#### PROCLAMATIONS BY THE LIEUTENANT-GOVERNOR.

In the Name of Her Majesty VICTORIA, of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland Queen, Defender of the Faith.

PROCLAMATION.

By His Excellency Sir E. NOEL WALKER, Knight Commander of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Lieutenant-Governor in and over the Island of Ceylon, with the Dependencies thereof.

E. NOEL WALKER.

WHEREAS by the 19th section of the Ordinance No. 10 of 1885 it is enacted that whenever the following events have occurred, viz:—

- (a) The period under section 7 for preferring claims has elapsed, and all claims (if any) within such period have been disposed of by the Forest Settlement Officer; and
- (b) If such claims have been made, the periods fixed for appealing from the orders passed on such claims have elapsed, and all appeals (if any) presented within such period have been disposed of by the Appellate Officer or the Supreme Court; and
- (c) All lands (if any) to be included in the proposed forest which may be acquired under section 13 have become vested in the Crown—

the Governor shall, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, specify the limits of the forest which it is intended to reserve, and declare the same to be reserved from a date fixed by such Proclamation:

And whereas all things necessary for declaring the forest hereunder mentioned to be a reserved forest have been fulfilled, and all times herein before recited have elapsed, and it is expedient to specify the limits of such forest:

Now know all Men that We, the said Lieutenant-Governor, do by this Our Proclamation proclaim the forest, the limits of which are set forth in the schedule hereto subjoined, to be reserved forest as from and after the First day of January, 1896.

And We do hereby further specify the limits of the said reserved forest to be those set forth in the said schedule, reserving, nevertheless, to the public the right to use the footpath, three feet wide, passing through the stream reservations along the Opatte-oya and Adonawe-oya.

Given at Colombo, in the Island of Ceylon, this Seventh day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand Eight hundred and Ninety-five.

#### GOVERNMENT NOTIFICATIONS.

It is hereby notified for general information that His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor has been pleased, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by authority of section 76 of "The Prisons Ordinance, 1877," to substitute the following in place of rule 283 of the "Prisons Manual":—

"The penal stage, which shall last for three months. Prisoners in the penal stage shall not be employed without the prison walls except on the written authority of His Excellency the Governor. They shall be entitled to write one letter within one month of admission on making application to the jailer for that purpose. They shall receive penal diet for such portion of period passed in the penal stage as His Excellency may direct.

"Prisoners sentenced to five years and upwards shall, unless detained under the provision of rule 252 or 299, remain for only one month in the penal stage."

And to make the following addition to rule 284:-

"Prisoners sentenced to five years and upwards shall not be promoted to class III. till they have served eleven months in class IV."
