Whereas it is enacted by sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934 (No. 30), that where the Registrar is satisfied that in the United Kingdom, or in any British Possession to which that section applies, estate duty is payable by reason of a death in respect of any property situate in the United Kingdom, or in such possession and passing on such death, he shall allow a sum equal to the amount of that duty to be deducted from the estate duty payable in respect of that property on the same death;

And whereas it is further enacted by sub-section (3) of section 3 of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934 (No. 30), as amended by the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1935 (No. 25), that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation in the Gazette, apply section 3 of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934, to any British Possession, where he is satisfied that by the law of such Possession, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in this Colony when passing on death, or that the law of such Possession as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the provisions contained in sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934;

And whereas the Governor in Council is satisfied that by the laws of the British Possessions hereinafter mentioned, either no duty is leviable in respect of property situate in this colony when passing on death, or that the laws of such Possessions as respects any duty so leviable is to the like effect as the provisions contained in sub-section (1) of section 3 of the Estate Duty (Amendment) Ordinance, 1934:

#### Collecting Station Rule.

RULES made by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 31 (2) of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, and by Article 93 of the Ceylon (State Council) Order in Council, 1931, and confirmed by resolution of the State Council on June 12, 1936.

- 1. Definition of Collecting Station.—
  - For the purposes of these rules, a "Collecting Station" means a place, in which (a) a distiller or a person nominated by him, or (b) a toddy renter or a person nominated by him, or (c) a vinegar manufacturer or a person nominated by him, keeps or stores, under a licence duly issued in that behalf, toddy collected from tapping gardens, before it is removed to the distillery, tavern, or vinegar manufactory.
  - 2. All Toddy for Distillery, Tavern, or Vinegar Manufactory to be brought from a Licensed Collecting Station.—

(a) No toddy shall be brought to a distillery, except from a licensed collecting station.

Provided, however, that toddy from topes in the vicinity of a distillery may be conveyed to a collecting station in the distillery premises, if the site of that collecting station has been approved by the Superintendent of the Circle.

(b) No toddy shall be brought to a tavern or vinegar manufactory by cart, motor vehicle, or other conveyance, except from a collecting station.

3. Accounting of Toddy received from Collecting Stations .-

(a) Daily accounts of all toddy received in a distillery, tavern, or vinegar manufactory shall be kept in the following form, and the total for each day shall be entered in the fifth column at the end of that day:—

CONDITIONS and form of the licence to possess toddy in a collecting station, pending removal to a distillery, toddy tavern, or vinegar manufactory, prescribed by the Governor by virtue of the powers vested in him by section 24 of the Excise Ordinance, No. 8 of 1912, in lieu of the conditions and form set out in Excise Notification No. 243, published in *Gazette* No. 7,992 of July 14, 1933, as amended by Excise Notifications bearing No. 266, No. 271, and No. 275 published in *Gazette* No. 8,063, No. 8,095, and No. 8,111 of July 13, 1934, December 14, 1934, and March 22, 1935, respectively, which are hereby rescinded.

Maximum and Minimum Number of Trees for a Distillery Collecting Station.

The number of collecting stations serving any distillery, in relation to the number of trees licensed for such distillery, shall not exceed such proportion between the two limits of one for every 500 trees and of one for every 3,000 trees, as may be prescribed for such distillery by the Superintendent of Excise.

- 2. Site of Collecting Station.—
  - (a) Every collecting station shall abut on a motorable road.
  - (b) No collecting station shall be less than 5 yards distant from a dwelling house or any other building.
- Contractor to collect Toddy for each Distiller separately.—

Where toddy is collected at one collecting station by a contractor who supplies toddy to more than one distiller, the supply for each distiller shall be separately collected and accounted for at the collecting station.

14. Collecting Station Premises to be fenced with Barbed Wire.

The premises of every collecting station shall be enclosed with a fence of barbed wire up to a height of not less than 4 feet, and with intervals between the strands of not more than one foot.

Articles to be kept in Collecting Station.—

In every collecting station there shall be a shed with open sides, in which shall be kept the following articles and no others:

- (a) the book of accounts,
- (b) the Inspection Note Book,
- (c) a table,
- (d) a chair, and
- (e) paper, blotting paper, pen and ink.
- 6. Prohibitions as to Persons employable.-
  - (a) For the purpose of transporting, collecting or measuring toddy, no person shall be employed who is under the age of 16 years, or is not the holder of a transport pass or of a licence to manufacture and supply toddy, or is not an authorized measurer.
  - (b) No person other than an authorized measurer, or a holder of a transport pass or of a licence to manufacture and supply toddy, shall be admitted into a collecting station.
- List of Employees to be kept in Collecting Stations.-

There shall be kept in every collecting station a complete list of all persons employed therein for each of the purposes of tapping, transporting, collecting and measuring toddy.

Exhibition of Signboard.-

A signboard shall be placed in a conspicuous position on the premises of every collecting station, with the following particulars set out thereon :-

- (a) The name of the distillery, toddy tavern or vinegar manufactory to which toddy is supplied.
  (b) The name of the land and village in which the collecting station stands.
- (c) The number assigned to the collecting station.
- 9. Accounting of Toddy at Collecting Station .-

#### 10. Particulars on Front Page of Accounts Book .-

The first page in the book of accounts shall contain the following particulars:-

- (a) Names of persons licensed to manufacture and supply toddy for delivery at the collecting station.
- (b) Names of tappers, if any, employed by the aforesaid persons.

