KNOW Ye that by virtue of the powers in Us vested by regulation 1 of the regulations made under section 4 of "The Quarantine and Prevention of Diseases Ordinance, 1897," and published in the *Gazette* of August 28, 1925, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, We, the Governor of Ceylon, do revoke the several Proclamations enumerated in column 1 of the schedule hereto confirming the declaration of the respective areas specified in column 2 of that schedule as "diseased localities," and hereby declare that the said areas shall cease from the date hereof to be diseased localities.

Column 1.

1. Proclamation of April 17, 1936, in the *Gazette* of April 24, 1936.

The areas in Weligama town bounded as follows :—

(1) North : Railway line extending from a point opposite the public latrine on Railway Approach road to the point where the Kottegoda road meets the Railway line.

South : From the motor omnibus halting place on Galle-Matara road to boutique bearing assessment No. 934 on the same road.

West : From boutique bearing assessment No. 934 on the Galle-Matara road to a line drawn to boutique bearing assessment No. 963 on Hettiweediya road.

East : From the last boutique near the motor omnibus halting place on the Galle-Matara road to the public latrine on the Railway Approach road.

(2) South : From the level crossing at Reid place to a length of 226 yards along the Railway line.

East : From the level crossing at Reid place to a point 240 yards towards Telijjawila road, along Reid place.

North : From the end of the eastern boundary towards the end of Telijjawila road to a point 109 yards ; the line being drawn at right angles to Reid place.

West : A line drawn from the western end of the northern boundary to the western end of the southern boundary.

2. Proclamation of April 22, 1936, in the *Gazette* of April 24, 1936.

The area in Weligama town bounded as follows :—

South : Galle-Matara road from Sea road to the 90th milepost.

East : A line drawn vertically from the 90th milepost to meet Polwatta-ganga and continuing along Polwatta-ganga until it meets the northern boundary.

West : From the junction of Sea road and Galle-Matara road to the live fence between the buildings bearing assessment numbers 792 and 793 on Hettiweediya road and from there to a point where Kottegoda road meets Borala road.

North : By a line drawn horizontally from a point where Kottegoda road meets Borala road to Polwatta-ganga.

WHEREAS by section 28 of the Courts Ordinance, 1889, as amended by section 2 of Ordinance No. 8 of 1924, it is amongst other things enacted that Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden by one of the Judges thereof or by a Commissioner of Assize duly appointed under the provisions of the said Ordinance, for each of the Circuits into which the Island is divided for the hearing, trying, and determining all prosecutions which shall be commenced against any person for or in respect of any crime or offence or alleged crime or offence :

For the Western Circuit, four times at least in each year at Colombo and such other places in such Circuit as the Governor, after previous consultation with the Judges, shall appoint, such sessions commencing at Colombo on January 10, March 20, July 10, and October 10 in every year :

And whereas it appears to Us expedient to order that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned at Ratnapura, a place included within the said Western Circuit :

Now, therefore, know Ye that We, the Governor, for sufficient reasons to Us appearing, and after previous consultation with the Judges of the Supreme Court, do order and appoint that a Criminal Sessions of the Supreme Court shall be holden at Ratnapura in the said Western Circuit on or about Monday, July 20, 1936.

- (1) revoke the Proclamation of July 31, 1934, published in the *Gazette* of July 31, 1934, so far as it relates to the several quota periods succeeding the quota period ending on December 31, 1935 ; and
- (2) proclaim that of the classes of textile goods severally described in the first column of the schedule hereto, and manufactured in the foreign countries mentioned in the second column of that schedule, the total quantities which may be imported into the Island, during the quota period specified at the head of the third column of that schedule, shall be the amounts expressed in yards of standard width in the corresponding entries in the third column of that schedule.

THE CEYLON IMPORTATION OF TEXTILES (QUOTAS) ORDERS IN COUNCIL, 1934 AND 1936.

REGULATIONS made by the Governor under Articles 9 and 10 of the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Orders in Council, 1934 and 1936.

REGULATIONS.

1. These regulations may be cited as the Textile Quotas (Amending) Regulations, 1936.

2. Any expression defined in the Ceylon Importation of Textiles (Quotas) Orders in Council, 1934 and 1936, or in the regulations heretofore made thereunder, shall, unless the context otherwise requires, have the same meaning in these regulations.

3. For the purpose of ascertaining the country of manufacture of any textiles or the percentage of cotton or artificial silk in any textiles, the Collector shall have authority to require the production of a certificate of origin or a certificate of composition or to direct an analysis to be made of any sample selected by him from those textiles.

