REGULATIONS.

- 1. The following new fees shall be added at the end of the Second Schedule to the Ordinance:—

 Rs. c.
 - "For the issue of a conductor's licence or a duplicate thereof ... 2 0
 - For the renewal of a conductor's licence, each year 0 50 "
- 2. The following new forms 28 and 29 shall be inserted in the Third Schedule to the Ordinance immediately after form 27:—
 - 28.—Application for Conductor's Licence.

To the Registrar of Motor Cars, Colombo.

- My age is _____ years. (Applicant should have completed eighteen years of age on the date of application.)
- I declare that I am not suffering from any physical or mental disability which prevents me from performing the duties of conductor and that I am free from any contagious or infectious disease.

I enclose two copies of my most recent photograph. $\P N.B.$ —These must be in size $2\frac{1}{2}$ in. by 2 in.—bust only.)

I hereby declare that the above particulars are true and accurate in every respect.

I enclose copies of two testimonials regarding my character. (The testimonials should be from two responsible persons who know the applicant personally.)

 $\it N.B.$ —The photograph shall be authenticated by the signature or official stamp of the Registrar.

3. The following regulation shall be inserted as regulation 8 in the Fourth Schedule to the Ordinance:—

8. (1) No person shall act as conductor of an omnibus unless he is the holder of a licence in that behalf issued by the registrar.

(2) Every application for a licence shall be in form 28 in the Third Schedule to the Ordinance, and shall be accompanied by two copies of the applicant's most

recent photograph, and the prescribed fee.

(3) Every licence shall be substantially in form 29

in the Third Schedule to the Ordinance.

(4) One copy of the photograph of each applicant shall be filed in the registrar's office, and the other copy shall be affixed to the licence, if the registrar decides to issue a licence, and shall be authenticated by the registrar with a facsimile of his signature or with his official seal or stamp.

(5) No licence shall be issued to any person who has

not completed eighteen years of age.

(6) Every licence shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is issued.

(7) A licence already issued may (on application made to the registrar by the holder thereof and on payment of a fee of fifty cents) be renewed by endorsement on such licence of the renewal thereof by the registrar. Every licence so renewed shall expire on the thirty-first day of December of the year in respect of which it is renewed.

(8) The registrar may, subject to appeal to the Executive Committee of Local Administration, refuse to issue or renew a licence, or at any time suspend or cancel a licence or a renewal of a licence already issued, to any person who is in the opinion of the registrar unfit to be the conductor of an omnibus because he habitually behaves in a riotous or disorderly manner or is habitually drunk or suffers from any disease of an infectious or contagious nature.

(9) Every conductor of an omnibus shall carry his licence on his person or in the omnibus while he is on duty, and shall forthwith produce it for inspection on

demand by a police officer or headman.

(10) Every conductor who is prosecuted before any court for any offence shall take his licence with him to the court-house and shall produce the licence when called upon to do so by the court at any stage of the

proceedings.

(11) A court which convicts a conductor of any offence under any written law shall call upon the conductor to produce the licence and endorse on it the particulars of the offence and the sentence imposed, and may in addition suspend or cancel the licence by a further endorsement made on the licence and recorded in the proceedings. If the licence is not so produced when demanded, the holder thereof may by an order recorded in the proceedings be disqualified for acting as conductor of any omnibus until the licence is produced in court for such endorsement as may be necessary.