Tapping licence numbers.

- (d) Numbers of trees in respect of which each tapping licence was issued.
- (e) Numbers of the transport passes for transporting the toddy to the collecting station.

#### 11. Disposal of Toddy in Collecting Station.—

No toddy deposited in a collecting station shall be sold, or gifted, or disposed of otherwise than by dispatch to the distillery, toddy tavern, or vinegar manufactory to which the supplies are ordinarily sent.

Toddy in Collecting Station not to be adulterated.—

No toddy deposited in a collecting station shall be diluted or adulterated in any manner.

All Vessels to be kept clean.—

All vessels used for the collection or transport of toddy shall be kept scrupulously clean.

#### Regulation of Hours of Transport.

(a) All toddy which is to be delivered to taverns and vinegar manufactories, shall be brought to the collecting station before 10 A.M. in the case of the morning collection, or 5.30 P.M. in the case of the afternoon collection, or before such later hour as the Excise Commissioner may determine in respect of each of those collections in the special circumstances of any case. All toddy which is to be delivered to distilleries, shall be brought to the collecting station before 1 r.m., or before such later hour as the Excise Commissioner may determine in the special circumstances of any case.

(b) Toddy collected for taverns and vinegar manufactories, shall be delivered daily at each tavern or vinegar  $\epsilon$ manufactory before 11 A.M. in the case of the morning collection, and before 6 P.M. in the case of the evening collection, or before such later hour as the Excise Commissioner may determine in respect of each of those collections in the special circumstances of any case. Toddy collected for distilleries shall be delivered daily at each distillery before 6 P.M., or before such later hour as the Excise Commissioner may determine in the special circumstances of any case.

(c) Except with the permission of the Superintendent of the Circle obtained in writing, no toddy shall be

permitted to remain in a collecting station after 6 P.M. or such other hour as may be fixed by the Excise Commissioner

under paragraph (b) of this rule.

#### 15. Consignments of Toddy to be accompanied by Advice Notes.-

- (a) Every consignment of toddy dispatched from a collecting station to a distillery, tavern, or vinegar manufactory, shall be accompanied by an advice note containing the following particulars:—
  - Serial number.
  - The number of the collecting station and village.

The quantity of toddy despatched.

(d) The time of despatch.

The number of the transport pass for transporting the toddy.

The registered number of the cart or motor vehicle employed for transporting the toddy, if any.

(g) The signature of the collecting station manager, and date of issue.

#### 16. Breakdown in Transport Arrangements.—

Prompt notice of every breakdown in the transport arrangements, which might reasonably be expected to cause infringement of the conditions of the transport pass, shall be given on the day of its occurrence by telegram or written message to the Officer-in-Charge of the nearest Excise Station or Office.

The collecting station licence shall be exhibited in a prominent place on the premises, so as to be visible from the road.

#### 18. Desposal of Advice Notes.—

All the advice notes received during each day shall be numbered serially, and filed at the distillery, tavern or vinegar manufactory. The advice notes for each month shall be handed to the Excise Inspector, who may remove them at the end of that month, if he desires to send them to the Inspectors who are in charge of the respective collecting stations. They shall not in any event be destroyed, except on the orders of the Excise Inspector.

#### SECTION I.—CONDITIONS APPLICABLE TO TAPPING LICENCES.

#### Licensee or his Employee may tap Trees .-

The licensee may tap the trees and draw toddy himself, or may employ for the purpose the tapper whose name is given in the licence.

#### Disposal of Toddy tapped.—

(a) All toddy tapped or drawn under this licence for the supply of a distillery, tavern, or vinegar manufactory,

shall be delivered at a collecting station named in the licence.

Provided that toddy tapped or drawn for the supply of a tavern or vinegar manufactory, and transported otherwise than by cart, motor vehicle or other conveyance, may be delivered at the tavern or vinegar manufactory direct.

(b) No toddy tapped, drawn or transported under this licence, shall be sold, or gifted, or disposed of otherwise than in the manner prescribed in paragraph (a) of this condition.

#### Hours for Tapping and Lowering Toddy.-

No tree shall be tapped between 6 P.M. and 5 A.M. In the case of trees licensed for the supply of toddy to taverns and vinegar manufactories, the morning and afternoon collections of such trees shall be lowered daily before 8.30 A.M. and 4.30 P.M. respectively. In the case of trees licensed for the supply of toddy to distilleries, the collections shall be lowered only once a day before 11 A.M.

4. Teddy not to be kept in Garden after certain Hours.—

No toddy which is to be delivered to a tavern or vinegar manufactory, shall be kept in the garden in which it is drawn after 10 A.M. on any day in the case of the morning collection, or after 5.30 P.M. on any day in the case of the afternoon collection. No toddy which is to be delivered to a distillery shall be kept in the garden in which it is drawn after 12 noon on any day.

5. Power to alter Hours prescribed in Conditions 3 and 4.—

The Excise Commissioner may, in his discretion, fix any other hours in place of the hours prescribed in the foregoing conditions 3 and 4.

- 6. Removal of Toddy to Collecting Station.—

No toddy shall be taken into any house or other building. It shall either be taken direct from the garden to the collecting station, or be poured into a transport cask placed in the open in such garden.

7. Toddy not to be Adulterated.—

The toddy drawn shall not be diluted or adulterated in any manner.

8. Vessels to be kept clean.—