4. (1) The country in which 50 per centum or more of the final cost of any class of textiles in their finished condition has been incurred, shall be deemed to be the country of manufacture of that class of textiles.

(2) Nothing contained in paragraph (1) of this regulation shall be deemed to affect the regulation dated September 5, 1935, published in the *Gazette* of September 6, 1935.

5. Where any textiles imported into the Island so closely resemble any regulated textiles so as to be capable of being substituted or passed off therefor, the Collector shall, subject to a right of appeal to the Governor, have power to determine whether or not those textiles are liable to be dealt with as regulated textiles.

6. The textile Quotas Regulations, 1934, published in the *Gazette* of July 31, 1934, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) in regulation 3—

(a) by the substitution for the words "per centum" wherever they occur therein, of the words "per centum by weight"; and

(b) by the addition thereto of the following new paragraph (d):—

"(d) piece goods containing 50 per centum or more by weight of cotton and artificial silk combined, shall be deemed to be cotton piece goods or artificial silk piece goods according as the weight of the cotton does or does not exceed the weight of the artificial silk";

(2) in regulation 4—

(a) by the substitution in the Table subjoined to paragraph (1), for the item relating to Sarongs, of the following items:—

"Single Sarongs of any material 48 inches.
Double Sarongs of any material 28 inches."

(b) by the insertion in the Table aforesaid, between the items therein relating to Sheetings and Ticking, of the following new item:—

"Tabling 72 inches";

(c) by the addition of the following new paragraph (3) thereto:—

"(3) Where any sarong which is cut and stitched together is imported into the Island, the yardage thereof shall be reckoned and recorded as double the actual yardage.";

(3) in regulation 12 (1)—

(a) by the substitution of the following for paragraph (c) thereof:—

"(c) regulated textiles identified and shown to the satisfaction of the Collector to have been exported from the Island, by proof of registration at the Customs Office prior to exportation or by any other adequate proof";

(b) by the addition thereto of the following new paragraph (d):—

"(d) regulated textiles imported as private property, and not for the purposes of trade or business, in quantities considered reasonable by the Collector.";

(4) in the Schedule to those regulations—

(a) in Form B, by the deletion of the clause numbered 1A, and of the note relating thereto, marked with the asterisk, at the foot of that form;

(b) in Form C, by the deletion of the cage marked C and the substitution of the two following cages therefor:—

C Regulated Textiles identified and proved to the satisfaction of the Collector to have been exported from the Island.

D Regulated Textiles imported as private property, and not by way of trade or business in quantities considered reasonable by the Collector.

REGULATIONS.

1. In these regulations the expression "camp area" shall mean the spaces within the boundaries specified in the schedule hereto,

and "Assistant Government Agent" shall mean the Assistant Government Agent of the Puttalam and Chilaw Districts.

2. No person shall camp in any place within the camp area where camping is prohibited by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent.

3. No person shall ease himself within the camp area, except at the places provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

4. No person shall deposit any liquid or solid refuse or any rubbish within the camp area, except in the places or receptacles provided for that purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent.

5. (a) No cattle shall be kept within the camp area, except those brought there for slaughter and those permitted by special or general order of the Assistant Government Agent to be kept within such area.

(b) No cattle shall be kept in the vicinity of the camp area, except at a place especially appointed as a cattle gala or at a place approved for such use by the Assistant Government Agent.

(c) The person in charge of the cattle shall cause their droppings to be removed to the nearest place provided therefor, and shall at all times keep clean the place occupied by his cattle.

6. All prepared foods sold within the camp area shall be protected from flies and dust by being (a) wrapped in or covered with clean paper or cloth, or (b) kept in closed glass cases, or (c) kept in other covered containers approved by the Medical Officer, or by the Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

7. No person who is likely to affect prejudicially the cleanliness of the camp area, and no person who is suffering from an infectious disease shall be permitted to enter the camp area.

8. In the event of an epidemic breaking out in the camp area during the festival, the Assistant Government Agent may direct the pilgrims to leave the place of pilgrimage, and may prescribe the routes and methods for their conveyance.

9. (a) Every person within the camp area who is suffering from an infectious or a contagious disease, and (b) every person who resides with him knowing that he is so suffering shall report the case to the Medical or Sanitary Officer in charge of the camp area.

10. When any tank or well within the camp area is set apart for any particular purpose and a notice to that effect is exhibited on the spot, no person shall use the tank or well for any purpose other than that for which it is set apart.

