants in accordance with the recommendations in Sessional Paper VIII. of 1934. No rent allowance is payable to new entrants to the Public Service and economic rent will be charged if Government quarters are allotted.

18. Clerks and Draughtsmen are required to pass a test in Draughtsmanship before they are eligible for their first increment. Facilities for training in Draughtsmanship are provided by the Department.

19. (a) (1) A Departmental "Test", entirely on departmental subjects, will be held at the same time, and may be taken by the Class III. officers specified in paragraphs 9 (a) and 9 (c), as an alternative to the "outside" examination referred to in those paragraphs. The syllabus of the "Test" will be published departmentally and the "Test" will be held entirely by the Survey Department. Old Entrants and New Entrants alike, must obtain a minimum of 50 per cent. of the marks in each of the subjects taken and satisfy the examiners that they have attained a sufficiently high standard in all their subjects before they can be passed. The whole examination must be taken at once each time and subjects cannot be taken singly or in groups. Successful candidates must be suitable for the promotion in every way, in addition to passing the examination, before they can be promoted to Class II.

(2) The number of vacancies to be allotted to the candidates being examined under each of the paragraphs 9 (a), 9 (c), and 19 (a) (1) above will be in proportion to the number of candidates entered under each of these paragraphs, amounting in the aggregate to 50 per cent. of the total vacancies, as laid down in paragraph 9 (b).

(b) Class II. officers recruited from outside and appointed under these regulations will be confirmed in their appointments only after they pass a test in Departmental subjects, of the same standard as that referred to in (a) above.

(c) Promotion of Clerks and Draughtsmen appointed under these regulations, over the first Efficiency Bar in Class II. will be by a higher test somewhat similar in nature to the one in (b) above. Any or all the subjects may be taken at one sitting.

8. The Chairman moved that Lieut.-Colonel J. H. Stafford, O.B.E., M.C., R.E., who ceased to be a member in consequence of having failed to attend three consecutive General Meetings be restored to office under the provisions of section 30 of Ordinance No. 6 of 1910. Mr. N. H. M. Abdul Cader seconded.—Carried.