11. No person shall keep bakeries, aerated water manufactories, tea and coffee boutiques, eating-houses or galas within the camp area without previously obtaining a licence from the Assistant Government Agent, permitting him to do so. The licence shall be issued free of charge.

12. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, construct any booth, or extend any building within the camp area so as to encroach on the main or other streets of the camp.

13. No person shall, without the previous sanction of the Assistant Government Agent, discharge fireworks and firearms within the camp area, or within a radius of one mile from the boundaries of such area.

14. No person shall slaughter animals within the camp area, except in the place provided for the purpose by, or with the approval of the Assistant Government Agent, and every person slaughtering animals in such a place shall be responsible for its cleanliness.

BY-LAWS REFERRED TO.

1. The proprietor, trustee, or other person entitled to the possession of a burial ground shall apply in writing to the Chairman of the Urban District Council to have the same registered as such stating the name of the keeper (if any) of the ground, and annexing to his application a figure of survey of the premises certified by the Surveyor-General or by a duly licensed surveyor. And the person named as keeper in such application shall subscribe the same in acknowledgment of his acceptance of the office and duties of keeper of such burial ground.

2. If no keeper be named, or if the keeper so named shall not have signed the application in manner aforesaid, then, and in either of such cases the person on whose application registration of a burial ground is made shall be deemed to be the keeper of that ground and to be responsible for any breach of any by-law or regulation in respect of that ground.

3. In the event of the death of the keeper of a burial ground or his inability from any cause to fulfil his duties the name of another keeper shall be registered, and no burial or cremation shall take place in such ground until such fresh registration shall have been effected, except on the special permission of the Chairman of the Urban District Council or in his absence of the Vice-Chairman, if any.

4. No burial or cremation shall take place until the certificate required by section 32 of the Births and Deaths Registration Ordinance, No. 1 of 1895, has been produced to the keeper of the burial ground, or to the Chairman or Vice-Chairman, as the case may be, if the burial or cremation is authorized by the Chairman or Vice-Chairman under by-law 3.

5. It shall be the duty of the keeper of every burial ground to keep a register of all burials or cremations carried out on the premises of which he is the keeper in the form prescribed by the Chairman of the Urban District Council, and within twenty-four hours after any burial or cremation to cause a true extract of the entry of such cremation or burial in his register to be delivered to the Urban District Council Office.

6. It shall be lawful for the Chairman of the Urban District Council or any person authorized by him in writing for the purpose, to visit and inspect at any time any burial ground and to have access to all books and documents relating thereto.

7. All registered burial grounds shall be kept properly fenced and kept free from jungle and clean to the satisfaction of the Chairman of the Urban District Council.

8. No grave shall be less than 4 feet in depth or at a distance of less than 2 feet from any other grave.

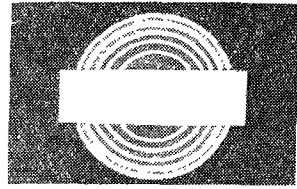

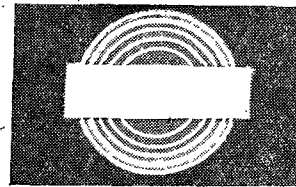

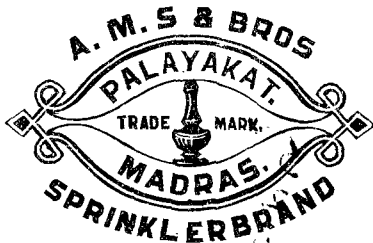

and sludge deposits do not accumulate, and power output, oil consumption and motor overhaul frequency are not adversely affected even under such aggravated circumstances as are encountered in automotive diesel and in aircraft motor operations.

Further, the presence of small amounts of these oil-soluble metal naphthenates in furnace oils and in diesel fuel oils lessens materially the tendency toward the eroding and plugging or fouling of fuel injection orifices, by virtue of the suspensibility of such substances as cause the said erosion and fouling, brought about by the agency of the said metal naphthenates.

There are seventeen claims and no drawings.

NOTICES UNDER "THE EXCISE ORDINANCE, No. 8 OF 1912."

Notification by the Excise Commissioner, relating to the List of Approved Brands of Foreign Spirits.

1. Repeal ; Revision of List of Approved Brands.—

The notification relating to the approval of brands of foreign spirits, dated December 6, 1934, and published in *Gazette* No. 8,095 of December 14, 1934, is hereby cancelled, and with reference to the List of Approved Brands of Foreign Spirits published in *Gazette* No. 8,135 of July 26, 1935, it is hereby notified—

- (1) that the Excise Commissioner reserves to himself the discretion to revise the standard of quality requisite for the approval of any class or description of foreign spirits, whenever it appears to him to be in the public interest so to do, whether in respect of brands already in the List or those to be added hereafter ;
- (2) that the Excise Commissioner is prepared to add to the aforesaid List, upon the conditions set out in paragraph 2 hereunder, any other brand of foreign spirits which in his opinion is of the requisite standard and in all other respects suitable ; and
- (3) that whenever it appears to the Excise Commissioner to be necessary in the public interest to reconsider the question of retaining in the aforesaid List any brand of foreign spirits included therein at any time prior to the date of this notification, steps will be taken by him in that behalf in accordance with the procedure and the conditions set out in paragraph 3 hereunder.

2. Conditions for Addition of New Brands to Approved List.—

(1) Application.—

Application shall be made in writing addressed to the Excise Commissioner, and shall be accompanied by a sample, not less than 8 drams in quantity, of each brand of foreign spirits specified in the application, and by a remittance to cover the cost of analysis calculated at the rate of seventy rupees (Rs. 70) for each such brand.

(2) Discretion of Excise Commissioner as to Approval.—

The addition of any new brand of foreign spirits to the List shall be in the absolute discretion of the Excise Commissioner.

(3) Disposal of Remittance.—

Where an application is refused before the analysis of samples of the brands of foreign spirits specified therein, on the ground that the identical brand has already been analysed and rejected, the sum remitted by the applicant will be returned to him. Where an application is refused after the analysis of samples, the applicant shall not be entitled to a refund of any part of his remittance.

(4) Approval for Limited Periods.—

Any brand of foreign spirits may, notwithstanding that it is found on analysis to be of the requisite standard and in all other respects suitable, be added to the List in the first instance for such limited period, not less than twelve months, as the Excise Commissioner may in his discretion determine.

(5) *Further Analysis of Approved Brands.*—

Samples of any brand of foreign spirits added to the List under these conditions, may, at the discretion of the Excise Commissioner, be subjected to further analysis at intervals of not less than twelve months; but neither the applicant at whose instance that brand was added to the List, nor any other person keeping that brand for sale, will be called upon to defray the cost of any such further analysis, except in the case of country made "foreign" spirits, for which a sum of Rs. 30 may be charged for any further analysis as provided for by rules relating to their manufacture. Samples for this purpose will, at the discretion of the Excise Commissioner, be taken by him, under condition 21 of the General Conditions applicable to all Excise Licences, from any licensed premises in which that brand is kept for sale.

(6) *Removal of any such Brand from Approved List.*—

Any brand of foreign spirits added to the List by the Excise Commissioner under these conditions, may at any time be removed by him from the List, if he is satisfied—

- (a) that it was added in the first instance through an error, or
- (b) that it has ceased to be of the requisite standard for the time being applicable to that brand, or to be in any other respect suitable for sale, or
- (c) that it had ceased to be imported into or manufactured in Ceylon more than twelve months prior to that time.

But before any brand is so removed from the List on any of these grounds, notice of not less than six months will be given by the Excise Commissioner of his intention to remove it, by advertisement published in the *Gazette* and in one or more of the local newspapers, and by written information addressed to such persons as may be known to him to be importers or manufacturers of that brand.

3. *Procedure and Conditions for Removal from Approved List of Brands included therein prior to this Notification.*—

Whenever it appears to the Excise Commissioner to be necessary in the public interest to reconsider the question of retaining in the List any brand of foreign spirits included therein at any time prior to the date of this notification—

- (1) not less than one year's notice of the intention to reconsider such question will be given by the Excise Commissioner, by advertisement published in the *Gazette* and in one or more of the local newspapers, and by written information addressed to such persons as may be known to him to be importers or manufacturers of that brand; and
- (2) on the expiry of the notice so given, such representations as may be made by any person interested in retaining that brand in the List will be entertained by the Excise Commissioner, and samples of that brand, selected at the discretion of the Excise Commissioner from any stock kept for sale at any place in the Island, will be subjected to a further analysis in accordance with condition (5) of the foregoing paragraph 2; and
- (3) if after considering the representations made to him and the results of the further analysis, the Excise Commissioner is satisfied that that brand should be removed from the List on any of the grounds set out in condition (6) of the foregoing paragraph 2, he will make order accordingly; and from the date on which a notification of such order is published by him in the *Gazette*, that brand will cease to be an approved brand.
